Mexico hosts Junior Davis Cup and Fed Cup Finals

France will be among the favourites to claim its first Junior Davis Cup title since 2005, when the Junior Davis Cup and Junior Fed Cup by BNP Paribas Finals get underway in San Luis Potosi, Mexico on Tuesday. The current European champions, along with runners-up Czech Republic, are fielding strong teams featuring several players ranked in the junior top 100.

The 32 qualified teams for the 16 & under competition come from 28 countries. Last year the USA made history, taking both the boys' and girls' titles, and while the boys return to defend their title with a completely new line-up, the girls failed to qualify in 2009.

Asia/Oceania champion Uzbekistan gave a dominant display at the regional qualifying in Australia and will be looking to claim its first Junior Davis Cup title on its debut at the Finals. Australia will be hoping to repeat its success at the 2007 World Junior Tennis Finals; two members of that team will play in San Luis Potosi, hoping to use their experience to reclaim the Junior Davis Cup title, last won in 2007. South America has finished on the podium in eight of the last nine years and this time it will be down to Argentina, Bolivia, Chile and Mexico to maintain that record.

The Junior Fed Cup looks particularly interesting this year with some of the best junior girls in the world in action. Having failed to qualify for last year's Finals, the Russian girls' team are serious contenders for the 2009 title. They finished top of the European qualifying group, and with all three players currently within the junior top 30, they will be hoping to reclaim a title Russia hasn't won since 1997. European runners-up Slovak Republic, whose three players are all within the junior top 75, could also be in contention, as could third placed Germany, who have two players ranked within the junior top 100.

The teams from Asia/Oceania look set for a strong showing in the Junior Fed Cup event, with Japan and China both fielding good teams. Japan will be looking to claim its first Junior Fed Cup title, and will be going into the event feeling confident after a dominant performance in the final qualifying in Australia.
