Monfils goes for Junior Grand Slam

As the men's and women's events reached the halfway stage at Flushing Meadows, the junior event got underway yesterday with attention firmly focused on Gael Monfils. The Frenchman is bidding to become only the second player to win all four junior Grand Slam titles in one year, a feat Stefan Edberg of Sweden achieved in 1983.

Monfils, who will undoubtedly end the year as Junior World Champion, dominated the Australian and French Opens and, although contesting many tighter matches, still proved to be a class above the rest on the unfamiliar grass of Wimbledon. He will start at Flushing Meadows as a strong favourite.

The USA will provide the majority of the likely opposition: Alex Kuznetsov reached the final at Roland Garros, while Brendan Evans has reached at least the last eight of all three Grand Slams this year. Recently-crowned 18 & Under US National champion, Scoville Jenkins has already had a taste of the event after playing Andy Roddick in the men's singles and together with Evans and Kuznetsov will be eager to do well at home. Jenkins also reached the quarterfinals last year.

Britain's Andrew Murray has shown a welcome return to form over the summer and will hope to improve on his quarterfinal showing in 2003 while Andreas Beck of Germany, makes his junior Grand Slam debut after a good year on the ITF Futures Circuit and could also mount a challenge.

Top seeds progress at US Open



The top seeds in both the men's and women's singles have survived the early rounds and are through to the second week of the US Open.



In the men's event No. 3 seed Carlos Moya is the only player missing from the top six seeds after he was upset in the third round by Olivier Rochus of Belgium. Australian Open and two-time Wimbledon Champion Roger Federer, US Open Champion Andy Roddick, US Open and Wimbledon Champion Lleyton Hewitt, the in-form No. 5 seed Tim Henman and eight-time Grand Slam Champion Andre Agassi are still in contention for the title. Olympic gold medallist Nicolas Massu from Chile was knocked out in a marathon five-set match against Sargis Sargsian of Argentina.




In the women's event, No. 2 seed and Olympic silver medallist Amelie Mauresmo, six-time Grand Slam Champion Serena Williams, 2004 French Open Finalist Elena Dementieva and three-time Grand Slam Champion Jennifer Capriati are already through to the quarterfinals. Two-time Grand Slam Champion and Olympic gold medallist Justine Henin-Hardenne and Lindsay Davenport, the fifth seed, make their bid for the quarters today.

US Open in New York. The eventual champion will gain 200 Race points as the competition for places at the season-ending Tennis Masters Cup heats up. Defending champion Andy Roddick is 290 points behind current leader Roger Federer. The top seven players in the Race, plus eligible Grand Slam champions, automatically qualify for the eight-player 2004 Tennis Masters Cup in Houston on 13-21 November. The event is co-owned by the ITF, Grand Slams and ATP.

The final Grand Slam tournament of the season enters the second week at Flushing Meadows this week, as the INDESIT ATP 2004 Race leaders look to gain vital points at the

In contrast to the boy's event, there is no overwhelming favourite in the girl's event. Ukraine's Kateryna Bondarenko, a semifinalist last year, bids to add to the junior Wimbledon crown that she took in July while Israeli Shahar Peer, the junior Australian Open champion, has shown that she can thrive on the big occasion. Bondarenko suffered a disappointing third-round loss in the Canadian Open while Peer gave herself a huge boost by winning that event. Switzerland's Timea Bacsinszky has made solid progress this year and reached the semifinals in Australia and at Roland Garros and is another player in form after reaching the semifinals in Canada.

Dutch player Michaella Krajicek was a finalist in 2003 and will look to gain something from a disappointing 2004 by her high standards. An early defeat in last week's Canadian Open won't have helped her confidence, but on her day, the talented Dutch player is capable of beating anyone in the field. American hopes will rest on the shoulders of Jessica Kirkland, who is taking time away from a successful year on the professional tour to try to win a junior Grand Slam.

Fed Cup World Group semifinals draw



The Fed Cup World Group Draw will take place at 10:00 BST (11:00 GMT) on Thursday 9 September 2004 at the official opening of the venue for the Finals, the new 5,200 seat Krylatskoe Ice Stadium in Moscow. The seeded teams for the draw are France and Russia. Austria and Spain are the other nations competing in the Finals.

The Fed Cup Finals will get underway the week commencing 22 November 2004 with the semifinals and final taking place in the same week. Matches will be played indoors on Taraflex, the same surface used for the 2003 Fed Cup Finals. The semifinals and final will be the best of five matches: four singles and one doubles, best of three sets.

France is looking to defend the title it won for the second time in 2003, while Spain is bidding for a sixth victory. Austria and Russia are hoping to win the competition for the first time.

This year marks the last time the Fed Cup will use this format for the Semifinals and Final. In 2005, with the creation of an eight-team World Group I and an eight-team World Group II, the Fed Cup Semifinals and Finals will take place in separate weeks, with each tie reverting to a two-day event between two nations, held on a home-and-away basis.

Fed Cup is the largest annual international team competition for women in any sport. Eighty-nine nations entered the Fed Cup in 2004. For further information on the Fed Cup, please visit www.fedcup.com.
