



DAVIS CUP JUNIORS BILLIE JEAN KING CUP JUNIORS BY GAINBRIDGE 2023 FINALS PREVIEW NOTES

EVENT SUMMARY

The Davis Cup Juniors Finals and Billie Jean King Cup Juniors by Gainbridge Finals are hosted in Cordoba, Spain for the first time. This is the 38th edition of the ITF's international team competition for players aged 16 and under, which was launched in 1985 as the World Youth Cup. The event was rebranded as the Davis Cup Juniors and Junior Fed Cup in 2002 – with the girls' event undergoing a second rebrand to become the Billie Jean King Cup Juniors in 2021.

In 2023, the Davis Cup Juniors Finals and Billie Jean King Juniors Finals are taking place in consecutive weeks, with the former being played from Monday 30 October to Sunday 5 November, and the latter being played from Monday 6 November to Sunday 12 November.

DEFENDING CHAMPIONS

2022 Billie Jean King Cup Juniors champions USA will bid to win the title for an 8th time this year. It would also be the USA's 5th title in the last 6 editions of the event, after victories in 2017, 2018 and 2019, with Czechia winning in 2021. The 2022 USA team included Clervie Ngounoue, who went on to peak at No. 1 in the ITF Junior Rankings in June 2023 and win the girls' singles title at 2023 Wimbledon.

In Davis Cup Juniors, 2022 champions Brazil will bid to defend their title after becoming the 14th nation to win the event last year. No team has successfully defended the title since France won in 1992 and 1993. Brazil had never previously reached the final, their previous best performance coming in 2006 when they finished 3rd behind Netherlands and Russia.

HOME VICTORIES

The Spanish boys' team are bidding to become the first team to win the Davis Cup Juniors on home soil on 3 occasions – with Spanish teams winning while hosting the event in both 1991 and 2004. Just 3 nations have won the Davis Cup Juniors title at home, with Germany and Chile the only other nations to have achieved the feat.

USA's girls team won the Billie Jean King Cup Juniors title at Lake Nona, Florida in 2019 – becoming the first girls' team in more than 20 years to win the title on home soil. The Spanish girls' team are bidding to become the 5th team to win the Billie Jean King Cup Juniors title at home.

DOING THE DOUBLE

A total of 9 nations have both boys and girls teams competing at the event this year: Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Czechia, Great Britain, Japan, Kazakhstan, Spain and USA. The last nation to win both Davis Cup Juniors and Billie Jean King Cup Juniors titles in the same year was USA in 2014. Just 2 other nations have achieved the feat since the events were established in 1985.

PAST CHAMPIONS

There are 10 past Davis Cup Juniors champions competing here this year. One other nation competing in Cordoba this year has reached the Davis Cup Juniors final without yet winning the title – Argentina, who finished as runners-up in 2007 and 2008.

There are 6 past Billie Jean King Cup Juniors champions competing here this year. Three other nations have reached the Billie Jean King Cup Juniors Final without yet winning the title – Japan, who finished as runners-up in both 2017 and 2021, Canada, who finished as runners-up in 2003, 2004 and 2011, and Great Britain, who finished as runners-up in 2008.

WINNING JUNIORS AND PROS

Five nations have won the Davis Cup title and the Davis Cup Juniors title in the same year – most recently the Russian Tennis Federation in 2021. Of the 16 nations competing in the Davis Cup Juniors Finals this year, 5 of those nations also have teams competing at the Davis Cup Finals knockout stage in Malaga in November – Canada, Czechia, Great Britain, Italy and Netherlands.

Just 2 nations have won the Billie Jean King Cup title and the Billie Jean King Cup Juniors title in the same year. Of the 16 nations competing in the Billie Jean King Cup Juniors Finals this year, 6 of those nations also have teams competing at the Billie Jean King Cup Finals in Seville, with both events concluding on Sunday 12 November – Australia, Canada, Czechia, Kazakhstan, Spain and USA.

PLAYERS TO WIN IN BOTH JUNIORS AND PROS

A total of 11 players have won both Davis Cup Juniors and Davis Cup titles. The most-recent junior champions to go on to win the Davis Cup title are Denis Shapovalov and Felix Auger-Aliassime, who won the Davis Cup Juniors title in 2015 and the Davis Cup title in 2022. Rafael Nadal holds the record for shortest time between Davis Cup Juniors titles and Davis Cup titles – having won the Davis Cup title for the first time just 2 years after winning the junior title in 2002.

A number of players have competed in either Davis Cup Juniors or Billie Jean King Cup Juniors before going on to become stars of the professional game – including multiple Grand Slam singles champions.
