Italy captures first Fed Cup title

Italy captured its first Fed Cup title in dramatic circumstances after a 3-2 victory over Belgium in the Final of the 2006 Fed Cup by BNP Paribas in Charleroi. Belgian No. 1 Justine Henin-Hardenne was forced to retire in the final set of the deciding doubles, as Italy went on to emulate the achievement of its men's team who captured the Davis Cup 30 years ago in 1976.

Honours were even after the opening day, with Francesca Schiavone overcoming Kirsten Flipkens 61 63, and Henin-Hardenne defeating Flavia Pennetta 64 75. Henin-Hardenne then defeated her opposite number one Schiavone 64 75, before Mara Santangelo brought Italy level with a 67(3) 63 60 victory over Flipkens. Henin-Hardenne, who aggravated a right knee injury during her victory over Schiavone, returned to partner Flipkens in the doubles against Schiavone and Roberta Vinci. However after jarring her knee again in the second game of the final set, the Belgians were forced to retire trailing 36 62 20.

Henin-Hardenne said: "I felt something wrong, something very sudden, but have no regrets. When I walk on the court it's to give 200 per cent. I couldn't do more this weekend, I gave a lot to the team, it wasn't enough." Belgian captain Carl Maes felt that Italy's greater strength in depth was a crucial factor, saying: "The best team has won, let's be clear about that."

Although this was the third successive year that the Fed Cup Final had gone to the final set of the deciding doubles, it was only the second time in the competition's history that the title was decided by injury. Despite the manner of the victory, Italian captain Corrado Barazzutti said afterwards: "I'm very proud of my team and it's an honour for me to be captain of this group. I am very happy, but I am very sorry for Justine Henin-Hardenne, that was not really the way that we wanted to win. But in tennis anything can happen."

A delighted Schiavone added: "I love this, I hope that Italian tennis can improve and grow up from this so everyone can enjoy it."

Buenos Aires and Moscow host semifinals

Argentina and Russia will look to make the most of home advantage when the semifinals of the 2006 Davis Cup by BNP Paribas get underway this Friday. A total of two World Group semifinals, eight World Group play-off ties and eight zonal ties will be held on 22-24 September, with full coverage on the official Davis Cup website www.daviscup.com.

Argentina is bidding to reach its first Davis Cup final in 25 years when it takes on Australia in Buenos Aires on clay. Team captain Alberto Mancini has named an unchanged line-up of David Nalbandian, Agustin Calleri, Jose Acasuso and Juan Ignacio Chela, to take on Australian team led by former world No. 1 Lleyton Hewitt. Hewitt is joined by Mark Philippoussis, Wayne Arthurs and Paul Hanley.

The other semifinal between Russia and USA in Moscow is expected to be a closer affair, with three of the four recent US Open semifinalists in action. Nikolay Davydenko and Mikhail Youzhny line up alongside Marat Safin and Dmitry Tursunov in a strong Russian team, while Andy Roddick is joined by James Blake and doubles team Bob and Mike Bryan in the US quartet. The tie will also be played on clay.

This weekend also sees 16 nations contest the World Group Play-offs in a bid to achieve World Group status in 2007. World No. 1 Roger Federer leads the Swiss team against Slovak Republic in Geneva; while Roland Garros champion Rafael Nadal is in action for Spain against Italy in Santander. Austria takes on Mexico in Portschach; Germany hosts Thailand in Dusseldorf; Netherlands faces Czech Republic in Leiden; Romania is at home to Korea in Bucharest; Slovak Republic takes on Belgium in Bratislava, and Brazil meets Sweden in Belo Horizonte.

Nominations for all ties, including zonal ties, can be found on www.daviscup.com, where you can also view up-to-date results, plus live scoring, news and photographs from the World Group semifinal and play-off ties. Davis Cup Radio will also be on air with a daily update of action from around the world, while there is also free access to www.daviscup.tv, which offers comprehensive video highlights from the weekend's ties.

Davis Cup by BNP Paribas will be broadcast on television in all four nations contesting the World Group semifinals, and 14 of the 16 play-off nations. The draws for all of this weekend's ties will take place on **Thursday 21 September**.

USTA nominates Brown Grimes as President

The USTA has announced the nomination of Jane Brown Grimes as USTA Chairman of the Board and President to serve a two-year term in 2007-2008. Brown Grimes, who is currently completing a two-year term as USTA First Vice President, is scheduled to take office on 1 January 2007. She will become the second female Chairman of the Board and President in USTA history.

In addition to her USTA Board responsibilities, Brown Grimes also serves on the USTA Investment Committee, the ITF's Fed Cup Committee and the Grand Slam Committee. A member of the Tennis in the Parks Task Force, she has previously held positions on the USTA Board as Secretary-Treasurer and Director at Large.

Brown Grimes, who has spent more than 25 years involved in the world of tennis, became Executive Director of the International Tennis Hall of Fame in 1981 and later served as its President and CEO, during which time she oversaw a major restoration of the Hall of Fame's historic buildings and grounds in Newport, RI. Central American & Caribbean Coaches Conference

One hundred and thirty-six coaches from 14 nations attended the 4th ITF Central American & Caribbean Regional Coaches Conference in Panama on 10-15 September. The Conference was held in cooperation with COTECC and the Federacion Panamena de Tenis at the Royal Decameron Beach Resort & Casino, and was designed to bring coaches from the region up-to-date on the latest coaching and sports science news.

The Conference featured keynote international speakers Prof. Bruce Elliott (AUS) and David Sanz (ESP). Elliott is the senior biomechanist in the School of Human Movement and Exercise Science at the University of Western Australia, while Sanz is the Technical Director of the Coaching School of the Spanish Tennis Federation, and National Coach for the Spanish Wheelchair tennis team.

While Elliott's presentations focused on the biomechanics of tennis play, Sanz spoke on a range of topics including motor learning and wheelchair tennis. Other international speakers included Bobby Bernstein and Paul Lubbers (USTA), Edgar Giffenig (MEX), Juan Antonio Pino Perez and Henry Wilfredo (CUB), and Gustavo Granitto (ARG).

Carlos Rodriguez, ITF Development Officer for Central America and the Spanish Speaking Caribbean, said: "It was great to see so many coaches from the region attend the Conference. It's an ideal opportunity for coaches not only to learn more, but also to exchange ideas and further strengthen the good cooperation between countries."

Success for North American ITF Touring Team

Jaak Poldma (EST) and Ksenia Milevskaya (BLR) were the stars of the ITF International Junior Touring Team to North America, whose four-week tour came to an end last week. The Touring Team comprised ten of the world's top junior players, who took part in a two-day training camp in Montreal before contesting three major events on the ITF Junior Circuit. The team travelled under the guidance of three ITF team coaches, Ivan Molina (COL), Frank Zlesak (CZE) and Roberta Burzagli (BRA)

Poldma and Milevskaya won three titles between them at the opening event, the Canadian Junior Open in Quebec. Eighteen-year-old Poldma defeated Peter Polansky of Canada 64 75 in the boys' singles final to score the biggest-ever international success by an Estonian boy. Milevskaya defeated Sharon Fichman (CAN) 62 64 in the girls' singles final, before partnering Ksenia Lykina of Russia to the girls' doubles title.

The US Open proved to be a tougher challenge for the ITF team. In the boys' singles, Lofu Ramiaramanana (MAD) reached the third round, where he was defeated 61 63 by eventual champion Dusan Lojda (CZE). Two of the girls team, Milevskaya and Dilyara Saidjokhaeva (UZB), lost in the second round of the girls' singles, Milevskaya going down to Katerina Vankova (CZE) 67(2) 76(3) 75, and Saidjokhaeva beaten by Sacha Jones (NZL) 46 63 61. Poldma and Ruben Bemelmans (BEL) reached the semifinals of the boys' doubles.

There was further success for the team at the final event in Kentucky, with Jose Robert Velasco (BOL) and Milevskaya carrying off the singles titles. In the finals, Velasco overcame Graeme Dyce (GBR) 26 62 62, while Milevskaya saw off Reka Zsilinszka (USA) 62 36 61.
