

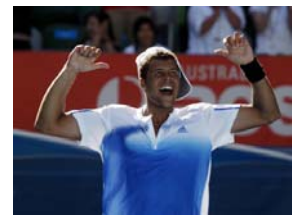

## Tsonga completes Tennis Masters Cup line-up

Jo-Wilfried Tsonga clinched the eighth and final berth for this week's Tennis Masters Cup in Shanghai, following victory over David Nalbandian in the final of the BNP Paribas Masters in Paris on Sunday.

The Frenchman, who claimed seventh place in the 2008 ATP Race in winning his first ATP Masters title, joins defending champion Roger Federer, Novak Djokovic, Andy Murray, Nikolay Davydenko, Andy Roddick, Juan Martin Del Potro and Gilles Simon, who replaces Rafael Nadal who has withdrawn through injury. The culminating event of the 2008 men's circuit is co-owned by the ATP, ITF and the Grand Slams.

The final place was also confirmed for the Tennis Masters Cup doubles event, with South Africans Jeff Coetzee and Wesley Moodie qualifying in Paris. Their semifinal victory was enough to move the pair into sixth place in the Stanford ATP Doubles Race. They join Bob and Mike Bryan, Daniel Nestor and Nenad Zimonjic, Mahesh Bhupathi and Mark Knowles, Jonas Bjorkman and Kevin Ulliyett, Jonathan Erlich and Andy Ram, Lukas Dlouhy and Leander Paes, and Pablo Cuevas and Luis Horna in the eight-team line-up.

Play gets underway on Sunday 9 November at Qi Zhong Stadium, the fourth and final year that the event will be held in Shanghai before it moves to London. The draw for singles and doubles will take place on Wednesday 5 November at the Hilton Shanghai hotel at 14:00 local time (06:00 GMT).

## Williams and Blake top seeds for Hopman Cup

USA, featuring Serena Williams and James Blake, has been named as top seed for the 2009 Hyundai Hopman Cup in Perth. The ITF's official mixed team competition will be held for the 21st year at the Burswood Dome on 3-9 January 2009. Williams will defend the title she won last year with Mardy Fish, having previously been victorious with Blake in 2003. Blake went on to defend the title in 2004 partnering Lindsay Davenport.

The eight teams are once again split into two round-robin pools of four with the top team in each pool meeting in the final on 9 January. The winner of Asian Hopman Cup in Kazakhstan, being played on 12-15 November, will fill the eighth position in the competition. The full line-up is as follows (seedings in brackets):

## 14th Asian Coaches Conference concludes in China

Over 140 coaches from 17 Asian nations gathered last week at the beautiful venue of the Yuedong Tennis Club in Shenzhen, China, for the 14<sup>th</sup> ITF Asian Coaches Conference.



The ITF's regional conferences are held every two years and deal with high-level player development and how to increase participation in tennis. This year, the topics touched on all aspects of junior development, with special emphasis on the 10 & Under age group, mental drills for junior players and power training for tennis athletes.

The vice president of the Chinese Tennis Association, Ms Sun Jing Fang and Mr Eichii Kawatei, former board member of the ITF, were in attendance. Outstanding speakers such as Craig Morris (AUS), Antoni Girod (FRA), Mike Barrell (GBR) and Kenneth Baastiens (BEL), who are all regular presenters at the Worldwide Coaches Conference, received acclaimed feedback from the Asian coaches.

Prior to the conference, the ITF held an Asian tutors' course which enabled the participants to brainstorm and discuss how to improve the ITF syllabi, content and schedule of its various courses.

## Pakistan hosts trio of Futures tournaments

Three successive Futures tournaments in Pakistan on the ITF Men's Circuit concluded last week, with first-time victories for Mikhail Vasiliev of Russia and Germany's Patrick Taubert, and a second for Syrym Abdukhalikov of Kazakhstan.

The first two tournaments took place in Pakistan's capital city Islamabad, where three-time Futures finalist Vasiliev kicked off the series by defeating Slovakia's Adrian Sikora, who was also looking for his maiden win, in the final. The No. 3 seed defeated his unseeded opponent in straight sets but was made to work hard for the victory, but eventually ran out a 62 75 winner. With an identical score line to the singles final, the Chinese Taipei pairing of I-Ta Chen and Hsin-Han Lee claimed their first doubles title together.

Improving on his second round exit the previous week, Kazakhstan Davis Cup player Abdukhalikov won his second career Futures singles title with a 64 63 victory over Vadim Alekseenko, the eighth seed, in the final of the second tournament, while Chen and Lee made it two successive title wins in the doubles.

The third and final tournament took place in Lahore, which saw Taubert face former Indian Junior Davis Cup player Rupesh Roy in the final with both players looking for their first Futures singles title. Having already won a very tight doubles final with partner Hyun-Soo Lim from Korea, Roy was unable to make it two wins as Taubert dominated the singles final, taking the title with a 62 61 victory.

## Doubles line-up decided for Sony Ericsson Championships

Doubles pairings Kveta Peschke and Rennae Stubbs, and Katerina Srebotnik and Ai Sugiyama completed the doubles line-up for the WTA Tour's season-ending Sony Ericsson Championships, to be held in Doha on 4-9 November. The teams join confirmed year-end world No. 1s Cara Black and Liezel Huber, and 2008 Roland Garros champions Anabel Medina-Garrigues and Virginia Ruano Pascual.

Srebotnik and Sugiyama qualified for the second year running by winning the title in Linz two weeks ago, while Peschke and Stubbs also head to Doha for a second straight year by virtue of their quarterfinal victory in Linz.

"The doubles field at this year's Sony Ericsson Championships is probably one of the strongest in the history of this event," said Larry Scott, CEO of the Sony Ericsson WTA Tour. "I'm sure fans will be captivated by the intensity, excitement and entertainment factor the world's best doubles teams will showcase in Doha."
