## ITF to honour Federer, Henin and Fraser

With Roland Garros well underway, the ITF will once again host the annual ITF World Champions Dinner to celebrate the achievements of its 2007 World Champions and honour a true Davis Cup champion with the prestigious Philippe Chatrier Award.

Held at the Pavillon d'Armenonville in Paris's Bois de Boulogne on Tuesday 3 June, over 400 guests from the tennis world gather to pay tribute to the ten players to have finished last year as No. 1 in the world.

This year's recipients are singles champions Roger Federer and Justine Henin, doubles champions Bob and Mike Bryan, and Cara Black and Liezel Huber, junior champions Ricardas Berankis and Urszula Radwanska, and wheelchair champions Shingo Kunieda and Esther Vergeer.

Federer, who finished 2007 at world No. 1 for the 204<sup>th</sup> consecutive week, receives the award for the fourth year in a row and Tuesday will also be the chance to recognise the talents of three-time recipient Henin, who recently announced her retirement from professional tennis.

The Bryans and Vergeer, regular honourees at the ITF's gala dinner, join first-time champions Huber, Berankis, Radwanska and Kunieda, and for Black, it's another trophy to add to her junior champion award from 1997.

This year the ITF's highest accolade, the Philippe Chatrier Award, will be presented to Neale Fraser, a name which has become synonymous with the Davis Cup for the past 53 years. Renowned for his dedication, passion and patriotism, Fraser's part in Australia's Davis Cup history has grown from player, to captain, to ambassador. Since making his debut in the 1958 final against the USA, he lifted the trophy 11 times, four as a captain after succeeding Harry Hopman in 1970 and holding the position for 24 years to become the competition's longest-serving captain.

When he bowed out in 1993, finishing on a high by leading Australia to its 57<sup>th</sup> final, he became a member of the Davis Cup Committee, a position which he still holds today. Fraser was also honoured as a Centenary Ambassador for Davis Cup and was the first recipient of the ITF and International Hall of Fame's Davis Cup Award of Excellence. He is the third Australian to win the Philippe Chatrier Award, after Rod Laver in 1998 and Margaret Court in 2006.

The evening's celebrations will be presented by former British Davis Cup player and current television presenter and tennis commentator Andrew Castle, with ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti bestowing the awards – trophies designed by internationally-recognised sculptor Laurence Broderick – to the champions.

## Junior Roland Garros wide open

The Roland Garros Junior Championships got underway on Sunday, and both boys' and girls' events are wide open.

In the boys' event, top seed and Australian Open winner Bernard Tomic (AUS) will be looking to win his second Grand Slam title. Tomic was unbeatable in the two tournaments he played in Australia at the start of the year, but he lacks clay-court experience compared to many of his rivals in Paris. World No. 4 Cesar Ramirez (MEX) won the Grade A Casablanca Cup at the start of the year and reached the Roland Garros quarterfinals last year, but his retirement due to injury in the first round of last week's Astrid Bowl suggests he may not be fully fit for Paris.

The girls' draw could see an intriguing battle between Melanie Oudin (USA), winner of 39 of her last 40 matches on the ITF Junior Circuit, and Australian Open champion Arantxa Rus (NED).

Oudin's dominance of the circuit has been highly impressive, but has taken place entirely in the USA. Her best Grand Slam result so far is the second round of the US Open, but her main rivals in Paris have much more experience at this level.

World No. 3 Rus won the Australian Open but has never had outstanding results on clay. She lost in the first round of the Italian Open and will need to play better if she is to have a chance of adding to her Grand Slam collection.

Other contenders among the girls include Simona Halep (ROU) and Bojana Jovanovski (SRB), the two finalists at the Italian Open, who both have excellent records on clay.

## Women's event continues upward march

For the fourth consecutive year the ITF Women's Circuit tournament at the Tiro A Volo tennis club in Rome, Italy, has upgraded its prize money. Starting at \$10,000 in 2005, the tournament now offers \$75,000 to the participants.

The investment has certainly had the desired effect in attracting star names. Jelena Dokic, who has played on the ITF Women's Circuit for ten years, has accepted a wild card into the tournament, which started today.

Dokic is a former Roland Garros quarterfinalist and Wimbledon semifinalist. Now on the comeback trail, Dokic is looking to add to the back to back \$25,000 titles she won at Florence and Caserta earlier this month.

## Beach Tennis tournament grades announced

Grades for the tournaments so far sanctioned on the 2008 ITF Beach Tennis Tour have been announced, with the Rome Masters awarded the sole Grade 1 status. As a result the winners of this tournament, Alan Maldini / Luca Meliconi (ITA) in the men's event and Franca Bruschi / Laura Olivieri (ITA) in the women's competition, all earned 150 points towards the ITF Beach Tennis World Ranking.

Most other tournaments have been awarded a Grade 2 or 3 status, but notably the European Championships on 31 July-3 August, has been granted a B1 Grade, restricted specifically for Regional Championships. Winners here will each earn 180 ranking points for their efforts.

## Top seeds contest Invacare World Team Cup

The 2008 Invacare World Team Cup, which takes place in Cremona on 9–15 June, sees Italy hosting the ITF's annual flagship wheelchair tennis event, for the second time in seven years.

World No.2 Robin Ammerlaan leads a strong Dutch squad looking for their sixth title while world No.1 Shingo Kunieda hopes to help Japan to a third title. Stephane Houdet will give France a strong chance of winning their first men's title since 1993.

While the Netherlands winning a 21st Invacare World Team Cup women's title would be no surprise, such is their amazing strength in depth, the competition to join them in the semifinals and final from Canada, Japan, Korea, Switzerland and the United States will be fierce.

The United States will once again be strong favourites to win the quad title for a sixth time, with former champions Great Britain and Israel, the Netherlands and Italy all vying for a place in the final.

With defending champions Great Britain without last year's three team members, Netherlands and France are likely to be amongst the main contenders for the Junior event this year.

#### Obituary - Sven Davidson

The ITF is saddened to learn of the death of former Swedish Tennis Player Sven Davidson of pneumonia at the age of 79.

Davidson was the first Swede to win a Grand Slam when he claimed the French Championships in 1957 and was a member of their Davis Cup team for six years. Davidson is also credited with initiating an extraordinary general meeting of the ITF (Paris, 1968) where "open" tennis was first agreed in principle. He was inducted into the International Tennis Hall of Fame last year.
