Largest Seniors World Team Championships underway

The largest-ever seniors World Team Championships got underway yesterday in glorious sunshine in Antalya, Turkey. A total of 323 teams from 34 countries are competing in the Seniors and Super-Seniors World Team Championships in 19 age categories from 35 and over to 80 and over at the Club Ali Bey resorts in Manavgat and Belek.

Saturday saw the Captains meetings take place in the afternoon, followed by Opening Ceremonies at both venues. On Sunday morning, play started with the round-robin stages of the competition simultaneously on 89 courts, 59 in Manavgat and 30 in Belek.

The Team Championships will be played over the entire week with finals to be held on Saturday 18 October, before the Super-Seniors World Individual Championships start on Sunday 19 October with around 1000 competitors. Bogdan secures Grade A title

Romania's Ana Bogdan claimed the first Grade A title of her junior career when she beat top seed and defending champion Kurumi Nara (JPN) in the final of the Osaka Mayor's Cup yesterday. When Nara took the first set of the final in front of a capacity 5000-strong crowd it seemed that she was going to achieve her goal of becoming the first girl ever to win Japan's Grade A tournament two years in succession, but Bogdan hit back to take a close second set and then ran away with the third for a 36 75 62 win.

The boys' final also featured the top two seeds and a local presence, with Japanese second seed Hiroki Moriya taking on top seed Yuki Bhambri (IND). Moriya was going for his first tournament win on the ITF Junior Circuit since a Grade 4 win in Thailand in July 2006, but he was up against it from the start against former world top five player Bhambri. The final was one-way traffic as Moriya never really got into the match, Bhambri running out a 62 63 winner. It was his first title since the Asia/Oceania Closed Championships almost a year ago, and sees him head back up the rankings again after his recent fall out of the top ten.

Bhambri had a chance to make it a double victory as he also contested the doubles final, but he and partner Liang Chi Huang (TPE) lost a close match 75 76(3) to Croatian pair Vedran Ljubicic and Marin Draganja. The girls' doubles final was even closer, with Kristina Mladenovic (FRA) and Tímea Babos (HUN) defeating Japan's Aki Yamasoto and Miyabi Inoue 76(6) 76(6).

Keothavong triumphs in Barnstaple

Anne Keothavong claimed her 16th career singles title when she triumphed at the first ever \$50,000 event to be held in Barnstaple, Devon. The Briton overcame Alberta Brianti (ITA) in the final 64 62. Also adding to her career singles title count was France's Julie Coin whose victory at \$50,000 Joue-Les-Tours in France took her tally to five titles. Other tournaments to take place week commencing 6 October was \$50,000 Pittsburgh, PA, which was won by Melinda Czink (HUN) and \$50,000 Jounieh in Lebanon, which saw Irina-Camelia Begu (ROU) secure her third title of the year.

This week (13 October) the northern Italian town of Ortisei will be hosting the eighth \$100,000 tournament on the 2008 ITF Women's Circuit.

Regional Coaches Conference concludes

The second of two regional coaches conferences organised in conjunction with Olympic Solidarity concluded yesterday in Tunisia. The ITF, together with the Tunisian Tennis Federation and the Confederation of African Tennis, hosted the North African Coaches Conference in Sousse. The 95 participants came from as far as Iraq, Sudan and Mali to listen to lectures from French experts Bernard Pestre, Antoni Girod and Dominique Cisse, who presented topics such as progressive tennis, mental approach of the game and development of specific fitness of tennis.

Bernard Pestre, who is in charge of coaches education for the French Tennis Federation, said: "This perfectly organised conference has shown the high level of knowledge of the participants. The presentations, exchange of ideas and questions demonstrated both the involvement and the pedagogical experience of the coaches."

In addition, 94 coaches from 12 nations attended the 6th ITF African Regional Coaches Conference, which ended on Saturday 27 September. The conference was held in co-operation with CAT, and the South African Tennis Association, at the High Performance Centre in Pretoria, South Africa and was designed to bring coaches from throughout the region up-to-date on the latest coaching and sports science news.

The conference featured keynote international speakers Sandi Procter (GBR), Dr Paul Roetert (USA) and Dr Machar Reid (AUS), who made presentations both on-court and in the lecture room. Other speakers included: Karl Davies (ITF), Dermot Sweeney (ITF), Miguel Crespo (ITF), Kevin Bouwer (RSA) and Janita van Wyk (RSA). A round table on the development of African tennis was also part of the programme with the participation of coaches from all countries in the region.

ITF Officiating school in USA

The USTA held two ITF Officiating Level 2 Schools in Orlando, Florida on 3-8 October 2008, which were taught by Anders Wennberg (the ITF's Regional Executive for Europe) and Jake Garner (ITF/Grand Slam Chair Umpire). Twenty-two of the 24 US officials passed the combination of written examinations and practical officiating and gained their ITF White Badge Official certification. They are:
