Fed Cup World Group Play Off Ties Week I

The Fed Cup World Group Play Off Ties Week I take place this coming weekend. Four ties being played on Saturday 28th April and Sunday 29 April in Australia, Japan, Italy and Slovak Republic, and the competition will see many players making their debuts.

Australia plays host to Austria on grass in Adelaide. This is the nations' fourth Fed Cup meeting, with Austria leading the series 2-1. The Europeans have won the last two meetings and this includes the 0-2 come back against the Australians in Klagenfurt in 1999.

Australia, seven times champion nation, is looking for a better year in 2001 having lost all their matches in last year's competition. They are fielding an experienced team with Nicole Pratt, Rachel McQuillan and Alicia Molik, being joined by Evie Dominikovic in her Fed Cup debut. Their opponents also have an experienced team with Fed Cup newcomer Evelyn Fauth joining Sylvia Plischke, Patricia Wartusch and Marion Maruska. Austria are also looking to improve on last year when they won just one of three round robin ties.

Italy hosts Croatia at Bassano del Grappa for only their second match-up. The two nations met for the first time last year in the World Group round robin won by Italy 3-0. Croatia is still looking for their first win in the World Group since working its way up to the top level of the event in 1998. Along with the seasoned Silvija Talaja and Jelena Kostanic the Croatians have two players making both their Fed Cup and senior debut next weekend: Karolina Sprem and Matea Mezak, both of whom play on the ITF Junior Circuit.

Giulia Casoni is the only player on the Italian team to have competed in last year's competition but Gloria Pizzichini and Adriana Serra-Zanetti are returning to Fed Cup after some years absence. Their fourth team member, Roberta Vinci, is making her Fed Cup debut.

Japan is taking on old rival Argentina in the Ariake Coliseum in Tokyo. These two teams have met four times previously with Japan leading the series 3-1. However

these three wins were in the early 70's while Argentina's only victory came in 1992.

All of Japan's team members are Fed Cup Veterans, Shinobu Asagoe and Yuka Yoshida were both part of the 2000 team which brought Japan up through the Asia/Oceania Qualifying Group I round to the World Group this year. Saori Obata and Rika Hiraki have also both previously had played doubles in Fed Cup.

Argentina is resting its hopes on the young shoulders of ITF Junior World Champion, Maria Emilia Salerni and doubles stalwart Laura Montalvo. Salerni has had two doubles semifinal finishes on the Sanex WTA Tour so far this year and the 17-year-old already holds an impressive 6-0 singles record in Fed Cup. Clarissa Fernandez is being introduced to Fed Cup to become the third member of the Argentine team.

In Bratislava the Slovak Republic takes on Hungary for the first time. The Slovakian team of Henrieta Nagyova, Karina Habsudova, Janette Husarova and Daniela Hantuchova have a wealth of Fed Cup experience between them but will however be hoping for more success. Their country's results have been up and down over the last few years although the Slovaks do seem to rise to the big occasion.

Hungary has worked its way up to the World Group this year with an impressive 5-0 Fed Cup record in 2000. Lead player Rita Kuti Kis, came back into the team in 1999 after a five year absence and since then is 7-0 in singles matches. Petra Mandula and Katalin Marosi-Aracama also have good records with Mandula's doubles record of 13-3 (9-0 since 1996) being particularly impressive. The newcomer to the team is Aniko Kapros who should have a great Fed Cup future ahead of her.

PABLO LLORENS REÑAGA IS NAMED 2001 GOLDEN ACHIEVEMENT AWARD WINNER

The International Tennis Hall of Fame announced that Pablo Llorens Reñaga is this year's recipient of the Golden Achievement Award.

The Golden Achievement Award is presented annually on a worldwide basis to individuals who have made important contributions to tennis in the fields of administration, promotion or education, and have devoted long and outstanding service to the sport.

Presentation of this year's Golden Achievement Award will be held on Tuesday, April 24 in Spain at a special dinner at the Village of the Open Seat Godo 2001 at the Real Club de Tenis Barcelona – 1899. Tennis Hall of Famer Tony Trabert will present Llorens Reñaga with the award. Joining Trabert for the award presentation will be Francesco Ricci Bitti, President of the International Tennis Federation (ITF); Agustin Pujol, President of the Spanish Tennis Federation and Member of the International Council of the ITF; and Juan M. Tintore, President of the Real Club de Tenis Barcelona – 1899.

Llorens Reñaga was President of the Spanish Tennis Federation for 15 years. In 1975 he founded the European Tennis Association together with the Federation Presidents of France, Switzerland, Germany and Great Britain. In 1973, Llorens Reñaga became the first Spanish member

He held the position of first Vice-President of the ITF and is now an honorary Vice-President for life. He has been a member of the Spanish Olympic Committee since 1971 and is now an honorary member for life.

Nominations are submitted by tennis federations from around the world and then voted on by the Golden Achievement Award Selection Committee.

Successful Level 2 Officiating School held in Algeria

ITF Officiating held a very successful Level 2 School for Chair Umpires in Algiers, Algeria (19-22 April 2001), linked to the Algeria F1 Men's Futures Tournament. As a result, the number of ITF certified officials in Africa has reached record levels.

Officials from Algeria, Egypt, Senegal and Tunisia participated in the School, which was taught by Mike Morrissey (responsible for ITF Officiating) and Jorge Dias (ITF/Grand Slam Chair Umpire).

Thirteen students successfully completed the written and practical examinations in Algiers to become ITF White Badge Officials. The number of White Badges in Africa has increased over 50% in the last three years to 75. ITF Officiating has been working to develop officiating in the continent and this has led to increased opportunities and education for African officials.

Junior Team event qualifying rounds start

The regional qualifying events for the World Junior Tennis Competition (Under 14's) and the NEC World Youth Cup for (Under 16's) start this week and next. The dates and venues are as follows:

World Junior Tennis:

23 April - North/Central America and Caribbean - Dominican Republic.

1 May - Asia/Oceania - Sri Lanka

1 May - South America - Colombia

NEC World Youth Cup

1 May - North/Central America and Caribbean - El Salvador

The World Junior Tennis Finals will be held in Prostějov, Czech Republic on 14-19 August and the NEC World Youth Cup will be held in Santiago, Chile on 16-21 October.

14 & Under Championships held in Malaysia

The 10th ITF / ATF East Asian 14 & Under Championships finished last week in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. Hosted by the Lawn Tennis Association of Malaysia (LTAM) at the National Tennis Centre in Kuala Lumpur, the two week event attracted participants from Brunei, Chinese Taipei, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Korea, Laos, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam, host country Malaysia and an ITF Team made up of players from India, Sri Lanka, Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan, and Syria. With some 71 players from 16 countries, this year's event was the largest to date.

The format of the event consisted of a 3 day training camp which was conducted by Suresh Menon, ITF Development Officer for Asia, followed by two consecutive tournaments using a feed in consolation system ensuring all players have to play a single match each day, leading to a final overall ranking. Points are awarded for each tournament and added together at the end of the event, to provide the final ranking. This points ranking determines who will qualify to be on the ITF/ATF Asian Team to Europe.

In the boys' event, the Sunu Trijati (Indonesia) and Kirati Siributong (Thailand) won the first and second tournament respectively. Anshuman Dutta from India and part of the ITF team was the

losing finalist in both tournaments. In the girls' event Kartiki Bhat also of India and part of the ITF Team defeated Nudida Luangnam of Thailand in both tournaments. Players qualifying for the ITF/ATF Asian Team for Europe will be announced next week.
