

Success for USA at Seniors World Team Championships

USA was the most successful nation at last week's ITF Seniors World Team Championships in Mallorca, Spain, winning three of the ten titles on offer. The remaining titles were shared by six other countries, led by Italy with two victories.

The American teams were as strong as ever in the older women's categories, winning the Margaret Court (women's 45) and Maureen Connolly (women's 55) Cups, and reaching the final of the Maria Esther Bueno Cup (women's 50). In the Maureen Connolly final they faced host nation Spain, the only unseeded finalists across all age categories, winning 3-0 without dropping a set.

The Americans also claimed victory in the Margaret Court Cup with a 2-0 win over defending champions Czech Republic. However there was an upset in the Maria Esther Bueno final, as third seeds Great Britain beat USA 2-1 to prevent them from winning a fourth successive title.

The younger women's events were dominated by western European teams. In the Suzanne Lenglen Cup (women's 35), France and Spain faced off for the third year in a row, with France reversing the result of the previous two years to win 2-0. The French were not so successful in the Young Cup (women's 40), losing 2-1 in the final to title holders Italy.

Italy also defeated France in the Tony Trabert Cup (men's 40) final in an exciting tie that went to the third set of the deciding doubles. It was the Italians' third successive win in the competition. France also had a narrow defeat in the final of the Austria Cup (men's 55), as the Renoult brothers forced Australia to a three-set deciding doubles before the four-time defending champions emerged victorious.

The Fred Perry Cup (men's 50) was the only men's event to be won by USA. The No. 2 seeds upset top seeds and defending champions Germany 2-0 in the final after winning their semifinal against Austria earlier the same day. There was consolation for Germany in the Dubler Cup (men's 45), as the fifth seeds beat second seeds Austria in the final after knocking out top seeds and defending champions Spain in the semifinals.

The Italia Cup (men's 35) final was of an extremely high quality, with former Top 100-ranked players on both sides of the net. Spain won the first singles match but Austria drew level when Oscar Martinez had to withdraw injured in the second set against Werner Eschauer. The Austrians then took the doubles to win their first ever Italia Cup.

Italians top seedings at Beach Tennis World Championships

The inaugural ITF Beach Tennis World Championships are underway with the Italians hoping for a clean sweep of men's and women's doubles titles. The championships are being held at the historic Foro Italico in Rome alongside this week's Sony Ericsson WTA Tour event.

Top seeds in the men's draw are the Italian pairing of world No. 1 Paolo Tazzari and No. 3 Luca Meliconi, who team up for the first time in major competition. They are likely to face a strong challenge from their Italian compatriots including second seeds Alan Maldini and Cristiano Minighini. Some of the emerging nations in Beach Tennis will also look to cause upsets this week.

In the women's draw, Italy's top seeded pairing of Simona Briganti and Rosa Stefanelli of Italy will look to cement their dominance of the Beach Tennis Tour by adding to their impressive haul of six career titles together, accounting for almost half the titles since the inception of the Tour in 2008. Compatriots and No. 2 seeds Laura Olivieri and Franca Bruschi will be their strongest challengers, while the other contenders include third seeds Elisabet Duran-Nat and Gemma Egea-Manas of Spain and former tour stars Olga Barabanschikova and Natalia Zvereva of Belarus, seeded fourth.

ITF junior team qualifying completed in USA and Uruguay

Following last week's qualifying events in Uruguay and USA, another 14 teams have booked their places at the ITF junior team competition finals in San Luis Potosi, Mexico and Prostějov, Czech Republic.

The South America World Junior Tennis qualifying was held in Punta del Este, Uruguay, with Argentina defeating Peru in the boys' final. Both teams qualify for the World Junior Tennis Finals alongside Chile, who defeated Colombia for third place. Argentina also took the top spot in the girls qualifying and will be joined in Prostějov by runner-up Brazil and Chile, who defeated Colombia for third place.

The final qualifying event of the North/Central America & Caribbean region for both World Junior Tennis and Junior Davis Cup & Junior Fed Cup by BNP Paribas took place on 1-3 May in Boca Raton, Florida, USA.

Hosts USA qualified for three of the four finals, winning the Junior Davis Cup and boys' World Junior Tennis and finishing 14 & under girls' runner-up. Canada's girls qualified for both Finals by winning the Junior Fed Cup and World Junior Tennis girls' qualifying. Mexico qualified for the boys' World Junior Tennis Finals as runner-up, and as host nation, will have a spot guaranteed at the Junior Davis Cup & Junior Fed Cup by BNP Paribas Finals.

The next four places in the team finals in Prostějov are at stake this week at the Asia/Oceania boys' final qualifying for World Junior Tennis in Kuching, Malaysia, where 16 teams compete for a place in the Finals.

Sevastova wins historic Soweto event

Anastasija Sevastova of Latvia won the first ever ITF Pro Circuit event staged in Soweto, South Africa, winning the \$100,000 Soweto Women's Open at the Arthur Ashe Tennis Complex last week. The No. 4 seed defeated eighth seed Eva Hrdinova of the Czech Republic 62 62 in the final.

Soweto, the largest and most populous of South Africa's townships, played a crucial role in the history of South Africa's struggle against apartheid. Following his controversial decision to play in the South African Open at Ellis Park in the 1970s, Ashe sponsored the tennis complex in Soweto in order to assist young black tennis players. Over the years the complex fell into decline, despite many attempts to revitalise it.

The complex has now been renovated as a result of a joint venture between the South African Tennis Association (SATA) and the Gauteng provincial government through the City of Johannesburg's Community Development Directorate, as well as the South African National Lotteries Board. Earlier in April it staged a successful ATP Challenger men's event, won by French veteran Fabrice Santoro.

SATA vice president Bongani Zondi is upbeat about the significance of this drive into areas that do not have a tennis culture. He said: "Historically tennis is an elite sport, but now we are bringing it to the people."

NEWS IN BRIEF

WADA meetings

The Executive Committee and the Foundation Board of the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) will meet on 9 and 10 May respectively in Montreal, Canada, for the first time this year. ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti sits on the Foundation Board.

During these meetings, members representing governments of all regions of the world and the Olympic Movement will discuss stakeholders' implementation and enforcement of the amended World Anti-Doping Code and International Standards, which went into effect on January 1 of this year.

Roland Garros wild cards

Australia's Bernard Tomic and Olivia Rogowska have received wild cards into 2009 Roland Garros following a reciprocal arrangement between the FFT and Tennis Australia. The same arrangement between the FFT and the USTA saw Americans John Isner and Lauren Embree awarded wild cards after the two players won last week's US wild card play-off events.

Obituaries

The ITF was saddened to learn of the recent death of two wheelchair tennis players **Oliver Puras Gomez** and **Diana Bowles**.

Puras Gomez, a member of the Spanish wheelchair tennis team, had a heart attack during a Spanish national tournament. He was Tournament Director for the "Caja Duero Open", and more recently helped organise a Junior Wheelchair Tennis Camp in his home town of Miranda.

Bowles, who passed away following a battle with cancer, played wheelchair tennis all over the world and represented Great Britain in the Invacare World Team Cup in Tremosine, Italy in 2002. She was a former Committee member of the National Wheelchair Tennis Association of Great Britain.
