Field is set for Tennis Masters Cup

The elite eight-man field for the Tennis Masters Cup, the culminating event of the 2005 men's circuit, is now set. Action gets underway next Sunday 13 November at the futuristic new Qi Zhong Stadium, Shanghai.

At the start of the BNP Paribas Masters Event in Paris-Bercy last week, several players were still in with a chance of booking their places in Shanghai, to join Roger Federer, Rafael Nadal, Andy Roddick, Lleyton Hewitt and Andre Agassi. The three men who secured places in the Top Eight of the Indesit ATP Race, and therefore their spots at the Tennis Masters Cup after Australian Open champion Marat Safin withdrew due to injury, were Guillermo Coria, Nikolay Davydenko and Ivan Ljubicic, who was runner-up in Bercy to Tomas Berdych.

Ljubicic, who will be in action for his country at the Davis Cup by BNP Paribas Final in Bratislava on December 2-4, has found a rich vein of form in recent weeks, reaching the finals in four of his last five ATP events, and winning the titles in Metz and Vienna. Ljubicic has won 20 of his last 23 matches, and is the first Croat to qualify for the Tennis Masters Cup since Goran Ivanisevic in 2001.

"It's an absolute dream come true. This is what I have been aiming for the whole way," said Ljubicic. "After winning a Grand Slam, I think this is the biggest achievement as you have to play well for the whole year to reach this goal."

Roger Federer is going for his third title in a row at the \$4.45 million event, having recovered from an ankle injury in time to defend his crown.

For the third year running, the Tennis Masters Cup doubles event will be played alongside the singles. The top seven teams in the ATP Doubles Team Race have qualified, with Wayne Arthurs/Paul Hanley claiming the last available place in Paris last week. The eighth spot goes to Wimbledon doubles champions Stephen Huss and Wesley Moodie, with Bob and Mike Bryan, Jonas Bjorkman/Max Mirnyi, Wayne Black/Kevin Ullyett, Mark Knowles/Daniel Nestor, Leander Paes/Nenad Zimonjic, and Michael Llodra/Fabrice Santoro the other teams who will be competing.

The draw for singles and doubles will take place on Wednesday 9 November, with the welcome ceremony, player press conferences and media round tables scheduled for Saturday 12 November. Both singles and doubles competitions are round robin events consisting of two groups of four, with group winners facing the runners-up from the other group in the semifinals. Play begins at 1pm on Sunday, with two singles round robin matches, followed by two doubles round robin matches. From Monday through Friday, there will be two doubles round robin matches starting at 2pm, with two singles round robin matches not before 7pm. The doubles semifinals begin on Saturday 19 November at 2pm, with the singles semifinals not before 7pm. The doubles final will be held on Sunday 20 November at 1pm, with the singles final not before 4pm.

Tennis Anti-doping Programme launches off-season initiative

The ITF has launched a whereabouts initiative requiring certain athletes to provide daily whereabouts information in order to permit effective no-notice out-of-competition testing during the off-season.

The 'Whereabouts Pool' has been designated as the top 30 men and women by ranking as of 12 September, the ranking achieved after the US Open; and the top five men, women and quads on the wheelchair tennis tour by ranking of 10 October, the ranking achieved after the Wheelchair US Open.

The designated players will be required to state where they will be for at least one hour during each day between 21 November and 31 December. This will make the out-of-competition testing much more effective as Doping Control Officers should be able to accurately locate players for no-notice testing, providing an enhanced deterrent to doping. A repeated failure to file information or to be available for testing at the location(s) and times(s) submitted may result in a sanction of a ban between three and 12 months for a first offence and up to two years for second and subsequent offences.

While it is only players in the "Whereabouts Pool" that have to file whereabouts information, all players playing on the ATP or WTA Tour or on the ITF Circuit remain subject at all times to testing under the ITF Tennis Anti-Doping Programme, both in and out of competition.

In other anti-doping news, the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) is holding an international symposium on gene-doping at Karolinska Institutet in Stockholm, Sweden, on 4-5 December 2005. African Nations Cup now underway in Tunisia

The Tunisian Tennis Federation is currently hosting the 6th African Nations Cup, under the authority of the Confederation of African Tennis. Eleven nations are competing at the Tunisian National Tennis Center, with 40 players (26 men and 14 women) contesting men's singles/doubles, women's singles/doubles and team events.

Top African players such as Selima Sfar (TUN), Samia Meedjahdi (ALG), Bahia Mouhtassine (MAR), Marine Giraud (MRI), and Liza Duplessis (RSA) on the women's side and Lamine Ouahab (ALG), Malek Jaziri (TUN), Mounir El Aarej (MAR), Karim Maamoun (EGY), Mehdi Tahiri (MAR) and Valentin Sanon (CIV) on the men's are amongst those in action.

Mr Tarak Cherif, President of the Confederation of African Tennis, opened the event on Sunday 6 November. As well as the \$25,000 prize money on offer, the men's singles winner will receive a wild card to the main draw of the 2006 Hassan II Trophy ATP event in Morocco.

Camozzi Doubles Masters to be held this week in Italy

The 2005 Camozzi Doubles Masters, the richest and most prestigious wheelchair doubles event of the year, takes place this week in Cividino, Italy.

Martin Legner (AUT) and Satoshi Saida (JPN) bid for a third straight men's crown, but could face their strongest ever examination from the pairing they have beaten in the last two finals, Michael Jeremiasz (FRA) and Jayant Mistry (GBR).



All four players have again enjoyed successful doubles campaigns in 2005, often with other partners, while Mistry and Jeremiasz finalised their preparations with victory in the men's doubles at the Nottingham Indoor Tournament on Sunday.

The eight-strong men's field features two strong Dutch partnerships, including 2003 semifinalists Robin Ammerlaan and Eric Stuurman, while last year's semifinalists Maikel Scheffers (NED) and Ronald Vink (NED), and Peter Wikstrom (SWE) and Tadeusz Kruszelnicki (POL) also return.

In the women's doubles, two partnerships stand out - Jiske Griffioen and Esther Vergeer (NED) and Florence Gravellier (FRA) and Maaïke Smit (NED), with Gravellier the only one of the four not to have yet won a Doubles Masters title. These two partnerships will be favourites to reach the final, as between them they have won all four Super Series doubles crowns this year.

Reigning Quad Doubles Paralympic champions David Wagner and Nick Taylor (USA) will be favourites to add the Masters title to their list of achievements. Wagner and Taylor's strongest opposition is likely to come from home favourites and last year's runners-up Giuseppe Polidori and Antonio Raffaele.
