## Nadal bids for record fifth title

Rafael Nadal (ESP) is attempting to win a record fifth straight title at the 2009 Roland Garros championships, which got underway on Sunday in Paris.

Nadal, who easily defeated Roger Federer in last year's final, is bidding to become the first man to claim a fifth successive French Open title. The Spaniard has already passed the record of 28 straight wins at the tournament set by Bjorn Borg between 1978-81, and after his first round victory against Marcos Daniel is now on 29, equal with the overall tournament record achieved by Chris Evert.

The world No. 1 arrived in Paris having just had his 33-match winning streak on clay broken by Roger Federer in Madrid, who in turn is once again looking to complete his set of Grand Slams and equal Pete Sampras' record of 14.

The women's draw looks more open, with defending champion Ana Ivanovic trying to rediscover her form, after a disappointing season so far. The No. 1 seed in Paris is Dinara Safina who can expect considerable opposition from the Williams sisters as well 2006 finalist Svetlana Kuznetsova.

## Arguello and Stephens claim Italian Open titles

Facundo Arguello (ARG) and Sloane Stephens (USA) both claimed their maiden Grade A titles last week on the clay courts of the Bonacossa Club in Milan.

Stephens, who has yet to lose a match on the ITF Junior Circuit in 2009, dropped just one set all week and cruised through the latter rounds in Italy. The unseeded American, who also won the title at the at the USTA International Spring Championships in April, brought to an end the 14-match winning streak of Russian Yulia Putintseva in the first round and overwhelmed world No.1 Laura Robson (GBR) 64 60 in the quarterfinals.

Stephens then lost just five games against compatriot Christina McHale in the semifinals and defeated Serbia's Aleksandra Krunic, who had not dropped a set on her way to the final, 64 62 to take the title and rise to a career-high ranking of 14.

The last American player to win Italian Open Bonfiglio was 1982's World Junior Champion Gretchen Rush Magers.

Arguello picked up his second title of the year, following his victory at the Grade 2 Copa Graiman in Ecuador in January. The Argentine, who benefited from all the seeds in his half of the draw losing by the second round, came through some tough matches early on, but lost just two games in his quarterfinal against Stanislav Poplavskiyy (UKR), then beat Guilherme Clezar (BRA) 62 62 to reach the final, where he faced home favourite Federico Gaio.

This was Gaio's fourth final of the year and he was searching for his second title. However, it was Arguello who found the edge in the deciding set for a 64 26 63 victory.

The German pairing of Richard Becker and Dominik Schulz won the boys' doubles title, while Magda Linette (POL) and Anna Orlik (BLR) were champions in the girls' event.

## Japan Open champions decided

Shingo Kunieda (JPN), Florence Gravelier (FRA) and David Wagner (USA) won the men's singles, women's singles and quad singles titles at the Japan Open, the first Super Series event of the 2009 NEC Wheelchair Tennis Tour, in Iizuka on Sunday.

All four top seeds reached the semifinals of the men's and women's singles with few problems. After two 60 60 wins apiece, world No.1 Kunieda and second seed Stephane Houdet dropped their first games of the tournament in the quarterfinals. Kunieda remained in devastating form to defeat French third seed Michael Jeremiasz 60 61 in his semifinal, with Houdet also easing into the final with a 62 62 win over fourth seed Maikel Scheffers (NED). Kunieda sealed his fourth successive Japan Open title with another superb display, withstanding a comeback from Houdet in the second set of the final, to record a 61 64 victory, in a match made available to wheelchair tennis fans all over the world via a live video stream on the internet.

The first women's singles semifinal was a thrilling contest between two former champions, as Florence Gravelier edged third seed Daniela di Toro (AUS) 46 62 76(6). Second seed Sharon Walraven (NED) comfortably came through the other semifinal against Canadian Yuka Chokyu 61 63. In the end, it was Gravelier who proved strongest in the final, defeating Walraven 63 63 in a rematch of the 2006 Japan Open final.

Peter Norfolk (GBR) and Wagner set up a rematch of the 2008 quad singles final, both encountering few problems in the earlier rounds. The result was the same as in 2008, as world No.2 Wagner got the better of a first set tiebreak, before dominating the second set to overcome world No.1 Norfolk 76(4) 60.

Top seeds Houdet and Jeremiasz won a fascinating men's doubles event, coming out on top against Dutch second seeds Scheffers and Ronald Vink 57 61 [10-7], after a championship tiebreak in the final.

In the women's doubles final, second seeds di Toro and Gravelier proved too strong for top seeds Chokyu and Walraven 62 62. Peter Norfolk partnered Canada's Sarah Hunter to victory in the quad doubles final, the second seeds overcoming American top seeds Bryan Barten and Wagner 76(4) 62.
