FedCup Fed Cup ties register impressive TV coverage

The first round Fed Cup World Group ties on 23-24 April registered extensive television coverage around the world.

The ITF's feature tie, USA v Belgium, was shown in over 30 countries. Host broadcaster ESPN dedicated eight hours of coverage from Delray Beach, while RTBF (Belgium) broadcast all five rubbers live. Several other broadcasters carried good coverage of the tie, including Dubai Sports Channel in the Middle East, Starhub in Singapore and Solar in Philippines.

TVE in Spain and China's CCTV were among the other international broadcasters covering the Fed Cup weekend. TVE was the host broadcaster for the Spain v Argentina World Group I tie in Jerez, registering remarkable market shares of nine per cent throughout the weekend, and also showing the feature tie on its sports channel Teledeporte. TyC Sports broadcast the Jerez tie in Argentina.

CCTV focused on China's performance at the Asia/Oceania Zone Group I event in India, where Doordashan was the host broadcaster. CCTV complemented its coverage with over six hours of the USA v Belgium tie.

The Italy v Russia World Group I tie was shown in both competing nations, with RAI the host broadcaster in Italy, and NTV Plus and RTR showing over 15 hours of live and delayed coverage in Russia. The Tennis Channel in the USA also dedicated over 38 hours of live and delayed transmissions from Brindisi. Austria's ORF and France's Sport+ both showed the Austria v France Group I tie in Portschat.

In World Group II, Slovak TV registered consistent market shares of over nine per cent during the Switzerland v Slovak Republic tie, while Japan's J Sports showed over 20 hours of Czech Republic v Japan. In other zonal events, VTV Uruguay showed over seven hours of Americas Zone Group I, while Telemedellin covered Americas Zone Group II in Colombia.

The Official Highlights programme, a summary of all four World Group I ties, was broadcast in 12 countries including UK, Spain, Italy, Russia, USA, Japan, Singapore and Thailand.



Luczak and Ferguson secure Paris wild cards

Australia's Peter Luczak and Sophie Ferguson have been announced as the recipients of wild cards into the main draw of 2005 Roland Garros, under a reciprocal agreement between Tennis Australia and the French Tennis Federation.

Luczak, aged 25, is currently Australia's third-highest ranked player at No. 131 in the world. Nineteen-year-old Ferguson is Australia's fifth-ranked player at No. 246 in the world and recently made her Fed Cup playing debut at the Asia/Oceania Zone Group I event in New Delhi, India in April.

Tennis Masters Cup Shanghai tickets on sale

Tickets are now on sale for Tennis Masters Cup Shanghai, the 2005 men's tennis circuit finale to be played on 13-20 November at the new \$200 million Qi Zhong tennis centre in China's economic capital.

The opening of ticket sales also coincides with the relaunch of masters-cup.com, the official website of Tennis Masters Cup Shanghai. The site contains the latest Tennis Masters Cup news, travel and ticket information, tournament history and much more.

Shanghai's Vice Mayor Zhou Yupeng unveiled the official Tennis Masters Cup booth in Times Square - the first ticketing booth ever to be located at the Shanghai landmark. More than 300 people queued to buy the first tickets. A second merchandising booth at Pudong was launched in support of online and telephone tickets sales.

Tennis Masters Cup Tournament Director Brad Drewett said: "At the Tennis Masters Cup Shanghai 2002 there was an overwhelming demand for tickets where nearly every session was sold out. Given this was our experience in 2002, it is great news that the new Qi Zhong Stadium is bigger and seats 15,000 people. Now that people in Shanghai and China have experienced tennis from the world's best players, we expect an even greater demand for tickets in 2005 and future years and can now accommodate that increase."

Further nations qualify for ITF junior team finals

Regional qualifying events in Junior Davis Cup by BNP Paribas, Junior Fed Cup and World Junior Tennis were held at three venues last week, with nations looking to secure places in the Finals in Barcelona and Prostějov later in the year.

Australia, Japan, Thailand and Philippines came through the Asia/Oceania Junior Davis Cup qualifying event held in Manila, Philippines. Japan went on to defeat Australia to secure first place, while Philippines defeated Thailand in the third place play-off.

Brazil's boys and girls teams both enjoyed success at the South American qualifying event for Junior Davis Cup and Junior Fed Cup in Asuncion, Paraguay. Ten nations in both categories competed for two boys' and three girls' places in Barcelona. Brazil and Ecuador went on to qualify for the Junior Davis Cup Finals, while Argentina, Brazil and Venezuela all qualified for the Junior Fed Cup Finals.

USA dominated the North/Central American & Caribbean final qualifying event for Junior Davis Cup, Junior Fed Cup and World Junior Tennis in Manzanillo, Mexico. All four USA teams qualified for the Finals, while host nation Mexico qualified for all but the Junior Fed Cup Finals. Canada girls managed to break the US-Mexican dominance by clinching the second Junior Fed Cup qualifying spot.

The World Junior Tennis Finals will be held in Prostějov on 8-13 August, while the Junior Davis Cup by BNP Paribas/Junior Fed Cup Finals will be held in Barcelona from 27 September to 2 October.

There will be further qualifying events this week, with the South American World Junior Tennis qualifying event in St. Catarina, Brazil and the Asia/Oceania Junior Fed Cup qualifying event in Bangkok, Thailand. For further information, visit www.itftennis.com/juniors.
