Davis Cup reaches new TV territories

Next week's Davis Cup by BNP Paribas ties will enjoy expanded television coverage after the ITF reached agreements with two new broadcasters.

The ITF has signed an agreement with the Cyprus Broadcasting Corporation (CYBC) to cover the Europe/Africa Zone Group II first round tie between Bulgaria and Cyprus in Plovdiv on 7-9 April. It is the first time ever that Davis Cup will have dedicated and live coverage in Cyprus.

Jan Menneken, ITF Executive Director, Commercial, said: "We are very excited to welcome CYBC on board as our Davis Cup by BNP Paribas broadcasting partner in Cyprus. As a public service broadcaster we are delighted to partner them in a country where tennis is at an all-time high following the recent success of Marcos Baghdatis at the Australian Open."

George Zachariades, Sports Producer and Director, CYBC, added: "We are pleased to be the Davis Cup broadcasting partner in Cyprus for this tie. We look forward to a successful relationship in years to come."

The ITF has also signed an agreement with Korean cable and satellite channel KBS Sky in a deal that includes Fed Cup by BNP Paribas. KBS Sky televised the Davis Cup Asia/Oceania Zone Group I first round tie between Korea and India in Changwon in February, and will also show Korea's second round tie away to Chinese Taipei on 7-9 April. In Fed Cup, the station will be host broadcaster for the Asia/Oceania Zone Group I and II events in Seoul on 19-22 April.

All eight nations contesting the Davis Cup by BNP Paribas World Group quarterfinals on 7-9 April will enjoy extensive live coverage. The Croatia versus Argentina tie in Zagreb will be shown on HRT (Croatia) and TyC Sports (Argentina); Seven Network (Australia) and ONT (Belarus) will broadcast Australia versus Belarus in Melbourne; France 2/3 and Sport Plus (France), and NTV Plus and RTR (Russia) will televise France versus Russia in Pau; and the USA versus Chile tie in Rancho Mirage, California can be seen on OLN (USA) and TVN (Chile), with delayed coverage on The Tennis Channel.

Nominations for the four World Group quarterfinals, and 26 Zonal Group I and II ties will be announced tomorrow, Tuesday 28 March. For further information, visit www.daviscup.com.



Belgians announce sell-out for Russian tie

The Belgian Tennis Federation announced that tickets for the 2006 Fed Cup by BNP Paribas World Group first round tie between Belgium and Russia have already sold out. The tie will be played indoors on clay in the 5000-seat Country Hall du Sart-Tilman in Liege on 22-23 April. The Belgians are hoping to be at full strength for the two-day tie against the defending champions, who will be led by last year's final heroine Elena Dementieva.

Several of the other World Group ties have also reported strong sales, with the France versus Italy tie in Nancy, and the Germany versus USA tie in Ettenheim both having already sold two thirds of their tickets. For all the latest Fed Cup news, visit www.fedcup.com.

Wheelchair stars line up in Miami

For the second time this year, the world's leading wheelchair players will compete alongside their able-bodied counterparts when the Nasdaq-100 Open Wheelchair Masters Series takes place in Key Biscayne, Miami, on 30 March-2 April. The event forms part of the NEC Wheelchair Tennis Tour. Both men's and women's events consist of a round-robin format featuring four players, with four of the world's top six men, and four of the top seven women challenging for total prize money of US\$10,000.

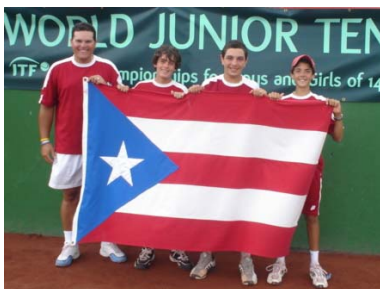
World No. 1 Michael Jeremiasz (FRA) heads the men's entry as he bids to maintain his unbeaten record for the year. Defending champion Robin Ammerlaan (NED) and Tadeusz Kruszelnicki (POL) both provide serious challenges. Ammerlaan defeated Jeremiasz in the season-ending NEC Wheelchair Tennis Masters in 2005, while Kruszelnicki reached his first ever Super Series final at the Australian Open in February. The fourth competitor Martin Legner (AUT) remains a difficult opponent.

Despite the absence of world No. 1 and four-time champion Esther Vergeer (NED), the women's field is still an all-Dutch affair and promises some intriguing matches. World No. 3 Jiske Griffioen was runner-up to Vergeer in Key Biscayne last year, while the more experienced Maaïke Smit, ranked No. 5, was a beaten finalist in 2002 and 2003. To reach the final again, Griffioen and Smit will face difficult tests against world No. 4 Sharon Walraven and the improving Korie Homan, ranked No. 7.

Two Caribbean teams triumph in Panama



Winning Puerto Rico boys team

Puerto Rico boys team and Bahamas girls team won the North/Central America & Caribbean pre-qualifying event for the 14 & under World Junior Tennis competition in Panama on 20-25 March.

The two teams advance to the North/Central America & Caribbean final qualifying event, which will be held in Yucatan, Mexico on 4-7 May. There they will compete against teams from Canada, Mexico and USA for the region's two available spots at the World Junior Tennis Finals to be held on 7-12 August in Prostějov, Czech Republic.

Eleven boys teams and nine girls teams represented the 11 participating nations. In the boys' event, fourth seeds Puerto Rico dominated their round-robin group, before going on to defeat top seeds Guatemala 2-1 in the final. In the girls' competition, unseeded Bahamas were the surprise team of the week, as they eased through their group stage, before upsetting top seeds Honduras in the final.

ITF junior team competition action moves on to Guatemala this week where the North/Central America & Caribbean qualifying event for the 16 & under Junior Davis Cup and Junior Fed Cup by BNP Paribas gets underway this Monday. A total of 14 boys teams and 13 girls teams will each compete for one place in the region's final qualifying event in Yucatan.

Coaches benefit from ITF/Olympic Solidarity Programme

Since the start of the year, three more coaches have taken up an ITF/Olympic Solidarity High Performance Tennis Coaching Scholarship in Valencia, Spain. Cuba's Wilfredo Henry completed the course in only seven weeks due to his commitments as Davis Cup Captain, while Syria's Farah Dayoub, a former Fed Cup player and current National Coach, and India's Radhika Tulpule, another former Fed Cup player, completed the course in the full three-month period.

During their time in Valencia, all coaches completed the ITF Level 3 Coaches Course with a weekly programme that involved approximately 25 hours of practical study at TennisVal: Centro de Tennis Altur-Alvarino, and 10 hours of theoretical studies at the ITF Coaching office in Valencia. The coaches also visited the J.C. Ferrero Equelite Tennis Academy, the Tarragona Tennis Club, the Coaches Education and Research Department of the Spanish Tennis Federation and numerous training centres in Barcelona, including the ITF Training Centre in Cornella.

Farah Dayoub said: "This has been one of the greatest opportunities in my career and life. My greatest appreciation goes to all the people involved in preparing and delivering this programme, and I now can't wait to return to Syria and begin to implement and incorporate all that I have learnt with the Federation and players."

Level 1 Coaches Course held in Bahamas

A Level 1 Coaches Course was held in Nassau, Bahamas on 11-19 March. Nineteen of the 20 participants completed the nine-day course at the National Tennis Centre, and are now awaiting their results.

Course tutor Anthony Jeremiah, ITF Development Officer for the English Speaking Caribbean, said: "After completing another Level 1 Coaches Course in the Caribbean, it has become quite obvious why coaches should try their utmost to attend workshops and courses in their region. The quantity and quality of information received at these events is critical to coaches' development and updates them about new science in the sport. Never let opportunities pass, they may never return."

Obituaries

The ITF was saddened to learn of the death of **Bernard Lacoste** in Paris on 21 March, aged 74. Lacoste ran the Lacoste clothing company in Paris for 42 years and remained honorary president.

Lacoste succeeded his father, tennis star Rene Lacoste, as president in 1963, and is widely credited with turning the family sportswear business into a major apparel company.

The ITF also learned of the death of US player, promoter and journalist **Eugene Scott** on 20 March in New York at the age of 68. A memorial service will be held on Saturday 1 April in Manhattan.

Scott, the founder and publisher of Tennis Week magazine, was a member of the US Davis Cup team from 1963 to 1965. He went on to become tournament director of many events, including the Nabisco Masters in New York and Moscow's Kremlin Cup.

Scott remained one of the world's best players in his age group, and won the Men's 65 singles title at the 2004 ITF Super-Seniors World Championships.

Wilson boost for Federer

Wilson, one of the ITF's international sponsors, has signed a lifetime agreement with world champion Roger Federer for rackets, string, tennis balls and accessories. Federer signed his first professional agreement with Wilson in 1997.
