Olympic tennis tickets in demand



More than 42,000 tennis tickets went on sale for the Olympic Tennis Event in a one-day only release by the Sydney Organising Committee for the Olympic Games (SOCOG) last week.

Within a few hours of opening, the top A-category tickets for the singles semifinal matches on 25 and 26 September and both sessions on 23 September were oversubscribed. As a result, ticket allocation will now be determined by a ballot. Tickets were on sale from 7am to midnight with nearly half of the 42,000 being bought by the close of business at midnight. The final four sessions, which include all medal matches, were sold out.

Referring to the high demand for tickets, John O'Neill, SOCOG ticketing spokesperson, said, "We were expecting these to be very popular, there's been a good spread of purchasing across all sessions." He added, "It's been solid all the way through - in particular, the \$55 ground passes will prove to be excellent value."

The tennis tickets are part of a four-week roll out of tickets for every sport which began on Sunday 7 May. Over 3.2 million tickets are on sale during this period - tickets are being sold on a day-by-day roll out basis in conjunction with News Limited newspapers. They are available by phone and, in some cases, mail order. Ground passes are still available and will be included in the next round of ticket sales in June. The date of the next sale of tickets and the sales procedure that will be used are all still to be confirmed.

Mike Daws, Tennis Competition Manager for SOCOG, said, "We're just thrilled with the public response and expect a sell out when the remaining 20,000 tickets go on sale in mid to late June."

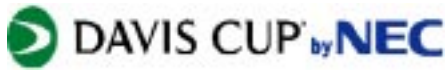

Tickets for Australia-Brazil tie

Tennis Australia has announced that tickets for its forthcoming semifinal with Brazil will be available from Wednesday 24 May from all Ticketmaster outlets. Telephone: 136 122 (check) The three-day tie is taking place from 14-16 July at the ANZ Stadium in Brisbane, Australia.

The process for appointing John Newcombe's successor as captain of **Australia's Davis Cup team** is set to begin. The selection committee has been finalised and consists of chairman and Tennis Australia President Geoff Pollard plus Tony Ryan, Brad Drewett, Ashley Cooper and Allan Stone. There are four candidates: John Fitzgerald, Geoff Masters, Wally Masur and Peter McNamara. Pollard said, "We have an extremely impressive field of applicants and an experienced selection committee... We will now set about interviewing all the candidates, and I have complete confidence that the right decision will be made in due course."

Brazil's Gustavo Kuerten moves into second place on the ATP Champions Race after claiming the third Tennis Masters Series title of his career in Hamburg. Meanwhile, Russia's Marat Safin moves into the Top Ten for the first time after reaching the final. The best players on the Leader Board at the end of the year including **Grand Slam winners** will qualify for the Tennis Masters Cup (eight-player draw) to be held in Lisbon, Portugal from 27 November-3 December. The Tennis Masters Cup is co-owned by the ITF, Grand Slams and the ATP Tour.

Argentina qualifies for NEC World Youth Cup

Argentina finished champion nation in both the boys' and girls' South American regional qualifying events of the NEC World Youth Cup in Paraguay, the ITF junior team competition for boys' and girls' of 16 & under. It was a day of triple celebrations for the teams, with the unexpected arrival of the President of the Republic of Argentina, Dr Fernando de la Rúa, at the Yacht y Golf Club Paraguayo, venue for the qualifying event. Delighted with the achievement of his young compatriots, Dr de la Rúa requested to meet the champion teams in order to congratulate them personally.

The Argentine boys, Brian Dabul and Juan Monaco, ranked No. 1 and No. 2 respectively in South America at U16, will be one of the hot favourites for the 2000 NEC World Youth Cup title at the Finals in Hiroshima in October. They will be keen to revenge their defeat at the hands of Austria in the U14 World Junior Tennis Final in 1998 when they took the runners up medals.

Referring to the Olympic gold medal she won at the 1996 Atlanta Olympic Games, Lindsay Davenport told USA Tennis Weekly:

"Even though I followed it up with Grand Slam titles, it's still the most memorable because it was my first bigger title and it was such awesome memories in Atlanta. You know, even the good things that have come since then, my emotions have never been topped by what I felt in Atlanta."

Woodies equal Open Era record

After winning the doubles title at the Tennis Masters Series event in Hamburg this weekend, Todd Woodbridge and Mark Woodforde are on level terms with Peter Fleming and John McEnroe and Bob Hewitt and Frew McMillan who have won 57 doubles career trophies. These three partnerships have won more doubles titles than any others since the Open Era began in 1968.

The Woodies have enjoyed an outstanding career on the doubles court. In 1996, they won the gold medal in doubles at the Atlanta Olympic Games. A year later, they achieved a record fifth consecutive doubles title at Wimbledon.

Their experience and teamwork has also helped Australia's cause in Davis Cup. The duo have won fourteen out of sixteen doubles matches in Davis Cup, with their last win in 1999 contributing to Australia's first Davis Cup trophy victory since 1986. Last weekend's title in Hamburg is their fourth this year after securing wins in Adelaide, Sydney and Miami.
