New official sponsor of Fed Cup Final

The International Tennis Federation is pleased to announce that new mobile-enabled classified advertising service Mobiya has signed as an Official Sponsor of the 2006 Final of the Fed Cup by BNP Paribas. Mobiya is a person-to-person mobile media company enabling the mobile-connected generation to interact with classified advertising, through both online and traditional media.

Mobiya will launch its mobile-enabled classified advertising service during the Fed Cup Final between Belgium and Italy, to be held in Charleroi over the weekend of 16 - 17 September. The sponsorship of the Fed Cup Final will allow Mobiya to communicate its brand and create awareness of its service to a global audience, with the Mobiya name and sms shortcode "4050" visible on court side banners.

This groundbreaking sponsorship deal will see the world's first mobile short code promotion at a worldwide sports stadium event, and is reminiscent of the early days of the internet when startups used sports events to launch their online brands and URLs. Mobiya will use the Fed Cup Final to activate its innovative service and grow its international footprint, leveraging the awareness that a world-class tennis event generates.

Mobiya aims to tap into the expansion of brand communication from website link URLs to include mobile phone short codes. Mobile media has become interactive with fans already participating in marketing campaigns using their mobile phones, and Mobiya will build on this in a pioneering way, allowing users to create classified advertisements using their mobile phones. Buyers can then view these ads - which can be for items, services, or even personal advertisements - on a variety of platforms, be it on the web, via mobile phone or in printed media, and if they are interested, Mobiya puts them directly in touch with the advertiser.

Wozniacki out, Buchanan shines at Junior US Open

The top junior players from around the world are in New York to contest the Junior US Open, which began on Sunday. The opening day witnessed an interesting start with the arrival of fresh new talent in the boys' draw, and the defaulting of second seed Caroline Wozniacki.

No. 2 seed and junior Wimbledon champion Wozniacki was leading 64 12 in her match against Russia's Alexandra Panova, when she was defaulted for verbally abusing the line judge. The 16-year-old from Denmark was playing only her fourth junior event of the year.

As the home fans mourned the retirement of hero Andre Agassi, a new chapter was opened by 14-year-old Chase Buchanan. The young American marked his US Open junior debut with a 75 26 75 first round win over seventh seed Petru-Alexandru Luncanu (ROM). Buchanan defied his age with a show of remarkable maturity on court, fighting off two break points at five-all in the third set to secure the match.

Elsewhere in the draw, top seeds Martin Klizan and Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova will be hoping to add a second Slam to the victories they recorded at the French and Australian Opens respectively.

Pavlyuchenkova shot to prominence on the ITF Junior Circuit in January when she won three consecutive events, including the Australian Open, and made the final at Roland Garros. However, a first round exit at Wimbledon cost her valuable ranking points. Pavlyuchenkova is looking to become the first player ever to complete the Grand Slam in doubles, having been crowned champion in Melbourne, Paris and London.

Roland Garros champion Martin Klizan (SVK) is the only boy in the draw to have won one of this year's junior Grand Slams, in the absence of Alexandre Sidorenko (Australian Open) and Thiemo de Bakker (Wimbledon). Lifting the trophy next week would make him firm favourite to end the year with the No. 1 ranking.

Other faces to watch include No. 4 seed Ayumi Morita from Japan has performed consistently in junior competitions this year and will be looking to add to her only title at the Asian Closed Championships in April. Morita has put in some strong performances in professional events and has recently achieved a ranking inside the world's top 250. Other prominent players seeded in the girls' draw are Romania's Mihaela Buzarnescu, Kristina Antoniychuk (UKR), Julia Cohen (USA) and Dominika Cibulkova (SVK).

Brazilian Nicolas Santos is the top ranked South American in the boys' draw and will be seeded No. 3. Santos won the majority of his ranking points earlier this year by winning three tournaments in South America, including the Grade 1 Asunción Bowl in Paraguay. At sixteen, Jonathan Eysseric of France is one of the youngest boys in the draw but moved up to world No. 3 after strong clay court performances on South America's COSAT circuit. His confidence and ability to rise to the occasion will make him a strong favourite to progress to the latter stages.

Vergeer and Jeremiasz head wheelchair tournament at US Open

Defending champions Robin Ammerlaan (NED) and Esther Vergeer (NED) are among an illustrious field for the 2006 US Open Wheelchair Tennis Competition, part of the NEC Wheelchair Tennis tour, which takes place at Flushing Meadows from 7 – 10 September.

The ITF Masters Series event will feature eight of the world's top men and women in singles and doubles competition. World No. 2 Ammerlaan looks set to have his strongest challenge from World No. 1 Michael Jeremiasz (FRA) and World No. 4 Shingo Kunieda (JPN), while Tadeusz Kruszelnicki (POL) and Ronald Vink (NED) have both been in fine form this year and are capable of upsetting those ranked above them.

A strong Dutch contingent for the women's event will see Vergeer joined by compatriots Sharon Walraven, Jiske Griffioen, Maaïke Smit and last year's runner-up Korie Homan. World No. 2 Florence Gravelier (FRA) will be hoping to mark her debut at the event with a strong performance.

Both the men's and women's fields include two American players apiece, with Jon Rydberg and Beth Arnoult having claimed the last guaranteed places based on ranking. Wild cards Larry Quintero and Kaitlyn Verfuert complete the line up.

The 16 players will compete for a total prize of \$50,000, an increase from \$10,000 at last year's inaugural competition.



Top doubles teams secure spots in Shanghai

Paul Hanley and Kevin Ullyett, the No. 3 team in the Stanford ATP Doubles Race, and Mark Knowles and Daniel Nestor the No. 4 team, have secured spots in the Tennis Masters Cup, to be held in Shanghai from November 12-19.

Hanley and Ullyett and Knowles and Nestor are the third and fourth doubles teams to qualify this year behind Bob and Mike Bryan and Jonas Bjorkman and Max Mirnyi who secured their Shanghai berths in July.

Hanley and Ullyett, a new pairing in 2006, have compiled an impressive 40-14 record this season and have taken home four titles. The duo opened the season by advancing to the final in Adelaide and then made a run to the semifinals at the Australian Open, their first team appearance in a Grand Slam event. They followed up their Australian Open appearance with back-to-back hard court titles in Rotterdam and Dubai and earned their first ATP Masters Series shield in Hamburg. The pair advanced to two consecutive finals this summer, in Washington and at the ATP Masters Series event in Toronto.

“To qualify by the US Open in the first year of a partnership is really great,” said Ullyett, the 2004 Tennis Masters Cup doubles finalist (with Wayne Black). “I knew we could do well this year and there was no doubt about that. We started off the first month doing well in Australia and have been playing well ever since.”

Knowles and Nestor, partners for the last 12 years, have a 36-14 record and have won four crowns this year. The pair started the season with a win in Delray Beach and made a run to the final in Marseille. They picked up some momentum advancing to the final in Dubai and taking their first ATP Masters Series shield of the season with a win in Indian Wells. The pair followed up their performance at Indian Wells with back-to-back wins in Barcelona and at the ATP Masters Series event in Rome.

“It is very exciting to be back at the Tennis Masters Cup,” said Nestor. “This is a title that has eluded us the past few years so it has definitely been a focus of ours. We’ve had a great year and it’s great to be able to qualify so early.”

Bruce Karr honoured with 2006 Brad Parks Award

Former Paralympian Bruce Karr has been awarded the prestigious Brad Parks Award in recognition of his instrumental dedication to the development and promotion of wheelchair tennis. The award is presented annually by the ITF to an individual, organisation or company who has made an outstanding contribution to the sport.

Bruce began the National Wheelchair Sports Fund (NWSF) in 1986 with the primary purpose of raising funds to finance wheelchair athletes and programs because of shortcomings in this area. Since its inception, the NWSF has spent almost three million dollars to equip and subsidise wheelchair athletes, organisations and programs.

In 1989, Bruce started a tennis tournament for 19 wheelchair players. That tournament is now the “Florida Open International Wheelchair Tennis Championships”. It is one of the largest wheelchair tennis tournaments with more than 200 participants and annually attracts the best players from around the world. The Florida Open has been designated as the USTA’s National Wheelchair Hardcourt Championships for the last 5 years and has ITF 1 status on the NEC Tour. In 2002 the tournament was the ITF’s worldwide “Tournament of the Year” as voted by the players.

Between 1960 and 1978, Bruce Karr competed in five Paralympics and One Gold Cup, winning twelve gold medals in as many sports as basketball, archery, table tennis, swimming and field Events. He is in the USA Wheelchair Sports Hall of Fame and the National Wheelchair Basketball Hall of Fame. Bruce will fittingly be presented with the Award at the Florida Open in April 2007.



Development team impresses on Tennis Europe Junior Tour

ITF/Tennis Europe's B Team, consisting of players 14 & Under and 16 & Under, have completed a successful three-week stint on the Tennis Europe Junior Tour.

Sixteen players from 11 countries benefiting from the ITF/Tennis Europe Development Programmes were invited onto the team and competed in three week-long events in Ulm, Bergheim and Renningen/Rutesheim.

Congratulations go to Ekaterina Gorgodze (GEO) and Bosnia & Herzegovina's Damir Dzumhur and Ema Burgic whose confident and consistent performance throughout the three weeks earned them several titles.

Dzumhur picked up the first 14 & Under boys' singles title in Ulm, and reached the finals again at the Mercedes Juced Cup in Renningen/Rutesheim, losing to Alexander Rumantsev (RUS) in straight sets. His success continued in the doubles with partner Arturs Kazijevs from Latvia, where they were runners-up in all three event finals.

In the 14 & Under girls' category, Burgic proved a doubles sensation by winning two out of the three titles, and also achieving twice runner-up in the girls' singles in Ulm and Renningen/Rutesheim.

Georgia's Ekaterina Gorgodze won two singles titles in the girls' 16 & Under category, and also the doubles title at the Vustenrot Junior Classic in Bergheim. Mirza Basic (BIH) took the boys' singles title in Bergheim, defeating compatriot Tomislav Brkic 63 61. They then teamed up to win the doubles over Dzumhur and Kazijevs, also 63 61.

Other victors include Tomislav Jovotski (MKD) and Revaz Osadze (GEO) who won the boys' 16 & Under singles titles in Ulm and Renningen/Rutesheim respectively.

Ales Filipcic, the ITF/Tennis Europe Team coach commented: "This year members of the ITF/Tennis Europe B Team showed very high level of tennis, motivation to improve their game and they live, work and have fun as a excellent team. These three weeks will for sure help them to be even more successful in future."

Pete Sampras awarded World Fair Play Trophy

The International Committee for Fair Play (CIFP) has honoured Pete Sampras with the Jean Borotra World Fair Play Trophy in the sports career category.

The award is given to athletes who demonstrate an attitude of sportsmanship throughout their career, marked by an outstanding and constant spirit of fair play. Previous award winners from tennis include Stefan Edberg, Arthur Ashe, Chris Evert, and Ken Rosewall.

The trophy is named after the great French Davis Cup player and Grand Slam and Olympic champion who was also the founder of the CIFP. Sampras will be presented with his trophy at the award ceremony in Budapest, Hungary on 16 December 2006.

"It as an honour for our sport to have Pete join the list of great athletes who have received this award," said International Tennis Federation President, Francesco Ricci Bitti. "It is a credit to the way he has conducted himself during his career, and I am sure that everyone in tennis and the world of sport would agree that he is a very worthy recipient of this honour."

ITF 14 & Under Caribbean Development Championships

The 2006 ITF 14 & Under Caribbean Development Championships concluded on Friday 1 September in Trinidad. The week-long event was funded by the Grand Slam Development Fund, which featured 24 boys and 18 girls who were supported by 13 coaches from twelve countries.

This year was a record-breaking event, with 12 of the 15 ITF Member Nations from the region participating, and it was particularly encouraging to see teams from Guyana and St. Kitts & Nevis after such a long absence. The event also featured players who experienced their first taste of international competition.

The highlight of the event was the performance of Darian King from Barbados, who, although sustaining a shoulder injury during his semifinal against Javier Lewis (TRI), eventually defeated his opponent 75 64 and showed grit and determination by winning the boy's singles event, defeating Liam Gomez (TRI) 61 62.

Gomez went on to win the boy's doubles with compatriot Javier Lewis in a close match against Claudio Dias and Justin Tjon (AHO) 63 46 75.

The girls' event was won by Fausthyara Pietersz (AHO) who reached the final without dropping a set and then went on to beat Lee-Ann Lingo (TRI) 62 62 to take the girls' singles title. Pietersz (AHO) teamed up with Keneel Teesdale (TRI) to repeat success in the girls doubles against Nathalie & Sarah Hew (SUR) 62 63.

The final team rankings in descending order were: Trinidad & Tobago, Netherlands Antilles, Surinam, Barbados, Aruba, St Vincent, St Lucia, Grenada, Bermuda, St Kitts & Nevis, Dominica, Guyana.

Anthony Jeremiah, Development Officer for the English Speaking Caribbean, remarked, "Events like these are essential to the growth and development of players in the English speaking Caribbean. Players, coaches, parents and the Federations should be honoured to be part of this event and should continue to work together in making this event a success each year. It was a privilege for me to oversee such an event and I look forward to the participation of all eligible ITF Member Nations in 2007."
