## ITF to honour Yannick Noah at World Champions Dinner

The ITF will present its highest accolade, the Philippe Chatrier Award, to Yannick Noah (FRA) at the ITF World Champions Dinner in Paris on 1 June. ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti will present Noah with this prestigious award in recognition of his wide-ranging and far-reaching contributions to tennis.

Named after former long-standing ITF President Philippe Chatrier, the award is bestowed upon people or organisations who, in the opinion of the ITF Board of Directors, have made an exceptional contribution to tennis.

In 1983 Yannick claimed French hearts by becoming the first of his countrymen to win at Roland Garros since 1946, defeating Mats Wilander in the final. He went on to win the Roland Garros doubles title in 1984, teamed with Henri Leconte. In 1986 Yannick reached his highest ranking of No. 3 in singles and No. 1 in doubles.

Yannick was a vibrant and dedicated team player, playing for his country in 22 Davis Cup ties with a 39-22 win-loss record. As charismatic a captain as he was a player, Yannick led his country to its first Davis Cup title in 59 years when France defeated the United States in Lyon in 1991. Noah again tasted Davis Cup victory as captain in 1996 then led France's Fed Cup team to their first Fed Cup title in 1997.

Yannick has been an ITF ambassador for Wheelchair tennis, showing his support at the World Team Cup in New York in 1999 and more recently playing an exhibition match at the 2003 Wheelchair Masters. But Yannick's contributions don't stop at tennis. His concern for others has seen him invest time and effort into creating two charities - both run by his mother Marie-Claire Noah - for the benefit of children less fortunate than himself. Les Enfants de la Terre provides a temporary home for children in need, while Fete le Mur gives free use of sports facilities to children and teenagers from under-privileged backgrounds.

Noah now joins the illustrious group of Philippe Chatrier Award winners. Previous recipients are Stefan Edberg, Chris Evert, Rod Laver, Nicola Pietrangeli, former IOC President Juan Antonio Samaranch, long-term Davis Cup sponsor NEC, Jack Kramer, and last year Billie Jean King.

## Second Grand Slam of 2004 underway in Paris









Roland Garros, the second Grand Slam event of the year, is currently underway in Paris. In the men's draw, No. 1 seed Roger Federer (SUI) will be hoping to become the first man since Jim Courier (USA) in 1992 to win Australian Open and Roland Garros titles back-to-back within a calendar year.

In the women's event, defending champion and No. 1 seed Justine Henin-Hardenne (BEL) will be aiming to become the first woman to win consecutive Roland Garros titles since Steffi Graf in 1996.

The top seven players in the Race, plus eligible Grand Slam champions, automatically qualify for the eight-player 2004 Tennis Masters Cup in Houston on 13-21 November. The event is co-owned by the ITF, Grand Slams and ATP.

## Venues for Davis Cup Semifinals and Play-offs are set

The remaining three venues have been confirmed for the Davis Cup by PNP Paribas Semifinal and Play-off ties. The USTA has announced that the Family Circle Tennis Center in Charleston, S.C., has been selected as the site for the USA v Belarus World Group Semifinal on 24-26 September. The first ever Davis Cup tie to be held in South Carolina will be played on hard court. Tickets will go on sale in mid-June.

In the World Group Play-off ties Great Britain will travel to Portschach to play Austria on clay, while Croatia will host Belgium in Rijeka.

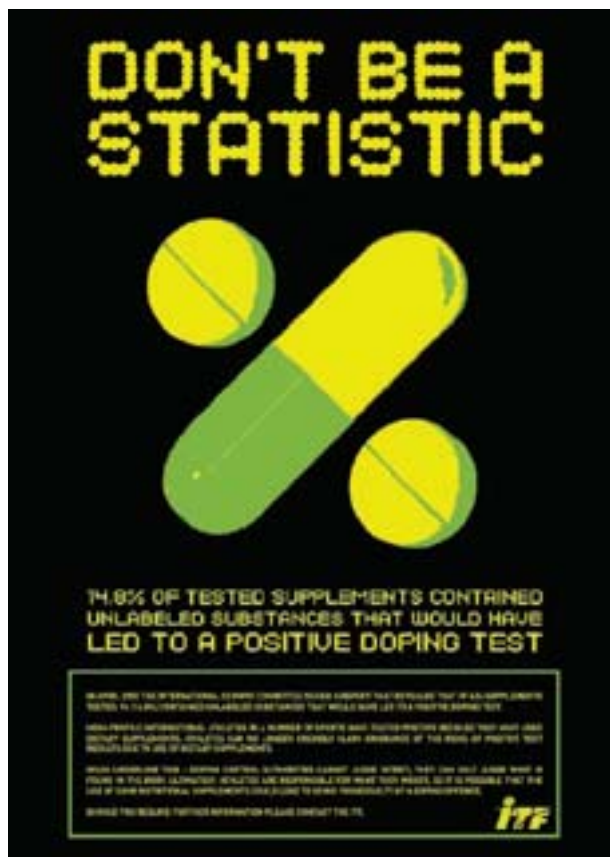

## ITF launches Anti-Doping Campaign at Roland Garros



The ITF today launched an anti-doping campaign at Roland Garros. The campaign is produced in association with the Grand Slams and will feature at all the forthcoming Grand Slams and at Davis Cup and Fed Cup ties.

The purpose of the campaign is to warn the elite players of the dangers associated with the consumption of dietary supplements. Supplements are often not manufactured to the same standard as prescription medications and are consequently subject to contamination. In April 2002 the IOC issued a report that revealed that of 634 supplements tested, 94 or 14.8% contained unlabeled substances that would have produced a positive doping test. High profile international athletes in a number of sports have tested positive because they have used dietary supplements. Athletes can no longer credibly claim ignorance of the risks of a positive test arising from dietary supplements and it is probable that a positive analytical analysis arising from a contaminated supplement would result in a Doping Offence.

The poster campaign seeks to highlight this fact. The pills and capsules are arranged in the sign for a percentage with the message "Don't be a statistic". It is hoped that the players adopt this message.

## Finalists confirmed for ITF team competitions

Ten nations have secured their place in the World Junior Tennis Finals (14 and under), Junior Davis Cup by BNP Paribas and Junior Fed Cup Finals (16 and under), after they finished top in their respective regional qualifying events. The European Qualifying Events, to be played in June and July, will confirm five more nations in the finals to join the host nation and complete the final line-up of 16.

Nations from the Asia/Oceania region faced each other at Melbourne Park last week to fight for the three boys' and four girls' places in the World Junior Tennis Finals. For the second successive year the home teams came out on top. The second seeded girls from Japan and boys from Thailand finished second behind the Australians. The girls from Indonesia and Korea and the boys from Korea will join them in the finals.

The South American WJT qualifying event saw the top seeded Argentinean girls sail to victory, only losing one match in the process. Second seeds Peru will join in them in the finals. Top seeds Brazil were victorious in the boy's competition and will be joined by Venezuela and Argentina in the finals.

The North/Central America and the Caribbean Pre-Qualifying event saw the boys from Guatemala and the girls from Dominican Republic move on to compete against the teams from USA, Canada and Mexico at the Final Qualifying event in Key Biscayne, Florida. USA and Mexico qualified in each category.

Despite facing monsoon rain at the Asia/Oceania Junior Davis Cup Qualifying Event, India still managed to come out on top without losing a match. Australia, Japan and Chinese Taipei will join them in the finals in Barcelona. China, Chinese Taipei and Japan qualified for the Junior Fed Cup Finals.

There were some unexpected results in the South American 16 & under Qualifying event, where unseeded teams won three out of the six final places. Top seeded Argentina cruised to the finals in both categories, but was surprisingly joined by the girls from Brazil and Chile and the boys from Venezuela. The Colombian boys took the remaining place.

Due to the new regional distribution, only one Junior Davis Cup Finals place was available to the competing nations in the North/Central American and the Caribbean Qualifying event. The home nation America rose to the challenge and took top spot in both categories, with the girls from Canada also qualifying for the Junior Fed Cup Finals.

The African Regional Qualifying event was part of the African Junior Championships. The South African and Egyptian boys teams and the Tunisian and Egyptian girls teams qualified for the World Junior Tennis Finals while the Tunisian and Moroccan boys teams and the Moroccan and Egyptian girls' teams qualified for the Junior Davis Cup and Junior Fed Cup Finals.

The remaining six places in the finals will be decided at the European World Junior Tennis Qualifying event on 27 June - 4 July and the European World Junior Davis Cup and Junior Fed Cup Qualifying event on 27 July - 4 August.

The World Junior Tennis Final will take place in Prostějov in the Czech Republic from 2 - 7 August and the Junior Davis Cup and Junior Fed Cup will be hosted at the Real Club de Polo de Barcelona in Spain from 28 September - 3 October.

## Italian success for Karatancheva and Rieschick

Two new names were added to the juniors' Grade A roll of honour as Sesil Karatancheva and Sebastian Rieschick won the girls and boys' singles titles at the Italian Junior Open Championships, which concluded in Milan on Sunday.

Karatancheva from Bulgaria enhanced her growing reputation defeating surprise finalist Viktoria Azarenka from Belarus 57 62 61 to lift the trophy. The fourteen-year-old, who already has a WTA ranking inside the top 200, had difficulty in the first set as the Belarusian used her drop shot to great effect to take the initiative. But Karatancheva's greater power and consistency eventually turned things in her favour.

"I aim to win every tournament that I take part in," Karatancheva said afterwards, "I know that after my performance in Indian Wells, people have higher expectations but I am ready to meet those."

Karatancheva, who has won five of her last seven tournaments on the ITF Junior Circuit, moved up to No. 11 in the new ranking and will undoubtedly start as one of the favourites to lift the Roland Garros junior title in two weeks time. Azarenka, just a week older than her opponent, had eliminated defending champion and top seed Michaella Krajicek from the Netherlands in the semifinals and was the only player to take a set off Karatancheva all week; she is rewarded with a career-high ranking of 15.

Sebastian Rieschick struggled to gain any rhythm early in the week and was taken to three sets before winning each of his opening three matches. However, from the moment the German assumed the mantle of favourite, after the defeat of top-seeded countryman Mihail Zverev in the last sixteen, he settled and put in three solid performances, culminating with a 62 75 victory over Argentina's Juan Martin Del Potro in the final.

Rieschick used his greater experience to good effect against an opponent some two and a half years younger and although Del Potro made a better fight of the second set, Rieschick always appeared to be the likely winner. The German has now moved up a spot to No. 2 in the current world rankings while Del Potro rises to a career-best of 16.

USA's Brendan Evans and Scott Oudsema won the boys doubles' title with a 64 62 victory over India's Karan Rastogi and Chinese Taipei's Chu-Huan Yi to add to their Australian Junior title. Azarenka combined with ITF teammate and countrywoman Volha Havartsova to defeat Karatancheva and New Zealand's Marina Erakovic 26 62 63.
