On court today...

- In the first of today's match-ups, Novak Djokovic contests his 48th Grand Slam semifinal against a man who is appearing at this stage of a major for just the 2nd time. Jannik Sinner fell to Djokovic in straight sets in his only previous appearance in a Grand Slam semifinal, at Wimbledon last year but since then the Italian has had the upper hand over his more-experienced opponent, winning 2 of the pair's 3 matches in the space of a fortnight in November last year. Sinner also remains the only man not to have dropped a set during his run to the semifinals here and will hope to continue the momentum from his win against Andrey Rublev on Tuesday, which was his first win against a Top 5 player at a Grand Slam on his 9th attempt. For Djokovic, victory today will send him through to a record-extending 11th Australian Open men's singles final and a 37th Grand Slam men's singles final. He is also bidding to record his 367th Grand Slam match-win today and equal Serena Williams in 2nd place on the all-time list for most Grand Slam match-wins, closing the gap on Roger Federer's all-time record of 369 victories at the majors.
- The night session semifinal sees Daniil Medvedev face Alexander Zverev for the 2nd place in this year's men's singles final. The duo know each other well, having met on 18 previous occasions at Tour-level however, this clash will be, remarkably, their first at a Grand Slam. Medvedev leads the overall head-to-head 11-7 and also won 5 of the 6 matches the pair contested last season. But Zverev will hope to continue the form that saw him defeat world No. 2 Carlos Alcaraz on Wednesday for his first victory against a Top 5 player at a Grand Slam. A win for Medvedev today would see him reach the final here for the 3rd time (and his 6th at a Grand Slam overall) and become the 13th player in the Open Era to reach the Australian Open men's singles final on 3 or more occasions. For Zverev, a win today would make him the 3rd German man to reach the singles final here, after Boris Becker in 1991 and 1996, and Rainer Schuettler in 2003.

A 7th meeting for Djokovic and Sinner and their 3rd at a Grand Slam. Djokovic has won both of their 2 previous meetings at the Grand Slams, both of which came at Wimbledon – in the quarterfinals in 2022, when Djokovic recovered from 0-2 down to win in 5 sets, and in the semifinals last year.

Sinner has won 2 of the pair's last 3 meetings – he defeated Djokovic for the first time in the group stage at the ATP Finals last year, before falling to him in the final. He then defeated Djokovic in the 2nd match of the Davis Cup semifinals between Italy and Serbia, saving 3 match points at 4-5 in the final set.

Djokovic is 14 years 86 days older than Sinner. This is the 4th-largest age gap between players in an Australian Open men's singles semifinal match in the Open Era and the joint-7th largest age gap between players in a Grand Slam men's singles semifinal match in the Open Era, alongside the pair's meeting in the semifinals at Wimbledon last year.

This is the 2nd match between a pair of Top 5 players at the Australian Open this year, after Sinner's victory over Andrey Rublev in the quarterfinals. Sinner's victory against No. 5 Rublev was his first victory against a Top 5 player at a Grand Slam on his 9th attempt.

Sinner has won 8 of his last 9 matches against Top 5 players at Tour-level, with his only defeat against a Top 5 player in that time coming against Djokovic in the final at the 2023 ATP Finals. He has a 12-20 win-loss record against Top 5 players at Tour-level overall.

Sinner has a 3-2 win-loss record against world No. 1s – in addition to his 3 matches against No. 1 Djokovic at the ATP Finals and Davis Cup Finals last year, he also fell to No. 1 Djokovic in the 2nd round at 2021 Monte Carlo-1000 but defeated No. 1 Carlos Alcaraz in the semifinals at 2023 Miami-1000.

Djokovic is bidding to extend a 17-match winning streak against Top 5 players at the Australian Open. He lost his first 2 matches against Top 5 players here – to No. 4 Marat Safin in the 1st round in 2005 and to No. 1 Roger Federer in the round of 16 in 2007 – but has won his last 17 matches against Top 5 players here since then. He has a 39-24 win-loss record against Top 5 players at the Grand Slams overall.

Djokovic is contesting his 200th Tour-level match against a Top 5 player. He has a 122-77 win-loss record against Top 5 players at Tour-level overall.

Djokovic has a 36-11 win-loss record in Grand Slam semifinals. Since the beginning of the 2015 season, he has won 22 of the 23 Grand Slam semifinals he has contested, with his only defeat in a Grand Slam semifinal in that time coming against Dominic Thiem at 2019 Roland Garros.

- Djokovic is contesting his **103rd Australian Open match today**. He is the 3rd player, man or woman, to contest 100 singles matches here after Federer (117 Australian Open matches) and Williams (105).
- Djokovic is bidding to record his **34th consecutive match-win at the Australian Open**. It is his longest streak of victories here and the longest streak of Australian Open men's singles match-wins in the Open Era. He has not lost an Australian Open match since falling to Chung Hyeon in the round of 16 in 2018, winning the title here in 2019-21 and last year. He did not compete here in 2022.

• Djokovic is bidding to **equal his own longest winning streak at a single Grand Slam event** – he also held a streak of 34 match-wins at Wimbledon, having not lost a match at Wimbledon between retiring against Tomas Berdych in the quarterfinals in 2017 and losing the final to Alcaraz last year. It would be the joint-5th longest men's singles winning streak at a single Grand Slam event in the Open Era.

The Australian Open is Djokovic's **most successful Grand Slam event** in terms of titles won and matches won. It is his joint-most successful Grand Slam event in terms of finals reached alongside the US Open.

- By reaching his 11th Australian Open semifinal, Djokovic has equalled Jack Crawford in 2nd place on the all-time list for most Australian Open men's singles semifinal appearances. Roger Federer, who made 15 appearances in the semifinals here, is the only man in history to have reached more Australian Open semifinals than Djokovic.
- By reaching his 48th Grand Slam semifinal, Djokovic has extended his all-time record for most Grand Slam men's singles semifinal appearances. He claimed sole ownership of the record, ahead of Federer, by reaching his 47th Grand Slam semifinal at the US Open last year.
- Djokovic is bidding to win his **11th Australian Open title** and extend his all-time record for most Australian Open men's singles titles. He claimed sole ownership of the record, ahead of Federer and Roy Emerson, by defeating Nadal in the final here in 2019 to win his 7th title before adding further titles here in 2020 (d. Dominic Thiem), 2021 (d. Daniil Medvedev) and 2023 (d. Stefanos Tsitsipas). He also won the title here in 2008 (d. Tsonga), 2011 (d. Andy Murray), 2012 (d. Nadal), 2013 (d. Murray), 2015 (d. Murray) and 2016 (d. Murray).
- Djokovic is bidding to become the **3rd player in history to win at least 11 titles at any Grand Slam event** after Nadal, who has won 14 titles at Roland Garros, and Margaret Court, who won 11 Australian Open women's singles titles. Martina Navratilova, who won 9 Wimbledon women's singles titles, is the only other player to have won at least 9 titles at one Grand Slam event.
- Djokovic is bidding to win his **25th Grand Slam title** and claim sole ownership of the record for most Grand Slam singles titles, ahead of Court. He would also extend his record for most Grand Slam men's singles titles, ahead of Nadal (22 Grand Slam titles) and Federer (20).
- Djokovic is bidding to become the **3rd man in the Open Era to win multiple Australian Open titles since turning 35** after Rosewall and Federer, both of whom won 2 titles here after their 35th birthdays.
- Djokovic is also bidding to win his **5th Grand Slam title since turning 35 and his 13th Grand Slam title since turning 30**, extending his Open Era records for both feats.
- Djokovic won 3 Grand Slam titles in 2023. In addition to his title here, he also won the titles at Roland Garros (d. Casper Ruud) and the US Open (d. Medvedev). He finished runner-up at Wimbledon (l. Carlos Alcaraz).
- Djokovic's other highlights in 2023 were winning the titles at Adelaide 1 (d. Sebastian Korda), Cincinnati-1000 (d. Alcaraz), Paris-1000 (d. Grigor Dimitrov) and the ATP Finals (d. Sinner). With a total of 7 titles, he led the Tour for most titles won in 2023.

- **Prior to the Australian Open**, Djokovic represented Serbia at the United Cup, where the team reached the quarterfinals before falling to Australia. He won singles matches against China, P.R.'s Zhang Zhizhen and Czechia's Jiri Lehecka but fell to Australia's Alex de Minaur. His defeat to De Minaur ended a 43-match winning streak in Australia, having previously not lost in Australia since falling to Chung in the round of 16 here in 2018.
- Djokovic is bidding to win his **99th Tour-level singles title**. Only Jimmy Connors (109 Tour-level titles) and Federer (103) have won more Tour-level singles titles in the Open Era than Djokovic.
- Djokovic holds the record for most weeks ranked at No. 1. He began his 409th week as world No. 1 on Monday. He returned to No. 1 after winning the US Open in September and has remained at No. 1 since then. He will remain at No. 1 on Monday 29 January regardless of his result in today's match.
- Djokovic has played **Davis Cup** for Serbia since 2004, and was a member of the team which defeated France in the 2010 final to win the nation's first Davis Cup title. He has a 40-8 win-loss record in Davis Cup singles matches and a 44-16 win-loss record in the competition overall. His 21-match Davis Cup singles winning streak ended during Serbia's semifinal defeat to Italy in November last year, when he fell to Sinner in 3 sets.
- Djokovic is coached by Goran Ivanisevic, who reached the quarterfinals here in 1989, 1994 and 1997.
- **SINNER** is bidding to reach his first Grand Slam final. This is his 5th Australian Open appearance and his 17th Grand Slam overall.
- Sinner is bidding to become the **first Italian player in history, man or woman, to reach an Australian Open singles final**. By reaching the semifinals here, he has become the 2nd Italian player to reach an Australian Open semifinal after Berrettini, who reached the semifinals here in 2022.
- Sinner is bidding to become the **5th Italian player in history to reach a Grand Slam men's singles final** and the 2nd active Italian player to do so, after Berrettini.

- Sinner is also bidding to become the **9th Italian player in history, man or woman, to reach a Grand Slam singles final** after Nicola Pietrangeli (4 Grand Slam final appearances), Francesca Schiavone (2), and Berrettini, Giorgio de Stefani, Sara Errani, Adriano Panatta, Flavia Pennetta and Roberta Vinci (all one).
- At 22 years 165 days, Sinner is bidding to become the youngest player to reach the Australian Open men's singles final since 2008, when Djokovic won the title here in 2008 aged 20 years 250 days. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- Sinner is bidding become the 8th active player to reach the Australian Open men's singles final. (NB Alexander Zverev is also bidding to reach the final here for the first time this year.) He would also become the 17th active player to reach a Grand Slam men's singles final.

- By reaching the semifinals here, Sinner has equalled his **best Grand Slam result**. He also reached the semifinals at Wimbledon last year (I. Djokovic).
- By reaching his 2nd Grand Slam semifinal, Sinner has become the **7th Italian player in history to reach the men's singles semifinals at the Grand Slams on multiple occasions** after Pietrangeli (5 Grand Slam semifinal appearances), Berrettini and Panatta (both 3), and Corrado Barazzutti, De Stefani, and Giuseppe Merlo (all 2).
- Last year here, Sinner reached the round of 16. He defeated Kyle Edmund, Tomas Martin Etcheverry and Marton Fucsovics before falling to Tsitsipas.
- Elsewhere at the Grand Slams in 2023, Sinner reached the round of 16 at the US Open, where he defeated Yannick Hanfmann, Lorenzo Sonego and Stan Wawrinka before falling to Alexander Zverev, but fell in the 2nd round at Roland Garros (d. Alexandre Muller, I. Daniel Altmaier).
- Sinner's best result in 2023 was winning his first Masters-1000 level title at Toronto-1000 (d. Alex de Minaur) in his 3rd Masters-1000 final. He also won the titles at Montpellier (d. A 19th meeting for Medvedev and Zverev – but their first at a Grand Slam. Zverev won 5 of the pair's first 6 matches but has won just 2 of their subsequent 12 matches. Medvedev won 5 of the 6 matches the pair contested in 2023.

Medvedev is facing a Top 10 player here for the 2nd straight round. He has a 5-3 win-loss record against Top 10 players at the Australian Open, including his victory against No. 9 Hubert Hurkacz in the quarterfinals here. He has a 9-8 win-loss record against Top 10 players at the Grand Slams and a 42-41 win-loss record against Top 10 players at Tour-level overall.

Zverev is facing a Top 5 player here for the 2nd straight round. He recorded his first Grand Slam match-win against a Top 5 player by defeating No. 2 Carlos Alcaraz in the quarterfinals here. He had previously lost all 10 of his matches against Top 5 players at the Grand Slams, including all 3 of his previous matches against Top 5 players at the Australian Open. He has a 25-38 win-loss record against Top 5 players at Tour-level overall.

Medvedev is contesting his 8th Grand Slam semifinal today, while this is Zverev's 7th Grand Slam semifinal appearance. They are in 5th and 6th place, respectively, on the list for most Grand Slam men's singles semifinal appearances among active players – behind Novak Djokovic (48 Grand Slam semifinal appearances), Rafael Nadal (38), Andy Murray (21) and Stan Wawrinka (9).

- By reaching his 3rd Australian Open semifinal, Medvedev has become the **6th active player to reach the Australian Open men's singles semifinals on 3 or more occasions** after Novak Djokovic (11 Australian Open semifinal appearances), Rafael Nadal (7), Andy Murray (6), Stefanos Tsitsipas (4) and Stan Wawrinka (3).
- By reaching his 8th Grand Slam semifinal, Medvedev has become the 5th active player to reach the men's singles semifinals at the Grand Slams on 8 or more occasions after Djokovic (48 Grand Slam semifinal appearances), Nadal (38), Murray (21) and Wawrinka (9).
- Last year here, Medvedev reached the 3rd round (I. Sebastian Korda). It was his earliest defeat at the Australian Open since 2018, when he fell to Chung Hyeon in the 2nd round.
- Medvedev is a 2-time Australian Open finalist. He reached back-to-back finals here in 2021, when he fell to Novak in straight sets, and 2022, when he fell to Nadal in 5 sets despite holding a 2-0 lead.
- Medvedev won his first Grand Slam title at the 2021 US Open, defeating Djokovic in straight sets. He has a 1-4 win-loss record in Grand Slam finals, having also finished runner-up at the US Open in 2019 (I. Nadal) and 2023 (I. Djokovic) in addition to his 2 runner-up finishes here.
- Elsewhere at the Grand Slams in 2023, Medvedev reached the semifinals at Wimbledon for the first time (I. Alcaraz) but fell in the 1st round at Roland Garros (I. Thiago Seyboth Wild).

- By reaching the semifinals here for the 2nd time, Zverev has become the 3rd German player in the Open Era to
 reach the men's singles semifinals at the Australian Open on multiple occasions after Tommy Haas (who
 made 3 Australian Open semifinals appearances) and Becker (2).
- By reaching the semifinals at the Grand Slams for the 7th time, Zverev has claimed sole ownership of 2nd place on the Open Era list for most Grand Slam men's singles semifinal appearances by a German player, ahead of Stich. - Elsewhere at the Grand Slams in 2023, Zverev reached the semifinals at Roland Garros (I. Casper Ruud), the quarterfinals at the US Open (I. Carlos Alcaraz) and the 3rd round at Wimbledon (I. Matteo Berrettini).
- Zverev's best results in 2023 were winning the titles at Hamburg (d. Laslo Djere) and Chengdu (d. Roman Safiullin).
 He also reached the semifinals at Dubai (l. Andrey Rublev), Geneva (l. Nicolas Jarry), Halle (l. Alexander Bublik),
 Cincinnati-1000 (l. Novak Djokovic) and Beijing (l. Medvedev).
- Prior to the Australian Open, Zverev was a member of the German team which won the United Cup. He won 4
 of the 5 singles matches he contested, defeating Italy's Lorenzo Sonego, France's Adrian Mannarino, Greece's
 Stefanos Tsitsipas and Poland's Hubert Hurkacz, but falling to Australia's Alex de Minaur.

- Zverev won Olympic singles gold for Germany at the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Tennis Event in 2021, defeating Russian Olympic Committee's Karen Khachanov in the final. It was Germany's 3rd Olympic gold medal in tennis after Steffi Graf in women's singles at Seoul 1988 and Becker/Stich in men's doubles at Barcelona 1992.
- Zverev is **the only former Australian Open boys' singles champion** through to the semifinals here from the 6 who started this year's men's main draw. He defeated Stefan Kozlov to win the boys' singles title here in 2014. He also finished runner-up at 2013 Junior Roland Garros (I. Cristian Garin) and was named 2013 ITF Junior World Champion. Stefan Edberg is the only player to have won both the boys' singles and men's singles titles here in the Open Era.
- Zverev has played **Davis Cup** for Germany since 2016 and has a 9-6 overall win-loss record in the competition. Germany play away against Hungary in the 2024 Davis Cup Qualifiers in February.
- Zverev is coached by his father, Alexander Zverev Sr.
