Top tv viewing figures for September ties

14 November 2005 Issue 46

The Davis Cup and Fed Cup ties played in September recorded excellent TV ratings around the world, with the doubles matches leading the way.

France Television, host broadcaster of the France v Russia Fed Cup Final played on Roland Garros' Philippe Chatrier court, averaged a 20% market share throughout the weekend (16-17 September). The deciding doubles match on the Sunday averaged over 27% of the market share and peaked with over 6 million viewers. Sport+ complimented the domestic coverage raising the total coverage in France to over 35 hours.

In Russia, RTR and NTV+ shared coverage of the Final, dedicating over 30 hours of live and replayed transmissions. The Final was broadcast in an impressive 68 countries including Spain, Belgium, United Kingdom, USA, Brazil, China, India, Thailand, Singapore and Japan.

Tennis Masters Cup underway in Shanghai

Day two of the Tennis Masters Cup, the culminating event of the 2005 men's circuit, was completed today, with Gaston Gaudio overcoming late replacement Mariano Puerta 63 75, and Nikolay Davydenko defeating Andre Agassi 64 62. Puerta was a replacement for Rafael Nadal, who withdrew from the Shanghai event earlier in the day with a foot injury. Following his defeat, Agassi also pulled out of the event with an ankle injury.

In Sunday's round robin matches Roger Federer eventually overcame David Nalbandian 63 26 64, before Ivan Ljubicic beat Guillermo Coria 62 63.

Today's doubles results saw Wayne Black and Kevin Ullyett win against Michael Llodra and Fabrice Santoro 36 63 64 followed by Stephen Huss and Wesley Moodie's 62 64 defeat of Jonas Bjorkman and Max Mirnyi. In the doubles action on Sunday, Wayne Arthurs and Paul Hanley got off to a good start when they beat the Bryan twins, Mike and Bob, 75 67 76. There was a further upset as Leander Paes and Nenad Zimonjic defeated arguably the form team coming into the event, Mark Knowles and Daniel Nestor, 75 57 63.

Davis Cup and Fed Cup TV viewing figures (cont. from page 1)

The Davis Cup by BNP Paribas World Group Semifinals (23-25 September) also registered exceptional TV figures. HRT, the host broadcaster of the semifinal between Croatia and Russia, maintained the impressive figures it had for previous rounds with over 40% of the market share during Saturday's exciting doubles' match, which went to five sets. RTR and NTV shared coverage of the tie in Russia, broadcasting over 40 hours of live, delayed and replayed coverage. The tie was shown in 38 countries including Spain, United Kingdom, USA, Australia, China, India and Singapore.

Slovak TV, host broadcaster of the other semifinal between Slovak Republic and Argentina, recorded over 20% of the market share during the three days of competition. TYC Sports showed the tie on a Pan Latin-American platform, bringing the total reach for this tie to 29 countries.

The Davis Cup World Group Play-offs, played the same weekend of the semifinals, also registered outstanding figures. SRG-SSR recorded a remarkable 34% market share during the doubles match of the Switzerland v Great Britain tie, while the BBC averaged over 15% for the same match. Strong results were also apparent for TVN Chile, with an average of over 36% market share during the doubles match of the Chile v Pakistan tie. Austria's ORF recorded 19% during Sunday's deciding rubber against Ecuador, and Belgium's RTBF held a 16% share during the doubles match.

In the Zonal qualifying events, Uruguay's Canal 4 registered an amazing 60% market share during Sunday's deciding match against Brazil.



Jeremiasz takes doubles title and looks ahead to the singles



Michael Jeremiasz (FRA) and Jayant Mistry (GBR) beat defending champions Martin Legner (AUT) and Satoshi Saida (JPN) 61 62 in Sunday's men's final at the Camozzi Doubles Masters, the most prestigious and lucrative wheelchair doubles event of the year, in Cividino, Italy.

Both partnerships dropped just one set in their three round robin matches earlier in the week en route to contesting the final for the third successive year. Unlike the previous two years, it was second seeds Jeremiasz and Mistry who had the upper hand to take the lion's share of the event's \$40,000 total prize money pool.

Dutch second seeds Jiske Griffioen and Esther Vergeer beat top seeds Florence Gravelier (FRA) and Maaïke Smit (NED) by the same 61 62 score in Saturday's women's final to finish the week without dropping a set.

The Quad Final produced the week's closest match as American top seeds David Wagner and Nick Taylor overcame a determined challenge from home favourites Giuseppe Polidori and Antonio Raffaele 63 67(5) 75.

Jeremiasz now bids to end a magnificent 2005 on another winning note as he heads eight of the world's top men at this week's NEC Singles Masters, the most coveted annual title on the NEC Wheelchair Tennis Tour, in Amersfoort, Netherlands.

Already guaranteed finishing the year as world No. 1, Jeremiasz bids for his first NEC Masters title after finishing runner-up to two-time champion David Hall (AUS) last year. With Hall a late withdrawal this year with a shoulder injury, Jeremiasz will still face two former champions, Robin Ammerlaan (NED) and Stephen Welch (USA).

Gravelier is the leading non-Dutch entry in the eight-strong women's singles, in which Vergeer bids for her eighth successive NEC Masters crown.

Defending champion Wagner is among three American entries for the quad singles, with Monique De Beer (NED) attempting to cause an upset for the home fans.



Mauresmo, Davenport and Clijsters take honours

Amelie Mauresmo became the first Frenchwoman to win the season-ending tournament when she rallied from a set down to overcome compatriot Mary Pierce 57 76 64 in the WTA Championships final on Sunday.

In a compelling contest that spanned three hours and six minutes, the tireless Mauresmo's brilliant defence and athleticism carried her to the biggest title of her career in her second appearance in the final of the eight-woman event.

Lindsay Davenport also benefited from Mauresmo's success. The American secured the year-end No. 1 ranking for the fourth time in her career after Mauresmo defeated Elena Dementieva in their round-robin match on Thursday. Davenport brought a 155-point lead over No. 2 Kim Clijsters into the tournament, but the Belgian needed to make the semifinals to overtake Davenport. Clijsters had lost twice going into Friday's final round-robin match, and Mauresmo's victory ensured her elimination.

Despite disappointing results in the season-ending event, Clijsters won't finish the year empty handed. The Belgian picks up a Porsche Cayenne S as the winner of the 2005 race to the WTA Championships. The World No. 2 captured the US Open among a tour-best nine titles this year and finished 59 points ahead of Davenport on the table standings.

Ouahab and Sfar triumph in African Nations Cup

The sixth African Nations Cup was held last week in Tunisia. Algeria's Lamine Ouahab took the men's title, overcoming Tunisia's Malek Jaziri 57 64 63 in the final. In the women's final Tunisia's Selima Sfar defeated Bahia Mouhtassine from Morocco 60 63 to take the title. Ouahab teamed with countryman Abdelhak Hameurlaine to take the doubles title, while Alicia Pillay and Lizaan Du Plessis from South Africa took the women's doubles title.

Tennis Europe Top Executives Meeting

The Portuguese Tennis Federation hosted the 2005 Tennis Europe Top Executives Meeting in Lisbon last weekend. Key executive staff from many member nations gathered for the 29th annual meeting, which provides an important opportunity for networking and discussion of current issues at a pan-European level.

Guest speakers included US Tennis Industry Association President Jim Baugh, speaking about the organisation and its programs to grow the game in the United States, Rebecca Miskin of the Lawn Tennis Association of Great Britain, presenting the LTA's 'Raw Tennis' program, and Christopher Stokes of NetResult with the latest on the management of intellectual property.

ITF Technical Manager Stuart Miller was also on hand to address the delegates on a number of ITF-related issues, including news on the recent ITF Global Survey and the latest developments in tennis and technology.

Staff from Tennis Europe, along with a number of other delegates also took to the speaker's stand in order to share some subjects of interest to all.

Tennis Europe President John James, who chaired the meeting commented, "I am very pleased with both the attendance and the content of this year's meeting. A wide variety of topics have been discussed, and I'm sure that all representatives will be able to draw upon this discourse to positive effect in their daily roles managing Europe's many national tennis federations. I'd like to thank the Portuguese Tennis Federation once again for their kind invitation and excellent organisation of the event."

2005 European Team Championships

Teams from the Czech Republic swept the European Team Championship titles for the second year running. The final rounds of both events featured some fiercely competitive matches, with both ties going the full distance in front of a lively, home crowd.

In the men's final, the top-seeded Czechs overcame Italy, despite the shock defeat of their No. 1 player Ivo Minar to Simone Bolelli, who defied a ranking gap of almost 200 places to record one of the best wins of his career.

The greater doubles experience of the Czech team of Jan Hajek and Tomas Cakl proved to be decisive though, as they swept aside Bolelli and Alberto Brizzi 75 61 to take the title.

The women's final was even more competitive - Barbora Strycova had looked to be on the brink of sealing the tie for the Czechs before Ukraine's Olga Savchuk staged a stunning comeback, from a break down, saving three match points, to win 62 57 75.

The doubles final also went to the wire, with Strycova alongside the experienced Michaela Pastikova, regrouping to eventually edge the final set tie break and record a 62 46 76(6) win.

Strycova explained, "I had never lost three match points in my entire career before, and so I left the court very affected. When the captain came to ask me if I wanted to play the doubles I thought: 'I have fun playing doubles with Michaela and the only thing that you can do to win is to keep fighting', so that's what I did: went back onto court and... it worked!"

Played on indoor courts at the Tenis Centrum Cesky Krumlov, the 2005 event marked the first time that both the men's and women's championships had been held simultaneously at the same venue.
