## Argentina bids for home glory

Argentina will bid for its first Davis Cup title when it takes on Spain in the Final of the 2008 Davis Cup by BNP Paribas at the Estadio Polideportivo Islas Malvinas in Mar del Plata, Argentina on 21-23 November. The Final will be played indoors on hard court.

This is only the third meeting between the two nations in the history of Davis Cup, with Spain having won both previous encounters, in 1926 and most recently in 2003, when Carlos Moya sealed victory with a win over Gaston Gaudio in the decisive fifth rubber.

Argentina has named Juan Martin Del Potro, David Nalbandian, Jose Acasuso and Agustin Calleri for its third Davis Cup Final, but the first it has played at home. Argentina is currently unbeaten in its last 13 home ties and has played all of its matches this year on home soil.

Spanish captain Emilio Sanchez has called up world No. 56 Marcel Granollers for his first Davis Cup tie, to replace the injured Rafael Nadal. The 22-year-old, who played alongside Nadal in the Spanish team that won the 2002 Junior Davis Cup by BNP Paribas, has been named alongside David Ferrer, Feliciano Lopez and Fernando Verdasco.

The draw for this weekend's Final will take place at 15:00 GMT on Thursday. The opening singles rubbers will take place at 13:00 local time (15:00 GMT) on Friday followed by the doubles rubber on Saturday (14:00 (16:00 GMT)) and the reverse singles rubbers on Sunday (12:00 (14:00 GMT)).

The Final will be preceded by the launch of the Spanish-language Davis Cup website on Wednesday, which will feature original content in Spanish and provide more news and information for Spanish-speaking fans than ever before.

Along with the Official Davis Cup by BNP Paribas website [www.daviscup.com](http://www.daviscup.com), the two sites will feature live ball-by-ball audio commentary from the final, along with text commentary and the usual features of live scoring, match reports, photos and audio interviews.












## Djokovic masters Davydenko in Shanghai

Serbia's Novak Djokovic crowned a memorable year by winning the 2008 Tennis Masters Cup in Shanghai. The world No. 3 scored his second victory of the week over Nikolay Davydenko, defeating the Russian 61 75 in the final in one hour 42 minutes.

Djokovic and Davydenko both qualified from the Gold Group, in which the Serb scored a tight 76(3) 06 75 over the Russian in their round-robin match to top the group. Britain's Andy Murray was the surprise winner of the Red Group, upsetting world No. 2 Roger Federer 46 76(3) 75 in his final match to compile a perfect 3-0 record. Having also lost his opening match to Gilles Simon, who finished as group runner-up, Federer failed to advance to the semifinals at the Tennis Masters Cup for the first time in seven appearances.

## Djokovic masters Davydenko *(continued)*

In contrasting semifinals, Djokovic edged past Simon 46 63 75, while Davydenko scored a comfortable 75 63 victory over Murray. The Russian fought back from 5-3 down in the second set of the final, but was unable to prevent Djokovic adding the title to his Australian Open crown, and closing the gap on world No. 2 Federer.

Djokovic said: "It means a lot. I would put it in the same league as a Grand Slam because the best eight players in the world are participating here. It's not easy, you know. There is a lot of pressure involved. I'm happy that I managed to hold my nerves in the end."

The year's No. 1 doubles team was decided in the final match of the season with Canada's Daniel Nestor and Nenad Zimonjic of Serbia defeating Americans Bob and Mike Bryan 76(3) 62 to clinch the Masters Cup title and the top ranking. This was Nestor's second successive triumph in Shanghai following victory with Mark Knowles in 2007.

The Tennis Masters Cup, which is co-owned by the ATP, ITF and Grand Slams, now leaves Shanghai after a successful four-year run at the Qi Zhong Tennis Centre. The 2009 event will be held at London's O2 Arena.

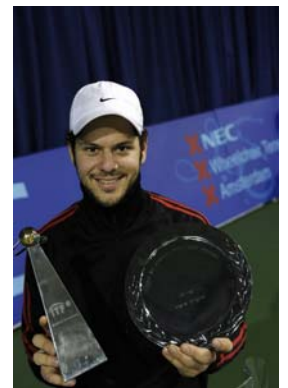


## Olsson, Vergeer, Wagner triumph in Amsterdam

Stefan Olsson (SWE) and David Wagner (USA) both avenged defeats in the round-robin stages to win the men's and quad titles at the NEC Wheelchair Tennis Singles Masters in Amsterdam, while Esther Vergeer (NED) survived her third successive three-set match against compatriot Korie Homan to win the women's title for an incredible 11<sup>th</sup> successive year.

In the men's singles, defending champion and world No.2 Robin Ammerlaan (NED) was undefeated in his pool, beating Olsson 75 62 as both players progressed to the semifinals, where they defeated Maikel Scheffers (NED) and Stephane Houdet (FRA) respectively. Scheffers and Houdet had edged through to the last four at the expense of Satoshi Saida (JPN), as all three players won two of their round-robin matches.

An exciting final saw 21-year-old Olsson reverse the previous result and prevail 63 46 63 over Ammerlaan to become the youngest NEC Masters men's champion.

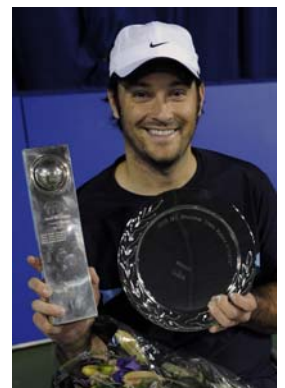

Vergeer dropped just seven games en route to the women's final, while world No.2 Homan topped her pool after a tough match against world No 4 Florence Gravelier (FRA), and then saw off Jiske Griffioen in the semifinals.

After Vergeer had faced her first match point in five and half years against Homan in the women's gold medal match at the Beijing Paralympics, the much anticipated final saw the world's top two players go to three sets for the sixth time. It was Vergeer who reigned supreme again after a 62 36 60 victory, extending her winning streak to 354 matches.

In the quad singles Wagner suffered his second loss of the season to Beijing silver medallist Johan Andersson (SWE) in their pool match, but the world No.2 turned that around in the final with a 61 36 62 victory to clinch his fourth NEC Masters title.

All three champions will now hope for further success this week when they contest the Camozzi Doubles Masters, which gets underway in Palozzolo, Italy on Wednesday.

## Bjorkman bows out

Three-time Davis Cup winner and multiple Grand Slam champion Jonas Bjorkman played the final match of his 17-year career in Shanghai last week as he and Kevin Ullyett went out at the round-robin stage of the Tennis Masters Cup.

"I've been very fortunate to be able to play for so long. It started as my hobby, and I've been able to do it for 17 years, which is great," said Bjorkman, who won 54 doubles titles in his career, including nine Grand Slam titles.

Bjorkman was also a Swedish Davis Cup stalwart, starring in three of the nation's triumphs in the competition, clinching the winning point in the 1994, 1997 and 1998 finals.

"I would probably say winning the Davis Cup was something that was huge to be part of. Very proud to be representing my country. I think Davis Cup weeks are probably one of the best weeks during the year, to be part of that. The whole camaraderie is something that I definitely will miss."

While latterly known as a doubles specialist – he was ranked No. 1 in doubles for a total of 74 weeks in his career - Bjorkman also reached a career high of No. 4 in singles and made singles semifinal appearances at both the 1997 US Open and 2006 Wimbledon. He finished the year ranked inside the singles top 100 for 15 consecutive years.

## Kyu-Tae Im-presses in Malaysia

Korean Davis Cup player Kyu-Tae Im won the first two Futures tournaments ever to be staged in Malaysia over the last two weeks.

In Kuala Lumpur, as the ITF Men's Circuit returned to Malaysia two weeks ago after an absence of 11 years, No. 4 seed Im eased to the title without dropping a set, rounding off with a 61 61 victory over No. 6 seed Nathan Thompson (USA) in the final.

Despite going to three sets in his first match in Petaling Jaya last week, Im, seeded fifth, maintained his winning form and defeated No. 6 seed Jose Statham 76(3) 61 to take a second title.

Thompson earned some consolation with victory in the doubles event at Kuala Lumpur with Christopher Rungkat (INA), while Mikal Statham (NZL) and Xin-Yuan Yu (CHN) won the doubles title at Petaling Jaya.

## NEWS IN BRIEF

### New position for Brian Hainline

The USTA has named Brian Hainline as Chief Medical Officer of the USTA. This newly created position will allow Dr Hainline, who is also chair of the ITP's Sport Science and Medicine Commission, to oversee and develop medical policies affecting all aspects of the sport.

### Venus Williams exhibition

Wimbledon champion Venus Williams is the subject of a photography exhibition currently on show at the Tennisium at Roland Garros. Fashion photographer Koto Bolofo has followed the American around for the last three years to create the exhibition, which is on display until 15 March 2009.

### Chinese Taipei books Hopman Cup ticket

Su-Wei Hsieh and Yen-Hsun Lu steered Chinese Taipei to a successful defence of the Asian Hopman Cup, defeating hosts Kazakhstan in the final to earn a place in the 2009 Hyundai Hopman Cup in Perth in January.

The pair were unbeaten in singles and doubles throughout the event and will now take their place in the eight-team Hyundai Hopman Cup in a strong field that features seven top 20 players among teams from USA, Russia, France, Italy, Germany, Slovak Republic and hosts Australia.

### Davis Cup Radio to debut in Spanish

After successful English transmissions from the last three Davis Cup finals, Davis Cup Radio will also broadcast in Spanish for the first time at this year's Final in Mar Del Plata, Argentina, beginning on Friday, with live ball-by-ball commentary from each of the five rubbers.
