Ivanovic withdrawal leaves Olympics wide open

The withdrawal of top seed and former world No. 1 Ana Ivanovic through injury has ensured the women's competition is wide open. Ivanovic, who was set to contest her first Olympics, announced yesterday that she has been experiencing pain in a joint in her right hand since Wimbledon, and would be unable to play in Beijing, although she remained optimistic about the US Open.

The first of eight days of tennis action got underway at the Beijing Olympic Tennis Centre yesterday only to finish almost as soon as it had started due to the bad weather. Torrential rain meant that only two hours and 12 minutes of tennis were played, allowing only nine matches to be completed. Of those safely through on the opening day were eighth seed James Blake (USA) and fourth seed Nikolay Davydenko (RUS).

The loss of Ivanovic was followed by the early exit of third seed Svetlana Kuznetsova (RUS), who was defeated by China's Li Na. Other seeds to fall early include Britain's Andy Murray, the sixth seed, eleventh seed Nicolas Pietrangeli and the No. 5 seed, David Ferrer (ESP). His compatriot Rafael Nadal didn't have it all his own way either in his match against Potito Starace (ITA), losing the second set before coming back to complete a 62 36 62 victory. The Spaniard will now face Australian Lleyton Hewitt in the second round.

It was more straightforward for the top seed Roger Federer (SUI) who defeated the big hitting Russian Dmitry Tursunov in straight sets. Likewise the third seed Novak Djokovic (SRB) overcame American Robbie Ginepri to book his place in the second round where he will meet Rainer Schuettler (GER).

In the women's draw second seed Jelena Jankovic saw off Cara Black (ZIM) 63 63 and current Wimbledon Champion Venus Williams also reached the second round, as she seeks to replicate her 2000 Olympic singles victory. Her sister Serena, the fourth seed, also progressed through her rain affected match against Olga Govortsova (BLR) and will now face Iveta Benesova (CZE). Alicia Molik (AUS), bronze medallist four years ago, went out in the opening round following a 61 61 defeat to Maria Jose Martinez Sanchez (ESP).

Chinese fans were delighted with the progression of three Chinese women into the second round. Wimbledon semifinalist Zheng Jie upset the formbook when she put out the 11th seed, Hungary's Agnes Szavay, and Peng Shuai overcame Carla Suarez Navarro (ESP) to join compatriot Li Na in the next round.

After four years of anticipation and careful planning, the 2008 Beijing Olympics got underway on Friday 8 August 2008 at 8:08pm. Over one billion people tuned in to watch the spectacular opening ceremony which featured fireworks, acrobats and athletes and lasted over four and a half hours. Federer celebrated his 27th birthday in style by carrying the Swiss flag into the Birds Nest stadium and reigning Olympic men's singles champion Fernando Gonzalez carried the Chilean flag. USA dominates World Junior Tennis Finals

The USA has won the boys' and girls' events at the World Junior Tennis Finals in Prostějov, Czech Republic, the first time that one nation has lifted both titles in the same year.

The boys' team, comprised of Christian Harrison, Alexis Halebian and Tyler Gardiner, is the first USA boys' team to lift the trophy since 2003. In the final Halebian set the USA on course for victory over France with a 63 62 win over Mathias Bourgue. Harrison, who was in the USA team that finished third here last year, then beat Lucas Pouille in straight sets, 62 64 to claim the second singles rubber and seal the title for the USA. In the boys' third place play-offs India defeated Canada to take third place, the highest finish for an Indian Junior team in their history of competition on the international stage.

The girls' final saw USA defeat Great Britain 2-1. The USA claimed the first match when number two player Kyle McPhillips defeated Joanna Henderson 26 64 64. Current Wimbledon Junior Champion Laura Robson (GBR) then levelled the tie with a completely dominant display, defeating Grace Min 61 61. The British pair took the first set of the deciding doubles before Min and McPhillips came back to win 46 62 64 and retain the title they won last year.

The US girls faced tough opposition from China in the group stage and Belgium in the semifinals, and had twice managed to win in the decisive doubles of those close ties. Second seed Russia defeated eighth seed Belgium 2-1 to claim third place. Full results, photos and reports from the competition can be found on www.itftennis.com/juniors.

Central Asian Training Camp a success

The first ever ITF Central Asian Training Camp came to a conclusion at the weekend following ten days of high-level training and competitive match play. The camp, which was organised by the ITF in conjunction with the Uzbekistan Tennis Federation (UTF), was held in the city of Namangan from 1-10 August.

A total of 39 players from the neighbouring countries of Kyrgyzstan, Kazakhstan, Tajikistan and Turkmenistan attended the camp, which was conducted by Suresh Menon, ITF Development Officer for Asia and ITF expert, Kawaljeet Singh (IND). The camp programme included tactical training, physical conditioning and some mental training.

Victor Krasnov, a coach from Turkmenistan said: "This was an excellent opportunity for the Turkmen players to undergo some quality coaching and also to be able to compete with so many different players of a good level. Adequate competition is one area that we are continuously lacking in Turkmenistan and the players were so happy to have so much match play. The camp provides excellent preparation for the upcoming ITF 13 & under Central Asian Championships and I am hopeful that the ITF will continue with this project in 2009."

Junior Davis Cup & Junior Fed Cup line-up revealed

The line-ups for the 2008 Junior Davis Cup and Junior Fed Cup by BNP Paribas Finals are now known after European qualifying finished last Wednesday. Five boys' and six girls' teams from Europe now join the list of qualifiers heading to San Luis Potosi, Mexico, from 23-28 September.

The Borotra Cup, held in Le Touquet, France, served as the qualifying competition for the boys' event. Russia were the winners, defeating Hungary in the final. They will be joined in Mexico by third place finishers Sweden, fourth placed Latvia and Great Britain, who clinched their spot on Wednesday by defeating Romania in the fifth place play-off. Teams from Hungary and Great Britain also came through the girls' qualifying, the Helvetie Cup, held in Leysin, Switzerland. Great Britain were defeated in the final by Poland, while Hungary took third place. The other qualifiers were Serbia, Belarus and the Netherlands. Hossam on fire on Young Stars Tour

African team member Karim Hossam (EGY) proved the man to beat on the Young Stars Tour, taking victory in the boys' singles event at two of the five tournaments. In the BNP Paribas Cup, Hossam defeated COSAT team member, Pedro Dumont (BRA) 62 63 in the final. The COSAT team pairing of Daniel Santos (PER) and Francisco Yim Kim (PAR) took the doubles title, defeating Asian team members Abduvoris Saitmukhamedov (UZB) and Bakhtiyor Sadulloev (TAJ) 46 75 10(6). In the girls' singles, European team member Ganna Poznikhirenko (UKR) was defeated by Petra Uberalova (SVK) 62 61.

The second week saw the teams move onto the Windmill Cup in Holland, where African team member Ons Jabeur (TUN) was defeated by Rosalie Van Der Hoek (NED) in the final. At Le 13/14 Hauts-de-Seine tournament, Hossam repeated his success of the first week, lifting the boys' singles trophy, with a

62 61 win over Luke Saville (AUS). In the girls' doubles it was an all-ITF team affair, with Carla Forte (BRA) and Jabeur defeating Bolivian sisters María Paula and María Inés Deheza 64 62.

The Brazilian duo of Dumont and Vitor Pinheiro captured the boys' doubles title for the COSAT team at the 31 RheinEnergie Tennis Cup, defeating the Australian pairing of Saville and Jack Schipanski 76 76. Europeans Julija Kulibaba (LAT) and Victoria Tomova (BUL) reached the girls' doubles finals but were ultimately defeated by Khromacheva (RUS) and Uberalova (SVK) 76 62.

The two tournaments were part of the ITF/Grand Slam 14 & under teams to Europe, a five week European Tour where four ITF teams, comprising 37 players from 23 different countries, contest five tournaments in France, Netherlands, Germany and Belgium.

One of the Asian coaches, Chris Pillai said: "This tour was a very good experience for the children as they got along with other players, who were representing different countries; different cultures and different backgrounds.
