



Nadal shatters Federer's Roland Garros dream

Spain's Rafael Nadal and Belgium's Justine Henin-Hardenne reigned supreme in the Parisian heat over the weekend, completing successful title defences to lift the Roland Garros singles trophies for a second consecutive year. It was the first time there had been repeat champions in both singles events at Roland Garros since 1992 (Jim Courier and Monica Seles), and the first time at any Grand Slam tournament since the 1996 US Open (Steffi Graf and Pete Sampras).

Victory for Nadal in the men's final ended world No. 1 Roger Federer's hopes of becoming only the third man in history to hold all four major titles at the same time, and the sixth man to win all four Grand Slams during his career. It also snapped his run of seven straight victories in Grand Slam finals. In the first Roland Garros men's final for 22 years to feature the No.1 and No. 2 seed, Nadal recovered from a bad start to defeat Federer 16 61 64 76(4). The win was the Spaniard's 60th consecutive on clay and improved his Roland Garros record to 14-0; Nadal is the first man to defend his title at Roland Garros since Gustavo Kuerten in 2001.

Henin-Hardenne, seeded No. 5 and appearing in her second Grand Slam final of 2006, defeated 2004 US Open champion and No. 8 seed Svetlana Kuznetsova 64 64 to become the first woman to defend at Roland Garros since Graf in 1996, and the sixth in the Open Era to win there three or more times (Henin-Hardenne won in 2003 as well as last year). The Belgian also became the first woman to win the title in Paris without losing a set since Arantxa Sanchez-Vicario in 1994. Henin-Hardenne now owns five Grand Slam titles, and in her sights now is Wimbledon, the only major title she has yet to collect.

Klizan and Radwanska take junior titles




Slovak Martin Klizan and Poland's Agnieszka Radwanska are the junior Roland Garros champions after emphatic final wins on Sunday.




Sixteen-year-old Klizan beat Philip Bester of Canada 63 61 in an all-unseeded final clash to win his first junior Grand Slam title. Radwanska's 64 61 victory over Australian Open champion Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova of Russia earned the 17-year old from Krakow her second junior major title following her triumph at last year's Wimbledon.



Klizan is the first Slovak to win a junior Roland Garros title and has now risen to No. 3 in the rankings. "I feel very good that I won. I didn't expect it," he said. "I am very happy. I thought that I would win two rounds and now I am champion. I felt very good form for my forehand and backhand, and I didn't lose my serve in the final." A string of long matches en route to the final may have taken its toll on Bester, who seemed to be hampered against Klizan after suffering an ill-timed bout of tendinitis in his knee a few days before the final.

There was further success for defending champions in the men's doubles, as Jonas Bjorkman (SWE) and Max Mirnyi (BLR) claimed the title for the second year running. In a repeat of last year's final, Bjorkman and Mirnyi won a close match against Bob and Mike Bryan 67(5) 64 75 to win their second Grand Slam title as a partnership. The Bryans made a bit of history of their own, becoming the first male pair in the Open Era to reach six successive Grand Slam finals.

Top seeds and ITF World Champions Lisa Raymond and Samantha Stosur took the honours in the women's doubles, with a 63 62 win over Daniela Hantuchova (SVK) and Ai Sugiyama (JPN) in the final. It was the US-Aussie duo's second Grand Slam title and third appearance in a Grand Slam final since teaming up in summer 2005.

In the mixed doubles, Katarina Srebotnik (SLO) and Nenad Zimonjic (SCG) took their first title as a team, defeating Elena Likovtseva (RUS) and Daniel Nestor (CAN) 63 64 in the final.

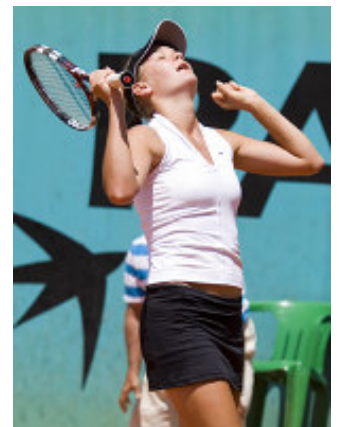

Radwanska's win in the girls' final was also achieved in straight sets, and even she was surprised at how one-sided her victory over the 15-year-old Pavlyuchenkova had been. "I'm so happy because I think it's my last tournament in juniors, so I think the best," she said. "I'm so happy I won that tournament. Wimbledon was different because last year was my first tournament, so it was very big surprise for everyone in Poland and everywhere. This tournament was like very good also, but, you know, not as much of a surprise. There was more pressure."

Both Radwanska and Pavlyuchenkova had featured in the girls' doubles final on Saturday, the win going to the Pavlyuchenkova and partner Sharon Fichman of Canada 67 62 61 against Radwanska and Caroline Wozniacki of Denmark. It marked the second junior doubles Grand Slam of the year for the duo, who won the Australian Open title in January.

Emiliano Massa earned himself a place in Roland Garros history by becoming the first Argentine to win the junior boys' doubles title twice. Last year Massa joined forces with fellow Argentine Leonardo Mayer to take the 2005 trophy. This time around, he teamed up with Japan's Kei Nishikori to beat Russians Artur Chernov and Valery Rudnev 26 61 62 in the final.

Wheelchair exhibitions at Roland Garros

ITF Wheelchair World Champions Michael Jeremiasz and Esther Vergeer joined up with Florence Gravellier and Ronald Vink for a series of wheelchair tennis exhibitions at Roland Garros on 7th and 8th June.

On Wednesday, France's Jeremiasz played Dutchman Vink in a men's singles exhibition on Court 7, followed by the Netherlands' Vergeer and Frenchwoman Gravellier in a women's singles exhibition. Jeremiasz took the first set against Vink despite dropping his opening service game. Vink drew level by winning the second set, but in the decider, Parisian Jeremiasz gave the local fans a masterclass to take the match 62 46 61. With Gravellier feeling unwell, the women's exhibition went to Vergeer 61 60.

Thursday's mixed doubles match between the Dutch and French partnerships began with Vergeer and Vink opening up a 4-1 lead and holding off a fightback from Gravellier and Jeremiasz to take the first set 64. The close second set was won by the French pair in a tiebreak, and the match was decided by another tiebreak in lieu of a full final set, with the honours going to Vergeer and Vink.

Another showcase for wheelchair tennis at the second Grand Slam of the year saw Jeremiasz and Vink play in a one-up-one-down exhibition with Mansour Bahrami and men's doubles semifinalist Andrei Pavel.

David Hall retires

Australia's David Hall, who was ITF Wheelchair World Champion a record-breaking six times, has announced his retirement from the NEC Wheelchair Tennis Tour.

Hall's achievements included winning the gold medal in front of his home crowd at the Sydney 2000 Paralympic Games. He captured eight Australian Open, five British Open and eight US Open titles in addition to winning more than 70 other tournaments. Other career highlights included winning two year-end NEC Masters titles, and a further five Paralympic medals – three silver, two bronze - spanning the Atlanta, Sydney and Athens Games in singles and doubles.

Hall, 36, dominated the NEC Wheelchair Tennis Tour, finishing six seasons ranked at No. 1 in the world: 1995, 1998, 2000 and three in a row 2002-04.

"Tennis has given me so much but I've also achieved everything that I've set out to do," Hall said. The Australian also felt that the sport was beginning to take its toll physically: "Over the last couple of years it was becoming more difficult to compete at 100 per cent, plus mentally the desire just wasn't there anymore."

In the future, Hall will continue to share his knowledge and love of the game with junior players, and he has recently undertaken a number of speaking engagements. His accident at age 16, his recovery and subsequent phenomenal rise through the wheelchair tennis rankings will also feature in a book of his life story that he is hoping to develop.

Press accreditation for Beijing 2008

The press accreditation process for the Beijing 2008 Olympic Games will officially start on 8th August, two years before the start of the Games, when the International Olympic Committee notifies all National Olympic Committees (NOCs) of their press accreditation quota allocation.

The overall press quota for the Beijing Game will be 5,600, the same as for Sydney 2000 and Athens 2004.

The Two-Stage Accreditation Process - involving the Press by Number process followed by the Press by Name process - will start on 1st March 2007, two months earlier than for Athens and Torino 2006. At this time the Beijing Organising Committee for the Games (BOCOG) will distribute the Press by Number forms and related publications such as the Press Accommodation Guide, Freight and Shipping Guide, Rate Card and Media Information Guide to all NOCs.

Each NOC will have allocated its press quota to the main media organisations in its country, and will forward the accreditation forms to those organisations. Completed forms must be returned by the NOC to BOCOG by June 2007.

The Press by Name process will start in November 2007 when each press organisation must identify their individual team members and notify the NOC no later than February 2008.

The non rights-holding broadcast ENR accreditation process will start in March 2007 when the IOC posts the ENR application forms and rules at www.olympic.org, with the deadline for applications being June 2007.

Tennis Europe and Centre Internacional de Tennis announce partnership

Tennis Europe and the Centre Internacional de Tennis (CIT) have announced an agreement under which the Centre will be recognised as the Official Academy Partner of Tennis Europe.

Owned and managed by the Catalan Tennis Federation, the centre, currently the European high-performance training centre of the ITF and a partner of the International Olympic Committee as a preferred centre for recipients of Olympic Solidarity Player training scholarships, is situated at Cornellà, close to Barcelona airport. Facilities at the site include 14 Greenset, 13 clay, and four indoor courts, as well as a gym, swimming pool, full medical centre and on-site accommodation for 48 people.

Tennis Europe President John James said, "We are extremely pleased to enter into this agreement. This is the first time that Tennis Europe has partnered with an Official Academy, and there is not a better location or facilities than those at the CIT in Barcelona."

The agreement was signed on 5th July at Roland Garros and lasts until the end of 2007.
