Kunieda, Vergeer, Norfolk win Paralympic gold

Shingo Kunieda (JPN), Esther Vergeer (NED) and Peter Norfolk (GBR) all won singles gold at the fifth Paralympic Tennis Event in Beijing. The event came to an exciting conclusion today when 9,000 spectators packed Centre Court at the Olympic Green Tennis Centre to watch the men's singles and doubles, and women's doubles finals.

World No. 1 Kunieda won his first singles gold medal with a 63 60 victory over 2004 gold medallist Robin Ammerlaan (NED). On Sunday Vergeer won her third Paralympic women's title, beating her compatriot and second seed Korie Homan 62 46 76(5), having saved a match point in a dramatic final set. Second seed Norfolk retained the quad singles title with a 62 62 victory over fourth seed Johan Andersson (SWE).

Wheelchair tennis proved hugely popular at the Beijing Games from the outset. The first day's play on Centre Court saw a capacity crowd of 10,000 turn up to watch China's No. 1 women's player Dong Fuli. Dong and compatriot Hu Dandan caught the imagination of the host nation's fans by going on to reach the women's quarterfinals, the first time that Chinese players have progressed so far in a Paralympic Tennis Event.

There were plenty of other firsts in Beijing, with the quad doubles pairing of Boaz Kramer and Shraga Weinberg winning Israel's first ever Paralympic Tennis medal, a silver, after upsetting British second seeds Jamie Burdekin and Peter Norfolk in the semifinals.

Russia retains Fed Cup title

Russia captured its fourth Fed Cup title in five years with a comfortable 4-0 victory over Spain in the Final of the 2008 Fed Cup by BNP Paribas at the Club de Campo in Madrid. For the second year running it was Svetlana Kuznetsova who won the decisive point after coming from behind to defeat Anabel Medina Garrigues 57 63 64 in Sunday's opening rubber.

Spain had scored two shock victories on its travels to reach its first final since 2002, defeating 2006 champions Italy in the first round and China in the semifinals. Despite home advantage in the final, the team was unable to bridge the gap against the experienced pairing of Kuznetsova and Vera Zvonareva, two of five Russians currently ranked in the world's top 10.

Zvonareva gave the visitors the perfect start on the opening day with a 63 64 victory over Medina Garrigues, before Kuznetsova overcame Roland Garros quarterfinalist Carla Suarez Navarro 63 61. Kuznetsova then squandered a 4-0 lead in the opening set against Medina Garrigues on day two, before fighting back to seal Russia's triumph. Elena Vesnina and Ekaterina Makarova ensured a Russian clean sweep with a 62 61 victory over Nuria Llagostera Vives and Suarez Navarro in the dead doubles rubber.

Sweden's first ever Paralympic medals came in the quad singles and men's doubles. Fourth seed Johan Andersson clinched silver after upsetting world No. 1 David Wagner (USA) in the semifinals of the quad singles, with Stefan Olsson and Peter Wikstrom (SWE) clinching men's doubles silver.

One of the best adverts for wheelchair tennis during the eight days of competition came in Sunday's women's singles final. Sydney and Athens champion Vergeer faced a match point for the first time since her last loss in January 2003 in an absorbing contest against Homan. Having at one stage led by a set and 4-2, the world No. 1 trailed 5-3 in the final set before fighting back to extend her unbeaten streak to 349 matches.

Homan turned the tables today when she and compatriot Sharon Walraven defeated Vergeer and Jiske Griffioen 26 76(4) 64 in the women's to inflict only the second defeat for the top seeds in 40 doubles events.

Frenchmen Stephane Houdet and Michael Jeremiasz were men's doubles champions, while Americans David Wagner and Nick Taylor successfully defended their quad doubles title.

Martin McElhatton, a member of the ITF Wheelchair Tennis Committee, said: "China has staged a great Paralympic Games and the wheelchair tennis event has exceeded our expectations. We have had some incredible matches, a packed centre court throughout the competition and a great atmosphere. The sport of wheelchair tennis can only benefit from the platform that the Games has provided in terms of the publicity worldwide." For further information, visit www.itftennis.com/paralympics.

"It's amazing to win another Fed Cup for my team. It's been a tough year with a lot of ups and downs," said Kuznetsova, who is now unbeaten in Fed Cup singles matches since 2004.

Medina Garrigues added: "We should be very satisfied to have made the Final. Nobody would have thought that at the start of the year. We did all we could and no-one should have any regrets."

Russian Shamil Tarpishchev once again had little time to savour victory as he headed to Argentina to begin his preparations as captain of Russia's Davis Cup team, which takes on Argentina in Buenos Aires this weekend in the World Group semifinals.

The International Tennis Hall of Fame and the ITF announced that Spanish captain Miguel Margets is the recipient of the 2008 Fed Cup Award of Excellence. Margets was presented with the award on Sunday during the Final by ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti and Manolo Santana. Ricci Bitti said: "Spain has a long, successful history in Fed Cup competition. Miguel has captained four Spanish teams to victory and was vying for a record fifth."

World's Top 10 in Davis Cup action

World No. 1 Rafael Nadal looks to book Spain's place in the final of the 2008 Davis Cup by BNP Paribas as the world's Top 10 players are all in Davis Cup action this weekend. A total of two World Group semifinals, eight World Group play-off ties and eight zonal ties will be held on 19-21 September, with full coverage on the official Davis Cup website www.daviscup.com.

Spain and Argentina will look to make the most of home advantage when the semifinals get underway this Friday. Nadal heads a full-strength Spanish line-up for its clay court tie against defending champions USA in Madrid in front of 21,000 spectators. He is joined by David Ferrer, Fernando Verdasco and Feliciano Lopez to take on Andy Roddick, Bob and Mike Bryan and newcomer Sam Querrey, a replacement for James Blake.

In the other semifinal, Argentina is looking for the victory that will guarantee its first home final, when it takes on Russia in Buenos Aires, also on clay. David Nalbandian teams up with the fast-improving Juan Martin Del Potro, Agustin Calleri and Guillermo Canas to face Nikolay Davydenko, Igor Andreev, Dmitry Tursunov and Igor Kunitsyn.

This weekend also sees 16 nations contest the World Group Play-offs in a bid to achieve World Group status in 2009. US Open champion Roger Federer leads the Swiss team against Belgium in Lausanne; while world No. 3 Novak Djokovic is in action for Serbia against Slovak Republic away in Bratislava. US Open finalist Andy Murray leads Great Britain in its tie against Austria at Wimbledon; Chile is at home to Australia in Antofagasta; Croatia takes on Brazil in Zadar; Israel meets Peru in Ramat Hasharon; Netherlands hosts Korea in Apeldoorn; while Romania faces India in Bucharest.

Nominations for all ties, including zonal ties, can be found on www.daviscup.com, where you can also view up-to-date results, plus live scoring, news and audio interviews from the World Group semifinal and play-off ties. Davis Cup Radio will also be on air with a daily update of action from around the world. The draws for all of this weekend's ties will take place on **Thursday 18 September**.

Success for Junior Touring Team to North America

There was plenty of success for the ITF/Grand Slam International Junior Touring Team to North America that completed its three-and-a-half-week tour last week. The team comprised ten of the world's top junior players, who took part in a two-day training camp in Montreal before contesting three major events on the ITF Junior Circuit. The team travelled under the guidance of three ITF team coaches, Ivan Molina (COL), Frank Zlesak (CZE) and Roberta Burzagli (BRA).

Mirza Basic (BIH) began the tour by reaching the final of the Canadian Junior Open in Quebec, losing to Marcus Willis (GBR) 16 62 75. Henri Kontinen (FIN) and Christopher Rungkat (INA) reached the boys doubles final, where they lost to Australians Dane Propoggia and Matt Reid 63 36 [10-8]. In the girls' events, Elena Bogdan (ROU) reached the singles semifinals, losing to eventual winner Kurumi Nara (JPN) 62 63, while Noppawan Lertcheewakarn (THA) and Australian partner Isabella Holland were doubles semifinalists.

Lertcheewakarn won the team's first title at the US Open where she partnered Sandra Roma (SWE) to victory in the girls' doubles, defeating Mallory Burdette and Sloane Stephens (USA) 60 62. Kontinen and Rungkat again reached the boys' doubles final, going down to Niki Moser (AUT) and Cedrik-Marcel Stebe (GER) 76(5) 36 [10-8].

There was further success for the team at the final event in Kentucky with Basic winning the boys' singles title against Hiroyasu Ehara (JPN) 75 64. There was also victory in the girls' doubles for Jessy Rompies and Beatrice Gumulya (INA), who defeated Courtney Dolehide and Jacqueline Cako (USA) 57 63 [10-7]. Rungkat suffered his third doubles final defeat, this time partnered by Takanyi Garanganga (ZIM), losing to Matt Kandath and Ryan Lipman (USA) 61 76(5).

NEWS IN BRIEF

Tennis Masters Cup qualifiers

US Open finalist Andy Murray of Great Britain secured his first trip to the prestigious Tennis Masters Cup—to be held at Shanghai’s Qi Zhong Stadium on 9-16 November—joining the ATP’s top trio of Rafael Nadal, Roger Federer and Novak Djokovic as singles players to have clinched their place in the eight-man, eight-team field. Meanwhile, reigning Australian Open doubles champions Jonathan Erlich and Andy Ram became the third team to qualify for the circuit finale.

Pro Circuit successes

Davis Cup players Talal Ouahabi (MAR) and Jerzy Janowicz (POL) have both enjoyed recent successes on the ITF Pro Circuit. Thirty-year old Ouahabi won two singles and one doubles title during the three Egyptian Futures tournaments held in Cairo and Giza, and currently stands at a career-high No. 496 on the ATP Rankings. Seventeen-year old Janowicz, runner-up at this year’s Junior Roland Garros, also stands at a career-high No. 454, after winning two singles and one doubles title during three Polish Futures events.
