Spain springs surprise in Argentina

Spain captured its third Davis Cup title, and first away from home, when it defeated Argentina 3-1 in the final of the 2008 Davis Cup by BNP Paribas in Mar del Plata. In the absence of world No. 1 Rafael Nadal, Feliciano Lopez and Fernando Verdasco were the heroes as the visitors recovered from the loss of the opening rubber to upset the title favourites.

David Nalbandian gave the hosts a perfect start with a 63 62 63 victory over Spanish No. 1 David Ferrer. Feliciano Lopez then saw off Juan Martin Del Potro 46 76(2) 76(4) 63, before partnering Fernando Verdasco to a 57 75 76(5) 63 win over Agustin Calleri and Nalbandian.

Spanish captain Emilio Sanchez then brought in Verdasco to replace Ferrer for Sunday's opening singles rubber against Jose Acasuso, a substitute for the injured Del Potro. The 25-year-old Spaniard stunned the home crowd with a thrilling 63 67(3) 46 63 61 comeback victory to seal the visitors' triumph.

"This is the most beautiful day of my life," said Verdasco, after he emerged from the surge of red bodies that had piled onto the court to embrace their hero. "This is the most important match and win of my life. I will always remember this." "There was a lot of sadness in the locker room after the loss," said Acasuso after the match, "and the fact that three of the four of us lost to Russia two years ago means that the pain was double."

After USA's triumph with a four-man squad in 2007, Spain's victory was a testament to the strength in depth in the team, with no less than six players contributing live rubber victories during the year. Nicolas Almagro, Nadal and Tommy Robredo also took part in the journey that saw three victories away from home, their victory over Argentina ending the hosts' 10-year unbeaten run on home soil.

Sanchez, who will step down after three years as Spain's captain, acknowledged that this was the sweetest victory of his career. He said: "A lot of people in Spain criticise me for not having a plan B, but I proved that I had a pretty good plan B. This is the biggest win for me, even as a player."

Argentine captain Alberto Mancini also announced his retirement, as both teams enter a new era going into 2009. Spain will start the defence of their title with a home tie against Serbia, while Argentina will host Netherlands. The first round ties will take place on 6-8 March, with the feature tie a clash between USA and Switzerland.

The International Tennis Hall of Fame and the ITF announced that Guillermo Vilas is this year's recipient of the Davis Cup Award of Excellence. The award was presented to Vilas on Saturday by ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti, who was joined by past award recipients Neale Fraser (2001), Pierre Darmon (2002) and Manolo Santana (2004). Tight at the top in new Davis Cup Nations Ranking

Spain's triumph in the 2008 Davis Cup by BNP Paribas Final takes it up to No. 2 in the latest Davis Cup Nations Ranking, its highest position since April 2006.

The three-time champion sits tantalisingly close to Russia, the 2006 champion, which has reached at least the semifinals for the last four years, and just ahead of last year's champion USA, which slips one place to No. 3.

Defeated finalist Argentina drops to fourth, while the only other changes in the top 10 see both Sweden and Germany overtake 2005 winner Croatia, as the points from that victory are finally discounted.

The three nations at the top are separated by just 200 points, giving added interest to their 2009 first round ties in March, which will see Spain host Serbia, USA at home to Switzerland and Russia travelling to Romania. It also sets up the prospect that the honour of 'top nation' could change hands on several occasions in 2009 as the three most recent champions battle it out to head the ranking list.

The ITF Davis Cup Nations Ranking was launched in 2001, and measures the success of all nations participating in the competition over a four-year period with recent performances weighted more heavily. For further information visit www.daviscup.com/ranking.

Swedes take first Doubles Masters title

Stefan Olsson and Peter Wikstrom (SWE) won their first Camozzi Doubles Masters men's title on Sunday in Palazzolo, Italy. Johan Andersson (SWE) and Bas Van Erp (NED) inflicted only the fourth loss in more than four years for defending champions Nick Taylor and David Wagner (USA) in the quad doubles final.

Olsson and Wikstrom came from a set down to win their opening round-robin pool match against Stephane Houdet (FRA) and Stephen Welch (USA) and both pairings went on to reach the semifinals after all four partnerships went in to the final day of pool matches with one win and one loss.

The 2006 champions, Maikel Scheffers and Ronald Vink (NED), joined surprise semifinalists Laszlo Farkas (HUN) and Fabian Mazzei (ITA) in the last four from the other pool before Scheffers and Vink survived a rollercoaster semifinal to beat Houdet and Welch 61 06 61. However, the Dutch top seeds saw their efforts to regain the title undone by Beijing Paralympic silver medallists Olsson and Wikstrom, who edged to a 64 26 75 victory in the final.

Andersson and Van Erp gave Beijing gold medallists Taylor and Wagner a fright in the pool match between the eventual quad finalists, the American three-time Doubles Masters champions eventually prevailing 76(5) 67(9) 63 to avoid a loss in the round-robin phase of the competition for the second successive year. Andersson and Van Erp turned the tables in the final, coming from a set down to win the title 36 62 63.

There were no upsets in the women's doubles, as top seeds Jiske Griffioen and Esther Vergeer (NED) eased in to the final before powering past second seeds Florence Gravelier (FRA) and Lucy Shuker (GBR) 63 60 to become Camozzi Doubles Masters champions for a fourth time.

Syrian success in Jordan

Syria dominated the two four-day tournaments which took place following a one-day training camp at the Group 4 ITF 13 & under Asian Championships. The competition was hosted by the Jordan Tennis Federation and held at the JTF Tennis Centre in Amman, Jordan.

The Syrian players won the boys' event at both competitions, while Keit Sadi claimed victory in the second girls' tournament, overcoming Nancy Karaki (LIB) who had defeated her in the final of the first tournament. Boys' top seed Amer Naow didn't drop a set in the first tournament, wrapping up victory with a 60 60 victory over second seed Nasser Alobaidy (KUW). The second tournament saw Naow repeat his previous score of 60 60, this time defeating Yacob Makhzoumeh (SYR) in the final.

A total of 25 boys and nine girls from nine countries took part in the one-day training camp, which gave players the opportunity to practise with other coaches and play a round-robin event for top seed positions. Based on the final rankings from the two events, players from West Asia will be selected to be on the ITF team which will participate in Group 2 of the Asian Championships in January 2009.

Van Der Merwe and Jabeur claim Masters titles

South Africa's Marc Van Der Merwe and 2008 African champion Ons Jabeur (TUN) secured the boys' and girls' titles at the first African 14 & Under Masters in Casablanca. Van Der Merwe won all his matches to secure the boys' title, overcoming compatriot Wayne Montgomery 62 64 in the final, while in the girls competition Jabeur defeated Intissar Rassif (MAR) 63 61.

The five-day round-robin competition, which welcomed the best eight girls and boys from Africa, was organised by the Confederation of African Tennis (CAT) and the Fédération Royale Marocaine de Tennis and supported by the ITF and took place at the Oceanic Club, Casablanca on 12-16 November.

The top four boys and girls were then selected to participate in the Afro-Asian Cup in Delhi, India on 14-22 December as part of a cooperation and exchange programme between the CAT and the Asian Tennis Federation (ATF). For full results, please visit www.cattennis.com/english/news.

Wozniacki triumphs in front of home crowd

Caroline Wozniacki, the world No. 12, completed a perfect week when winning her first home professional tournament in Odense, Denmark without dropping a set.

The home favourite, who was the highest ranked player ever to contest an ITF Women's Circuit event, overcame another Scandinavian, No. 2 seed Sofia Arvidsson (SWE) in the final of the \$100,000 tournament 62 61. Wozniacki is one of the most improved players on the Tour this year having jumped 50 places up the rankings and will be one to watch for the 2009 season.

Anastasia Yakimova (BEL) won the inaugural \$25,000 Mauritius event, following Patricia Mayrs (AUT) retirement during the deciding set of the final. All players were impressed with this new addition to the calendar. Runner-up Mayr said: "I wish to thank the tournament director and his team for their wonderful job and made all of us enjoy our tennis and stay in Mauritius."

Tennis...Play & Stay Seminar 2008

The four-day seminar, starting on Friday, will feature a host of presentations and discussions relating to starter tennis, and how the Play and Stay campaign can be best promoted and developed to increase tennis participation worldwide.

Obituary - Carole Caldwell Graebner

The ITF was saddened to learn of the death of former doubles player Carole Caldwell Graebner, who died in New York last week from cancer. She was 65.

Carole teamed up with Nancy Richey to claim the women's doubles championships at the 1965 US Championships (now the US Open) and the 1966 Australian Championships (now the Australian Open). She also won doubles titles at the US Clay Court Championships in 1965 and 1966 and was a finalist in singles at the 1964 US Championships.

Later in life Carole served on the United States Tennis Association (USTA) as chair of the Fed Cup Committee and vice chair of the Wightman Cup Committee. She also was a vice president of Tennis Week magazine and a radio and television commentator.
