

## Spain and USA win World Junior Tennis titles

The Spanish boys' team and USA girls' team triumphed in Saturday's finals of the World Junior Tennis Finals in Prostějov, Czech Republic. Seventh seeds Spain defeated fifth seeds Portugal to lift the boys' trophy, while USA, the No. 2 seeds, beat fifth seeds Czech Republic to claim their third successive girls' title.

The final between Spain and Portugal was decided after the two singles rubbers. Carlos Benito defeated Portugal's Rodolfo Pereira in straight sets in the opening match on centre court to give Spain the early lead. The No. 1 players, Albert Alcaraz and Frederico Silva, then contested an extremely close second rubber, which Alcaraz edged 76(7) 57 64 to seal the title for Spain.

This is the first time Spain has won the title since 2000, when Rafael Nadal helped his country to victory.

Both Spain and Portugal had dominated their round-robin groups, before overcoming Japan and Czech Republic respectively in the semifinals. The bronze medal was won by Japan, who fought off tough competition from the host nation to win the deciding doubles and take third place on the podium.

## Davis Cup by BNP Paribas semifinal venues confirmed

Murcia, Spain and Porec, Croatia have been confirmed as the venues for the 2009 Davis Cup by BNP Paribas World Group semifinals on 18-20 September. Both venues are subject to successful site visits.

Murcia has been selected by the Spanish Tennis Federation to host Spain's semifinal against Israel. The tie will be staged at the 12,000-capacity Polaris World La Torre Golf Resort on clay. The last time that the city hosted a Davis Cup tie was in 2000.

Spain has won all three previous meetings with Israel, who is contesting its first World Group semifinal. The defending champion has also won its last 16 home Davis Cup ties and last 18 ties on clay. In 2009, Spain has already scored home victories over Serbia and Germany, while Israel won away in Sweden before upsetting Russia in Tel Aviv.

The Davis Cup Committee has approved the Sportska Dvorana "Zatika" in Porec as the venue for Croatia's semifinal against Czech Republic, also on clay. Croatia played its two previous ties in 2009 at the same stadium, defeating Chile and USA. It has won 11 of its last 12 home ties in Davis Cup.

The two former Davis Cup champions have never faced each other previously in the competition. Croatia, a winner in 2005, is bidding to reach only its second final, while the Czechs are looking to reach the final for the first time since Ivan Lendl led them to victory in 1980, and just the third time overall. The USA girls' team found themselves playing in front of the largest crowd of the tournament on court one as they faced the host nation in the final. Czech Aneta Dvorakova maintained her unbeaten run in Prostějov by defeating Victoria Duval 76(3) 26 64 in the first singles rubber, to give the home nation a 1-0 lead. Sachia Vickery, who was part of USA's winning team last year, then levelled the tie with a 64 67(3) 62 success over Petra Rohanova to force a deciding doubles.

Despite fervent support from the home crowd, the Czech pair struggled in the third set with the American duo of Vickery and Duval finally coming out on top to secure a 62 67(4) 61 victory, and claim a record breaking third successive title in Prostějov.

In the third-place play-off, Japan claimed its second bronze medal of the competition with a 2-1 victory over top seeds Russia. Full results, photos and reports from the competition can be found on [www.itftennis.com/juniors](http://www.itftennis.com/juniors).

## ITF launches Chinese version of Junior Tennis School

The ITF Junior Tennis School today launched a Chinese language version of its e-learning website: [www.itfjuniortennisschool.com](http://www.itfjuniortennisschool.com). Up until now the players, parents, coaches and tennis officials have been able to access the 17 modules in English, French or Spanish.

Almost 18 months after its initial launch, the website has over 5,000 registered members from 142 countries. Currently just under one per cent of these members are from China, but a dramatic increase in numbers is expected when Chinese players and coaches can access the website in their own language.

Ms Sun Jin Fang, Vice President of the Chinese Tennis Association said: "We are extremely delighted that the online ITF Junior Tennis School is now available in our own language. This is a great opportunity for our many junior players and their team supporting members to learn and become more aware of important topics affecting an international tennis career. We look forward to working closely with the ITF on junior development."

The e-learning website, along with the educational forums which are the other part of the ITF Junior Tennis School, aims to educate junior players and their support team members about all aspects of a tennis career.

"In the 18 months since it was launched, the ITF Junior Tennis School e-learning website has contributed to the tennis education of several thousand young players, coaches and parents," said ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti. "The Chinese version of the website will open up this educational programme to many thousands more junior players and will bring them enormous benefits in their future tennis careers."

The Junior Tennis School e-learning website's expansion plans do not stop here, with the Russian language version due to launch by the end of 2009 and further languages planned over the next year.

## Full line-up confirmed for Junior Davis and Fed Cup Finals

The complete list of qualifiers for the 2009 Junior Davis Cup and Junior Fed Cup by BNP Paribas Finals is now known after European qualifying finished on Wednesday. Six boys' and girls' teams from Europe now join the list of qualifiers heading to San Luis Potosi, Mexico, on 29 September – 4 October.

Le Touquet, France served as the qualifying competition for the boys' event. The French team were the winners, defeating Czech Republic in the final to top the European group. Slovak Republic, Spain, Poland and Great Britain complete the European qualifiers. Russia overcame Slovak Republic in the final of the girls' qualifying competition which was held in Leysin, Switzerland. The other qualifiers are Germany, Ukraine, Croatia and Belarus.

## Success for ITF 14 & under teams in Europe

Four ITF 14 & under teams, comprising 39 players from 25 different countries, completed a successful five-week trip to Europe at the weekend, which saw them contest 11 finals and win seven titles on the Young Stars Tour, part of the Tennis Europe 14 & under circuit.

The ITF/COSAT South American Team was by far the most successful squad, sharing in six of the seven titles. Jose Andres Chamba of Ecuador won the boys' singles title in Rueil-Malmaison, while Peru's Jorge Panta was victorious in Cologne, defeating teammate Juan Pablo Paz (ARG) in the final. There were also doubles victories for Panta and Nicholas Osterling in Paris, and Chamba and Paz in Cologne.

There were titles too for South America's girls, with Ferny Angeles (PER) and Carmen Blanco (VEN) victorious in Hasselt, Belgium, and Ecuador's Domenica Gonzalez sharing the girls' doubles title in Cologne with Ashleigh Barty (AUS). Gonzalez also reached the girls' singles final in Hasselt, where she lost to Egypt's Mayar Sherief, a member of the ITF/CAT African & Rest of World Team.

In addition there were strong girls' doubles performances from the ITF/ATF Asian Team, with Katherine Ip (HKG) and Zi Yue Sun (CHN) reaching two finals, and Voni Darlina and Adila Sutjiadi (INA) runners-up in Paris.

All the players qualified for the ITF teams by performing well in designated ITF regional events and were accompanied by nine ITF appointed coaches.

Frank Couraud, ITF Development Projects Administrator, said: "The circuit offered some of the best competitive opportunities for players in this age group. Through their participation this year, players from South America, Central America & Caribbean, Africa, and parts of Europe and Asia, not only gained experience but were able to compare their skills against the best young European players."
