Netherlands repeats World Team Cup double

Netherlands retained its men's and women's titles at the 2006 Invacare World Team Cup, the ITF's flagship wheelchair tennis event, in Brasilia, Brazil. For the first time in the event's history, all four titles were successfully defended, with USA retaining its quad title, and Belgium winning the junior event.

The men's competition was once again divided into two groups of 16 nations. In World Group 1, all eight seeded nations reached the quarterfinals, where in a minor upset fifth seed Austria overcame fourth seed Japan 2-1. The top two seeds, Netherlands and France, went on to contest the final, where Stephane Houdet, in his first year of wheelchair tennis, defeated Maikel Scheffers 64 75 to give the French the lead. World No. 2 Robin Ammerlaan then recovered from a set down to beat World Champion Michael Jeremiasz 26 63 75, before partnering compatriot Ronald Vink to a 64 64 win over Jeremiasz and Frederic Cazeaudumec to secure Netherlands' fifth men's title.

There was a strong South American presence in men's World Group 2, with Brazil defeating Argentina 2-0 in the final. Both nations earn promotion to World Group I in 2007.

In the women's event, where Great Britain was the only first round seeding casualty, second seed Switzerland needed a deciding doubles rubber in all three of its victories, over Poland, Korea and France, to reach the final. In contrast 18-time champion Netherlands sailed through to the final without the loss of a set. In a repeat of the 2003 final, Jiske Griffioen overcame Sandra Kalt 64 61, before World Champion Esther Vergeer whitewashed Karin Suter-Erath 60 60 to give the Dutch its 19th title.

Defending quad champion USA won all three of its round-robin matches 3-0 to reach the final for the seventh time in nine years. The other group was much closer, with second seed Italy scoring 2-1 victories over Sweden and three-time champion Israel to reach its first final. The final proved another comfortable win for USA, with Nick Taylor defeating Antonio Raffaele 61 62, and world No. 1 David Wagner overcoming Giuseppe Polidori 61 60 to secure a record fourth title for the Americans.

In the junior event, Belgium and Australia both reached the final with three group wins, although the Australians were taken to a deciding doubles by Netherlands. In a keenly contested final, Mike Denayer defeated Dylan Alcott 63 46 64 to give the defending champion the lead, before Michael Esler scored a first ever win over Joachim Gerard 61 26 63 to level the tie. Denayer and Gerard then overcame Alcott and Esler 63 76(5) to retain the title for Belgium.

ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti was on site in Brasilia to present trophies to the women's champions, plus the winners of the men's World Group 2 and junior events. For further information, visit www.itftennis.com/wheelchair.

ITF launches Beijing 2008 line umpires programme

Mike Morrissey, ITF Administrator of Officiating, travelled to China last week to start the process of training line umpires for the 2008 Olympic and Paralympic Games in Beijing. Morrissey joined Chinese International Official Chen Shu to present a series of seminars in Beijing (3-4 May), Shanghai (5 May) and Guangzhou (6 May).

A total of 208 participants with different levels of officiating experience attended the seminars, which are the first stage of preparation for the Games. One hundred and eighty-six participants qualified for the next stage of the programme to work as line umpires at major professional events, both inside and outside China. Over 20 Chinese officials have been selected to travel to England in June to officiate at the Wimbledon qualifying event, with five staying on to work as line umpires in the main draw at the All England Club.

The programme is being organised by ITF Officiating, in close cooperation with the Chinese Tennis Association and BOCOG. Based on the success of the training programme before Athens 2004, it is hoped that 50 Chinese line umpires will be selected for the 2008 Beijing Games.

Further qualifiers for junior team finals

Seventeen teams have booked their places at the ITF Junior Team Competition Finals following last week's qualifying events on three continents.

The South America Qualifying for the Junior Davis Cup & Junior Fed Cup by BNP Paribas was held in Bogota, Colombia. Ecuador, Argentina and Venezuela were the three girls' qualifiers, while Argentina, Brazil and Chile qualified for the boys' finals. Venezuela's girls and Chile's boys both needed a deciding doubles victory to win their third place play-off, against Brazil and Colombia respectively.

The Asia/Oceania Qualifying for the Junior Davis Cup took place in Kuching, Malaysia. The three qualifying places went to surprise winner Thailand, along with Australia and Japan, who defeated Korea 2-1 in the third place play-off.

The North/Central America & Caribbean Final Qualifying event for both the World Junior Tennis Finals and the Junior Davis Cup & Junior Fed Cup was played in Merida, Yucatan, Mexico. USA qualified for all four finals, winning three of the events, and finishing runner-up to Canada in the girls' World Junior Tennis. Mexico achieved the second qualifying spot in the boys' World Junior Tennis, Junior Fed Cup and Junior Davis Cup.

Ten more places at the team finals are at stake this week. The Asia/Oceania Qualifying for the Junior Fed Cup by BNP Paribas takes place on 8-13 May at the Tennis Academy of Asia in Bangkok, Thailand. Sixteen girls' teams compete for four places at the finals in Barcelona. The South America Qualifying for the World Junior Tennis competition also starts today in Merida, Venezuela. Ten countries in both the boys' and girls' events are competing for three available spots at the finals in Prostějov.

Wimbledon prize money announced

The prize money for Wimbledon 2006 has been published with more than 10.3 million pounds on offer at the event, which will be held from 26 June until 9 July. Singles prize money is up 4.0 per cent on last year. The men's champion will receive £655,000 (£630,000 in 2005) and the women's champion £625,000 (£600,000 in 2005). The breakdown is as follows:
