## Historic win for Israel

Israel has reached the Davis Cup semifinals for the first time in history after a 4-1 victory over Russia in Tel Aviv in the Davis Cup by BNP Paribas World Group quarterfinals on 10-12 July.

In the semifinals, Israel will travel to Spain, who needed a deciding fifth rubber to see off Germany 3-2 in Marbella. Czech Republic also scored a last-rubber 3-2 victory over Argentina in Ostrava to set up an away trip to Croatia, 3-2 winners over USA in Porec. The semifinals will be played alongside the World Group Play-offs on 18-20 September, with venues to be confirmed by 22 July.

All four members of Israel's team contributed a point as the hosts built up a 3-0 winning lead over Russia in front of 11,000 spectators. Thirty-one-year-old Harel Levy upset Igor Andreev 64 62 46 62 in the opening rubber, before Dudi Sela overcame Mikhail Youzhny 36 61 60 75. Jonathan Erlich and Andy Ram then completed victory inside two days with a 63 64 67(3) 46 64 win over Igor Kunitsyn and Marat Safin, ending Safin's Davis Cup career.

Explaining Israel's success, Ram said: "I think that as a team we are the No. 1 team in the world. We are all friends, we all grew up together since the age of 14, we know each other so well, and the families too."

## Madrid hosts 2009 ITF AGM

Delegates will be guests of the RFET for Thursday's welcome dinner, while other functions will be hosted by the ITF, RTF (Russian Tennis Federation) as Fed Cup champions, and LTA (Lawn Tennis Association).

Juan Carlos Ferrero was Spain's hero as the title holders fought off a strong German challenge at the Plaza de Toros de Puerto Banus. The 29-year-old was brought in for the final rubber for his first Davis Cup appearance since 2005, and defeated Andreas Beck 64 64 64. Earlier Philipp Kohlschreiber had starred for the visitors, upsetting Tommy Robredo 63 64 64 on the opening day, before levelling the tie with a dramatic 64 62 16 26 86 win over Fernando Verdasco.

Ferrero said. "It's a long time I didn't play Davis Cup competition and this tie for me was very special. To come back and play the last point, I felt amazing on the court."

There were also heroics in Ostrava, where 30-year-old Radek Stepanek defied a recent knee injury to win the deciding rubber against Argentina's Juan Monaco 76(5) 63 62 to secure Czech Republic's first semifinal appearance since 1996. Juan Martin del Potro weighed in with two straight sets wins for the Argentines, but victories for Tomas Berdych and the Berdych and Stepanek in the doubles were enough to see the home team through.

"It was the biggest effort I have ever done in Davis Cup," said Stepanek. "I had to really dig deep to step on the court. After the doubles I was like 90 per cent sure that I'm not able to play singles, but I was assured by the doctors that it was not going to damage my knee."

The remaining quarterfinal saw Croatia upset USA indoors on clay in the coastal resort of Porec. The tie was decided on a marathon opening day, when the hosts won two five-set thrillers which combined to last over eight hours. Ivo Karlovic overcame James Blake 67(5) 46 63 76(3) 75, before Marin Cilic saw off Mardy Fish 46 63 67(3) 61 86. The Bryan brothers kept the Americans in the hunt, before Cilic clinched victory with a 63 63 46 62 triumph over Blake.

"This was one of the greatest ties I've played so far," Cilic said afterwards. "The Czechs are also a great team, but playing at home is a little bit of an advantage, so with our team we can go through to the final."

## Seles, Gimeno, Dell, Johnson inducted into Hall of Fame

Nine-time Grand Slam singles champion Monica Seles was inducted into the International Tennis Hall of Fame in Newport, Rhode Island on Saturday.

Joining the former women's world No. 1 among the inductees were 1960s Spanish player Andres Gimeno, pioneer marketer Donald Dell and the late Robert Johnson, a junior player developer who helped launch the careers of black players Althea Gibson and Arthur Ashe.

Seles headed the WTA rankings for a total of 178 weeks and won Roland Garros in 1990-1992, US Open in 1991-92, and the Australian Open in 1991-1993 and 1996.

Speaking at the induction ceremony, Seles said: "I hope it will inspire young children to pick up a racket, hit a few balls and fall in love with the sport the way I did. I look forward to watching the sport and seeing how much faster it can get."

## Madagascan triumphs on ITF/CAT 12 & under circuit

Jackinah Rakotosasy of Madagascar dominated the ITF/CAT 12 & under circuit which concluded last week in Pretoria, South Africa. The circuit featured 22 boys and 20 girls from the following ten countries: Botswana, Lesotho, Madagascar, Malawi, Mauritius, Namibia, South Africa, Swaziland, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

The circuit started with a two-day training camp followed by a South African Tennis Association (SATA)-sanctioned junior tournament in Belgrave. This tournament provided an opportunity for players in the region to test their skills against nationally ranked South Africans. The second tournament was an ITF event held at the University of Pretoria with only the invited countries participating against each other.

Rakotosasy won the two girls singles titles, defeating Sedi Jacobs of Namibia in both finals. In the boys singles, Chisomo Lumeta of Malawi beat Kukutha Motlojoa of Lesotho 62 63 in the first final, but went on to lose the second final to Alywn Mushonga of Zimbabwe 76 61.

Karl Davies, ITF Development Officer for Southern Africa said: "Thanks have to be extended to the hosts South African Tennis Association for their excellent hospitality. We are looking forward to the players continuing their training and competition and be ready if selected for the regional CAT 14 & under circuit."

## US Open prize money tops record \$21.6 million

The 2009 US Open purse will top \$21.6 million, marking the third consecutive year that the tournament's prize money has increased by \$1 million. In addition to the base purse of \$21.6 million, the top three men's and top three women's finishers in the Olympus US Open Series may earn up to an additional \$2.6 million in bonus prize money at the US Open, providing a potential total payout of \$24.2 million.

Both the men's and women's US Open singles champions will earn a record \$1.6 million with the ability to earn an additional \$1 million in bonus prize money (for a total \$2.6 million potential payout) based on their performances in the Olympus US Open Series. In addition, both US Open singles champions will receive a new 2010 Lexus IS Convertible

The Olympus US Open Series Bonus Challenge rewards the top three men's and top three women's finishers each year with bonus prize money at the US Open and has resulted in the largest paychecks in tennis history for men (2007 – Roger Federer, \$2.4 million) and women (2005 – Kim Clijsters, \$2.2 million). Montcourt enjoyed a career-high junior world ranking of No. 4 in 2003, after reaching the semifinals of the Junior Australian Open. As a senior, he achieved a career-high ATP ranking of No. 104 last month.

ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti said: "As a junior, Mathieu enjoyed great success on the ITF junior circuit, where he was a strong competitor and a popular player. Our thoughts are with his family and friends."
