Countdown to Wimbledon

The qualifying event for next week's Wimbledon Championships began today at the Bank of England Sports Ground, Roehampton, London, running until Thursday 18 June. Men's singles qualifying sees 128 players contest 16 places in the main draw, while women's singles qualifying sees 96 players chase 12 places in the main draw.

The 2009 Wimbledon Championships will be held from Monday 22 June until Sunday 5 July. The seeds will be announced on Wednesday 20 June, and the draws will be held at 10:00 local time on Friday 19 June.

Wild cards for the event include last year's Wimbledon junior champions Laura Robson of Great Britain and Bulgarian Grigor Dimitrov. Other men's wild cards have gone to former world No.1 Juan Carlos Ferrero (ESP), Nicolas Mahut (FRA) plus Britons Alex Bogdanovic, Daniel Evans, Joshua Goodall and James Ward. Kimiko Date-Krumm (JPN), Alexa Glatch (USA) and Michelle Larcher De Brito (POR) join British players Elena Baltacha, Katie O'Brien, Melanie South and Georgie Stoop as the other women's wild cards.

First World Group Play-off venues announced

Brazil, Italy, Netherlands and Sweden have all submitted their choice of venues for the 2009 Davis Cup by BNP Paribas World Group play-off ties on 18-20 September.

Brazil will take on fellow South Americans Ecuador on clay in Porto Alegre at the Ginasio Gigantinho, while clay is also the chosen surface for Italy, which faces Switzerland at Genoa's Centro Sportivo and Netherlands, which hosts France at the MECC in Maastricht. In the other venue to be announced so far, Sweden meets Romania on hard court at the Idrottens Hus in Helsingborg.

The remaining four venues (Serbia, Chile, Belgium and South Africa) are expected to be announced in the next week. All chosen venues are subject to a successful site visit by the ITF. The following is a full list of September's play-off ties:

Guga uses Play and Stay to help tennis growth in Brazil

The Brazilian Tennis Federation (CBT) teamed up with former world No. 1 Gustavo Kuerten to host 'Guga Kuerten Week' in Florianopolis, 7-14 June, visiting various schools, shopping malls and avenues in Kuerten's home city, using the ITF's 'Play and Stay' campaign and equipment to encourage people to take up the sport.

Since his retirement after an illustrious career, Kuerten has focused on providing opportunities in Brazil for people to start playing tennis, and changing people's view of tennis as a difficult sport.

CBT was one of the first nations to embrace 'Play and Stay', and has worked tirelessly to ensure the growth and success of the programme in Brazil. Cesar Kist, CBT Development Director, said: "A project like this makes us really thankful. We saw people aged 70 and above playing tennis for the first time, and people who came out of work to experience sport for the first time."

Kist continued: "The most important thing is to show these people that tennis is an easy sport, not expensive to play when done in a group, and is really fun when you play the game early on. We received positive feedback from everyone who tried the Play and Stay programme."

'Guga Kuerten Week' finished with a Play and Stay competition, coach education workshop, and an exhibition tie featuring a rematch of the 1997 French Open final between Kuerten and Sergi Bruguera. For further information, visit www.tennisplayandstay.com.

Successful debut for Robredo wheelchair event

Stefan Olsson (SWE) and Aniek Van Koot (NED) justified their top seedings to win the inaugural 'Memorial Santi Silvas' wheelchair event in Olot, part of the NEC Wheelchair Tennis Tour, which saw Spanish Davis Cup star Tommy Robredo act as tournament director.

Robredo, who resumes his pre-Wimbledon schedule at the grass court event in 's-Hertogenbosch, organised last week's tournament in his childhood home town in memory of his friend, Spanish wheelchair tennis player Santi Silvas, who passed away last year.

Top seeded Olsson came through a three-set semifinal against France's Fred Cattaneo, before seeing off second seed Maikel Scheffers (NED) 26 61 61 in the final. Van Koot also came back from set down in the women's final against Lucy Shuker (GBR), winning 26 62 63 to justify her status as title favourite. Cattaneo and Martin Legner (AUT) were men's doubles champions, while Shuker and Van Koot teamed up for the women's doubles title.

An excellent host and organiser, Robredo invited a host of stars to the finals weekend. Former Wimbledon champion Conchita Martinez, Spain's Davis Cup Captain Albert Costa and Spain's double Beijing Olympic champion cyclist Joan Llaneras all took part in a series of exhibitions and clinics with the wheelchair players.

Tommy Robredo's foundation will give the proceeds from the tournament to help fund more players who want to enjoy wheelchair tennis.

Commonwealth Games referee appointed

The ITF has announced the appointment of Australian Wayne McKewen as Referee for the inaugural Commonwealth Games Tennis Event taking place in Delhi, India on 4-10 October 2010.

McKewen, Referee at the Australian Open and a member of the ITF's Team of Officials, said: "I am glad to have been selected as Referee for this prestigious event and very much looking forward to the experience. The Commonwealth Games has great tradition and history and I am pleased to be involved in the first tennis event."

This is the first time that tennis has been included in the Commonwealth Games schedule and McKewen will be working alongside the ITF, Delhi Organising Committee and Commonwealth Games Federation to ensure the smooth running of the event. The Games themselves will run from 3-14 October 2010.

NEWS IN BRIEF

Tennis players honoured

Australian tennis legend **Lesley Bowrey** (nee Turner) has been appointed a member of the Order of Australia for service to tennis as a player, coach and mentor to junior players, and to the community. Between 1961 and 1967, Lesley Bowrey won 13 major titles, including two French Open singles titles, seven doubles and four mixed.

Two-time Paralympic champion **Peter Norfolk** of Great Britain has been made an OBE for services to disability sport in the Queen's Birthday Honours List. Norfolk receives an honours upgrade, having already being made an MBE in the Queen's 2005 Birthday Honours List after becoming Britain's first ever Paralympic tennis medallist at the 2004 Athens Paralympics.

Thomas Johansson retires

Sweden's Thomas Johansson has announced his immediate retirement from professional tennis. The 24-year-old captured the 2002 Australian Open title, eight ATP World Tour titles and an Olympic Games silver medal in doubles with Simon Aspelin at Beijing in 2008. He also reached the 2005 Wimbledon semi-finals and played in three Davis Cup semi-finals during a 15-year professional career.

Johansson's last tour-level matches came for Sweden in its Davis Cup by BNP Paribas World Group first-round tie against Israel in March.
