## Russia faces difficult start to title defence

Two-time defending champion Russia faces a tough first round tie against Belgium in Liege as the 2006 Fed Cup by BNP Paribas gets underway this week. Eight World Group and World Group II first round ties will be held on 22-23 April, while five Zonal Group events are taking place this week.

Elena Dementieva, who led Russia's successful title defence against France in the 2005 Final at Roland Garros, is joined in the team by Nadia Petrova, Maria Kirilenko and Dinara Safina. For Belgium, world No. 2 Kim Clijsters and No. 4 Justine Henin-Hardenne compete together for the first time since July 2003, as the home team begins its bid to capture its first Fed Cup title since 2001.

In other World Group ties, world No. 1 Amelie Mauresmo spearheads the French team in Nancy against a strong Italian side led by Francesca Schiavone; Germany, which includes the fast-rising Anna-Lena Groenefeld, is looking to pull off an upset in Ettenheim against an American team hit by injury; while Spain and Austria are both at full-strength for their first round clash in Valencia.

Asia has strong representation in the World Group II first round ties. Japan hosts Switzerland in Tokyo; Croatia takes on Argentina in Zagreb; Thailand faces Czech Republic in Nonthaburi; and Indonesia hosts China P.R. in Jakarta. The four winners will qualify for July's World Group Play-offs, where they will take on the four World Group first round losers.

In addition to the eight World Group and World Group II ties taking place over the weekend, there are five Zonal Group events being held this week. Four nations will qualify for July's World Group II Play-offs (two from Europe/Africa Zone Group I, one from Asia/Oceania Zone Group I, and one from Americas Zone Group I), where they will take on the four first round losers from World Group II.

## Morocco wins team trophy at African Junior Championships

Morocco won the overall team trophy at the 29th ITF/CAT African Junior Championships, which took place in Cairo, Egypt on 10-15 April. The nation won three of the six singles titles on offer to claim the trophy for the seventh time.

The team trophy sees players gain points for their countries according to their individual singles and doubles results in the three age-groups, with the nation with the highest total winning the trophy. Morocco was a convincing champion, having also secured the boys' and girls' team trophies. The real battle was for second and third place, with Egypt edging out Tunisia by only 40 points.

Ali Choqri, Morocco's team coach, said: "We are proud to have won the team trophy again. It is a great achievement for all our players who have worked hard to secure this win. We look forward to defending the title again next year."

The boys' 18 & under final was an all-Moroccan match-up between No. 2 seed Reda El Amrani and No. 3 seed Houssam Yassine, who had knocked out top seed Christian Vitulli of Kenya. El Amrani was the favourite having defeated his opponent to win the warm-up event, but the Yassine avenged this defeat with a 63 64 final victory.

Another Moroccan, Fatima El Allami, a stalwart of these championships, swept aside her Algerian opponent Amira Benaissa 62 61 to win the girls' 18 & under title. El Allami now holds girls' singles titles in all three age categories.

In front of an enthusiastic home crowd, third seed Mohamed Safwat of Egypt won the boys' 16 & under title, easily defeating South African Hendrick Coertzen 64 61. Top seed Nadia Lalami of Morocco also had a convincing victory in the girls' 16 & under final, seeing off No. 3 seed Olfa Dhaoui (TUN) 62 61.

There was further success for Egypt in the girls' 14 & under final, in which Mora Eshak came from behind to defeat Christi Potgeiter (RSA) 36 62 60. En route to the final Potgeiter and Eshak had eliminated the top two seeds, Nour Abbes (TUN) and Elizabeth Morake (RSA) respectively. The boys' 14 & under final saw a lone singles triumph for Tunisia, with No. 4 seed Sami Ghorbel overcoming No. 2 seed Mohamed Anas Amallah (MAR) 64 61. Ghorbel had saved a match point in his 36 75 75 semifinal victory over top seed Seif El Sherbini (EGY).

Morocco also won three of the six doubles titles, with victories in both 16 & under events and the girls' 18 & under competition. Tunisia won the boys' 18 and 14 & under titles, while South Africa was successful in the girls' 14 & under age-group.

During the championships, ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti met Egyptian Prime Minister Ahmed Nazif and Hassan Sakr, Head of the National Sports Council of Egypt. He also attended the CAT Annual General Meeting.

The African Junior Championships also included the African regional qualifying events for the 16 & under and 14 & under ITF junior team competitions. Based on their earlier performances in the individual competition, four nations took part in each qualifying event, with the following countries qualifying for the finals later in 2006:

## Seniors World Championships underway in Durban

The 2006 ITF/ASG Seniors World Team Championships began yesterday in Durban, South Africa with 37 teams from 25 nations making the journey to contest the week-long event. Men and women in age categories 35 through 55 will compete for a total of ten trophies.

Last year's championships in Perth, Australia saw the host nation and USA claim seven of the ten team cups between them. Australia is defending the Fred Perry Cup (men's 50), Austria Cup (men's 55), Margaret Court Cup (women's 45) and Maureen Connolly Cup (women's 55), while USA is defending champion in the Tony Trabert Cup (men's 40), Dubler Cup (men's 45) and Young Cup (women's 40). France won both 35 age category events in 2005, the Suzanne Lenglen Cup (women) and Italia Cup (men), while Netherlands took home the Maria Esther Bueno Cup in the women's 50 category.

This year's event features some strong teams from Europe, with Spain, Germany, Austria and Great Britain all in a good position to claim some silverware at the end of the week.

Daniel Ahl leads a Great Britain team that was runner-up in last year's men's 35 competition to France, which is once again spearheaded by former tour player Lionel Barthez. Three-time Grand Slam doubles champion Danie Visser fronts the men's 45 South African team in the Dubler Cup, but 2005 winner USA and finalist Germany will be tough to beat in this age group. Defending champion France and runner-up Great Britain have again entered strong teams in the women's 35 event, while the Dutch women's 50 trio will look to retain its trophy against strong competition from USA.

Australia will challenge for a number of trophies including the women's 45 Margaret Court Cup that Ros Balodis helped secure on home soil last year. Arguably Austria's biggest chance will be in the men's 40 Tony Trabert Cup in which Manfred Hundstorfer will lead a competitive team that could go all the way. Meanwhile Spain again relies on Jorge Camina Borda to carry its hopes in the men's 55 Austria Cup competition in which it was runner-up to Australia last year.

The new Museum, which has undergone a multi-million pound transformation, combines state-of-the-art interactive touch screens with an unparalleled collection of traditional and contemporary tennis memorabilia to explore the story of the game and the Wimbledon Championships.

Among the new features on display are a 3-D cinema featuring a film on the The Science of Tennis (filmed during the 2005 Championships); a 'Reaction Zone' in which visitors test their powers of speed, stamina and coordination; and seeing John McEnroe 'live' in a recreation of the 1980s' Gentlemen's Dressing Room as he relates stories conveying the drama and emotion of the Wimbledon Championships.
