Fed Cup first round venues announced

The ITF has confirmed the full list of proposed venues for the first round of the 2010 Fed Cup by BNP Paribas World Group and World Group II, to be played the weekend of 6-7 February.

Six of the eight first round ties will take place in eastern Europe. Ukraine makes its debut in the World Group at home in Kharkiv to 2009 finalists Italy, while its opponents in this year's final, USA, will travel to France. Czech Republic plays its fourth consecutive tie in Brno while Serbia has selected Belgrade for its first-ever World Group tie. Poland and Estonia both mark their first appearances in World Group II with home ties. Poland has chosen the northern town of Bydgoszcz to host Belgium while Estonia, which has won its last eight ties, will play in Tallinn against Argentina. Kunieda, Vergeer & Wagner head US Open Wheelchair event

Shingo Kunieda (JPN), Esther Vergeer (NED) and David Wagner (USA) head the fields for this week's wheelchair event at the US Open in Flushing Meadows. The three world No. 1s are looking to add success in the final Grand Slam of the year to the titles they won on Sunday at the final Super Series event of the 2009 NEC Wheelchair Tennis Tour.

Kunieda beat world No. 2 Stephane Houdet (FRA) 76 61 in the men's final at the USTA Wheelchair Championships in St Louis and the duo lead a field of eight of the world's top nine players in New York when the wheelchair event gets underway on Thursday.

Florence Gravelier (FRA) and Sharon Walraven (NED) strengthen the field for the women's singles. The world No. 3 and world No. 4 bypassed last week's Super Series tournament, but they will have to be on top form if they are to challenge Vergeer and Korie Homan (NED). World No. 2 Homan took Vergeer to three sets for the sixth time in the women's final in St Louis but it was Vergeer who clinched her eighth USTA Championships title with a 60 36 61 victory, bringing her tally of career Super Series titles to 26 and extending her unbeaten streak to 375 matches. Seven of the world's top 10 women are in the field of eight players in New York.

After a clash of dates with the Beijing Paralympics last year, the return of wheelchair tennis to the final Grand Slam also sees world No. 2 Peter Norfolk (GBR) bid to win the quad singles title for the second time. World No. 1 Wagner should provide Norfolk's strongest opposition, with Johan Andersson (SWE) and Nick Taylor (USA) completing a line-up featuring the world's top four players. Seeds tumble at Junior US Open

The world's best juniors arrived in New York this week for the US Open Junior competition, the final Grand Slam of the 2009 ITF Junior Circuit.

With the shock first round exit of top seed Kristina Mladenovic (FRA), the girl's draw has now opened up. Mladenovic, the current Roland Garros champion and Wimbledon runner-up, crashed out to wild card Asia Muhammed (USA) 61 64. Wimbledon champion Noppawan Lertcheewakarn (THA) now assumes favourite status and opened her campaign with a solid 64 61 victory over Sina Haas (GER). The 2008 ITF World Champion will face fierce competition from a host of American seeds, which include Italian Open winner Sloane Stephens, as well as world No.3 Timea Babos (HUN).

In the boy's draw world No. 1 Yuki Bhambri (IND) will look to finish the year how he began, by claiming his second Grand Slam title of 2009. Australian Open champion Bhambri enters the event in excellent form and is a clear favourite to dominate at Flushing Meadows. In the first round he overcame a potentially difficult opponent in Jordan Cox (USA), a Wimbledon finalist, with a controlled 62 61 victory. "Obviously, being the top seed you think you're the favourite to win the Slam but I'm going to just try and take it one match at a time," Bhambri said.

With No. 2 seed Daniel Berta (SWE) falling in the first round, third seed Bernard Tomic (AUS) poses the greatest threat to Bhambri's title ambitions. The Wimbledon semifinalist scored a straight-sets win over Henri Laaksonen (FIN) in Sunday's first round. Chinese Taipei's Liang-Chi Huang is seeded fourth and looking to claim his first title outside of Asia. Chase Buchanan (USA) was handed a wild card after his loss to Jo-Wilfred Tsonga (FRA) in the men's event last week. For further information and updates visit www.itftennis.com/juniors

ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti presented Rafael Nadal with his 2008 ITF World Champion trophy at the US Open over the weekend.

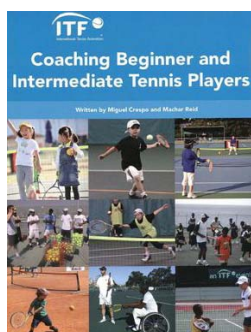
Nadal received the award in recognition of his outstanding successes in 2008, which saw him clinch two Grand Slam titles, the Olympic gold medal and the world No. 1 spot, as well as contributing to Spain's Davis Cup triumph.

The Spaniard was unable to collect his award at the ITF World Champions Dinner which took place during Roland Garros earlier this year.
