Spain eyes Davis Cup Final

Defending champion Spain will bid to reach its second successive Final when the Davis Cup by BNP Paribas World Group semifinals take place this weekend. A total of two semifinals, eight World Group Play-off ties and eight zonal ties will be held on 18-20 September, with full coverage on the official Davis Cup website www.daviscup.com and www.daviscup.com/es.

Spain will look to make the most of its home advantage against Israel outdoors on clay in Murcia. Despite missing world No. 2 Rafael Nadal through injury, the team boasts a strong line-up in Tommy Robredo, David Ferrer, Feliciano Lopez and Juan Carlos Ferrero, the hero of Spain's 3-2 quarterfinal victory over Germany. Israel, the surprise package of this year's competition, has named an unchanged team of Dudi Sela, Harel Levy, Jonathan Erlich and Andy Ram to contest its first ever semifinal.

The other semifinal sees Croatia take on Czech Republic in an evenly balanced tie indoors on clay in Porec. Croatia, bidding to reach its second final after its title success in 2005, has nominated US Open quarterfinalist Marin Cilic alongside Ivo Karlovic, Roko Karanusic and Lovro Zovko. Czech Republic meanwhile is looking to reach its first final since winning the title in 1980, with the team featuring Radek Stepanek, Tomas Berdych, Jan Herynych and US Open doubles champion Lukas Dlouhy.

This weekend also sees 16 nations contest the World Group Play-offs in a bid to achieve World Group status in 2010. World No. 1 Roger Federer is nominated to lead the Swiss team against Italy away on clay outdoors in Genova; Chile is at home to Austria in Rancagua on outdoor clay; Belgium takes on Ukraine indoors on clay in Charleroi; Brazil hosts Ecuador in Porto Alegre on indoor clay; Netherlands is at home to France indoors on clay in Maastricht; South Africa meets India in Johannesburg on indoor hardcourt; Serbia hosts Uzbekistan indoors on hardcourt in Belgrade; and Sweden faces Romania in Helsingborg on indoor hardcourt.

Davis Cup Radio will also be on air with a daily update of action from around the world. The draws for all of this weekend's ties will take place on Thursday 17 September.



Clijsters claims US Open title

Kim Clijsters made an impressive return to competition when she claimed the title at the US Open, overcoming Denmark's Caroline Wozniacki in the final in straight sets. The Belgian, who needed a wildcard to play at the tournament, had played just seven competitive matches before the US Open got underway, having retired two and a half years ago.

"I can't believe this happened. It still seems so surreal that, yeah, in my third tournament back won my second Grand Slam," she said. "Because it wasn't in the plan. I just wanted to come here and get a feel for it all over again, to play in a Grand Slam so at the start the next year, I didn't have to go through all the new experiences again. It feels great, obviously, but it's confusing in a lot of ways as well."

Wozniacki, the first Dane to make a Grand Slam final, served for the opening set at 5-4 but Clijsters broke back before fending off further break points in the following game. Clijsters then took control in the second set and powered her way to victory 75 63, becoming the first mother to win a Grand Slam title since Evonne Goolagong in 1980.

Another wildcard to do well at the US Open was the mixed doubles pairing of Travis Parrott and Carly Gullickson who defeated defending champions Leander Paes and Cara Black in the final 62 64. Paes went one better in the men's doubles when he joined forces with Lukas Dlouhy to claim the men's doubles title.

The men's final will take place later today, a day later than scheduled, due to rain which affected play on Friday. The first semifinal between Roger Federer (SUI) and Novak Djokovic (SRB) was completed a day later than scheduled with Federer taking victory 76(3) 75 75. The Swiss is unbeaten at Flushing Meadows since 2003. Argentina's Juan Martin Del Potro stands in the way of Federer's sixth consecutive title as he defeated world No. 3 Rafael Nadal in straight sets in the other semifinal yesterday. Junior US Open champions crowned

Australia's Bernard Tomic claimed his second junior Grand Slam title yesterday at the US Open, while Heather Watson (GBR) claimed her first win at this level.

At the start of the event 16-year-old Tomic, with an ATP ranking inside the top 300 and previous experience of winning his home Grand Slam in 2008, was one of the clear favourites for the title. The Australian benefitted from the early losses of second seed Daniel Berta (SWE) and sixth seed Yong-Kyu Lim (KOR) as after the second round he found his path to the final cleared of seeded opposition. Tomic's final opponent was unseeded American wild card Chase Buchanan, who had been ranked in the world's top 10 earlier this year. Buchanan defeated top seed Yuki Bhambri (IND) on his way to the final but put up little resistance as Tomic won 61 63.

Heather Watson was very much a surprise winner of the girls' event, having lost in the first round of the previous two Grand Slam tournaments. Eleventh seed Watson was in impressive form throughout the week, dropping just three games to Wimbledon junior champion Noppawan Lertcheewakarn (THA) in the quarterfinal, and three more to Roland Garros runner-up Daria Gavrilova (RUS) in the semifinal. Her opponent in the title decider was Yana Buchina (RUS), who may have suffered from playing two long three-setters the previous day. Buchina took an early lead but Watson pulled level and then pulled away, eventually winning 64 61 for the biggest tournament win of her junior career.

Kunieda, Vergeer and Norfolk win in New York

Shingo, Kunieda (JPN), Esther Vergeer (NED) and Peter Norfolk (GBR) repeated their 2007 US Open victories on Sunday, with Kunieda and Vergeer producing devastating displays of tennis to win the men's and women's singles.

Maikel Scheffers (NED) defeated world No. 2 Stephane Houdet (FRA) on the way to his first Grand Slam singles final. However, he earned just a few points against Kunieda as the world No. 1 won his second title in New York 60 60. The world's top two reached the women's singles final with ease before Vergeer secured her second 60 60 victory over her compatriot Korie Homan to win her fourth women's title in New York. Meanwhile, Norfolk got the better of a roller coaster quad singles final against world No. 1 David Wagner 63 36 63 to win his second US Open title.

Vergeer and Homan won the women's doubles with a 62 62 victory over Daniela di Toro (AUS) and Florence Gravelier (FRA). Meanwhile, Houdet and Stefan Olsson (SWE) also justified top seeding to win the men's doubles against Dutch second seeds Scheffers and Ronald Vink 64 46 64. Venus Williams was among the spectators for the quad doubles final as Nick Taylor (USA) and Wagner overcame Johan Andersson (SWE) and Norfolk 61 67(5) 63.

Obituary - Jack Kramer 1921-2009

The ITF was saddened to learn of the death of former Wimbledon champion Jack Kramer who died at his home in Los Angeles from cancer over the weekend. He was 88.

Kramer won the singles titles at Wimbledon in 1947, the US Championships in 1946 and 1947 and seven Grand Slam doubles titles. He was a founder and the first executive director of the Association of Tennis Professionals, a forerunner to the current ATP Tour. Kramer was inducted into the International Tennis Hall of Fame in 1968. Alongside his playing achievements Kramer also made an impact as a promoter and television commentator. He and his family have been involved in the Los Angeles men's pro-tournament since the 1970s, the event is now run by Bob, one of his five sons.

"The tennis world will mourn and miss Jack Kramer, as a player and as an innovator who transformed the game," said ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti. "Jack was a man of vision who influenced the way people played, the structure of the game and, through his long career as a television commentator, how people felt about our sport. It was his idea to form the Grand Prix circuit leading to the Masters and he played an important role in the formation of the ATP and served as its first executive director. He was one of the leaders of the boycott of Wimbledon in 1973 changing forever the status of tennis professionals. The ITF presented Jack with its highest honour, the Philippe Chatrier Award, in 2002 in recognition of his many contributions to tennis. We send our sincere condolences to Jack's family and many friends on this sad occasion."

Molik gives injury the elbow

Following recent appearances in the doubles events at New Haven and at the US Open, Australia's two-time Grand Slam doubles champion, Alicia Molik, 28, is to make a full-scale comeback to the game at a series of seven tournaments on the ITF Pro Circuit to be held in Australia over the remainder of 2009.

Molik, a former top 10 player in both singles and doubles, announced her retirement from Professional Tennis back in early September 2008 due to an elbow injury. The Australian marks her return to the ITF Pro Circuit for the first time since May 2006 with back-to-back \$25,000 tournaments in Darwin starting this week.

Tennis Australia's Director of Tennis, Craig Tiley, quoted in *The Australian* online newspaper, said of the 2004 Olympic singles Bronze medallist, "It's terrific to see Alicia on the comeback trail and we wish her well."

The USTA inducted Arthur Ashe into the US Open Court of Champions in a ceremony last Thursday evening. The US Open Court of Champions salutes the tournament's all-time greatest champions with an individual permanent monument that serves as a lasting tribute.

President Clinton participated in the on-court ceremony, paying tribute to Ashe who was the first African American US Open men's singles champion and one of tennis' greatest ambassadors.
