Defending champion upset in first round

The final Grand Slam of the year got underway in New York on Monday, with world No. 97 Ekaterina Bychkova providing the major upset. Bychkova knocked out defending champion Svetlana Kuznetsova, making her the first defending women's champion to lose in the first round in the history of the US Open.

Top seed Maria Sharapova blasted her way past Eleni Daniilidou to take her place in the second round. Sharapova heads up a tough top half of the draw that includes the in-form Kim Clijsters as well as both the Williams sisters. All three moved safely through the first round on Monday. In the bottom half of the draw No. 2 seed Lindsay Davenport has Amelie Mauresmo and Justine Henin-Hardenne to contend with.

Defending champion Roger Federer begins his US Open campaign when he faces Ivo Minar in his first round match today. Federer is attempting to become the first man to defend his US Open title since Patrick Rafter in 1998. With 2000 champion Marat Safin out with a knee injury, 2001 champion Lleyton Hewitt is one of the few threats to Federer in the top half of the draw.

In the other half of the draw No. 2 seed Rafael Nadal made a confident start, defeating Bobby Reynolds in straight sets yesterday. The Spaniard will need to overcome two-time champion Andre Agassi and 2003 winner Andy Roddick if he is to reach his first US Open final.

Both Roddick and Clijsters will compete for double prize money at the 2005 US Open with the potential to win a record \$2.2 million after they won the US Open Series Bonus Challenge. Agassi and Nadal secured second and third spots for the men; Mary Pierce and Mauresmo were second and third for the women. Agassi and Pierce will play for 50% more prize money and Nadal and Mauresmo for 25% more.

WADA appoints head of Latin American office

The World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) has announced the appointment of Diego Torres Villegas as Director of WADA's Latin American Regional Office.

Torres joins WADA after serving a number of years with the Colombian Institute of Sports (Coldeportes) as manager of its International Affairs office. Torres is fluent in several languages including Spanish and English. He will be responsible for WADA's Latin American office, to be located in Montevideo, Uruguay.

The ITF is a Signatory to the World Anti-Doping Code. The Tennis Anti-Doping Programme is a comprehensive and internationally recognised drug-testing programme that applies to all players competing at tournaments sanctioned by the ITF, ATP and WTA Tour. Players are tested for substances prohibited by WADA.





Countdown begins for London 2012 Paralympics

Yesterday (Monday 29 August) marked exactly seven years to the Opening Ceremony of the London 2012 Paralympic Games.

Wheelchair tennis is one of 11 events to be held within the main Olympic Park in Stratford, in what will be an athlete-centred Paralympic Games. Athletics, swimming, table tennis, wheelchair rugby, goalball, wheelchair fencing, archery, 7-a-side and 5-a-side football and cycling (track) make up the other 10. In addition to this, powerlifting, judo, wheelchair basketball, boccia, sitting volleyball will all take place at the nearby ExCeL Centre, equestrian events at Greenwich Park and shooting at the Royal Artillery Barracks.

Sebastian Coe, Chairman of the London Organising Committee for the Olympic Games (LOCOG), said, "29 August 2012 will be a great day in the history of sport for people with a disability in the UK. We won our bid as one bid for both the Olympic Games and Paralympic Games. Our vision for the London 2012 Paralympic Games is to set new standards for services, facilities and opportunities for people with a disability. I have no doubt that our Games will be the first to be fully integrated and that London will host the best ever Paralympic Games in 2012."

ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti commented, "The ITF looks forward to an outstanding Paralympics in London and a strong working relationship with LOCOG."

Albot, Kalashnikova and Jovanovski dominate in Germany

Radu Albot (MLD), Oksana Kalashnikova (GEO) and Bojana Jovanovski (SCG) were the most successful players on the ITF/Tennis Europe 14 & under and 16 & under B team tour of Germany. The tour featured three tournaments in Ulm, Eching Bei Munchen and Renningen/Rutesheim.

Albot picked up two singles titles in the boys 16 & under events in Ulm and Renningen/Rutesheim and teamed with Achim Ceban (MLD) to claim the doubles titles at all three events.

In the girls' 16 & under category, Kalashnikova won the event in Renningen/Rutesheim defeating the No. 1 seed, Elena Chernyakova (RUS) 46 64 76. Kalashnikova then joined forces with Hana Malakovich (BLR) to clinch the doubles title in three sets, 63 16 75 over Anna Maskaljun (EST) and Chernyakova.

In the girls' 14 & under category, Jovanovski defeated Hanna Orlik (BEL) 62 62 at the event in Ulm to take the girls' singles title and also made it to the doubles final with Ema Burgic (BIH).

In the boys' 14 & under category Stanislav Poplavsky (UKR) reached the semifinals in Renninger/Rutesheim where he lost to Marko Lenz (GER) 16 36.

Ales Filipcic, the ITF/Tennis Europe Team coach commented, "The standard of play from the team members was, as far as tennis is concerned, on the same level as the A Team. This tour has enabled the players and coaches to receive new ideas and knowledge which will be an invaluable tool in helping to improve their tennis game."

West Pacific continue domination of POJC

The team from the West Pacific continued its domination of this year's ITF Pacific Oceania Junior Championships (POJC) as its 16-player team clinched the regional title for the fifth consecutive year. The annual event which plays host to the best 18 & under and 14 & under players from throughout the Pacific region was held at the Dr Robin Mitchell Regional Training Centre in Lautoka, Fiji from 16 – 20 August 2005.

Last year's runner-up, Michelle Pang from Guam dominated the girls' 18 & under event to win the girls' singles title, defeating Tavu Fa from Fiji 61 62 in the final. In the boys' event Johnson Taliki from the Solomon Islands surprised Chris Toli of American Samoa to take the boys' singles title in a tough three-set match 63 26 75. Yohan Citre from New Caledonia also had an untroubled run in the 14 & under boys' event to clinch the title without dropping a set, defeating Ji Hoon Heo from the Northern Mariana Islands 62 62. In the girls' 14 & under event, 13-year old Abigail Tere-Apisah (PNG) needed three sets against Doriana Brehe of New Caledonia to win the 14's title 61 26 63 for the second consecutive year.

Based on their individual finish in the POJC, the final points of each of the 16 regional team members were added together to find the winning region and the West Pacific Team underlined its dominance by making it five POJC wins in a row. After losing their second place position to the team from the North in last year's event, the East Pacific team were determined to redress the balance and claimed second place behind the West Pacific team to leave North Pacific in third place overall.

Air Pacific Oceania Closed Junior Tennis Champs

Just one day after the close of play in the 2005 POJC, the top eight boys and girls in the 18 & under category turned their attention to the Air Pacific Oceania Closed Junior Tennis Championships which were also held at the Regional Training Centre from 21 – 25 August. The tournament allows the top Pacific juniors to compete against Oceania powerhouses from New Zealand and Australia.

Brydan Klein (AUS) completed his domination of the boys' singles event when he beat fellow Australian Greg Jones 62 61 in the final.

The girls' singles final between New Zealanders Sacha Jones and Ellen Barry turned into another marathon affair after Barry's three-hour semifinal the day before. Jones fought back from one set down to claim her third ITF World Junior Circuit title in a row, 46 62 63.

The boys' doubles final was another long three-set match that ended in victory for surprise finalists Jason Lee (AUS)/James Pilbro (NZL) over Brydan Klein (AUS)/Joel Lindner (AUS) 67(o) 76(5) 62.

The girls' doubles final was a walkover after Michelle Brycki (AUS) suffered an injury at the end of the semifinal forcing Brycki and her partner Kairangi Vano (NZL) to default and give Tyra Calderwood/Jessica Moore (AUS) the girls' doubles title.
