Spaniard retains Seniors title

Spain's Juan Luis Rascon Lope was crowned men's 35s World Champion for the second consecutive year at the ITF Seniors World Individual Championships in Antalya, Turkey. In front of a capacity Centre Court crowd, the world No. 1 saved a match point in the final against Russia's Andrei Cherkasov, coming from two breaks down in the final set to win 63 36 75.

The women's 35s was an all-Spanish affair between Noelia Perez and Ana Salas Lozano, which lasted almost four hours. In windy conditions both players struggled to hold serve, with the first two sets decided by tiebreaks. Perez eventually took the advantage in the decider to win 67(3) 76(6) 63.

Dutch players picked up two titles as top seed Carin Bakum easily overcame Italian Francesca Ciardi 62 61 in the women's 45s, and Nora Blom beat Great Britain's Marjory Love by the same score in the women's 55s. Klaartje van Baarle of Belgium denied Netherlands a third title, dropping just one game as she eased past Yvonne der Kinderen Hoedt 60 61 in the women's 40s final.

Frank Fevrier (FRA), Val Wilder (USA) and Andrew Rae (AUS), three of the greats of seniors tennis, all added to their World Championship tallies with victories in their respective events. Fevrier picked up his third individual title, beating Adrian Graimprey (LUX) 36 62 60 in the final of the men's 40s. Rae showed his dominance of the men's 55s category as he beat Larry Turville (USA) 61 61 to claim his fifth title. Wilder was crowned world champion for a third time having dominated the men's 45s, although his final opponent John Chatlak (USA) was unable to play due to injury.

The men's and women's 50s were won by Americans Daniel Waldman and Diane Fishburne. Unseeded Waldman conquered Michel Galey (FRA) 61 76(6), while top seed Fishburne overcame compatriot Susan Wright 63 62. For further information, visit www.itftennis.com/seniors.

Fed Cup and Davis Cup venues update


The ITF has granted the USTA and Italian Tennis Federation (FIT) extensions to the deadline for announcing details of their Fed Cup by BNP Paribas semifinal venues. The USTA will now announce the venue for the USA v Russia semifinal on 11 May, while the FIT will announce the Italy v France semifinal venue on 14 May. Both ties will take place on 14-15 July.

Venues for the Fed Cup World Group and World Group II Play-off ties, also held on 14-15 July, will be confirmed on 16 May. Further details will appear on www.fedcup.com.

Venues for the eight Davis Cup by BNP Paribas World Group play-off ties on 21-23 September are due to be announced on 11 May. The Lawn Tennis Association has already confirmed that Great Britain will play Croatia in London on Wimbledon's No. 1 Court.

Moscow and Gothenburg have previously been announced as the venues for the Davis Cup semifinals, between Russia and Germany, and Sweden and USA respectively. For further information, visit www.daviscup.com.

Eighteen teams reach ITF junior finals

Following last week's qualifying events in Canada, Peru and Thailand, another eighteen teams have booked their places at the ITF junior team finals in Reggio Emilia, Italy and Prostějov, Czech Republic.

Sixteen nations participated in the Asia/Oceania qualifying for Junior Davis Cup by BNP Paribas in Bangkok, Thailand. The four qualifying places for the finals in Reggio Emilia went to Australia, Chinese Taipei, China P.R. and Japan.

The South America Junior Davis Cup & Junior Fed Cup by BNP Paribas qualifying was held in Lima, Peru, with Brazil defeating Argentina in the boys' final. Both teams qualify for the Junior Davis Cup Finals, alongside Chile who defeated Venezuela for third place. The girls' teams from Argentina and Chile took the two top spots in the Junior Fed Cup qualifying and will be joined by Paraguay, who dominated Venezuela in the third place play-off.

The final qualifying event of the North/Central America & Caribbean region for both the World Junior Tennis competition and Junior Davis Cup & Junior Fed Cup took place on 4-6 May in Montreal, Canada. USA qualified for all four finals, winning all four events. Host nation Canada achieved the second qualifying spot in Junior Fed Cup, and boys' and girls' World Junior Tennis, while Mexico finished runner-up in Junior Davis Cup.

The last nine places at the team finals are at stake this week. The Asia/Oceania qualifying for Junior Fed Cup takes place on 8-13 May in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. Sixteen teams compete for the three places at the finals. The South America qualifying for the World Junior Tennis competition also started yesterday in La Paz, Bolivia. Ten countries in both the boys' and girls' events area are competing for three available spots at the finals.

Level 2 Officiating School

Chair Umpires from all over Europe attended the Level 2 Officiating School in Sofia, Bulgaria, taught by ITF/Grand Slam Officials Andi Egli and Jake Garner.

Egli, one of the regular teachers of ITF Officiating Schools, said: "This was a very good School, with a high standard from the officials attending, and well organised by the Bulgarian Tennis Federation, especially Nikolai Pravchev. All the students and teachers were made to feel very welcome during our stay in Sofia."

The participants also umpired during qualifying for the ITF Men's Circuit event being played in Sofia to demonstrate their ability to officiate in professional tennis tournaments. The following 21 candidates passed the final written examination on the Rules of Tennis, Code of Conduct and other procedures to become new White Badge Officials:

Registration now open for TST Congress

More than 50 scientific papers are to be presented at the 3rd ITF International Congress on Tennis Science & Technology, which will be held at Roehampton University in south west London on 10-12 September 2007. This outstanding conference venue is near the International Tennis Federation's offices and the new LTA National Tennis Centre.

As with the previous congresses held in 2000 and 2003, TST 3 aims to provide a unique international forum for scientists, engineers, researchers, manufacturers and coaches from around the world who are involved in the sport of tennis.

Papers will be presented on the following themes:

- Equipment: *the impact of science and technology on tennis equipment*
- The Game: *initiatives to improve the game through new technology*
- Sports Science: *the benefits of sports science to the tennis player*

A book containing the papers presented at the Congress is to be published, with all delegates attending TST 3 receiving a copy. The author(s) of the best paper given at TST 3 will be presented with the Howard Brody Award for an original contribution to the science and technology of tennis. The prize winner will also receive a cash prize of \$1,000 which has been donated by CISLUNAR Aerospace.

Delegates will also be given an opportunity to visit the All England Lawn Tennis Club at Wimbledon for a behind-the-scenes tour of the grounds, followed by a dinner in the No. 1 Court debenture lounge overlooking the outside courts.

TST 3 is open to anyone with an interest in the science of tennis. Delegate registration opens on Monday 7th May, with discounts available for bookings received before 11 July. In addition, representatives from National Associations and ITF Foundation member companies are entitled to discounts on the registration fees.

Clijsters retires

Former world No. 1 Kim Clijsters of Belgium has announced her retirement from tennis. The 23-year old spent nine seasons as a professional, winning 34 career singles titles and 11 doubles titles, and earning \$14.5 million in career prize money. Her highlights included capturing her first Grand Slam title at the 2005 US Open, and leading Belgium to the 2001 Fed Cup title.

Honoured as ITF World Champion in 2005, Clijsters was also named Belgian Sportswoman of the year five times, and received the Karen Krantzcke Sportsmanship award from her peers an unprecedented six out of seven years.

Clijsters said: "I am extremely proud of what I have achieved in my career. Tennis has been an amazing journey for me all over the world and I'm very happy to have met the people that I did. I couldn't have done all that I did, without the support of my family and coaches who worked with me, and to them I'm truly grateful. I am also thankful to all the encouragement from the fans over the years and the media's support in following my career."
