Italy triumphs over USA

Italy won its second Fed Cup title in four years with a comprehensive 4-0 victory over USA in the 2009 Fed Cup by BNP Paribas World Group Final in Reggio Calabria. Italy's triumph ended a run of nine Fed Cup defeats by the United States as it followed up its success in the 2006 Final.

Flavia Pennetta and Francesca Schiavone, who had combined for six Fed Cup singles victories en route to the Final, were once again Italy's heroines as the hosts built up a winning 3-0 lead without dropping a set. And it was Pennetta, who earlier in the year became the first Italian woman to break into the world's Top 10, who sealed victory when she defeated Melanie Oudin 75 62 in the battle of the No. 1 players.

"It's a very nice feeling," Pennetta said afterwards. We worked hard to get to this point and finally we make it. In the beginning of the week everyone expects so many things, and we were very nervous. But now we are 3-0 and can enjoy."

The 27-year-old Italian had given the hosts the perfect start on the opening day with a comfortable 63 61 over Alexa Glatch, the heroine of the US semifinal victory over Czech Republic. Schiavone, unbeaten in Fed Cup singles in 2009, then came back from a 4-1 first set deficit to overcome Oudin 76(2) 62 after play had been suspended at 4-2 due to rain.

Oudin, who earlier was awarded the inaugural Fed Cup by BNP Paribas Heart Award for her previous performances in the 2009 competition, said: "I feel like I let my team down and the whole US too."

Italian captain Corrado Barazzutti was delighted with his team's victory, saying: "This is something unbelievable. These girls write the history of Italian tennis, this is a great moment. For a country like Italy - we are not America - this is a dream come true."

Mary Joe Fernandez, US Fed Cup captain, and Silvia Farina, the player with the most Fed Cup wins in Italian history, were honoured with the 2009 Fed Cup Award of Excellence on Sunday by the International Tennis Hall of Fame (ITHF) and the ITF. ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti and Jane Brown Grimes, honorary president of the ITHF, made the presentations on court shortly before the start of the reverse singles.

Italy's triumph over USA saw it become the No. 1 nation in the Fed Cup Nations Ranking for the first time, and also the eighth nation in history to win more than one Fed Cup title.

Australia dominates Super-Seniors Team Championships

Australia was the biggest winner at last week's ITF Super-Seniors World Team Championships, taking home five of the nine cups on offer.

The team championships, which came to an end on Saturday, saw over 300 competitors from 93 teams representing 21 nations at the Robertson Park Tennis Centre and Alexander Park Tennis Club in Perth, Australia.

The host nation ended its thoroughly impressive event with eight final appearances, with its five titles including the Alice Marble Cup (Women's 60), Althea Gibson Cup (Women's 70), Jack Crawford Cup (Men's 70), Queens' Cup (Women's 75) and Gardner Mulloy Cup (Men's 80).

Australia overcame the reigning champion in two of the finals, defeating top seed France 3-0 to win the Alice Marble Cup, and South Africa 2-1 in the Althea Gibson Cup final. The home nation whitewashed neighbour New Zealand 3-0 in the Jack Crawford Cup final, and overcame USA 2-1 to win its first ever Queen's Cup title. Australia's final triumph came in the Gardner Mulloy Cup final, where it faced USA for the third year in a row, retaining the title with a 2-1 victory.

USA claimed two titles this year, including its 22nd victory in the Britannia Cup (Men's 65), defeating Australia 2-1 in the final. USA also overcame Australia 3-0 in the Bitsy Grant Cup (Men's 75) final to win the event for the tenth time.

Spain retained one of the two titles it won last year, defeating USA 2-1 in the Von Cramm Cup (Men's 60) final, thanks to victories for world No. 1 Jorge Camina and the doubles pairing of Camina and Jairo Velasco. The remaining title went to Great Britain, who overcame Australia 2-1 in the final of the Kitty Godfree Cup (Women's 65).

This week many of the competitors remain in Perth to compete in the World Individual Championships, where around 330 players from 22 nations are taking part in 22 events. For further information, visit www.itftennis.com/seniors.

Kazakhstan hosts Asian Hopman Cup

The eighth and final team for the 2010 Hyundai Hopman Cup will be determined at the fourth Asian Hopman Cup at the National Tennis Centre in Astana, Kazakhstan on 11-14 November. The winning team automatically qualifies for the ITF's international mixed teams championship to be held in Perth, Western Australia on 2-9 January 2010.

Teams from Kazakhstan, China Rep., Korea, India and Thailand will be vying to beat two-time defending champions Chinese Taipei and take their place in the Hyundai Hopman Cup eight-nation field.

Record attendance at ITF Worldwide Coaches Conference

Six hundred and seventy-nine coaches from over 110 countries participated in this year's ITF Worldwide Coaches Conference presented by BNP Paribas, which finished last Tuesday in Valencia, Spain.

The five-day conference brought together leading experts in the area of Coaches Education, player performance and sport science to present on the latest developments in these fields. Among the keynote speakers, Bruce Elliott (AUS) and Machar Reid (AUS) gave a presentation on biomechanics; Alex Corretja (ESP) questioned whether tennis is a team or individual sport; and Francisco Roig (ESP), who works with Rafael Nadal, gave a practical demonstration of working with elite performance players.

The conference was opened on Friday evening by ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti, RFET President Jose Luis Escanuela, Joaquin Garcia, President of the Valencia Federation, Andres Sanzol, Director of the RFET Coaches Commission, and Ismail El Shafei, member of the ITF Board of Directors and Coaches Commission Chairman. During the Opening Ceremony, Ricci Bitti and El Shafei presented ITF Awards for Services to the Game to Ivan Molina of Colombia and Frank van Fraayenhoven of the Netherlands.

Apart from listening to presentations from world renowned experts, participants enjoyed a social programme including an opening cocktail party, a closing dinner at the Alameda Palace and tickets to the Open Valencia 500 ATP tournament.

Alberto Riba, RFET General Manager, said: "It has been a great pleasure for the RFET to host for the third time this Worldwide Coaches Conference as part of our centenary celebrations. It is gratifying to see that over the years more and more coaches want to attend the conference to keep updated on the latest developments in coaching."
