Spain serves up another surprise

The Spanish team produced another upset in the 2008 Fed Cup by BNP Paribas World Group Semifinals, defeating China 4-1 in Beijing. Spain will host Russia in the final on September 13-14, after the defending champion scored a 3-2 victory over USA in Moscow.

Following an away victory in Italy in the first round, Spain travelled to Beijing with just one player with any notable Fed Cup experience but two victories from Nuria Llagostera Vives, coupled with a stunning singles debut by Carla Suarez-Navarro, saw the five-time champion advance to its first Fed Cup Final since 2002.

Suarez-Navarro overcame a ranking gap of more than 60 places with a 63 76 victory against Shuai Peng in the tie's opening rubber, before Llagostera Vives dominated Jie Zheng 63 64 in the second and then completed Spain's triumph with a 64 64 defeat of Peng.

"I'm feeling unbelievable now; I'm very excited about playing in my first final. We've always had a very good atmosphere and we're all very good friends. We have fun together and I think that's very important," said a delighted Llagostera Vives afterwards. Zheng restored some pride for China in the first of the dead rubbers but Spain took the doubles for a final 4-1 scoreline.

In Moscow, Anna Chakvetadze, Svetlana Kuznetsova and Vera Zvonareva were all victorious as the defending champion eased into its fourth Fed Cup final in five years. A depleted USA side fought hard throughout the tie but were unable to bridge the gap to a team containing three of the world's top 15.

Chakvetadze subdued the tenacious challenge of Vania King in the first rubber, winning 64 75, before Kuznetsova simply outclassed Ahsha Rolle 61 62 in the second. The in-form Zvonareva stepped in for Kuznetsova for the third rubber and once the Russian had found her rhythm on the red clay, having not played on the surface for almost two years, it was just a matter of time before she would clinch the tie, defeating King 46 63 62.

"It's a pleasure for me to be back in the team. All the girls are really good, the coaches are great and I'm just happy to be part of the best team in the world," said Zvonareva.

Russia has now won 13 of its last 14 Fed Cup ties and with eight women currently ranked above Spanish No.1 Anabel Medina Garrigues will be a huge favourite for September's final, but the Spanish have twice shown that they are a force to be reckoned with, and they will have home advantage for the first time this year. The venue and surface for the final will be announced on 6 May.

In the World Group Play-offs, Italy and France retained their places in the World Group while Argentina and Czech Republic earned promotion. France easily defeated Japan in Tokyo, while Francesca Schiavone was again heroine for Italy against Ukraine. Gisela Dulko scored two victories for Argentina as it overcame Germany while Czech Republic clinched an exciting doubles rubber to edge Israel. Japan, Ukraine, Germany and Israel will start 2009 in World Group II.

Serbia earned a place in World Group II for the first time with Ana Ivanovic and Jelena Jankovic contributing to a 3-2 victory against Croatia, while Switzerland fought back for a 3-2 win against Austria to return to World Group II. The other two ties saw Belgium and Slovak Republic comfortably hold on to their World Group II places for next year's competition against Colombia and Uzbekistan, who return to Zonal Group I in 2009, along with Austria and Croatia.

DAVIS CUP[®] by BNP PARIBAS Ten Spanish cities bid to host semifinal

The Spanish Tennis Federation (RFET) has announced that ten cities have officially bid to host the Davis Cup by BNP Paribas World Group Semifinal against USA on 19-21 September.

The ten cities are: Barcelona, Benidom, Gijon, Jerez de la Frontera, Madrid, Malaga, Marbella, Murcia, Santa Cruz de Tenerife and Santander. Each proposed venue has a capacity of at least 12,000 with four of them detailing a capacity of up to 20,000 and beyond. The highest attendance for a Davis Cup tie was set at the Spain versus USA World Group Final in 2004 in Seville when the daily crowd numbered 27,200.

A shortlist of candidates will be drawn up by RFET. After each of the shortlisted cities has been visited, a final selection will be made on 9 May. The chosen venue will be forwarded to the ITF for approval, subject to a successful site visit.

China's girls head Asia/Oceania qualifiers on home soil

China, Uzbekistan, Australia and Japan secured the four spots for the World Junior Tennis Competition Finals at the Asia/Oceania girls' final qualifying event of the World Junior Tennis Competition staged last week in Shenzhen, China. The Finals will be held on 4-9 August in Prostějov, Czech Republic.

In the semifinals, third seed China defeated top seed Japan, while fourth seed Australia lost to seventh seed Uzbekistan. China then went on to beat Uzbekistan in the deciding doubles in the final, while Australia won 3-0 against Japan in the match for third place.

This week ITF Junior Team Competition continues on three continents. At the South American qualifying for the World Junior Tennis Competition in Caracas, Venezuela, ten nations will be competing for the two girls' and three boys' spots at the Finals. India will host the final qualifying for Junior Davis Cup by BNP Paribas in New Delhi where 16 teams will be trying to secure one of the four available places at the Finals.

At the North/Central America & Caribbean final qualifying event for the World Junior Tennis Competition and Junior Davis Cup & Junior Fed Cup by BNP Paribas, in Montreal, Canada, two teams in the 14 & under age category will qualify for the Finals in Prostějov, while one team in the 16 & under age category will join host nation Mexico at the Finals in St. Luis Potosi. Pro Circuit triumph for Fabbiano

Thomas Fabbiano (ITA) defeated Victor Ionita (ROU) 62 62 to capture his first senior singles title at the recent \$10,000 Futures tournament in Francavilla, Italy. It was the second title of the year for the 18-year-old, who also collected the doubles crown at the Croatia F5 Futures in Vrsar.

Fabbiano was ranked No. 7 on the 2007 year-end ITF Junior World Ranking. The ITF Junior Exempt Project, introduced for the first time in 2007 for boys, rewards the year-end top 10 male junior players with direct acceptance into the main draw of three selected ITF Men's Circuit tournaments from \$10,000 to \$15,000.

South America and Asia are now into a busy ITF Pro Circuit period. Last week Brazil started off the first of an 11-strong series of tournaments with a \$10,000 Futures in Ribeirao Preto, Sao Paulo. Colombia, Argentina, Venezuela, Peru and Paraguay will all host their first Circuit tournaments between April and June.

Japan will host three Women's Circuit \$50,000 back-to-back tournaments over the next few weeks, with events in Gifu, Fukuoka and Kurume. Japan's Aiko Nakamura and Thailand's top female, Tamarine Tanasugarn, both of whom are currently in the WTA Tour top 100 at Nos. 82 and 89 respectively, are the highest ranked entrants for the three tournaments.
