## Seoul hosts 2006 ITF AGM

The ITF Annual General Meeting is being held this week in Seoul on 23-25 August, hosted by the Korean Tennis Association (KTA). It is the first time that the AGM has been held in Korea, and the first time the event has been hosted in Asia since 1994.

More than 60 nations will attend the AGM, which is taking place at the Shilla Hotel. Thursday's Key Issues Sessions will cover topics including Commercial, Finance, Fed Cup, Davis Cup, Development, Juniors, the ITF Survey, Anti-Doping and Marketing the Game. The formal AGM is on Friday and will be opened by Mr Myunggon Kim, Korean Minister of Culture and Tourism.

Delegates will be guests of the KTA on Thursday evening for dinner at Seoul's Changkyung Palace, and delegates' lunches will be hosted by the ITF/LTA on Thursday and by the ITF and the Russia Tennis Federation, as Fed Cup champion nation, on Friday. The Gala Dinner at the Shilla Hotel on Friday evening is being hosted by the ITF and the Croatian Tennis Federation, as Davis Cup winning nation.

Voting for any proposed amendments to the ITF Constitution and on any other matters will take place on Friday 15 August, when a Special Edition of This Week will be published with full details.



## US Open wild cards announced

With a week to go until the start of the US Open, the USTA has announced the wild cards for the fourth Grand Slam of the year. The list is highlighted by two-time champion Serena Williams and former finalist Mark Philippoussis, and ten promising Americans aged 20 and under.






Former world No. 1 Williams won her debut Grand Slam title at the US Open in 1999, and repeated in 2002. Philippoussis was runner-up at Flushing Meadows in 1998, and also runner-up at 2003 Wimbledon; his wild card is part of a reciprocal arrangement with Tennis Australia, which on the women's side has been awarded to Alicia Molik, the 2004 Olympic bronze medallist.

The other women's wild cards are Chanda Rubin, 29, currently unranked after a limited schedule in the past two years because of a left knee injury, and 21-year-olds Bethanie Mattek and Ahsha Rolle. There are three teenagers: Jessica Kirkland, 18, the 2004 girls' singles runner-up; Alexa Glatch, 16, the 2005 girls' singles and doubles runner-up; and 16-year-old Lauren Albanese.

After Philippoussis, all seven remaining men's wild cards have been awarded to players aged 20 and under, four of whom are teenagers. The youngest is 17-year-old Donald Young: the 2005 ITF World Champion has received a US Open wild card for the second consecutive year by successfully defending the USTA Boys' 18s National Championship title. Young is joined by 19-year-old Ryan Sweeting, the 2005 boys champion; fast-rising Sam Querrey, 18; and Alex Kuznetsov, 19. The list is rounded out by a trio of 20 year-olds: Scoville Jenkins, Wayne Odesnik and Phillip Simmonds.

It was also announced last week that the USTA and Heineken have signed a new sponsorship agreement extending Heineken's relationship with the US Open through 2010, and that IBM has renewed its technology sponsorship of the tournament through 2009.

Plans were unveiled to induct Martina Navratilova and Don Budge into the US Open Court of Champions in ceremonies to be held in Arthur Ashe Stadium before the men's final. Four-time US Open singles champion Navratilova and two-time US Open singles champion Budge were chosen by a panel of international media as the 2006 inductees of the Court of Champions, which honours the greatest singles champions in the history of the US Championships and US Open. They will have commemorative plaques added to the US Open Court of Champions attraction which opened last year. In addition, Navratilova will be honoured with a special retirement tribute as she plays her last professional tournament at the 2006 US Open.

The 2006 US Open takes place at the newly renamed USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center from Monday 28 August to Sunday 10 September, with the qualifying event running from Tuesday 22 to Friday 25 August. The draw will be held on Wednesday 23 August. Both the men's and women's US Open singles champions will earn \$1.2 million, with the opportunity to earn an additional \$1 million in bonus prize money based on their performances in the US Open Series. ## ITF/CAT West/Central Africa 13 & Under Junior Circuit 2006

The 2006 ITF/CAT West/Central Africa 13 & Under Junior Circuit, hosted by the Federation Camerounaise de Tennis (FECATENNIS), finished on 13 August in Yaounde, after a change of venue from Douala due to adverse weather conditions. Twenty boys and 16 girls from nine countries participated in the circuit which comprised a training camp, followed by three four-day tournaments.

Host nation Cameroon dominated the boys draw with Celestin Nkoueleue winning all three legs of the circuit, beating Stephen Peter (NIG) in the first and second tournaments and compatriot Franck Tamokoue in the third event. It was Ghana's turn to shine in the girls' events, as Anita Kodjoe took the girls singles titles in two of the tournaments. The other girls' winner was Benin's Stephanie N'Tcha.

The doubles titles were shared between Cameroon and Nigeria, as the host nation swept to victory in the boys' and girls' doubles of the first and third events, and Nigeria winning both the doubles trophies in the second leg.

The level of competition was high thanks to talented boys such as Tunde Segodo (BEN), Stephen Peter (NIG) and home player Franck Tamokoue, as well as Biola Akewula (NIG) and Yvonne Kamegne (CMR) in the girls draw. The circuit was one of the biggest events organised by FECATENNIS and Edouard Eugene Akame, President of the Federation, said: "I would like to thank the ITF and CAT for the confidence they have placed in us for the organisation of this event, as well as the sponsors – SCDP, CAMTEL and VORTEX – for all their support. I hope that all the participants have enjoyed their stay in Cameroon and hope that we will see them here again soon for other international events."

## ITF South/Central Africa 18 & Under Junior Circuit 2006

The 2006 ITF South/Central Africa 18 & Under Junior Circuit ended on 16 August. The three-week circuit was funded by the Grand Slam Development Fund and the host nations were Lesotho, Swaziland and Mozambique. The Grade 4 tournaments featured players from 20 different countries.

The circuit started off in Maseru, Lesotho and for the first time in 40 years it snowed. Despite the bad weather conditions, Monica Gorny from South Africa managed to reach the girls' final, but the other semifinal between her compatriots Chane Hines and Jeanine Bianca Swanepoel could not be played before they had to move on to Swaziland for the second leg. Lofu Ramiamanana (MAD), Michael Thompson (GBR), Mpilo Migogo (RSA) and Takura Happy (ZIM) reached the boys' semifinals before that event had to be abandoned. The doubles events were cancelled due to the weather.

The Mbabane Tennis Club in Swaziland was the venue for the second week of the circuit and fortunately the weather was fine. The fast hard courts at the club benefited Zimbabwe's Takanyi Garanganga, who mixed his baseline game with serve-and-volley and was hardly threatened throughout the tournament, defeating Sunday Emmanuel from Nigeria 62 62 in the final. Emmanuel won the boys' doubles with Duncan Mugabe (UGA). Gorny reached the girls' final again, and this time the 15-year-old was able to complete victory, defeating Austria's Jeannine Prentner 75 63. Prentner and Abigail Olivier (RSA) went on to win the girls' doubles.

The third tournament was played at the Maputo Tennis Club in Mozambique, where the lower altitude benefited the baseliners. The boys' singles produced a repeat of the second week's final between Garanganga and Emmanuel, and Emmanuel got his revenge on Garanganga 64 75. The dominant Gorny also repeated in the girls' singles, defeating Swanepoel (RSA) 63 63. The boys' doubles went to Wesley Baptiste and Stephan Havenga of South Africa, and their compatriots Bronwyn Davidson and Hedda Wolmarans also captured the girls' title.

"Competition is one of the keys to develop tennis further in Africa and events like these are great. I would also like to see more local and national competition happening in Africa," said Sami Sidia, ITF Development Officer for Southern Africa. Sidia also acted as the ITF representative during the circuit.
