Russia defends Fed Cup title

Russia has retained the Fed Cup by BNP Paribas after a dramatic 3-2 victory over France in front of a capacity 15,000 crowd at Roland Garros. Elena Dementieva was the heroine, winning all three rubbers she contested, as Russia won a deciding doubles against France in the final for the second successive year.

Honours were even after the opening day, with Dementieva seeing off Mary Pierce 76(1) 26 61, and Amelie Mauresmo overcoming Anastasia Myskina 64 62. Dementieva then defeated her opposite number one Mauresmo 64 46 62, before Pierce brought France level with a 46 64 62 win over Myskina. In a fluctuating doubles rubber, which finished under darkening skies at 19:55, Dementieva and Dinara Safina sealed Russia's victory with a 64 16 63 victory over Mauresmo and Pierce.

Dementieva, who missed last year's final triumph through injury, was delighted with the victory after twice being runner-up for Russia in 1999 and 2001. She said: "It's my third Fed Cup final but the first time I have won, so I am really happy. I am not the heroine, the team won, not any individual."

Although the French were disappointed to have lost such a close final, they took some consolation in playing their part in a memorable contest. Pierce said: "I am proud of my performance this weekend. We played some high-level tennis. The public were great. It's just a pity that we didn't win."

ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti was delighted with the weekend's success. He said: "It was an outstanding final, a great start to our partnership with BNP Paribas, and confirms our belief in the new format."

This year has seen the return to the home-and-away format that has been intrinsic to the success and immense popularity of Davis Cup. The top eight teams contested the World Group over three weekends in a bid to become Fed Cup champion. Juan Margets, ITF Executive Vice President and Executive Director, Fed Cup said: "The ITF has worked hard over the last two years to reposition Fed Cup in its role as the largest annual international women's team competition in sport."

The International Tennis Hall of Fame and the ITF announced that Francoise Durr is the recipient of the 2005 Fed Cup Award of Excellence. Durr was presented with the award on Sunday during the Fed Cup Final by ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti and Christian Bimes, President of the French Tennis Federation.

Russia has become only the third nation to top the ITF Fed Cup Nations Ranking, overtaking France following its victory in the Final. The Fed Cup Nations Ranking is published following every Fed Cup round. For further information, visit www.fedcup.com.

Split and Bratislava stage Davis Cup semifinals

Croatia and Slovak Republic will look to make the most of home advantage when the semifinals of the 2005 Davis Cup by BNP Paribas get underway this Friday. A total of two World Group semifinals, eight World Group play-off ties and eight Zonal ties will be held on 23-25 September, with full coverage on the official Davis Cup website www.daviscup.com.

Croatia, who defeated USA and Romania to reach the last four for the first time, are once again led by Ivan Ljubicic and Mario Ancic for their tie against Russia on indoor carpet in Split. They are backed up by the big-serving Ivo Karlovic. Russia are missing their No. 1 player Marat Safin through injury, but still boast a strong line-up of Nikolay Davydenko, Mikhail Youzhny, Igor Andreev and Dmitry Tursunov.

Slovak Republic, whose victories over Spain and Netherlands saw them reach their first ever semifinal, enjoy home advantage for the third time in 2005 against Argentina on an indoor hard court in Bratislava. Karol Beck and Dominik Hrbaty are expected to contest the singles rubbers, with Michal Mertinak in contention for doubles. Argentina are at full strength, with all four players, Guillermo Coria, David

Nalbandian, Mariano Puerta and Gaston Gaudio all ranked in the world's top 11.

The Final of the 2005 Davis Cup by BNP Paribas will be held on 2-4 December. Russia would be at home in the final against either Slovak Republic or Argentina. Croatia would be at home to Argentina, while Slovak Republic would be at home to Croatia.

This weekend also sees 16 nations contest the World Group Play-offs in a bid to achieve World Group status in 2006. World No. 1 Roger Federer leads the Swiss team against Great Britain in Geneva, while Roland Garros champion Rafael Nadal heads the Spanish team for their away tie against Italy in Torre del Greco. Austria are at home to Ecuador in Portschach, Canada take on Belarus in Toronto, Chile host Pakistan in Santiago, Czech Republic face Germany in Liberec, India are at home to Sweden in New Delhi, and Belgium host USA in Leuven.

Nominations for all ties can be found on daviscup.com, where you can also view up-to-date results for all ties, as well as live scoring, news and photographs from World Group semifinal and play-off ties. 'Davis Cup Radio' will provide regular audio updates on the semifinals, while there is also free access to www.daviscup.tv, which offers comprehensive video highlights from the weekend's ties.

Davis Cup will be broadcast on television in all four semifinal nations, and 13 of the 16 countries contesting the World Group Play-offs. Fourteen broadcasters will show the Croatia v Russia semifinal, and seven broadcasters the Slovak Republic v Argentina semifinal. Fourteen broadcasters will show the ITF's highlights programme.

The draws for all of this weekend's ties will take place on **Thursday 22 September**.

Safin qualifies for Tennis Masters Cup

Australian Open champion Marat Safin has qualified for the Tennis Masters Cup Shanghai, joining world No. 1 Roger Federer and Roland Garros winner Rafael Nadal in the elite eight-man, eight-team circuit finale. It will be Safin's fourth appearance in five years at the Tennis Masters Cup, which will be held at the spectacular new Qi Zhong Stadium in Shanghai on 13-20 November.

With Federer and Nadal already assured of their places in Shanghai due to their point totals, the 25-year-old Russian qualified by virtue of his status as the only other 2005 Grand Slam winner. The top seven players in the INDESIT ATP Race 2005 on 6 November will qualify, with one spot reserved for a Grand Slam champion finishing within the Top 20. Currently in eighth position with 346 points, Safin is guaranteed not to slip outside the Top 20.

"I am looking forward to going back to Shanghai for the Tennis Masters Cup," Safin said. "I played there in 2002 but was not so successful, so I want to do better this year. I know they have built a brand new stadium, which is very modern and impressive." For further information, visit www.masters-cup.com.



US Open shatters tournaments records

The USA today announced that the 2005 US Open set several records in attendance and website traffic and generated significant television ratings growth over last year.

An all-time attendance record was set at 659,538 fans, breaking the previous record set in 2001 by over 20,000 fans. The US Open remains the highest attended annual event in sports. The daily total attendance record was set at 58,589 on Saturday 3 September, and again the following day with 58,817 on Sunday 4 September.

The national overnight rating for the Men's Final on CBS Sports was 6.2, doubling the 2004 rating. Viewership of Super Saturday (both men's semifinals and the women's final) on CBS Sports increased by 56% versus 2004. Total ratings of the US Open on CBS Sports were up 18%, while total viewership on USA Network was up 8%.

Traffic on USOpen.org, the official tournament website set an all-time record of 27.0 million visitors versus 15.4 million last year, up 75%. For further information, visit www.usopen.org.



Roland Garros announces extra day in 2006

French Tennis Federation president Christian Bimes confirmed that next year's Roland Garros championships will start on a Sunday for the first time in the tournament's history, running from Sunday 28 May to Sunday 11 June 2006.

Speaking after last weekend's Fed Cup final between France and Russia at Roland Garros, Bimes said: "This project has long been discussed with the ATP, WTA as well as within the Grand Slam Committee. The tournament will last 15 days from 2006, which is great news for the worldwide promotion of tennis."

Bimes also confirmed that for the first time the winner of the men's and women's singles championships will receive equal prize money.

WTA Tour appointments

Sony Ericsson WTA Tour Chairman and CEO Larry Scott announced the appointment of Stacey Allaster as President of the Tour and the promotion of David Shoemaker to Chief Operating Officer and General Counsel.

Allaster, a 15-year veteran of Tennis Canada, and member of the Board and Tournament Council on the Sony Ericsson WTA Tour, will oversee the areas of marketing and PR, tournament and player relations, and television, in addition to playing a key role in Tour sales efforts.

David Shoemaker, currently the Tour's Chief Legal Officer, will oversee the areas of legal affairs, finance, information technology and administration, in addition to business and operational areas.

Hall of Fame Chairman

The International Tennis Hall of Fame announced the election of Christopher E. Clouser as the new Chairman of the Hall of Fame's Executive Committee. Clouser succeeds Sir James Harvie-Watt, who served as the committee's chairman for the past four years.

Clouser is currently Chairman of ATP Properties, the global marketing arm of the ATP Tour, and Chairman of the ATP Foundation, and will continue in his roles for the ATP until the end of his term (31 December 2005).

"The International Tennis Hall of Fame and Museum is a fabulous organisation and facility with outstanding leadership, staff and volunteer support," said Clouser. "I am honoured to be selected and to continue my involvement in tennis with the Hall of Fame."

Obituary - Jeremy Shales

The ITF was sad to learn of the death of Jeremy Shales on 8 September 2005 after a short illness. Shales was one of the first two professional Chair Umpires hired by the Men's Tennis Council and went on to umpire at 45 Wimbledon Championships. He also umpired the Davis Cup Final in 1988 and officiated at many ties all over the world.

Mike Morrissey, ITF Administrator of Officiating, said: "Jeremy had an outstanding record of achievement as a tennis official. The fact that he officiated at such a high level for so many years shows the level of respect he had received from players and fellow officials."

North American Touring Team

Ryan Sweeting was the star of the six-player ITF International Junior Touring Team that finished its four-week tour of North America on Saturday. The 18-year-old from the Bahamas captured his first Grand Slam title at the US Open unseeded, defeating Wimbledon junior champion Jeremy Chardy 64 64 in the final.

Two other members, Andrew Miele (BRA) and Amina Rakhim (KAZ) reached the final at last week's Grade 1 event in Lexington, Kentucky.
