Italy and USA contest Final

Italy will bid to end a nine-match losing streak against the United States when the two nations contest the 2009 Fed Cup by BNP Paribas Final in Reggio Calabria, Italy on 7-8 November. Italy is bidding for its second title in four years, while USA is looking for its first triumph since 2000.

Italy will start the tie as favourites following two impressive victories earlier this year: a 5-0 first round triumph over France in Orleans, and a 4-1 semifinal win over defending champion Russia in Castellaneta Marina. The hosts name an unchanged team for the third tie running, headed by world No. 11 Flavia Pennetta and No. 17 Francesca Schiavone, who both contributed three singles victories en route to the Final. Sara Errani and doubles specialist Roberta Vinci complete the Italian line-up.

USA meanwhile relies on the nucleus of the team that has twice recovered 2-1 deficits to score 3-2 victories over Argentina in Surprise, Arizona, and Czech Republic in Brno. They are led by US Open quarterfinalist Melanie Oudin, 18, who won a vital singles match against Argentina, and 20-year-old Alexa Glatch, who scored two victories against Czech Republic. Completing the US team are doubles world No. 1 Liezel Huber, who won the deciding doubles rubber in both ties, and Vania King, a late replacement for Serena Williams.

USA, Fed Cup champion a record 17 times, holds a 9-0 career record against Italy, who won its lone Fed Cup title in 2006. Their last meeting was back in 2003, when USA won their quarterfinal tie 5-0 in Washington en route to its last appearance in the Final. Italy has enjoyed the greater success in recent years, its 2006 triumph the first of three Final appearances in four years.

The draw for the Final will take place on **Friday 6 November** at 12 noon local time (11:00 GMT).

Australia heads Hyundai Hopman Cup entry

The Australian team of Lleyton Hewitt and Samantha Stosur will top the seedings for the 2010 Hyundai Hopman Cup, which takes place at the Burswood Dome in Perth on 2-9 January. The seven direct entries for the event are now confirmed following the announcement that world No. 4 Andy Murray will partner former Wimbledon junior champion Laura Robson for Great Britain.

Murray said: "I look forward to playing the Hopman Cup with Laura. I'm hoping it will be a good preparation for the Australian Open. Laura is a great talent and it will be good to link up together playing for our country."

The direct entries will be joined by the winner of this month's Asian Hopman Cup, which takes place in Astana, Kazakhstan on 11-14 November. China P.R., Chinese Taipei, India, Kazakhstan, Korea Rep. and Thailand are the six teams contesting the final place in the January event.

Australia will open up the 22nd edition of the event with a contest against Romania on Friday 2 January. The full line-up is as follows (seedings in brackets):

Super-Seniors World Team Championships get underway in Perth

The 2009 ITF Super-Seniors World Team Championships got underway today in Perth, Australia, with 93 teams representing 21 nations. The event consists of nine cups, featuring players aged 60-and-over to 85-and-over, and is being held at two venues, Robertson Park and Alexander Park, on Australia's west coast.

Six countries will defend titles at the World Team Championships. Last year in Turkey, the Americans won two of the nine cups and narrowly missed out on a further five titles, losing some closely-fought finals. This year they are looking to surpass last year's achievement with strong teams across the board, and should start as favourites in several of the age groups.

Multiple world champion King Van Nostrand makes his first appearance in the Bitsy Grant Cup (Men's 75), in which USA is defending champion, while the American Jack Crawford Cup (Men's 70) team will also be difficult to beat. The Australians and Spanish return with strong teams to defend their Gardnar Mulloy Cup (Men's 80) and Von Cramm Cup (Men's 60) titles respectively, while the French and Dutch will also be hoping to take home some silverware.

The Americans will also prove hard to beat in the women's cups, with several past world champions featuring on their teams. Among the other nations, a strong French team defends the Alice Marble Cup (Women's 60), with individual reigning champion Nicole Hesse-Cazaux spearheading the side; and South Africa defends the Althea Gibson Cup (Women's 70), fielding last year's winning team of Janine Lieffrig and Audrey Val Coller.

BNP Paribas supports ITF wheelchair distribution programme

BNP Paribas presented 60 wheelchairs to the Turkish Sports Federation for Disabled People at last month's Antalya Open wheelchair event to become the first company to support the ITF's partnership with the charity Motivation UK.

Motivation UK's Worldmade project is a global programme designed to help organisations establish or upgrade wheelchair service provision through the supply of appropriate mobility products and training of wheelchair service personnel. The ITF wheelchair department has been working closely with Motivation UK Worldmade on the production of simple but quality sport wheelchairs for a fraction of the normal costs involved.

The ITF is looking to help developing countries fund these wheelchairs through companies who want to get involved in corporate social responsibility activities.

BNP is the first company to support the programme through its donation to the Turkish Federation, with the ceremony taking place on court before the finals of the 2009 Antalya Open.

Mark Bullock, ITF Manager of Wheelchair Tennis, said: "Such a donation will make a huge difference to the development of wheelchair tennis in Turkey and help increase participation across the country, particularly in areas without activity or the resources to compete. Access to sports wheelchairs remains the biggest limiting factor for participation, and donations such as this from one of tennis's biggest supporters are of huge value and contribute significantly to the ITF reaching its development goals."

Fahir Altan of the Turkish Sports Federation for the Physically Disabled, added: "We are absolutely delighted to receive the donation of wheelchairs from BNP Paribas. The general perception for sport for the physically disabled is developing in Turkey, but the funding of equipment and facilities is still a major issue. With new sport equipment for our wheelchair tennis athletes we hope that we can inspire even more wheelchair users to start playing tennis."

Tennis venues receive Paralympic awards

The Beijing Olympic Green Tennis Centre and the LTA's National Tennis Centre in London both received awards from the International Paralympic Committee (IPC) and International Association for Sports and Leisure Facilities (IAKS) for distinction for accessibility.

The awards recognised those sports facilities and architectural projects that increased their accessibility in order to give opportunities to persons with a disability to practise and view sport freely and without barriers.

ITF launches Junior Online Entries

The ITF today launched the introduction of automated centralised entries for the ITF Junior Circuit, starting with events on the 2010 Circuit. This is the third and final stage of the Circuit's digitalisation project, following the successful introduction of Junior IPIN for 2008 and the Junior Tournament Planner for 2009. It also brings the ITF Junior Circuit further in line with the ITF Pro Circuit, which launched online entries in 2005.

Via their online IPIN account, players can now enter and withdraw from tournaments on the 2010 ITF Junior Circuit calendar, manage their schedule and view up-to-date entry lists.

The ITF will now be responsible for the centralised management of entry lists for over 350 tournaments around the world, which will significantly reduce the amount of administration that was previously undertaken by National Associations and tournament directors.
