Countdown to the US Open

Defending champion Roger Federer warmed up for next week's US Open by winning his 16th ATP Masters title at Cincinnati. The 15-time Grand Slam champion lies in fourth place in the 2009 Olympus US Open Series behind current leader, world No. 2, Andy Murray. In second place is Juan Martin del Potro and in third Sam Querrey, who heads to this week's New Haven tournament with a chance of taking the overall Olympus US Open Series title.

Serena Williams has added a further two Grand Slam titles to her name since her win at Flushing Meadows last year and is looking for a fourth US Open crown. Elena Dementieva's victory at Toronto on Sunday ensures she currently heads the women's Olympus US Open Series with Williams in sixth place. Italy's Flavia Pennetta could replace Dementieva at the top should she win the title at New Haven.

Players are competing for the largest payout in tennis history at the 2009 US Open - \$2.6 million (\$1.6 million for winning the US Open and a \$1 million bonus for winning the US Open and the US Open Series). Second and third place finishers of the US Open Series will also compete for bonus prize money at the US Open.

Federer is bidding for a sixth successive men's singles title in New York, while Williams will look to defend the title she won with a straight sets victory over Jelena Jankovic last year.

The USTA announced that Americans Devin Britton, Chase Buchanan, Taylor Dent, Brendan Evans, Jesse Levine, Ryan Sweeting, plus Australian Chris Guccione and Michael Llodra of France have been awarded men's singles main draw wild card entries. Americans Gail Brodsky, Mallory Cecil, Alexa Glatch, Vania King, Christina McHale, plus former champion Kim Clijsters (Belgium), Kristina Mladenovic (France) and Olivia Rogowska (Australia) are the eight women's wild cards.

The USTA also announced that the Opening Night Ceremony will celebrate athletes who give back, featuring two-time US Open singles champion Andre Agassi and other notable athletes. ESPN2 will televise the celebration live, marking the cable network's first primetime broadcast from the US Open. ESPN 2 and Tennis Channel both make their debuts as cable broadcasters at the 2009 event.

The US Open qualifying event begins tomorrow, Tuesday 25 August, and runs until Friday 28 August. Men's singles qualifying sees 128 players contest 16 places in the main draw, while women's singles qualifying sees 96 players chase 12 places in the main draw. The 2009 US Open takes place at the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center from Monday 31 August until Sunday 13 September. The draws will be held at 11:30 local time at the Times Centre in Manhattan on Thursday 27 August. For all the latest US Open news, visit www.usopen.org.

Bermuda claims team title in Trinidad

Bermuda just pipped Trinidad & Tobago to the team title at the ITF 13 & under Caribbean Development Championships, which took place in Trinidad last week. Tyler Smith scored maximum points for Bermuda when she won the girls' event, defeating Melena Lopez (BAR) 62 62. Bermuda also picked up good points in the boys' competition after Christopher Rego (BER) finished runner-up to Joel Lutchman (SUR) 63 62. Unfortunately due to two days of incessant rain the doubles competition could not be completed.

Burundi and Kenya dominate 12 & under East Africa Circuit

Host nation Burundi emerged victorious in the boys' tournaments at the ITF/CAT 12 & under East Africa Circuit thanks to Nkurunziza Saidi's impressive performances which saw him claim both titles. The girls' competition was dominated by Kenya; Cherryl Fouasso won the first tournament with Stephanie Mbaya securing the second.

The tournaments followed a three-day training camp which was conducted by the ITF Development Officer for the region, Prince Madema. The event, which was held in Bujumbura, Burundi, was the first circuit of this age group and attracted six countries from the region. The circuit is seen as a tool to identify and nurture talent while the players are still young. This year the best players were then selected to join the 14 & under circuit which followed immediately after at the same venue. This will be followed by a second week of the 14 & under circuit in Kigali, Rwanda.

Liberat Hincintuka, President of the Federation de Tennis du Burundi, said: "We are really grateful for the ITF to give us this opportunity to host such an important event for our juniors. We hope the players and the coaches will continue to work hard so that players with talent can realize their dreams."

West Pacific claims title again

The West Pacific continued its domination of the ITF Pacific Oceania Junior Championships (POJC), clinching the regional title for the ninth consecutive year. The annual event, which plays host to the best 18 & under and 14 & under players from the Pacific region, was held at the Goodman-Fielder Regional Training Center, Lautoka, Fiji on 17-21 August 2009. Qualifying events had been held earlier in the year to determine which teams from the East, North and West Pacific would feature in the championships.

Zinnia Leamana of the Solomon Islands clinched the girls' 18 & under title defeating the top seed, 14-year old Marcia Tere-Apisah from Papua New Guinea 62 63. In the boys' event, Ji-Hoon Heo from Northern Mariana Islands overcame Chris Hargrove (FI) 60 63.

One of the most outstanding players of the championships was 13-year-old Annie Shannon of Fiji, who didn't drop a set as she dominated the 14 & under girls' event to clinch the title. In the boys' 14 & under event, New Caledonia's Clement Coaraze, a 2008 finalist, was able to hold his nerve against Devin Khatri of Fiji to clinch the boys' title 62 61.

Based on their individual finish in the POJC, the final points of each of the regional team members were then added together to find the winning region. The best performing team was West Pacific which is made up of players from Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands, Vanuatu and Fiji. The North Pacific Team finished second with East Pacific in third.

A 10-metre high countdown clock was unveiled at the location, where thousands of Singaporeans gathered in February 2008 to hear the announcement of Singapore as the host city for the inaugural Games.

The One Year Countdown also saw the start of a three-week naming exercise for the first YOG mascots.
