Russia regains Fed Cup title

Russia captured its third Fed Cup title by defeating defending champion Italy 4-0 in the final of the 2007 Fed Cup by BNP Paribas at Moscow's Luzhniki stadium. US Open finalist Svetlana Kuznetsova gave the hosts a 3-0 winning lead as the Russians won the trophy for the third time in four years.

The tie saw heartbreak for Italian No. 1 Francesca Schiavone who lost two dramatic three-set matches as the visitors saw their six-match winning-streak come to an end. She let slip a 3-0 lead in the final set to lose the opening singles to Anna Chakvetadze 64 46 64, before Kuznetsova overwhelmed Mara Santangelo 61 62 to put the Russians in charge. Schiavone then missed two match points on the second day against Kuznetsova before losing 46 76(7) 75 in two hours 48 minutes. After serving for the match at 5-4 in the second set, the Italian held two match points in the tiebreak, and then squandered a 4-1 lead in the final set. Elena Vesnina overcame Mara Santangelo 62 64 in the dead singles rubber before the final doubles was cancelled.

A delighted Kuznetsova said afterwards: I was really motivated and wanted to fight so much. The crowd was amazing and the team gave me so much support. I was tired but had the power of my teammates. I felt we were all together."

A disappointed Schiavone rued the loss of the two match points. She said: "I am a little bit sad, because I had a chance but didn't take it. I could have won both of my matches which would have made a big difference."

Russian Shamil Tarpishchev had little time to savour victory as he begins his preparations as captain of Russia's Davis Cup team, which takes on Germany in Moscow this weekend in the World Group semifinals. The 59-year-old, in his 101st tie as captain, dedicated his latest victory to the former Russian president Boris

Yeltsin. He said: "When Yeltsin picked up a tennis racket in the early 1990s, the game just took off in our country. And today you see the results of that work."

The International Tennis Hall of Fame and the ITF announced that Italian Lea Pericoli is the recipient of the 2007 Fed Cup Award of Excellence. Pericoli was presented with the award on Sunday during the Final by ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti, 2005 Fed Cup Award of Excellence winner Francoise Durr (FRA) and Ann Haydon Jones (GBR).

Gothenburg and Moscow host semifinals

Russia and Sweden will look to make the most of home advantage when the semifinals of the 2007 Davis Cup by BNP Paribas get underway this Friday. A total of two World Group semifinals, eight World Group play-off ties and eight zonal ties will be held on 21-23 September, with full coverage on the official Davis Cup website www.daviscup.com.

US Open semifinalist Nikolay Davydenko heads a strong Russian line-up for its indoor clay-court tie against Germany in Moscow. He is joined by Mikhail Youzhny, Dmitry Tursunov and Igor Andreev to face the German team of Tommy Haas, Philipp Kohlschreiber, Alexander Waske and Philipp Petzschner.

The other semifinal sees an unchanged USA team of Andy Roddick, James Blake, and Mike and Bob Bryan start as favourites to defeat Sweden on indoor carpet in Gothenburg. The Swedish team sees the return of Joachim Johansson alongside Jonas Bjorkman, Thomas Johansson and US Open doubles champion Simon Aspelin.

This weekend also sees 16 nations contest the World Group Play-offs in a bid to achieve World Group status in 2008. World No. 1 Roger Federer leads the Swiss team against Czech Republic in Prague; while US Open runner-up Novak Djokovic is in action for Serbia against Australia in front of an expected crowd of 20,000 spectators in Belgrade. Austria hosts Brazil in Innsbruck; Peru takes on Belarus in Lima; Great Britain meets Croatia at Wimbledon; Japan is at home to Romania in Osaka; Slovak Republic hosts Korea, Rep. in Bratislava; while Israel faces Chile in Ramat Hasharon in a tie played on 20, 21 and 23 September.

Nominations for all ties, including zonal ties, can be found on www.daviscup.com, where you can also view up-to-date results, plus live scoring, news and photographs from the World Group semifinal and play-off ties. Davis Cup Radio will also be on air with a daily update of action from around the world, while there is also free access to www.daviscup.tv, which offers comprehensive video highlights from the weekend's ties. The draws for all of this weekend's ties will take place on **Thursday 20 September**.

Kunieda and Vergeer bid for wheelchair grand slam

World No. 1 players Shingo Kunieda (JPN) and Esther Vergeer (NED) this week bid to become the first players to complete the wheelchair tennis grand slam as they head the men's and women's fields for the US Open Wheelchair Tennis Championships in San Diego, the fourth and final Super Series event of the 2007 NEC Wheelchair Tennis Tour.

Since the Japan Open became the fourth tournament to be awarded Super Series status in 2004 no player has won all four Super Series events in the same year, but both Kunieda and Vergeer remain on course having won the singles titles at this year's Australian Open, Japan Open and British Open.

Kunieda currently holds all four titles, having won his first US Open in October 2006, but the defending men's champion will have strong opposition from world No. 2 Robin Ammerlaan (NED), who aims for his first US Open success after several appearances in the final, and 2005 champion Michael Jeremiasz (FRA). Another strong challenge is likely to come from current world No. 3 Stephane Houdet (FRA), who has beaten all three players this year.

In the women's singles, Vergeer bids to win her seventh US Open title, with last year's runner-up Florence Gravelier (FRA) among the challengers. Also competing are Vergeer's compatriots Sharon Walraven, Jiske Griffioen and Korie Homan. In the quarterfinals of last year's US Open, Homan became the only player to win a set against Vergeer in 2006, while Homan also took the world No. 1 to three sets in the final of last weekend's Atlanta Masters.

The quad singles features the world's top four players, David Wagner (USA), Peter Norfolk (GBR), Nick Taylor (USA) and Sarah Hunter (CAN). Norfolk and Taylor have shared the US Open title between them since 2000, with defending champion Norfolk a four-time winner in San Diego.

ITF hosts successful TST Congress

The ITF Science & Technical Department hosted its 3rd International Congress on Tennis Science & Technology (TST) at Whitelands College at the University of Roehampton in London last week. Over 90 of the world's leading tennis science and technology researchers were present for three days of outstanding presentation and discussion.

Almost 50 presentations were given, the standard of which was extremely high. In addition to academics, the delegates included representatives from the equipment manufacturers, coaches, court constructors and national governing bodies. The congress was officially opened by ITF Vice President Geoff Pollard who commented that the Congress was a gathering of "the brains of tennis", and how understanding technology was crucial to the future of the game. In addition, he contributed to four scientific papers which focused on the probability of a player winning a match based on improving their level of play at different stages of the match.

Two keynote presentations were given: the first, by Dr Stuart Miller, ITF Head of Science & Technical, and which opened the Congress, discussed the role of the Science & Technical Department in the development of rules and regulations for tennis equipment. This presentation included an overview of the projects undertaken by the ITF Technical Centre, and their contribution to the understanding and protection of the nature of tennis. The second was presented by Professor Steve Haake of Sheffield Hallam University, Great Britain, who examined the evolution of the tennis racket and its effect on serve speed.

To encourage debate amongst the delegates, a discussion panel, entitled 'Rules are made to be broken: where does tennis go from here?', addressed current issues with respect to the Rules of Tennis. As Chairman of the ITF Rules of Tennis Committee, Geoff Pollard played a major part on the distinguished panel, and was joined by Chris Bowers (journalist and broadcaster), Steven Martens (LTA Head of Technical Support), Angie Cunningham (Vice-President, Player Relations, Sony Ericsson WTA Tour), and Ralph Schwenger (Head Sport AG, R&D Director Racketsports). Among the many topics discussed during the discussion were electronic line-calling, equipment development, player physiology and coaching.

The quality of presentations was extremely high, and covered a variety of topics, including equipment technology, player development and analysis, and the environment. The second Howard Brody Award (sponsored by CISLunar Aerospace) for outstanding contributed paper, which was presented in person by Professor Brody, went to Simon Choppin of Sheffield University, Great Britain, for a paper on the three-dimensional analysis of racket and ball during play. Professor Brody commented that the 3rd TST Congress was thought-provoking, and generated more interaction between delegates than either of the two previous events.

Over 40 delegates took the opportunity to visit the ITF Technical Centre, which contains the world's leading tennis-specific research and testing laboratory. Prior to the congress dinner being held at the All England Lawn Tennis Club, delegates also had the opportunity to tour the facility for a behind-the-scenes look at Wimbledon.

The congress dinner was attended by ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti, who stressed the importance of technology in tennis, and the responsibility of the ITF to control the nature of the game through an understanding of equipment.

Success for Guatemala at Development Championships

Guatemala dominated the 10th ITF Central American 14 & Under Development Championships which took place last week in Nicaragua. The event, which was organised for the first time by the Federacion Nicaraguense de Tenis in collaboration with COTECC, saw the participation of six nations from the region with 16 boys and 12 girls taking part.

The participating nations were Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua and Panama. The Championships were held over six days and the singles events comprised a round-robin tournament on the first two days progressing to a feed-in consolation event over the following four days, which ensured that players played a singles match each day.

The Championships were dominated by the team from Guatemala. In the boys singles finals, Wilfredo Gonzalez defeated teammate Rudy Richter 62 63 and this pairing went on to take the doubles title, defeating Alberto Suriano and Rafael Orantes of El Salvador 41 41.

In the girls singles final, Guatemalan Jennifer Pusey defeated Leyla Tarecena of Honduras 64 62. Rosaline Chavez and Alma Espinoza of Panama defeated the Nicaraguan duo, Zuniga and Toruno 40 42, to take the girls doubles title.

Carlos Rodriguez, ITF Development Officer for the region, said: "These types of development events ensure that nations maintain development programmes in their own countries. They also give new generations of players the opportunity to train and to reach optimum physical, technical, tactical and mental condition so as to be able to represent their nations in the best way they can."

Berankis stars for ITF Touring Team

Ricardas Berankis of Lithuania was the star of the ITF International Junior Touring Team to North America that completed a successful four-week trip at the weekend. The 17-year-old improved his ITF Junior World Ranking to No. 2 after capturing the singles titles at the Canadian Open and US Open Junior Championships.

The team comprised nine of the world's top junior players, who took part in a two-day training camp in Montreal before contesting three major events on the ITF Junior Circuit under ITF team coaches Ivan Molina (COL), Frank Zlesak (CZE) and Roberta Burzagli (BRA).

At the Canadian Junior Open in Quebec, Berankis upset teammate and No. 1 seed Vladimir Ignatik (BLR) in the semifinals, before overcoming another team member Guillermo Rivera-Aranguiz (CHI) 61 64 in the final. Ignatik went on to win the doubles title with Roman Jebavy (CZE). There was also success in the girls' events, with Oksana Kalashnikova (GEO) winning the girls' doubles title in partnership with Ksenia Lykina (RUS).

Berankis continued his run at the last Grand Slam junior event of the year, the US Open, where he defeated Jerzy Janowicz (POL) 63 64 in the final. Kalashnikova reached the girls' singles semifinals and the doubles final partnering Lykina. There were more doubles titles for the team at the final event in Kentucky, where Kalashnikova won the girls' event with Elena Chernyakova (RUS), and Rivera-Aranguiz taking the boys' doubles title with fellow Chilean Ricardo Urzua-Rivera.

Frank Couraud, ITF Development Projects Administrator, said: "Berankis has received continuous support from the ITF from the age of 12 and has been invited to various ITF teams. The ITF teams are there to provide competitive opportunities to players who would not have this chance otherwise. This year the International Junior Touring Teams have had the most outstanding results since they started in 1986, with two Grand Slam junior champions, Ignatik at Roland Garros and Berankis at the US Open, and Ignatik runner-up at Wimbledon."

Super-Seniors team entries

One hundred and six teams from 23 nations have entered the 2007 Super-Seniors World Team Championships. The Cup events in the categories men's 60 to 80 and women's 60 to 75 will be held from 26 November until 1 December in Christchurch and Ashburton, New Zealand. The team events will be followed by the Super-Seniors World Individual Championships taking place on 2-9 December in Christchurch. The entry deadline for the Individual Championships is Monday 22 October 2007.
