BNP Paribas presents ITF Worldwide Coaches Conference

The 16th ITF Worldwide Coaches Conference by BNP Paribas starts in Valencia, Spain this Friday, 30 October. The conference, which is organised every two years by the ITF, is being hosted by the Real Federacion Espanola de Tenis (Spanish Tennis Federation) as part of its centenary celebrations and will take place at the Luis Puig Velodrome.

BNP Paribas's involvement with the conference as presenting partner expands the relationship between the ITF and BNP Paribas. This is the first time the conference has had a presenting partner and heralds a new era for what is the ITF's flagship event in the field of coaches education.

The theme of the five-day conference is Developing Competencies for Elite Players and Coaches and the programme consists of lecture room and on-court presentations, as well as some shorter sessions, involving five presentations taking place simultaneously. Confirmed keynote speakers include Spanish Davis Cup captain Albert Costa and former world No. 2 Alex Corretja. They are joined by Bruce Elliott, world-renowned biomechanist; Mark Kovacs, Senior Manager of Sport Science for the USTA; Yassine Yousfi of Olympic Solidarity, and Carl Maes, former coach of Kim Clijsters.

Invacare World Team Cup moves to Turkey

The ITF announced that that 2010 Invacare World Team Cup, the ITF's flagship wheelchair tennis team event, will be held for the first time in Antalya, Turkey. The event will be staged on the clay courts of the Club Manavgat on the Turkish Riveira on 3-9 May 2010.

Turkey will become the 15th nation to host this prestigious event, which is often referred to as the Davis Cup and Fed Cup of wheelchair tennis. A total of 187 players from 33 nations competed in this year's 25th anniversary event in Nottingham, Great Britain in the men's, women's, quad and junior categories.

The 2010 Invacare World Team Cup will be an exciting addition to the wheelchair tennis programme in Turkey, which has grown considerably since the country first benefitted from the launch of an ITF Silver Fund programme in 2007. Turkey went on to be represented at the 2008 Beijing Paralympics, before making its Invacare World Team Cup debut in 2009. The country also hosted its first world ranking wheelchair tournaments last year.

"The ITF is very pleased to announce Turkey as a host nation for the 2010 Invacare World Team Cup," said ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti. "It is an exciting time for wheelchair tennis in Turkey and I am sure that Antalya will stage a tremendous event after the success of previous ITF championships hosted by Club Manavgat."

Franz Krammer, Managing Director of Invacare Europe said: "Invacare Europe is extremely proud to be a team member of the Invacare World Team Cup. Turkey joined the ever-growing list of nations to participate in 2009, and we look forward to taking this major event to a new part of the world in 2010, spreading the Invacare ethos 'Yes You Can' and hosting events such the International Invacare Symposium."



Kubler and Mladenovic win in Osaka

The Osaka Mayor's Cup, the penultimate junior Grade A event of the year, finished yesterday with the circuit breakthrough of Australia's Jason Kubler and confirmation of France's Kristina Mladenovic as the world's leading girl.

Kubler had not previously played an ITF Junior Circuit event outside his home region of Oceania, but he came to the world's notice three weeks ago when leading Australia to the Junior Davis Cup by BNP Paribas title, winning all his matches without dropping a set. The 16-year-old breezed through the Osaka draw, dropping just 19 games in five matches on his way to the final.

In the decider Kubler faced home favourite Hiroyasu Ehara, the eighth seed, who had previously knocked out second seed and world No. 4 Liang-Chi Huang (TPE).

The Australian raced away with the first set, and although Ehara managed to come back in the second, Kubler proved too strong in the decider, winning 60 46 62 to capture his first Grade A title.

In contrast, Mladenovic is a known quantity on the ITF Junior Circuit, having won the Roland Garros title earlier this year and switched places with Noppawan Lertcheewakarn (THA) at the top of the world rankings several times. The French player had to fight through several tough matches to reach the final, where she was up against her doubles partner, second seed Tímea Babos of Hungary. After a closely-fought first set, the top seed pulled away to win 76(5) 62 for her second Grade A title, putting herself back on top of the rankings.

Mladenovic and Babos teamed up to win the doubles with a 62 75 win over Sai-Sai Zheng (CHN) and Mai Grage (DEN). The boys' doubles was won by four-time Grand Slam doubles champion Chang-Peng Hsieh (TPE) and his French partner, Wimbledon doubles champion Pierre-Hugues Herbert, who beat Ehara and Yasutaka Uchiyama (JPN) 60 76(4). Success for Uzbekistan at 13 & Under Asian Championships

Uzbekistan players dominated last week's ITF 13 & Under Asian Championships (Group 3) held in Ashgabat, Turkmenistan. The Championships, organised for the third time by the Turkmenistan Tennis Federation (TTF), proved to be an outstanding event, and this year included a team of eight players from Afghanistan.

The format of the event consisted of two consecutive tournaments using a feed-in consolation system in which all players have to play a single match each day, leading to a final overall ranking. The final rankings determine who will qualify for the ITF Team to participate in the next development circuit.

Unsurprisingly, the Uzbeks continued their winning streak of the past few years by taking the top honours at both tournaments. A much more developed tennis nation than its neighbours, the Uzbek juniors reflected this in their performance. Dilmurodbek Hasilov and Rasuljon Ahmadaliev won the two boys singles titles, while Arina Folts and Valeriya Korotina were both victorious in girls singles. Uzbekistan also won all four doubles titles.

Suresh Menon, the ITF Development Officer for Asia, who organised a one-day training camp prior to the first event, said: "Most of the players participating in these two tournaments started playing tennis in schools through the ITF's Junior Tennis Initiative (JTI). It is very rewarding to know that the programme is consistently producing results since first introduced to the Central Asian nations in 1997."

Serdar Bashyimov, Chairman of the Turkmenistan Tennis Federation, added: "At the present time there is only one international competition being organised in Turkmenistan annually. TTF is always ready to host the ITF 13 and under championships as it is a very important competition for the Central Asian Region and more importantly for Turkmen juniors who are starved of international competitions."

Ricci Bitti attends Russian sports forum

ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti attended last week's inaugural 'Russia – Sports Power' forum in Kazan which gave impetus to sports development in the region. The city will host the 2013 Universiade on the 40th anniversary of the last staging of the University Games in Russia in Moscow in 1973. Ricci Bitti joined representatives from ten other international federations at the forum.

During the forum, the ITF President was also present at the inauguration of the Kazan Tennis Academy, where he joined Russian President Dmitry Medvedev and Russian Tennis Federation President Shamil Tarpishev. The Academy consists of eight indoor and 18 outdoor courts, with movable stands providing a 3,000-seat centre court capacity for events.

Ricci Bitti then went on to Moscow, where he attended the Russian Tennis Federation AGM, which saw Tarpishev re-elected as President for a further four years. The ITF President also visited the Kremlin Cup event, where he met with ATP CEO Adam Helfant and ITF board member Roman Murashkovsky.
