- Australian Open girls' singles champion **KORNEEVA** is bidding to win her 2nd Grand Slam title.
- Korneeva is bidding to become the **first player to win 2 Grand Slam girls' singles titles in a season since 2013**, when Ana Konjuh won the title at both the Australian Open and the US Open and Belinda Bencic won the title at both Roland Garros and Wimbledon.
- Korneeva is bidding to become the **first player to win the girls' singles titles at the opening 2 Grand Slam events of the year since 1990**, when Magdalena Maleeva won the girls' singles titles at both the Australian Open and Roland Garros, and at the US Open later in the season.
- By reaching the final here, Korneeva has become the **first player to reach the girls' singles finals at the Australian Open and Roland Garros in the same season since 2019**, when Leylah Fernandez finished runner-up at the Australian Open and won the title at Roland Garros.
- Korneeva is making her **2nd junior Grand Slam appearance here**. She is bidding to extend her perfect record in junior Grand Slam matches, having made her junior Grand Slam debut at the Australian Open this year.
- Korneeva is contesting her **3rd junior event of 2023**. In addition to her title victory at the Australian Open and her appearance here, she also reached the semifinals at J300 Traralgon (AUS) (l. Melisa Ercan).

- Korneeva **won her biggest event on the ITF World Tennis Tour** in March this year, defeating Timea Babos to win the title as a qualifier at W60 Pretoria (RSA). She has won one other professional title, at 2022 W15 Casablanca (MAR) (d. Laura Hietaranta).
- Korneeva's **other highlights at professional-level in 2022** are reaching the quarterfinals at W60 Grado (ITA) (l. Irene Burillo Escorihuela) and W25 Pretoria (RSA) (l. Lulu Sun).
- Korneeva reached the **junior No. 1 ranking** in May this year and plays here two places lower at No. 3. She is also currently at a career-high WTA ranking of No. 331.
- Korneeva entered the **girls' doubles here** as No. 1 seeds with Sara Saito. The pair face No. 6 seeds Tyra Caterina Grant/Clervie Ngounoue in the final later on Saturday. She would become the 2nd player to win both the girls' singles and doubles titles here in consecutive years, after Lucie Havlickova achieved the feat in 2022.
- Korneeva is coached by Andrey Savin.
- **PEREZ ALARCON** is bidding to become the first Peruvian player to win a Grand Slam girls' singles title. By reaching the final here, she has become the first Peruvian player to reach a Grand Slam girls' singles title.
- Perez Alarcon is bidding to become the **2nd Peruvian player to reach a Grand Slam junior singles final** – after 1985 Roland Garros boys' singles champion Jaime Yzaga. By reaching the final here, she has become the 3rd Peruvian player to reach a Grand Slam junior singles final – after Yzaga and 1997 Roland Garros boys' singles runner-up Luis Horna.
- Perez Alarcon is bidding to become the **first South American girls' singles champion here since 1992**, when Paraguay's Rossana de los Rios won the girls' singles title here. She would also become the first South American player to win a Grand Slam girls' singles title since Colombia's Camila Osorio won the girls' singles title at the 2019 US Open.
- Perez Alarcon is contesting her **4th junior Grand Slam event**. She has lost in the 1st round on her 3 other junior Grand Slam appearances – at 2022 Roland Garros (l. Yaroslava Bartashevich), 2022 Wimbledon (l. Ella Seidel) and the 2022 US Open (l. Sofia Costoulas).
- Perez Alarcon has **won 3 junior titles in 2023** – at J300 Barranquilla (COL) (d. Iva Jovic), J300 Lima (PER) (d. Kaitlin Quevedo) and J300 Santa Cruz (BOL) (South American Championships) (d. Luciana Moyano). She also reached the final at J300 Porto Alegre (BRA) (l. Sara Saito) and the quarterfinals at J500 Criciuma (BRA) (l. Emma Ottavia Ghirardato)
- Perez Alarcon **made her professional debut in October 2021** and has contested 5 events as a professional. She has won 2 matches on the ITF World Tennis Tour – in 2nd round finishes at 2021 W25 Lima (PER) (d. Caterina Salas, l. Panna Udvardy) and 2022 W15 Lima (PER) (d. Wakana Sonobe, l. Noelia Zeballos Melgar).
- Perez Alarcon made her **Billie Jean King Cup debut for Peru** at the Americas Group I event in Colombia this year. She won all 5 singles matches she contested as Peru maintained their status in Group I.
- Perez Alarcon reached a **career-high junior ranking** of No. 6 in May this year and plays here 3 places lower at No. 9. She does not have a WTA ranking.
- Perez Alarcon is coached by Sergio Morez.
