## Seeds announced for Paralympics

Four-time Paralympic gold medallist Esther Vergeer (NED) will be one of the torchbearers for the 13th Paralympic Games which gets underway in Beijing on Saturday, with an Opening Ceremony expected to be every bit as spectacular as for the Olympics. The Paralympic Torch is currently on its nine-day journey across China.

The Paralympic Tennis Event starts next Monday, 8 September, beginning eight days of intense competition during which 18 medals will be contested by 112 competitors representing 35 countries. The men's singles features 64 competitors, while 32 women and 16 quad players will contest their respective singles events. The doubles events will comprise players already contesting the singles, with a maximum of 32 men's, 16 women's and eight quad pairs.

The ITF announced the seedings today, with Shingo Kunieda (JPN) and Vergeer (NED) heading the seeds for the men's and women's singles, while Athens silver medallist David Wagner (USA) is the No.1 seed for the quad singles. Twenty-six-year old Vergeer, unbeaten in singles competition since 2003, will bid for her third successive gold medal in singles and doubles. Netherlands dominates the women's entry, with Vergeer, Korie Homan, Sharon Walraven and Jiske Griffioen occupying the top four positions. Florence Gravelier (FRA) is the highest non-Dutch player to be seeded at number five. China's Dong Fu-Li, world No. 17, represents the best home hope of success.

Although not among the medals in Athens four years ago, 24-year-old Kunieda has dominated the men's game for the past two seasons and is unbeaten so far this year. Kunieda's strongest challenger will be Athens gold medallist Robin Ammerlaan (NED), who is the second seed as he bids to become the first men's singles player to retain a Paralympic title. Athens bronze medallist Michael Jeremiasz (FRA) goes to Beijing seeded to reach the podium once again and he leads a strong French challenge that also includes No. 4 seed and Paralympic Games debutante Stephane Houdet. France is the only nation to have all four of its men's singles players among the 16 seeds for the event. Perhaps the strongest challenge to the top four will be seventh seed Stefan Olsson (SWE), who has beaten all the world's top 10 players this season apart from Kunieda.

In the quad singles, being held for just the second time, Britain's Peter Norfolk returns to defend his title against current world No.1 Wagner. Second seed Norfolk has an advantage over Wagner in head-to-heads this season and has the chance to regain the quad singles world No.1 ranking in Beijing, should he repeat his Athens victory four years ago. Nicholas Taylor, who partnered Wagner to win the inaugural quad doubles gold for the USA in Athens, occupies the quad singles third seeding for Beijing, while Johan Andersson (SWE) is the fourth seed. Shraga Weinberg (ISR), who is the only player to have beaten both Wagner and Norfolk this season, is outside of the seedings for Beijing, but is someone they will be keen to avoid early in the competition, while Sarah Hunter (CAN) and Athens bronze medallist Bas Van Erp (NED) are among those capable of causing upsets. ## Nadal progresses, Ivanovic falls

Top men's seed and world No. 1 Rafael Nadal (ESP) remains on course for his first US Open title. The Spaniard has yet to drop a set and he faces American Sam Querrey for a place in the quarterfinals in the second match on Arthur Ashe today. Another American still in the draw is No. 5 seed Andy Roddick, who takes on Fernando Gonzalez (CHI) for a place in the next round.

It wasn't so straight forward for the top seed in the women's event, however. World No. 1 Ana Ivanovic crashed out in the second round to American Julie Coin 63 46 63, who is ranked 187 places below the Serbian. This exit has left the door open for No. 2 seed Jelena Janovic, who is aiming for her first Grand Slam title. Jankovic overcame Caroline Wozniacki 36 62 61 and now faces Austrian Sybille Bammer in the quarterfinals. Olympic champion Elena Dementieva (RUS) has also reached the quarterfinal stage, and will play Patty Schnyder (AUT) tomorrow.

The Williams sisters are en route to a quarterfinal clash providing they can overcome their fourth round opponents when play gets underway today. The only Americans left in the women's tournament, Venus takes on No. 9 seed Agnieszka Radwanska (POL) while Serena faces Severine Bremond (FRA).

Elsewhere in the men's draw, Roger Federer (SUI) faces Russian Igor Andreev for a place in the quarterfinals and the chance to keep his dream of his first Grand Slam title in 2008 alive. World No. 3 Novak Djokovic came through a rollercoaster four-hour match against Croatian teenager Marin Cilic to set up a meeting with Spain's Tommy Robredo and Kei Nishikori (JPN), who put out David Ferrer (ESP) in a third round five-set tussle, will meet Argentina's Juan Martin Del Potro. ## Junior US Open gets underway

The world's best juniors are in New York this week for the last Grand Slam of the year and for many of them, the last Grand Slam of their junior careers.

Chief among those looking to leave the junior ranks on a high note will be Melanie Oudin (USA). After losing in the second round of last year's US Open, Oudin put together an incredible run which saw her win 49 of her next 52 matches, with the three losses crucially coming in Grade A events to leave her still searching for a major title.

Oudin's task was apparently made much easier yesterday when top seed Arantxa Rus (NED) slumped to a shock first round defeat to Russia's Victoria Kamenskaya, and fourth seed Jessica Moore (AUS), who had defeated Oudin in the first round of the women's event, withdrew. With two of her main rivals out of the picture, Oudin's toughest challenge may come from fellow Americans Madison Brengle and Asia Muhammad, who both upset seeds for the loss of just a few games on the opening day. Wimbledon runner-up and No. 3 seed Noppawan Lertcheewakarn (THA) could also be in contention.

The boy's event looks just as open as the girls, with all three of this year's Grand Slam winners in action. World No. 1 Tsung-Hua Yang (TPE), champion at Roland Garros; No. 2 Bernard Tomic (AUS), the winner in Australia and Grigor Dimitov (BUL), Wimbledon champion and world No. 4, will all be keen to claim their second Grand Slam titles and stake their claim as the best junior of 2008.

Several American boys could trouble the top seeds, with world No. 11 Ryan Harrison, winner of the Grade A Osaka Mayors Cup last year, heading the local challenge. Bradley Klahn, Jarmere Jenkins, Rhyne Williams and Chase Buchanan have all had good results on the ITF Junior Circuit and home advantage may inspire them to go one step further in New York.
