US Open gets underway

The final Grand Slam of the year got underway on Monday with defending champion Roger Federer and former winner Andy Roddick both in action on the opening day. Federer made light work of his first round opponent Devin Britton, sailing into the second round in straight sets 61 63 75 to take his unbeaten run at the US Open to 35 matches. The Swiss star is bidding for a sixth consecutive US Open title which would equal Bill Tilden's 1920's record.

Roddick overcame Germany's Bjorn Phau 61 64 62 in Arthur Ashe Stadium while the Williams sisters, who have both claimed the title here, also safely progressed to the next round, although Venus had to fight back from a set down against Vera Dushevina (RUS). Other former US Open champions in action on the first day were Belgium's Kim Clijsters and Australia's Lleyton Hewitt. Clijsters, who returned to the tour earlier this year following a two-year absence, wasted little time defeating Viktoriya Kutuzova (UKR) 61 61 and will now face Marion Bartoli in the second round. No. 31 seed Hewitt overcame Brazil's Thiago Alves 60 63 64 and is on course to meet Federer in the third round, providing he prevails in his second round clash against Juan Ignacio Chela (ARG).

The opening night's festivities celebrated athletes who give back and featured eight-time Grand Slam champion Andre Agassi, who spoke about education policy and the foundation he established in 1994 to help at-risk youths. The evening also featured stars from soccer, football and basketball who have devoted their time to raising money and supporting various causes and charities.

World No. 1 Dina Safina starts her campaign on Tuesday when she faces Australia's Olivia Rogowska on Arthur Ashe. They will be on court after Roland Garros champion and sixth seed Svetlana Kuznetsova, who faces Julia Goerges (GER). Other seeds playing on Tuesday include Jelena Jankovic, Ana Ivanovic and Elena Dementieva, while on the men's side Novak Djokovic and last year's beaten finalist Andy Murray will also be in action. Top wheelchair players meet in St Louis


Nine of the world's top 10 men, five of the world's top 10 women and six of the world's top 10 quads will contest the third and final Super Series event of the 2009 NEC Wheelchair Tennis Tour as the US Open USTA Wheelchair Championships gets underway in St Louis, Missouri today.

World No. 1 Shingo Kunieda (JPN) is bidding for his third US Open Super Series title and goes into the event unbeaten since the start of 2008. Dutchmen Robin Ammerlaan and Maikel Scheffers, world No. 2 Stephane Houdet (FRA) and Stefan Olsson (SWE) lead the contenders out to dethrone Kunieda.

In the absence of world No. 3 Florence Gravelier (FRA), Daniela di Toro (AUS) is the only non-Dutch world top 10 player in the women's singles. Esther Vergeer heads the field as the world No. 1 bids for her eighth US Open Super Series title, while Korie Homan, Jiske Griffioen and Aniek van Koot strengthen the Dutch challenge.

World No. 1 David Wagner (USA) will be hard to beat in the quad singles as he bids for his second US Open Super Series title, while fellow American Nick Taylor and Johan Andersson (SWE) head the challengers.

Australia dominates in Fiji

Australian players made a clean sweep of titles at the Air Pacific Oceania Closed Junior Championships, which were held at the Goodman Fielder International Regional Tennis Centre in Fiji last week.

Victorija Rajicic continued her meteoric rise up the ITF Junior Rankings by claiming both the girls' singles and doubles titles. The 15-year-old Australian was totally dominant throughout the week and defeated top seed Briar Preston (NZL) 60 61 in a fearless display in the final. In the doubles she combined with Junior Fed Cup teammate Molly Polak to overcome Harriet Sheahan (AUS) and Preston in a close match 75 75.

After upsetting the top seed in the semifinals, surprise finalist William Kwok was no match for fellow Australian and second seed Jason Kubler in the boys' singles final. Kubler was impressive all week and took the final 64 61 to claim the title without dropping a set. The boys' doubles featured the top seeded New Zealand pair of Ben McLachlan and Barret Franks against unseeded Luke Saville and Jack Schipanski (AUS). After winning the first set narrowly in a tiebreaker the more aggressive Australian pair ran away with the second set to win 76(5) 62.

In a new innovation for the tournament, a mixed doubles event was held and was won by Imogen Golder and Jamie Eccleton of New Zealand.

Junior Touring Teams complete successful tour

The 14 & under and 16 & under ITF/Tennis Europe Grand Slam Junior Touring Teams completed a successful four-week tour in Germany and Austria at the end of August.

The tour started with a training camp at the Württemberg Regional Tennis Center, near Stuttgart, which gave the players and coaches the opportunity to get to know each other before competing in various tournaments.

The camp was attended by the 16 & under team of George Tsivadze (GEO), Lukas Mugevicius (LTU), Elena-Teodora Cadar (ROU) and Borislava Bothusharova (BUL); the 14 & under team of Yuriy Kryvoy (UKR), Ivan Divkovic (BIH), Nastassia Rubel (BLR), Julia Terziyska (BUL) and Fatmanur Atilgan (TUR); and the team coaches Goran Shevchenko (MKD) and Oskar Saarne (EST). The teams then participated in the LBS Cup Waiblingen, LBS Muller Junior Cup, Mercedes Jugend Cup and the 16 & under team also competed in a tournament in Ansfelden, Austria.

ITF/Tennis Europe Development Officer Hrvoje Zmajic said: "The Touring Teams are the most important part in assisting in the development of the most promising juniors from the countries benefiting from the ITF/Tennis Europe Development Programme.

"For the second time in a row the teams started the tour with a training camp at the Württemberg Regional Tennis Centre and I would like to thank the Württemberg Tennis Federation for enabling us to use the Centre where we found excellent conditions for preparing for the very succesful tour. We are looking forward to continuing this cooperation in future years."
