## Double celebration for Netherlands at Invacare World Team Cup

The Netherlands secured a double victory at the 2005 Invacare World Team Cup over the weekend, netting the men's and women's titles at home in Groningen. The United States became the second nation to claim the quad title three times, while Hungary is the second country to win in the Men's World Group 2.

In World Group 1, third seed Japan upset top seed France 2-1 in the semifinals to reach their second men's final. Meanwhile, in a repeat of last year's semifinal, second seed Netherlands overcame fourth seed Australia 2-0. In the final, Robin Ammerlaan and Ronald Vink (NED) outclassed Shingo Kunieda and Satoshi Saida (JPN) in the deciding doubles to clinch a 75 76(4) triumph over the 2004 Paralympic gold doubles medallists.

World Group 2 produced a close final, with Hungary's Laszlo Farkas and Csaba Prohaszka defeating Fabian Mazzei and Luca Spano of Italy in straight sets 62 64 in the deciding doubles. Both Hungary and Italy have now earned promotion to World Group 1 for next year's competition, while Chile and Switzerland have been relegated to World Group 2.

In the women's competition, top seeds Netherlands and seventh seeds Korea reached the last round, marking the 18th time for the mighty Dutch team and the first time for the Asian nation. Jiske Griffioen and Esther Vergeer (NED) won both singles rubbers against Park Ju Yeon and Hong Young Suk (KOR) in straight sets to give the Netherlands their 18th women's title and sixth consecutive triumph.

In the quad event, defending champions Israel and the United States progressed to the final in which Paralympic doubles gold medallists Nick Taylor and David Wagner (USA) both dominated their singles rubbers. Taylor defeated Ido Fridman (ISR) 63 46 60 while Wagner overpowered Shraga Weinberg (ISR) 61 63 to give their country a 2-0 victory over Israel. Israel and the United States are the only two countries to have won the quad title three times in the eight years that the division has been part of the Invacare World Team Cup.


The junior title was fiercely contested by two round-robin pools of four nations, in which Belgium and Australia finished top. In Friday's final Belgium's Mike Denayer and Joachim Gerard outclassed the Australian boys, Richard Engles and Michael Esler, in both singles rubbers, to the delight of a tearful but joyous crowd of family and friends.

On the eve of the final day, the Chilean men's team received the Team of the Year Award from ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti during the ITF Official Dinner. Mr Ricci Bitti also presented Sue Wolstenholme from the British Tennis Foundation with the prestigious Brad Parks Award, the highest recognition in wheelchair tennis, for her outstanding contribution to the development of the sport in Great Britain and internationally. ## 2006 Davis Cup dates confirmed

The ITF today confirmed the complete schedule for the 2006 Davis Cup by BNP Paribas:

<b>World Group 1st Round</b>	<b>10-12 February</b>
<b>World Group Quarterfinals</b>	<b>7-9 April</b>
<b>World Group Semifinals and Play-offs</b>	<b>22-24 September</b>
<b>World Group Final</b>	<b>1-3 December</b>

This is a return to the competition's traditional dates in the men's tennis calendar. The 2005 dates were changed to assist the ATP with some difficult scheduling issues facing two of the Masters Series tournaments.

The 2005 quarterfinals will be staged next month on 15-17 July, with Slovak Republic taking on Netherlands in Bratislava, Australia hosting Argentina in Sydney, Russia at home to France in Moscow, and Croatia facing Romania in Split.

Davis Cup by BNP Paribas is the largest annual international team competition in sport with 134 nations entered in 2005. The title sponsor is BNP Paribas, the Official Bank of Davis Cup. International sponsors are Adecco (Official Recruitment), Fossil (Official Watch), Getronics (Official ICT Sponsor), Hugo Boss (Official Men's Fashion Clothing Sponsor), Kia Motors (Official Car) and NH Hoteles (Official Hotel). ## Combined Junior Ranking increases doubles play

The ITF has announced that the first year of the ITF Combined Junior Ranking proved an overwhelming success, with an increase in the number of players participating in doubles and an improved commitment by those players in doubles.

The ITF introduced the combined ranking in January 2004 with the immediate aim of encouraging the doubles game at junior level and the long-term goal of producing well-rounded players graduating from the junior to the professional game.

The ranking, which counts a player's best six singles results and 25 per cent of a player's best six doubles results, replaced the separate singles and doubles junior rankings. Gael Monfils (NED) and Michaela Krajicek (NED) were named the first combined ITF Junior World Champions for 2004.

Detailed research showed that the top 20 boys and top 20 girls on the 2004 year-end rankings participated in both singles and doubles in 91 per cent of the tournaments that they played during the year. This is an increase of 20 per cent on the 2003 figures.

More Regional and National Associations are expected to use a similar system to combine their singles and doubles rankings and thus emphasise the importance of doubles to players from an early age.

Luca Santilli, ITF Manager, Juniors & Seniors Tennis, said: "Coaches appreciate the added incentive for players to develop all areas of their game by playing doubles. Tournament organisers have witnessed a rise in the standard of players in doubles draws as well as a drop in the number of withdrawals from doubles events. We look forward to seeing the impact of the Combined Junior Ranking on the wider game in the future."



## Junior Wimbledon underway

The junior tournament at Wimbledon has started and there is plenty of speculation about which of this year's talented crop of youngsters will triumph at the All England Club. For many of the girls and boys in action, this is only their first or second outing on grass, and this fact alone is likely to throw up a few surprise results on the hallowed turf.

Due to his impressive run to third round of the men's event, Andrew Murray has withdrawn from the junior tournament, thus opening the field for others to make their name at Wimbledon. Current junior world No.1 Donald Young (USA) will pose a threat to all those hoping to lift the coveted trophy. Although he lost in the second round of Roehampton's Grade 1 ITF Junior event last week, it was only his second outing on grass and after a week's practice on the surface, the Australian Open champion cannot be discounted and is No. 2 seed for a very good reason.

One of the main threats for the title will undoubtedly come from the recent Roland Garros champion Marin Cilic of Croatia. He has also shown impressive form on grass, having won the Roehampton tournament. His towering frame and booming serves will give him a massive advantage at Wimbledon. Compatriot Petar Jelenic's game is also ideally suited to grass and he will be tough opposition for anyone. Jelenic, who lists the green stuff as his favourite surface, is also in a rich vein of form and, having won the Grade A Italian Open in May, is capable of going all the way.

In the girl's competition, Belarus's Viktoria Azarenka claims top seed status as No.1 in the current ITF junior rankings. The Australian Open champion will be hoping to better last year's semifinal loss, and her steady progress on the WTA tour will stand her in good stead.

Hungary's Agnes Szavay has also enjoyed a great year after her recent victory at Roland Garros and reaching the final of the Australian Open. If her Grand Slam form is an indication, she will be involved in the latter stages of the tournament but, having fallen in the first round of last year's event, her ability on grass is yet to be proved.

America's greatest hopes rest on the shoulders of Jessica Kirkland. The 17-year-old has broken into the top 200 in the WTA rankings and will be looking to add to her Orange Bowl victory and runner-up finish at the US Open in 2004.

The girls' event has a very strong field and on current grass court form one might look no further than Denmark's Caroline Wozniacki or New Zealand's Marina Erakovic, who both performed splendidly to reach the final at Roehampton. Wozniacki won in straight sets, to complement her victory in the junior invitational event at Eastbourne. Wozniacki has also won two Grade A events in the last 12 months while Erakovic has been playing on grass for the last few weeks, winning the Grade 3 Gerry Weber Open in Germany. The fact that the pair are seeded tenth and 11th respectively demonstrates the depth of the girls' singles draw.

## Sue Wolstenholme receives Brad Parks Award

The 2005 Brad Parks Award was awarded to Sue Wolstenholme (GBR) by ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti during the Invacare World Team Cup last week. This award is presented annually to recognise the contribution to wheelchair tennis by an individual or organisation.

Sue has made a significant contribution to the sport both within Great Britain and internationally. Since being appointed Director of the British Tennis Foundation (formerly the Lawn Tennis Association Trust) in 1988, she has been a driving force behind the British Open, which has had Super Series status on the NEC Wheelchair Tennis Tour since 1995.

Sue has also been Chairman of the ITF Wheelchair Tennis Medical Commission for the past three years, becoming heavily involved in the development of quad wheelchair tennis, which made its Paralympic debut at Athens 2004.

She has worked with the All England Lawn Tennis Club to build on the success of wheelchair tennis demonstration matches held at Wimbledon since 2001. Next weekend, The Championships will have its first-ever wheelchair tennis invitational tournament, with eight of the world's top doubles players pairing up on 2 and 3 July in a knock-out tournament carrying a purse of £6,000 in prize money.

## Obituary - RK Khanna

The ITF was sad to learn of the death of Raj Kumar Khanna on 20 June at the age of 81. He was an Honorary Life Counsellor of the ITF, Honorary Life Vice President of the Asian Tennis Federation (ATF) and Honorary Life President of the All India Tennis Association (AITA).

Khanna served as a member of the ITF Committee of Management from 1967-77, and was elected as its senior Vice President from 1971-76. He was twice General Secretary of AITA, and served as AITA President from 1992-2000, during which time he oversaw the continued development of the infrastructure of the game in India.



## West Asia Training Camp, Amman, Jordan

The first ever West Asia Training Camp came to a close over the weekend in Amman, Jordan. ITF Development Officer for West Asia, Hichem Riani, selected 27 male and female players from 12 different countries in the region to participate, the players aged between 11 and 14 years old.

The training camp took place 21-26 June 2005 and an ATF 14 & Under Series Tournament follows this week in Amman. Hichem Riani conducted it along with six Level 2 certified coaches from the region: Adel Al Shatti (KUW), Farah Dayoub (SYR), Tawfiq Ibrahim (KSA), Basil Tayyem (JOR), Majdy Yacoub (IRQ) and Fadi Yousef (LIB). Each day players and coaches spent four and a half hours working on fitness, technique, tactics and mental strength. All participants were given the opportunity to take some time out to visit the Dead Sea, one of the most famous tourist sites in the Middle East.
