

USA begins defence of World Junior Tennis titles

France's boys team and Russia's girls team top the seedings for the 19th World Junior Tennis Finals, which start today on the clay courts at TK Prostějov in Czech Republic. For the 11th consecutive year, the club is hosting the official ITF team competition finals for boys and girls aged 14 & under. Rafael Nadal, Andy Roddick, Nicole Pietrangeli and Amelie Mauresmo are among the current stars who once played World Junior Tennis.

From a total of 89 countries, 16 boys and 16 girls teams have fought their way through regional qualifying competitions for a chance to compete in Prostějov and vie for a place in Saturday's final.

USA returns to defend its titles in both events. It rates among the favourites to claim this year's competition and with it the accolade of being the first country to win consecutive titles in the girls and boys events.

In the boys competition, France earns top seeding following its recent victory in the European Summer Cup. It will look to go one better this year after losing to USA in last year's final. Australia, the 2007 champion, is seeded number two, while USA and Argentina complete the top four seeds.

Russia is hoping to reclaim the title it won in 1999 and 2000 in the girls' competition. Last year's champion, USA, is the number two seed, with Ukraine and Czech Republic seeded fourth and fifth respectively. Number three seed and Asian champions, China, is looking to put itself on the map with its first World Junior Tennis title.

Invacare extends sponsorship at World Team Cup

The ITF has announced that Invacare has extended its sponsorship of the World Team Cup wheelchair event through 2010, marking its 15th year of title sponsorship. The agreement was signed at yesterday's finals of the 2009 Invacare World Team Cup, which celebrated its 25th anniversary in Nottingham. Martin McElhatton, President of the International Wheelchair Tennis Association, signed the agreement on behalf of the ITF, along with Agnes Riquelme of Invacare Europe.

After a week of bad weather affecting the schedule of play, the Invacare World Team Cup had glorious sunshine for Sunday's four finals, with France and the Netherlands winning the men's World Group 1 and women's titles respectively, while host nation Great Britain won a third quad title. Austria and Chile both earned promotion to World Group 1 after reaching the World Group 2 final, with top seeds Austria going on to win the title.

On Friday, the Netherlands retained the junior title when they defeated Australia in a deciding doubles rubber. Tom Egberink and Sven Jonker completing a 2-1 victory to give the Dutch their fifth Invacare World Team Cup junior title.

Nicolas Peifer and Stephane Houdet clinched a first Invacare World Team Cup men's title for 16 years for France, Peifer beating the Netherlands' Maikel Scheffers and Robin Ammerlaan in the final, Peifer winning in straight sets and Houdet wrapping up a 36 60 64 victory over Ammerlaan.

Great Britain made history in the women's event, justifying their second seeding to reach the final for the first time, but Jordanne Whiley and Lucy Shuker were unable to dethrone the Dutch as Korie Homan and Esther Vergeer steered the Netherlands to a 22nd Invacare World Team Cup title.

There was more British success in the quad event, where Great Britain and USA topped their respective round-robin pools before beating the Netherlands and Israel respectively in the semifinals. Jamie Burdekin and Peter Norfolk beat Americans Nick Taylor and David Wagner in the two singles rubbers in the final and Great Britain completed the week without dropping any singles or doubles rubbers.

To mark the 25th anniversary of the event, special guests in Nottingham during the week included Rainer Kuschall, Invacare World Team Cup Ambassador, and Brad Parks, the founder of wheelchair tennis. Parks presented the ITF Brad Parks Award to Frenchman Jean-Pierre Limborg in recognition of his contribution to the international development of wheelchair tennis.

Diop dominates in Senegal

Seynabou Diop of Senegal dominated the two girls 14 & under tournaments on the ITF/CAT West & Central Africa circuit before teaming up with compatriot Sokhna Diatta to also claim both doubles titles. In the boys 14 & under competition Kevin Logbo of Benin captured the first leg, leaving the second one to Linus Paul (NGR). Logbo then partnered Batazi Abissoubie (TOG), to a win in the doubles. Ivory Coast secured victory in the boys 12 & under competitions; Yao Connor and Ouattara Abdoul Karim won the first and second singles legs respectively, before joining forces to claim the doubles title.

The two four-day tournaments followed a training camp, which was hosted by Federation Senegalaise de Tennis in Domaine de Nianing. During the last three days of the circuit, another training camp took place, giving coaches the opportunity to work on the weaknesses shown by their players during the competition.

Mohamed Ubale, National Coach of Nigeria said: "This event was a great success. Thanks to our host, Federation Senegalaise de Tennis, in conjunction with the ITF/CAT, for their organisation and to Domaine de Nianing for their excellent hospitality."

ITF President visits Libya

ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti spent two days in Libya last week to meet with the country's top sports representatives.

While there he attended meetings with Dr Mohamed Moammar Gaddafi, Head of the High Commission of Sport in Libya, Mr Abdussalem Aweeti, President of the Libyan Arab Tennis & Squash Federation and Mrs Fattouma, representative of the Libyan National Olympic Committee. Obituary - Nancy Reed

The ITF was saddened to learn of the death on 25 July of Nancy Reed, a three-time ITF seniors world champion and a pioneer of seniors tennis.

Reed captured the women's 40 doubles title at the very first ITF Seniors World Championships in Brazil in 1981, and went on to win a total of three singles and 12 doubles seniors world titles. She was also a member of many US seniors title-winning teams, most recently the Queens Cup in Turkey in 2008.

Reed's involvement in the sport was not limited to on-court activities, as she contributed to American seniors tennis as a volunteer at both state and national level, winning many awards for her effort and commitment. She had many dealings with the ITF both as a player and an administrator, and will be greatly missed.
