Australia loses in first round of Davis Cup by BNP Paribas



Sweden defeats defending champions, Belarus upsets Russia

Australia was the biggest casualty of the first round of the 2004 BNP Paribas, the reigning champions suffering a shock 4-1 defeat to Sweden in Adelaide this weekend. There was bad news for Russia too, the 2002 champions losing 3-2 to World Group newcomers Belarus in Minsk. Another former champion nation, Spain, was saved from defeat by Davis Cup debutant Rafael Nadal, who won the decisive fifth rubber in the Czech Republic to keep their 2004 campaign on track.

Elsewhere, the USA went through to the quarterfinals comfortably against Austria 5-0, Argentina overwhelmed an injury-hit Morocco 5-0 and Australian Open champion Roger Federer helped Switzerland to a 3-2 defeat of Romania. The Netherlands overcame Canada 4-1, and a resurgent Arnaud Clement was key to France's 4-1 defeat of Croatia.

As a result, the quarterfinals will feature USA at home to Sweden, Belarus at home to Argentina, Switzerland hosting France and Spain hosting the Netherlands. The ties will take place 9-11 April.

In Adelaide, Jonas Bjorkman's straight-sets win over Mark Philippoussis 75 62 62, the Australian's second such defeat of the tie, sealed Sweden's victory in the first reverse singles rubber. Australia's loss marks the seventh time since the introduction of the Final Round in 1972 that the defending champion has lost in the opening round the following year, but only the second time that it had happened on home soil. Ironically, the first time it happened was when 1998 winners Sweden lost at home in the first round in 1999.

Playing Belarus in Minsk, Russia was 2-1 ahead after the doubles, Australian Open runner-up Marat Safin bouncing back from a five-set defeat by Max Mirnyi in singles to team with Mikhail Youzhny to victory on Saturday. After Mirnyi drew the hosts level on Sunday however, Youzhny stepped in for the decisive singles instead of Safin and lost to Vladimir Voltchkov 75 62 64. The Belarusian prevailed despite having retired from his singles match on Friday with an ankle injury.

Injury to Juan Carlos Ferrero and Carlos Moya had ruled Spain's top two players out of their away tie to the Czech Republic, and as expected the hosts were tough opposition. After Saturday the Spanish were 1-2 down

Donation from Getronics as Roddick breaks serve speed record

Andy Roddick broke the world speed serve record during the USA v Austria Davis Cup by BNP Paribas first round tie, registering a 150 mph / 241.4kph unreturnable serve on the Getronics Speed Serve in his defeat of Stefan Koubek in the second rubber. He later matched this with a serve in the dead fourth rubber against Jurgen Melzer.

The serve beat the previous record of 149 mph / 239.7 kph that Roddick held jointly with Greg Rusedski.

As a result, the ITF Tennis Development Fund has benefited from a \$1,000 donation from Getronics. As part of their Speed Serve Competition, which will reward the player with the fastest serve in Davis Cup World Group play this year, Getronics has also agreed to donate \$1,000 to the ITF Tennis Development Fund each time the world record is broken in 2004.

Getronics are also donating \$1 to the Fund for every ace served in the World Group in 2004. A total of 700 were served over the weekend, for a further donation of \$700.

Getronics are the official ICT Sponsor of Davis Cup.



After a week of Davis Cup action, the ATP Champions Race 2004 makes its first stop in Europe and the Americas with tournaments taking place in Milan, Vina del Mar and San Jose. Andy Roddick, Andre Agassi, Gustavo Kuerten, Rafael Nadal and Jiri Novak are among those in action. A player's ATP Champions Race position is based on points received from the four Grand Slams, nine Tennis Masters Series tournaments, and his best five results from International Series events. The top seven players in the Race automatically qualify for the eight-player 2004 Tennis Masters Cup in Houston, which is co-owned by the ITF, Grand Slams and ATP.

thanks to the efforts of Jiri Novak and Radek Stepanek, but Feliciano Lopez, a singles replacement for Tommy Robredo, defeated Tomas Berdych before Nadal, playing in his first Davis Cup tie, stepped up against Stepanek for the decisive fifth rubber. The 17-year-old Spanish prodigy put the disappointments of his singles and doubles losses in the previous two days behind him to defeat the more experienced Czech 76 76 63 and secure a 3-2 victory to Spain.

USA's 5-0 whitewash of Austria in Connecticut saw Andy Roddick set a new service speed record of 150 mph / 241.4 kph in his defeat of Stefan Koubek in the second rubber, which he later matched against Jurgen Melzer. (For more details on this see page 2.) World No. 4 Guillermo Coria made a successful debut for Argentina in their first round tie away to Morocco, winning both his singles matches to help the Argentines to a 5-0 victory. Already without the services of Younes El Aynaoui, the hosts were dealt another blow on Friday when Hicham Arazi retired from his match against David Nalbandian with a leg injury and was unable to play for the rest of the weekend.

Federer won all three of his matches in Switzerland's 3-2 defeat of Romania, and the world No. 1's straight-sets victory over Andrei Pavel in the decisive fourth rubber extended his winning streak in singles to 14 matches. Switzerland now have a rematch of last year's quarterfinal when they take on France, who advanced against Croatia after the heroic efforts of Clement, who had singles wins over Mario Ancic and Ivan Ljubicic.

The Netherlands' 4-1 defeat of Canada was tinged with sadness due to Paul Haarhuis' decision to retire from tennis, making his announcement after re-injuring his right shoulder and having to retire from Saturday's doubles match where he was partnering Martin Verkerk. The 37-year-old was playing his 26th tie for the Netherlands in Maastricht, equalling the all-time Dutch record set by Hendrik Timmer. Haarhuis compiled a 31-17 record overall in the competition, 16-9 in doubles, recording the most Davis Cup doubles victories by a Dutchman.

Obituary: Eric Sturgess

South Africa's Eric Sturgess, winner of six Grand Slam doubles titles, died after a short illness on 14 January at the age of 83.

Sturgess won the men's doubles title at the French Championships in 1947 with countryman Eustace Fanning, and five more Grand Slam mixed doubles titles. He was mixed doubles champion twice at Wimbledon, in 1949 with Sheila Summers and in 1950 with Louise Brough, and twice with Summers at the French Championships, in 1947 and 1949. He also won the mixed title at the 1949 US Championships with Brough.

In singles, Sturgess reached three Grand Slam finals, at the 1947 and 1951 French Championships and at the 1948 US Championships. He represented South Africa in Davis Cup in six ties, compiling a 13-5 record in singles and doubles.

Sturgess's success was achieved despite having served six years as a Spitfire pilot in World War Two, where he was shot down and captured, spending the last seven months of the war in a prison camp.



Tennis Europe launches European Solidarity Scheme

Tennis Europe has announced a new Solidarity Scheme for its member nations to provide a solution to lack of funding for new development projects.

The initiative asks that Tennis Europe's more affluent and developed member nations work with less prosperous members to actively seek out mutually beneficial cooperation. The hope is to create interaction between members and increased awareness of their joint responsibility to growing the sport.

Suggested modes of cooperation include staff exchange programmes, loans and exchanges of coaching staff and players, and the donation of surplus and second hand equipment. Nations already taking part in the Solidarity Scheme are Belgium, Denmark, France, Germany, Great Britain, Netherlands, Slovak Republic, Spain and Switzerland.
