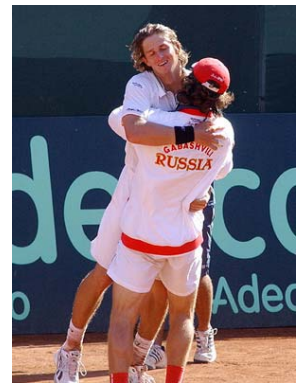


Russia looks to extend winning run

Russia will bid to become the first defending champion to reach the semifinals since 2001 when the quarterfinals of the 2007 Davis Cup by BNP Paribas get underway this Friday. Four World Group quarterfinal ties and 26 Zonal Group I and II ties will be held on 6-8 April, with full coverage on the official Davis Cup website: www.daviscup.com.

Russia, who extended its winning run to five ties with a 3-2 first round victory over Chile away in La Serena, will be looking to make home advantage count when it takes on France indoors on clay in Moscow. Russia welcomes back Nikolay Davydenko in its four-man team against a French side headed by Richard Gasquet. This is the third successive year that the two nations have met at this stage, with the Russians currently enjoying a three-match winning streak in head-to-head encounters.

The competition is guaranteed at least one unseeded semifinalist, with Belgium hosting Germany on clay in Ostend. Belgium, who upset Australia 3-2 in the first round in Liege, is led by Olivier Rochus. Germany will be looking for another strong performance by its No. 1 player Tommy Haas, who won two singles rubber in its 3-2 home win over Croatia.

A capacity crowd of over 14,000 spectators will be supporting the US team in its quarterfinal against Spain on hard court at the Joel Coliseum in Winston-Salem. Andy Roddick, James Blake and the Bryan brothers make up an unchanged USA line-up, while Tommy Robredo heads the Spanish team in the absence of world No. 2 Rafael Nadal.

The remaining tie sees Argentina bid to win back-to-back matches away from home for the first time since 1981 when it takes on Sweden in Gothenburg on carpet. David Nalbandian returns to head an Argentine team that also includes first round hero Juan-Martin Del Potro, while Sweden is led by Robin Soderling, whose two victories helped the team defeat Belarus in Minsk.

In 1981, Argentina won its first two matches in the World Group against West Germany and Romania away from home, before going on to reach the final. The team had to wait another 25 years to reach its second final, losing to Russia in Moscow's title decider in 2006.

Sixteen nations will be contesting Zonal Group I second round ties in the three regions in a bid to qualify for the World Group Play-offs on 21-23 September, where they will join this year's first round losers, Australia, Austria, Belarus, Chile, Croatia, Czech Republic, Romania and Switzerland.

Jankovic and Schnyder head Zonal nominations

World No. 9 Jelena Jankovic (SRB) and No. 16 Patty Schnyder (SUI) head the line-up for the Fed Cup Zonal Group events that take place during the week of 16 April alongside the Fed Cup World Group and World Group II first round ties.

Sixteen teams will contest the Europe/Africa Zone Group I event in Plovdiv, Bulgaria, bidding for two places in the Fed Cup World Group II Play-offs. US Open semifinalist Jankovic leads the Serbian team, while Schnyder heads the line-up for 1998 runner-up Switzerland. Former junior world champions Viktoria Azarenka and Michaela Krajicek lead the Belarus and Netherlands teams respectively, while sisters Agnieszka and Urszula Radwanska team up for Poland. Another pair of sisters, Alona and Katerina Bondarenko, feature in a strong Ukraine line-up boasting three Top 100 players.

Seven teams will contest Asia/Oceania Zone Group I in Christchurch, New Zealand, with one place available in the World Group II Play-offs. Thailand's Tamarine Tanasugarn is the highest ranked player in action. Gisela Dulko heads the Argentine team in Americas Zone Group I in Buenos Aires, which also offers one spot in the Play-offs. Bahamas and Guatemala triumph in junior pre-qualifying

Bahamas girls' team and Guatemala boys' team won the North/Central America & Caribbean pre-qualifying event for the Junior Davis Cup & Junior Fed Cup by BNP Paribas in El Salvador on 26-31 March.

The two 16 & under teams advance to the North/Central America & Caribbean final qualifying event, which will be held in Montreal, Canada on 4-6 May. There they will compete against the teams from Canada, Mexico and USA for the region's two available spots at the Junior Davis Cup & Junior Fed Cup by BNP Paribas Finals to be held on 25-30 September in Reggio Emilia, Italy.

Fourteen boys' and 11 girls' teams represented the 14 participating nations in El Salvador. In the boys' event, top seed Guatemala underlined its strength this year, clinching first place in the Junior Davis Cup just one week after its 14 & under boys' and girls' teams had won the World Junior Tennis pre-qualifying events. It defeated second seed Dominican Republic 3-0 in the final. In the Junior Fed Cup event, second seeded Bahamas upset top seed Guatemala 3-0 in the final having not dropped a single set in six ties played.

Players warm up for African Junior Championships

Africa's leading juniors begin their preparation for the 30th ITF/CAT African Junior Championships (AJC) at the International Junior Championships of Botswana, which take place at the National Tennis Centre in Gaborone on 3-7 April.

The tournament offers competition in three age categories - 18 & under, 16 & under and 14 & under - and serves as the warm-up event to next week's championships which also take place in the Botswana capital on 9-14 April. Both events are being hosted for the first time by the Botswana Tennis Association (BTA) in collaboration with the ITF and the Confederation of African Tennis (CAT).

This week's tournament has attracted entries from 97 boys and 75 girls from 25 nations in the three age categories. The 18 & under events are Grade 3 open events on the ITF Junior Circuit. In the 16 & under and 14 & under age categories, a new format was implemented for the first time in eight years. Players from three of the four African zones (West & Central Africa, Southern Africa and East Africa) competed in zonal championships in January to qualify for a place in both this week's championships and the AJC.

The International Junior Championships of Botswana will allow the African players to adapt to the high altitude conditions. Feed-in consolation events will be organised, so that players have the opportunity to play a singles match every day, giving the players vital match-play in advance of their continent's most prestigious junior tennis event. Tennis Europe enjoys successful AGM

Tennis Austria hosted an outstanding Tennis Europe AGM in Vienna last weekend, the 33rd annual meeting of the ITF's largest regional association.

Delegates from 40 of Tennis Europe's 49 member nations were in attendance to hear presentations on a wide variety of topics. ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti addressed the delegates with a summary of recent ITF activities, while Executive Vice President Juan Margets presented an overview of professional tennis. Both men joined Tennis Europe President John James for an open-floor 'Question and Answer' session.

Robert Marte, Division Manager Racquetsports at HEAD, Tennis Europe's main partner, gave the assembly an introduction to the company and demonstrated HEAD's support for the ITF's 'Play and Stay' programme by donating an extensive mini-tennis kit to all member nations, to be used for coaches' education and in the promotion of the programme.

Applications from Croatia, Israel, Turkey and Ukraine to increase their membership status from C-Nation to B-Nation were approved unanimously by the delegates. Tennis Europe Awards from the Board of Management were approved for Malta Tennis Federation's Lino Farrugia Sacco and Mike Ballardie of Prince Sports Europe, while further awards proposed by member nations were endorsed for Aleksandr Tsaturyan (ARM), Peter Pokorny (AUT), Franz Lemaire (BEL), Henrik Klitvad (DEN), Raimo Karvaila (FIN) and Oleg Kornblit (RUS).
