## Spain continues title defence

Spain continues the defence of its Davis Cup title when the 2009 Davis Cup by BNP Paribas quarterfinals take place this weekend on 10-12 July. As well as the four quarterfinal ties, 20 Zonal Group I and II ties will be held, with full coverage on the official Davis Cup website [www.daviscup.com](http://www.daviscup.com).

Despite the absence of the injured Rafael Nadal, Spain fields a strong team on clay in Marbella in Fernando Verdasco, Juan Carlos Ferrero, Feliciano Lopez and Tommy Robredo, who boasts the most match wins on clay so far this season. The defending champions take on Germany in a repeat of last year's quarterfinal, with Philipp Kohlschreiber and Nicolas Kiefer once again heading the team which also includes Davis Cup newcomers Mischa Zverev and Andreas Beck.

World No. 5 Juan Martin del Potro takes the helm in the Argentine squad which travels to Ostrava to face the Czech Republic, led by the talented duo of Tomas Berdych and Radek Stepanek. Del Potro is joined by Jose Acasuso, Juan Monaco and debutant Leonardo Mayer, under the guidance of captain Tito Vasquez who is enjoying his first season in the role. The Czechs ousted a strong French team in the first round in March and are into the Davis Cup quarterfinals for the second straight year, having had to contest the World Group play-offs the previous four years.

## Federer wins historic 15th Grand Slam title

Roger Federer became the most successful man in Grand Slam history when he clinched his 15th Grand Slam title at Wimbledon on Sunday, defeating Andy Roddick in a record-breaking final 57 76(6) 76(5) 36 1614. Federer also became only the third player to win six Wimbledon titles, regaining the crown he lost in dramatic fashion to Rafael Nadal last year. He also wins back the No. 1 ranking from Nadal.

The match was the longest final in Grand Slam history at 77 games and contained the longest-ever fifth set. However, at 4 hours 18 minutes, it was 30 minutes shorter than last year's final, with both players dominating on serve. Roddick was left to regret missing four set points in the second set tiebreak, the last with a miss-hit volley with the court wide open. Having successfully held his first 37 service games, the American was finally broken in an epic final set lasting 95 minutes.

Federer's win on the Wimbledon Centre Court was witnessed by Grand Slam greats Rod Laver, Bjorn Borg and Pete Sampras, with whom he previously shared the record of 14 Grand Slam titles.

Wimbledon finalist Andy Roddick has had to withdraw from the USA team to face Croatia on clay in Porec. Roddick has a hip injury, leaving James Blake, Mardy Fish and Bob and Mike Bryan attempting to reach the semifinals for the fourth year in a row. The team takes on an in-form Croatian team, which includes Marin Cilic, Ivo Karlovic, Roko Karanusic and Lovro Zovko.

The fourth quarterfinal sees Israel take on Russia in Tel Aviv, with the hosts bidding to reach their first ever World Group semifinal. Dudi Sela, who reached the round of 16 at Wimbledon, is joined by Harel Levy and doubles specialists Jonathan Erlich and Andy Ram, while a strong Russian line-up features Dmitry Tursunov, Marat Safin, Igor Andreev and Mikhail Youzhny.

The four quarterfinal winners will compete in the World Group semifinals on 18-20 September. In the semifinals, Czech Republic would be away to Croatia or USA, while Argentina would be at home to Croatia or USA. Israel would be home to Germany or away to Spain, while Russia would be away to Germany or home to Spain.

Nominations for all ties, including zonal ties, can be found on the Davis Cup website, where you can also view up-to-date results, plus live scoring, news, photographs and audio interviews from the World Group quarterfinal ties.

The draws for all of this weekend's ties will take place on **Thursday 9 July**.

Federer said: "It definitely feels like it's come full circle for me, you know, starting it here and ending it here. Of course, my career is far from over. But it's also nice to think especially so many legends were sitting there today."

Roddick was left to reflect on his third runner-up finish at Wimbledon. Asked how it compared to his 2004 and 2005 final defeats to Federer, the clearly upset American said: "I think it's worse."

The women's singles was dominated by the Williams sisters, with Serena avenging last year's final defeat with a 76(3) 62 victory over sister Venus

to regain the title she previous won in 2002-03. It was the fourth time the sisters had met in a Wimbledon final. Serena has now won 11 Grand Slam titles and holds the Wimbledon, Australian and US Open crowns.

"It feels so amazing, I'm so blessed," Serena said. "I feel like I shouldn't be holding the trophy, like I'm holding Venus's trophy. It's named for Venus and she always wins, so it hasn't settled in I won yet." Venus said: "Today she was too good, she had an answer for everything. She played the best tennis today so congratulations."

The two sisters defended their women's doubles title with a 76(4) 64 victory over Australians Samantha Stosur and Rennae Stubbs. Daniel Nestor and Nenad Zemonjic also defended their men's doubles title, defeating top seeds Bob and Mike Bryan 76(7) 67(3) 76(3) 63. The mixed doubles was won by Mark Knowles and Anna-Lena Groenefeld, who overcame title favourites Leander Paes and Cara Black 75 63.

## Lertcheewakarn and Kuznetsov win Wimbledon junior titles

History was made at the 2009 Wimbledon Junior Championships, with Noppawan Lertcheewakarn becoming the first-ever Thai player to lift the girls trophy, while Andrey Kuznetsov was the first Russian in over 40 years to win the boys title.

Lertcheewakarn, the 2008 ITF Junior World Champion, was finalist at Wimbledon in 2008 but went one better this year, coming from behind to defeat French world No.1 Kristina Mladenovic 36 63 61 in front of a large crowd on Court No.1. "It's good – it's for Thai people," she said of her win. "It means everything".

Having saved five match points in her opening match against Alejandra Granillo (MEX), Lertcheewakarn cruised through to the final without dropping another set. In the decider the Thai No. 4 seed withstood some ferocious hitting from this year's Roland Garros junior champion and dominated the final set to lift the trophy and regain the No. 1 ranking.

Kuznetsov also had to come from behind as he overcame American Jordan Cox 46 62 62 to win his first junior Grand Slam title. The unseeded Russian dropped just one set prior to the final and came through a tough semifinal against Australian Bernard Tomic 63 76(6).

Cox claimed the first set as Kuznetsov pushed a forehand long but the Russian broke twice in both remaining sets to clinch victory. "I still can't believe I made it," said Kuznetsov. "I couldn't show my best in the beginning. But in the second set I relaxed a little then just used my chances to win this match."

In the doubles finals, Lertcheewakarn and Sally Peers (AUS) defeated Mladenovic and Silvia Njiric (CRO), while Pierre-Hugues Herbert (FRA) and Kevin Krawietz (GER) overcame Julien Obry and Adrien Puget (FRA) 67(3) 62 1210. ## Dutch and French success at Wimbledon wheelchair event

Dutch top seeds Korie Homan and Esther Vergeer made history on Sunday, cruising to victory in the inaugural Wimbledon women's wheelchair doubles, while Frenchmen Stephane Houdet and Michael Jeremiasz had a much tougher time before lifting the title in the men's wheelchair doubles.

The world's top two singles and doubles players, Homan and Vergeer won their semifinal against Germany's Katharina Kruger and Sharon Walraven of Netherlands 60 60, while Australia's Daniela di Toro and Britain's Lucy Shuker edged out the second seeds Florence Gravelier (FRA) and Jiske Griffioen (NED) 64 64.

In the final, Homan and Vergeer rallied from 3-1 down in the second set to defeat di Toro and Shuker 61 63 to earn their third Grand Slam title of the year after their Australian Open and Roland Garros victories. "To play here for the first time is amazing, but to go on and actually win it is very special and the one thing I always wanted to add to my list of titles," said nine-time world champion Vergeer.

The second seeds also went out in the semifinals of the men's doubles, Dutch duo Maikel Scheffers and Ronald Vink losing to Japan's Shingo Kunieda and Dutchman Robin Ammerlaan 67(9) 64 61. Meanwhile a rematch of the Beijing Paralympic men's doubles final saw Houdet and Jeremiasz once again defeat Sweden's Stefan Olsson and Peter Wikstrom 76(13) 61.

In a thrilling three-set final, Roland Garros champions Houdet and Jeremiasz eventually overcame Australian Open champions Ammerlaan and Kunieda 16 64 76(3).

## Success for ITF/Grand Slam 18 & under touring team

The ITF/Grand Slam international 18 & under junior touring team to Europe concluded its eight-week tour at the weekend at Wimbledon. Eleven players representing nine countries embarked on the tour in May, taking part in various Grade 1 and Grade A tournaments including Junior Roland Garros and Junior Wimbledon.

The team had a successful tour with at least one member of the team reaching the quarterfinals in singles or doubles at each of the seven tournaments.

Veronica Cepede Royg (PAR), in partnership with Serbia's Aleksandra Krunic, defeated ITF teammates Ulrikke Eikeri (NOR) and Zsafia Susanyi (HUN) to clinch the first doubles trophy for the team in Santa Croce. In the boys doubles final, Liang-Chi Huang (TPE) and Nikala Scholtz (RSA) were unable to make it a team double when they lost to No. 3 seeds Filip Horanksy and Jozef Kovalik (SVK) 63 16 [10-3].

At the Astrid Bowl, the ITF team filled all four places in the boys doubles final, with Francis Casey Alcantara (PHI) and Cheng-Peng Hsieh (TPE) scoring a 63 62 victory over Guilherme Clezar (BRA) and Karim-Mohamed Maamoum (EGY).

At junior Roland Garros, Clezar and Huang proved to be successful pairing, earning a place in the boys' doubles final. Unfortunately the two boys were unable to overcome the Croatian partnership of Marin Draganja and Dino Marcan, losing in straight sets 63 62.

In Offenbach/Main, members of the ITF/Grand Slam team were involved in both boys and girls doubles victories. Alcantara and Huang captured the boys doubles title, while Eikeri and her Swedish partner Hilda Melander clinched the girls doubles title defeating ITF teammate Grace Ysidora (INA) and Russia's Anastasia Mukhametova (RUS) 76(5) 76(4).

The team was financed by the Grand Slam Development Fund, giving players not only the opportunity to take part in top level international competition but also the invaluable experience of travelling abroad as part of a team under the guidance of an ITF coach.

## Chinese players star in 16 & under touring team

Members of the ITF/Grand Slam 16 & under touring team enjoyed a successful trip to Europe, winning four titles and reaching a further five finals on the five-week 16 & under circuit.

Team member Rian Tian of China and her Belarus partner Aleksandra Sasnovich dominated the girls doubles events, winning four titles out of five finals contested. The boys pairing of Guan-yu Cao (CHN) and Jeson Patrombon (PHI) also enjoyed doubles success, reaching three finals, while Zarah Razafimahatrata of Madagascar reached the girls' singles final in Le Pontet.

Radhika Kaniktar, one of the team coaches from India, said: "This is a great opportunity for the Asian, African and Central American players to see how much more seriously they have to train in order to beat, day in and day out, the tough European and South American players. In general, physically and mentally, our players are a little below the world top standards in their age group."

Mexico's Guillermo Stevens, the other team coach, added: "Playing in Europe is a shock for many of the ITF international team members because they have to deal with a very different world from theirs. But at the end of the tour they return as stronger tennis players, and with a clearer picture in their mind of what they need to focus on to keep on the road that leads to professional tennis."

## Line-up decided for World Junior Tennis Finals

Last weekend's final round of the 14 & under European Summer Cups determined the European qualifiers for the World Junior Tennis Finals in Prostějov, Czech Republic, on 3-8 August. The boys' Copa del Sol and girls' Europa Cup act as the qualifying round for Europe, with five nations in both the boys and girls events bidding to join Czech Republic, which automatically qualifies as host of the Finals.

The Europa Cup for girls took place in Loano, Italy, where in a rematch of last year's final Russia avenged its defeat by Ukraine 2-1. The three other girls teams to qualify were France, Bulgaria and Netherlands. In the boys competition, France successfully defended its Copa del Sol title, with a 2-0 win over Portugal in Seville, Spain. Israel, Russia and Spain also booked their ticket for the finals.

The European final qualifying events (Borotra and Helvetie Cup) for the 16 & under Junior Davis Cup/Fed Cup by BNP Paribas Finals will take place on 3-5 August.
