14th Worldwide Coaches Workshop

Two hundred and ninety coaches from 90 nations attended the 14th ITF Worldwide Coaches Workshop, entitled 'Quality Coaching for the Future', which ended on Saturday 22 October. The workshop was hosted by the Turkish Tennis Federation in the Club Ali Bey Hotel, Antalya, and featured over 60 presentations from a series of renowned international speakers.

Keynote speaker Arantxa Sanchez-Vicario gave an on-court presentation about the process and drills required to bring female players to the top level. She was also involved in a round-table panel discussion with speakers that included Steven Martens (Belgium's current Davis Cup and former Fed Cup Captain), Kathleen

Stroia (Vice-President of the WTA Sport Sciences & Medicine and Professional Department) and Georges Goven (France's Fed Cup Captain), which was one of the most successful sessions during the five-day workshop.

Sixty per cent of the presentations took place on court, which supplied participants with valuable practical information. Steven Martens and Kenneth Bastiaens (BEL), both presenting for the first time at a Worldwide Coaches Workshop, hosted two excellent sessions, as did Bruce Elliott and Machar Reid (AUS), who have both presented at previous workshops. Lecture room presenters included Jofre Porta, current coach of Carlos Moya, with whom he has been working with since the age of six; and Ann Quinn, former National Director of Coach Education for Tennis Australia.

In a successful new format, workshop sessions were held simultaneously with three 20-minute presentations in each of three rooms. These sessions gave participants the opportunity to choose both topics and speakers. In addition 'Free Communication' sessions allowed participants to choose theme specific rooms to listen to speakers presenting findings from their own research projects.

USA dominates Super-Seniors team championships

The USA dominated the 2005 ITF Super-Seniors World Team Championships which ended in Antalya, Turkey on Saturday. The Americans won five of the nine cups played, with France, Canada, Australia and Austria also returning home with silverware after a week of high quality tennis played in the friendly yet competitive spirit that characterises seniors tennis.

The USA were top seeds in seven of the nine events, and with several world No. 1s and past world champions in their squad, were heavily favoured to be the big winners in Turkey. They went on to capture the Von Cramm Cup (men's 60+), Jack Crawford Cup (men's 70+), Gardner Mulloy Cup (men's 80+), Althea Gibson Cup (women's 70+) and Queens' Cup (women's 75+), and also picked up silver medals in the Britannia Cup (men's 65+) and Bitsy Grant Cup (men's 75+). The Americans have an almost unbreakable hold on the oldest age categories, having won the Gardner Mulloy Cup nine times in the competition's ten-year history, and the Queens' Cup all four years that it has been in existence.

The Britannia Cup was won for the second time by Austria, the No. 2 seeds, with the USA taking second place and France picking up the bronze medal. France also took the silver medal in the Kitty Godfree Cup (women's 65+), losing to Australia, who were happy to gain revenge on the team who beat them in the same final last year. The French did not go home empty handed, after defeating Germany to clinch the Alice Marble Cup (women's 60+) in the most dramatic final of the week.

The Germans took the first singles rubber when Renate Schroeder defeated Sylvie Galfard-Kirsten. In the next singles rubber, world No. 1 Heide Orth (GER) had match point against Gail Lovera (FRA), a point which would have given the tie to the Germans. However, Lovera fought back and eventually emerged triumphant after an epic battle, 67 76 75. The French team of Lovera and Michele Bichon then won a three-set doubles against Brigitte Hoffmann and Alena Klein to give France a dramatic victory.

The Bitsy Grant Cup went for the very first time to the top seeded Canadian team, who defeated the USA 2-1 in a tight tie which went right down to the third set of the deciding doubles rubber.

Most of the players will be staying on in Antalya this week for the World Individual Championships, which start today. Several players will be defending their titles from Philadelphia last year, including King and Yvonne Van Nostrand, and Louise Russ, who all helped their teams to victory this week. They will be aiming to make it a double victory next Saturday. Others to watch this week include Heide Orth, world No. 1 in the women's 60+ and world champion for the last three years, and Peter Pokorny, who has been world champion for two of the last three years. Magdalena Maleeva retires

Magdalena Maleeva has announced her retirement, bringing to an end a 15-year career that brought her ten singles titles, five doubles titles and a career-high ranking of No. 4. Maleeva, 30, is the youngest of Bulgaria's famous Maleeva sisters, Manuela and Katerina having already retired. The family made history by becoming the first sisters trio to compete in the main draw of a Grand Slam tournament (1990 Roland Garros) and the first to all reach the round of 16 of a major (1993 Roland Garros and the 1993 US Open). In 2005, Maleeva has been playing captain of the Bulgarian Fed Cup team, with an overall 24-17 Fed Cup playing record.



Schedule announced for Hyundai Hopman Cup

China and Netherlands will open the XVIII Hyundai Hopman Cup on 30 December 2005 when the nations play off for a place in Group B. Following last week's announcement of the nations in contention in the ITF's Official Mixed Team Competition, Sweden has been announced as a replacement for Belarus in the field. Viktoria Azarenka and Max Mirnyi will no longer take part, but will be replaced by Thomas Johansson and Sofia Arvidsson. Johansson, the 2002 Australian Open champion, ensures that there will be four Grand Slam singles titlists in action in Perth. Sweden moves into Belarus's position in the draw.

Hewitt ensures Shanghai return

Lleyton Hewitt, currently in fourth place in the INDESIT ATP 2005 Race, has secured a spot in Tennis Masters Cup Shanghai, the \$4.45 million circuit finale. He qualifies because there are no longer enough ATP tournament points available for four other players to pass him.

Two-time champion Hewitt will be making his fifth appearance in Tennis Masters Cup, and owns a 13-5 record in the event. In 2001, Hewitt claimed the title on home soil in Sydney with a win over Sebastien Grosjean in the final. One year later, he defended that title in Shanghai and finished as the year-end No. 1 for the second consecutive season. Last year at the 2004 Tennis Masters Cup, Hewitt reached the final where he lost to Federer.

In the doubles event, Mark Knowles and Daniel Nestor, and Stephen Huss and Wesley Moodie have both earned qualification, joining Bob and Mike Bryan, Jonas Bjorkman and Max Mirnyi, and Wayne Black and Kevin Ullyett.

Huss and Moodie secured their place in the eight-team field by virtue of being the only other Grand Slam winning team not already qualified. At Wimbledon, the Australian-South African duo became the first qualifiers to win the men's doubles title in the history of the Championships. It will be their first appearance at the Tennis Masters Cup.

The 2005 Tennis Masters Cup takes place at the Qi Zhong Stadium in Shanghai on 13-20 November 2005. For more information visit www.masters-cup.com.

WADA welcomes adoption of UNESCO Convention

The World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) last week welcomed the unanimous adoption of the first International Convention against Doping in Sport by the General Conference of UNESCO in Paris.

Previously, many governments could not be legally bound by a non-governmental document such as the World Anti-Doping Code. In accordance with the Code, governments have now drafted an International Convention under the auspices of UNESCO, the United Nations body responsible for education, science and culture.

“The adoption of the Convention by UNESCO is a strong signal of the commitment of the governments of the world to the fight against doping in sport,” said David Howman, WADA’s Director General. “The drafting of this Convention in just two years was a world record for international treaties. We warmly commend and thank UNESCO for facilitating the process, and we look forward to the treaty coming into force and the ratification by each government before the opening day of the 2006 Winter Olympic Games in Turin.”

The International Convention against Doping in Sport is now available for UNESCO member states to ratify. More than 570 sports organizations have already adopted the WADA Code.
