On court today...

- Novak Djokovic maintained his perfect record in the 1st round at Wimbledon by defeating Alexandre Muller under the Centre Court roof on Tuesday evening. Opening up Centre Court today, he now faces an opponent he has never beaten before – wild card Daniel Evans. The Brit defeated Djokovic in their only previous meeting, on clay in the 3rd round at Monte Carlo-1000 in 2021 and should he upset Djokovic today, he would become just the 10th player to win his first 2 matches against Djokovic. If, however, Djokovic is victorious this afternoon, he will advance to the 3rd round here for the 19th time and claim sole ownership of the Open Era record for most appearances in the men's singles 3rd round at Wimbledon, ahead of Roger Federer.
- World No. 4 Jack Draper closes play on No. 1 Court today as he takes on 2017 runner-up Marin Cilic in a bid to reach the 3rd round here at Wimbledon for the first time. With 3 British players already through to the 3rd round (Cameron Norrie in the men's draw, and Sonay Kartal and Emma Raducanu in the women's draw), Draper will hope that he and his 3 compatriots in action today can join them – should they all do so, it will represent the highest number of British players to reach the 3rd round at a Grand Slam since 1975 Wimbledon. If he is to stop Draper, Cilic must win a grass-court match against a Top 5 player for the first time. The 2014 US Open champion has lost all 9 of his previous grass-court matches against Top 5 players, 6 of which have come at Wimbledon.
- A battle of the former Wimbledon boys' singles champions is the final match on the Court 18 schedule today, as Marton Fucsovics faces Gael Monfils. Fucsovics won the junior title here in 2010, while Monfils was the boys' singles champion 21 years ago in 2004. Now 38 years old, Monfils was the oldest man to begin the men's singles draw this year – and he and fellow 38-year-old Djokovic are aiming to join a group of just 9 men in the Open Era who have reached the 3rd round at Wimbledon aged 38 or older. Meanwhile, Fucsovics and compatriot Fabian Marozsan (who plays Jaume Munar today) are aiming to write Hungarian history – should both players win, it will be the 2nd time in history that multiple multiple Hungarian players have reached the men's singles 3rd round at Wimbledon, after Emil Gabori and Otto Szigeti both achieved the feat in 1939.

A 3rd Tour-level meeting for Sinner and Vukic – but their first at a Grand Slam or on grass. Sinner won both of their previous matches in straight sets in 2021-22.

Sinner has never lost a Grand Slam match to a player ranked as low as No. 93 Vukic. The lowest-ranked player to have defeated Sinner at a Grand Slam is No. 79 Daniel Altmaier in the 2nd round at 2023 Roland Garros. The lowest-ranked player to have defeated Sinner at Wimbledon is No. 48 Marton Fucsovics in the 1st round in 2021.

- **SINNER** is bidding to reach the 3rd round here for the 4th consecutive year. This is his 5th Wimbledon appearance and his 23rd Grand Slam overall.
- Sinner advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Luca Nardi 64 63 60 in the 1st round on Tuesday.
- **Last year here**, as No. 1 seed, Sinner reached the quarterfinals. He defeated Yannick Hanfmann, Matteo Berrettini, Miomir Kecmanovic and Ben Shelton before falling to Daniil Medvedev in 5 sets.
- Sinner's **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the semifinals in 2023 (l. Novak Djokovic). It was his first appearance in a Grand Slam semifinal, having previously reached the quarterfinals at all 4 Grand Slam tournaments, including at Wimbledon in 2022 (l. Djokovic).
- Sinner is a **3-time Grand Slam champion**. He won his first Grand Slam title at the 2024 Australian Open, recovering from 0-2 down to defeat Daniil Medvedev in 5 sets in the final. He also won the title at the 2024 US Open (d. Taylor Fritz), before successfully defending his title at the Australian Open this year (d. Alexander Zverev). He became the 5th player in the Open Era to win 3 consecutive hard court Grand Slam men's singles titles – and the first since Djokovic in 2011-12.
- By winning his 3rd Grand Slam title at the Australian Open this year, Sinner claimed sole ownership of the record for **most Grand Slam singles titles won by an Italian player** – moving ahead of 2-time Grand Slam champion Nicola Pietrangeli, who won the men's singles title at Roland Garros in 1959 and 1960.
- Sinner is bidding to become the **first Italian player to win a Wimbledon singles title, man or woman**. He is also bidding to become the 3rd Italian player, man or woman, to reach a singles final here – after 2021 men's singles runner-up Matteo Berrettini and 2024 women's singles runner-up Jasmine Paolini.
- Sinner is bidding to record his 76th Grand Slam match-win. He is in **2nd place on the all-time list for most Grand Slam men's singles matches won by an Italian player**, behind Pietrangeli (94 Grand Slam match-wins).
- Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year, Sinner **reached the final at Roland Garros for the first time**, falling to Carlos Alcaraz in 5 sets despite leading 2-0. At 5 hours 29 minutes, it was the longest Roland Garros singles final in the Open Era and the 2nd-longest Grand Slam singles final in the Open Era, after Djokovic's 5 hour 53 minute victory over Rafael Nadal at the 2012 Australian Open.

- Sinner is bidding to reach his first Wimbledon final and become the **11th player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles final at all 4 Grand Slam tournaments** – and the first since Andy Murray, who completed the set of Grand Slam final appearances with a runner-up finish at 2016 Roland Garros.
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Sinner reached the 2nd round at Halle (d. Hanfmann, I. Alexander Bublik). It was the first time that he had failed to reach at least the quarterfinals at an event since 2023 Paris-1000, where he gave a walkover to Alex de Minaur in the 3rd round due to fatigue, ending a streak of 19 Tour-level events reaching at least the quarterfinal stage.
- Sinner is one of **22 players competing here this year to have won a title on grass**. He won the title at 2024 Halle (d. Hubert Hurkacz) in his first event as world No. 1. He is one of 4 Italian men to have won a Tour-level title on grass in the Open Era – alongside Berrettini (4 grass court titles), and Andreas Seppi and Lorenzo Sonego (both one).
- Sinner is contesting his **5th event of the 2025 season** here. In addition to his title at the Australian Open, runner-up finish at Roland Garros and 2nd round finish at Halle, he also finished runner-up at Rome-1000 (I. Alcaraz).
- Sinner has won one of the last **7 five-set matches** he has contested, with his only victory in a 5-set match in that time coming against Medvedev in the final at the 2024 Australian Open. He has lost both 5-set matches he has contested at Wimbledon – in the quarterfinals in both 2022, when he lost to Djokovic in 5 sets despite holding a 2-0 lead, and last year to Medvedev. He has a 6-10 win-loss record in 5-set matches overall.
- Sinner became **world No. 1** for the first time following Roland Garros last year and has remained there since then. He began his 56th week as world No. 1 on Monday. He will remain world No. 1 following Wimbledon regardless of results at the tournament.
- Sinner reached a **career-high junior ranking of No. 133** and did not contest the boys' singles events at any of the Grand Slam tournaments. His best result as a junior was reaching the quarterfinals as a wild card at the Grade A Trofeo Bonfiglio event in Milan in 2018 (I. Naoki Tajima).
- Sinner **led Italy to their 3rd Davis Cup title in 2024**, successfully defending their title from 2023. He won all 4 matches he played across singles and doubles at the Final 8 Knockout Stage in Malaga in November. He made his Davis Cup debut in 2021 and has an 15-4 overall win-loss record in the competition. Italy have received a wild card to the 2025 Davis Cup Final 8 Knockout Stage in Bologna in November.
- Sinner is coached by Simone Vagnozzi and Darren Cahill.
- **VUKIC** is bidding to reach the 3rd round here for the first time and equal his best Grand Slam result. This is his 3rd Wimbledon appearance and his 13th Grand Slam overall.
- Vukic advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Tseng Chun Hsin 63 64 46 76(5) in the 1st round on Tuesday.
- By reaching the 2nd round here, Vukic has equalled his **best Wimbledon result**. He has reached the 2nd round on both of his previous appearances here – in 2023 (d. Daniel Altmaier, I. Quentin Halys) and 2024 (d. Sebastian Ofner, I. Carlos Alcaraz).
- Vukic's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the 3rd round at the Australian Open this year. He defeated both Damir Dzumhur and Sebastian Korda in 5 sets before falling to Jack Draper, also in 5 sets.
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Vukic fell in the 1st round at Roland Garros (I. Karen Khachanov).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Vukic fell in the 1st round as direct acceptance at 's-Hertogenbosch (I. Gabriel Diallo) and as a qualifier at both Queen's (I. Alexei Popyrin) and Eastbourne (I. James Duckworth). He also fell in the 1st round at the Birmingham Challenger (GBR) (I. Otto Virtanen).
- Vukic is bidding to record his **7th Tour-level match-win in 2025**. Prior to Wimbledon, his only victories at Tour-level came in his 3rd round finish at the Australian Open, in 2nd round finishes as a wild card at Brisbane (d. David Goffin, I. Grigor Dimitrov) and as a direct acceptance at Rome-1000 (d. Nicolas Moreno de Alboran, I. Korda), and against Leo Borg during Australia's Davis Cup Qualifiers 1st Round victory over Sweden.
- Vukic has contested **3 Challenger-level events in 2025**. His best result is reaching the semifinals at the Estoril Challenger (POR) (I. Andrea Pellegrino). His 3 victories at Estoril ended a 10-match losing streak at all levels – he had not previously recorded a match-win at any level since defeating Borg during the Davis Cup Qualifiers 1st Round.

- Vukic is **bidding to defeat a world No. 1 for the first time on his 2nd attempt**. He lost his only previous match against a world No. 1, falling to Novak Djokovic in the 2nd round at 2024 Indian Wells-1000. The highest-ranked player he has defeated is No. 9 Casper Ruud in the 2nd round at 2024 Shanghai-1000. The highest-ranked player he has defeated at a Grand Slam is No. 22 Korda in the 2nd round at the Australian Open this year.
- Vukic won the only **5-set match** he has contested at Wimbledon – against Ofner in the 1st round here last year. He has a 3-3 win-loss record in 5-set matches overall, with all 5 other 5-set matches he has contested coming at the Australian Open – including all 3 matches he contested at the Australian Open this year.
- Vukic reached a **career-high ranking** of No 48 in August 2023. He plays here at No. 93.
- Vukic played **college tennis**. He represented the University of Illinois from 2015 to 2018 and was named a 3-time All-American and 2017 Big Ten Athlete of the Year.
- Vukic made his **Davis Cup** debut for Australia at the Qualifiers 1st Round this year, defeating Sweden's Borg in the only match he has contested at the competition so far. Australia will play at home against Belgium in the Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Vukic is coached by Nuno Lencastre and Jay Gooding.

NO. 4 JACK DRAPER (GBR) v MARIN CILIC (CRO)

Head-to-head: first meeting

Cilic lost his only previous match against a British player at Wimbledon – he fell to Andy Murray in the round of 16 here in 2012. He has an 11-14 win-loss record against British players at Tour-level. Of his 14 defeats to British players, 12 came against Murray – his other 2 defeats to British players came against Daniel Evans in the 2nd round at the 2017 Australian Open and against Cameron Norrie in the semifinals at 2021 Estoril.

Cilic has a 12-3 win-loss record against players at their home Grand Slams. In addition to his 0-1 win-loss record against British players at Wimbledon, he has a 3-0 win-loss record against Australian players at the Australian Open, a 2-1 win-loss record against French players at Roland Garros and a 7-1 win-loss record against American players at the US Open.

Cilic has won 5 of the 6 matches he has contested against lefthanded players at Wimbledon. His only defeat to a lefthanded player here came against Guido Pella in the 2nd round in 2018. He has a 22-3 win-loss record against lefthanded players at the Grand Slams, with both of his other defeats coming against Rafael Nadal – in the round of 16 at the 2011 Australian Open and in the round of 16 at the 2019 US Open. He has an 86-36 win-loss record against lefthanded players at Tour-level overall.

- **DRAPER** is bidding to reach the 3rd round here for the first time. This is his 4th Wimbledon appearance and his 13th Grand Slam overall.
- Draper is one of 4 British players competing in the men's singles here today, alongside Daniel Evans, Arthur Fery and Jack Pinnington Jones. If all 4 British men win today and join Cameron Norrie in the 3rd round here, it will be the **highest number of British men to reach the 3rd round at Wimbledon since 1962**. With 7 British men reaching the 2nd round here, it is the joint-highest number of British men to reach the 2nd round at Wimbledon in the Open Era – there were also 7 British players in the men's singles 2nd round here in 1968, 1969, 1976, 1996 and 1997.

- If Draper, Evans, Fery and Pinnington Jones all win today and join Norrie, Sonay Kartal and Emma Raducanu in the 3rd round here, it will be the **highest number of British players to reach the 3rd round at a Grand Slam since 1975 Wimbledon**, when 10 British players reached the 3rd round here. (see table overleaf)

- Draper advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Sebastian Baez in the 1st round on Tuesday. He was leading 62 62 2-1 when Baez retired due to a knee injury.
- By reaching the 2nd round here, Draper has equalled his **best Wimbledon result**. He also reached the 2nd round here in 2022 (d. Zizou Bergs, l. Alex de Minaur) and 2024 (d. Elias Ymer, l. Cameron Norrie). In his only other appearance here, as a wild card on his Grand Slam debut in 2021, he fell to Novak Djokovic in the 1st round. He missed the entire grass court season in 2023 due to a shoulder injury.
- Draper's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the semifinals at the 2024 US Open (l. Jannik Sinner). He became the first British player to reach the men's singles semifinals at the US Open since Andy Murray won the title in 2012.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Draper reached the round of 16 at the Australian Open, where he recorded 5-set victories against Mariano Navone, Thanasi Kokkinakis and Aleksandar Vukic, recovering from 1-2 down in all 3 matches, before retiring due to a hip injury against Carlos Alcaraz. He also reached the round of 16 at Roland Garros (l. Alexander Bublik).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Draper reached the semifinals at Queen's (l. Jiri Lehecka).
- Draper's **best grass court result** is winning the title at 2024 Stuttgart (d. Matteo Berrettini). He is one of 22 players competing in the men's singles here this year to have won a Tour-level title on grass.
- Draper's best result in 2025 is winning his **first Masters-1000 title** at Indian Wells-1000 (d. Holger Rune). His other highlights this season are finishing runner-up at Doha (l. Andrey Rublev) and Madrid-1000 (l. Casper Ruud) and reaching the quarterfinals at Rome-1000 (l. Alcaraz).
- Draper has won 5 of the 6 **five-set matches** he has contested, with his only defeat in a 5-set match coming against Jesper de Jong in the 1st round at 2024 Roland Garros. He won the only 5-set match he has contested at Wimbledon, against Elias Ymer in the 1st round last year.
- Draper is one of **7 lefthanders** through to the 2nd round from the 15 who began the men's singles main draw here this year. Rafael Nadal is the last lefthanded player to win the men's singles title here in 2010.
- Draper **broke into the Top 5 for the first time** in May this year, becoming the 4th British man to break the Top 5, after Greg Rusedski, Tim Henman and Murray. He reached a career-high ranking of No. 4 following Roland Garros and plays here at the same ranking.
- Draper finished **runner-up in the boys' singles at 2018 Wimbledon**, falling to No. 1 seed Tseng Chun-Hsin 61 67(2) 64 in the final. He had defeated Nicolas Mejia 76(5) 67(6) 19-17 in a semifinal match lasting 4 hours 23 minutes. He reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 7 in December 2018.
- Draper made his **Davis Cup** debut for Great Britain at the 2023 Finals Group Stage and has won one of the 4 matches he has contested in the competition. Great Britain fell to Japan 2-3 in the Qualifiers 1st Round in February and will play away against Poland in a World Group I tie in September.
- Draper is coached by James Trotman.

- **CILIC** is bidding to reach the 3rd round here for the 9th time. This is his 15th Wimbledon appearance and his 61st Grand Slam overall.
- Cilic advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Raphael Collignon 63 64 63 for his **first Grand Slam match-win since the 2022 US Open** in the 1st round on Tuesday.
- Cilic is making his **first Wimbledon appearance since 2021**. He withdrew from the 2022 tournament due to illness and underwent knee surgery in 2023, contesting just 6 events between January 2023 and August 2024. On his last appearance here, in 2021, he reached the 3rd round (l. Daniil Medvedev).
- Prior to this tournament, Cilic had made **2 Grand Slam main draw appearances since the beginning of the 2023 season** – he fell in the 1st round at the 2024 Australian Open (l. Fabian Marozsan) and fell in the 1st round as a lucky loser at 2025 Roland Garros (l. Flavio Cobolli). His appearance in qualifying at Roland Garros this year, where he defeated Wu Yibing and Pol Martin Tiffon before falling to Lloyd Harris, was his first appearance in the qualifying draw at a Grand Slam since the 2007 US Open.
- Cilic is a **former Wimbledon runner-up**. He reached the final here in 2017, falling to Roger Federer in straight sets. By reaching the final, he became just the 2nd Croatian player – man or woman – to reach multiple Grand Slam finals after Goran Ivanisevic.
- Cilic **won his only Grand Slam title to date** at the 2014 US Open, defeating Kei Nishikori in the final. He was the first Croatian to win a Grand Slam title since Ivanisevic at 2001 Wimbledon. He also finished runner-up at the 2018 Australian Open (l. Federer).
- Cilic is bidding to record his **4th Tour-level match-win of the season**. His only Tour-level match-wins this year prior to this tournament came in a quarterfinal finish at Dubai, where he defeated Alex de Minaur and Alexei Popyrin before falling to Felix Auger-Aliassime. He lost in the 1st round at the 3 other Tour-level events he has contested in 2025 – at Doha (l. Carlos Alcaraz), as a wild card at Madrid-1000 (l. Benjamin Bonzi) and as a lucky loser at Roland Garros.
- Cilic has won **2 Challenger-level titles in 2025** – on clay at the Girona Challenger (ESP) (d. Elmer Moller) and on grass at the Nottingham Challenger (GBR) (d. Shintaro Mochizuki). They were the 3rd and 4th Challenger-level titles of his career, with his first 2 titles at Challenger-level both having come in 2007. He also finished runner-up at the Madrid Challenger (ESP) (l. Kamil Majchrzak).
- **Elsewhere on grass this season**, Cilic reached the 2nd round at the Ilkley Challenger (GBR) (d. Paul Jubb, l. Zachary Svajda).
- Cilic has won **3 Tour-level titles on grass** – at Queen's in 2012 (d. David Nalbandian) and 2018 (d. Novak Djokovic) and at 2021 Stuttgart (d. Felix Auger-Aliassime).
- Cilic is bidding to **defeat a Top 5 player on grass for the first time**. He has lost all 9 matches he has contested against Top 5 players on grass – including all 6 matches he has contested against Top 5 players at Wimbledon. The highest-ranked players he has defeated on grass are No. 6 Tomas Berdych in both the quarterfinals at 2013 Queen's and the 3rd round at 2014 Wimbledon, and No. 6 Nishikori, who retired due to a rib injury in the pair's round of 16 match at 2016 Wimbledon.
- Cilic has **won one of the last 19 matches he has contested against Top 5 players**. Since defeating No. 1 Rafael Nadal in the quarterfinals at the 2018 Australian Open, his only victory against a Top 5 player came against No. 2 Daniil Medvedev in the round of 16 at 2022 Roland Garros. He has a 5-20 win-loss record against Top 5 players at the Grand Slams and a 12-66 win-loss record against Top 5 players at Tour-level overall.
- Cilic is in 4th place on the all-time list for **most 5-set matches won at the Grand Slams**. He has a 6-6 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Wimbledon, a 28-15 win-loss record in 5-set matches at the Grand Slams and a 34-20 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.

- Cilic reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 3 in January 2018 following his runner-up finish at the Australian Open. He dropped outside the Top 1000 in January 2024 but re-entered the Top 200 in November and re-entered the Top 100 after winning the title at the Nottingham Challenger last month. He plays here at No. 83.
- Cilic reached the quarterfinals of the boys' singles at 2005 Wimbledon (l. Robin Haase). He finished the year at **No. 2 in the ITF Junior Rankings** behind Donald Young after winning the boys' singles at Roland Garros (d. Antal van der Duim) and also reaching the quarterfinals at the Australian Open and the US Open.
- Cilic became a **Davis Cup** champion after leading Croatia to the title in 2018. He won 6 of the 7 matches he contested during 2018 and defeated Lucas Pouille in the 4th match of the final to seal Croatia's 2nd Davis Cup title. He was also a member of the Croatian team which finished as runners-up to Russian Tennis Federation in 2021. He has a 43-23 win-loss record in the competition and holds the record for most Davis Cup match-wins by a player representing Croatia. Croatia will play at home against France in the 2025 Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Cilic is coached by Vilim Visak.

NO. 6 NOVAK DJOKOVIC (SRB) v (WC) DANIEL EVANS (GBR)

Head-to-head: Evans leads 1-0

A 2nd meeting for Djokovic and Evans, but their first at a Grand Slam or on grass. Evans won their only previous meeting, a straight-sets victory in the 3rd round at 2021 Monte Carlo-1000.

Evans is bidding to become the 10th player to win his first 2 matches against Djokovic – after Guillermo Coria, Roger Federer, Nick Kyrgios, Rafael Nadal, Olivier Rochus, Marat Safin, Alejandro Tabilo, Fernando Verdasco and Jiri Vesely. He would also become the 41st player to record multiple victories against Djokovic.

Djokovic has never lost a Grand Slam match to a player ranked as low as No. 154 Evans. The lowest-ranked player to have defeated Djokovic at a Grand Slam is No. 117 Denis Istomin in the 2nd round at the 2017 Australian Open. The lowest-ranked player to have defeated Djokovic at Wimbledon is No. 75 Marat Safin in the 2nd round in 2008.

Djokovic is facing a British wild card in the 2nd round at Wimbledon for the 2nd consecutive year, having defeated Jacob Fearnley in the 2nd round here in 2024. He has won 16 of the 17 matches he has played against wild cards at the Grand Slams – including all 4 matches he has played against wild cards at Wimbledon. His only defeat to a wild card at the Grand Slams came against Istomin at the 2017 Australian Open.

Evans is bidding to become the 2nd British player to defeat Djokovic at a Grand Slam. Djokovic has a 17-2 win-loss record against British players at the Grand Slams, with both of his defeats coming against Murray – in the finals at the 2012 US Open and 2013 Wimbledon. Djokovic has won his other 5 matches against British players at Wimbledon.

Evans is also bidding to become the 2nd British player to defeat Djokovic on multiple occasions. Djokovic has a 45-13 win-loss record against British players at Tour-level overall – of his 13 defeats, 11 have come against Murray, with one defeat against Evans and one defeat against Kyle Edmund.

Djokovic has won 34 of the 35 matches he has contested against players at their home Grand Slam tournaments – with his only defeat coming against Murray in the final at 2013 Wimbledon. In addition to his 5-1 win-loss record against British players at Wimbledon, he has a 4-0 win-loss record against Australian players at the Australian Open, a 12-0 win-loss record against French players at Roland Garros and a 13-0 win-loss record against American players at the US Open.

- **DJOKOVIC** is bidding to record his 99th Wimbledon match-win and claim sole ownership of 3rd place on the all-time list for most Wimbledon singles matches won, ahead of Serena Williams.

- Djokovic is bidding to reach the 3rd round here for the 19th time and claim sole ownership of the **Open Era record for most appearances in the men's singles 3rd round at Wimbledon**, ahead of Roger Federer.
- Djokovic is also bidding to reach the 3rd round at a Grand Slam for the 74th time and equal Federer's **all-time record for most appearances in the men's singles 3rd round at the Grand Slams**.
- At 38 years 52 days, Djokovic is bidding to become the **10th man in the Open Era to reach the 3rd round at Wimbledon aged 38 or older**. He is the 2nd-oldest man to begin the men's singles main draw here this year – after Gael Monfils (38 years 315 days), who plays Marton Fucsovics in the 2nd round today. By reaching the 2nd round here, Djokovic and Monfils have become the 17th and 18th men in the Open Era to reach the 2nd round at Wimbledon aged 38 or older. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- Djokovic is bidding to reach the 3rd round at a Grand Slam for the 2nd time since turning 38 and become the **10th man in the Open Era to reach the 3rd round at the Grand Slams on multiple occasions after turning 38**. He reached the 3rd round at Roland Garros this year aged 38 years 17 days. (NB Monfils is also bidding to reach the 3rd round at a Grand Slam for the 2nd time since turning 38 here, having reached the 3rd round at the Australian Open this year aged 38 years 147 days)
- Djokovic advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Alexandre Muller 61 67(7) 62 62 in the 1st round on Tuesday.
- Djokovic has **lost in the 2nd round at Wimbledon once before** – in 2008, when he fell to Marat Safin. It remains his earliest defeat at Wimbledon.
- Last year here, Djokovic reached his **10th Wimbledon final**, falling to Carlos Alcaraz in straight sets. On his 9 other appearances in the Wimbledon final, he won the title in 2011 (d. Rafael Nadal), 2014 (d. Federer), 2015 (d. Federer), 2018 (d. Kevin Anderson), 2019 (d. Federer), 2021 (d. Matteo Berrettini) and 2022 (d. Nick Kyrgios) and finished runner-up in 2013 (l. Andy Murray) and 2023 (l. Alcaraz).
- Djokovic is bidding to win his **8th Wimbledon title** and equal Federer's all-time record for the most Wimbledon men's singles titles. He is also bidding to equal Federer and Helen Wills Moody in 2nd place on the list for most Wimbledon singles titles won among men and women, behind 9-time Wimbledon champion Martina Navratilova.
- Djokovic won his **22nd, 23rd and 24th Grand Slam titles in 2023** – he equalled Nadal's all-time record for most Grand Slam men's singles titles at the 2023 Australian Open (d. Stefanos Tsitsipas), claimed sole ownership of the record at 2023 Roland Garros (d. Casper Ruud) and equalled Margaret Court's all-time record for most Grand Slam singles titles among men and women at the 2023 US Open (d. Daniil Medvedev).
- Djokovic is bidding to win his **25th Grand Slam title** and claim sole ownership of the all-time record for most Grand Slam singles titles won among men and women.
- At 38 years 52 days, Djokovic is bidding to become the **oldest player in the Open Era to win a Grand Slam men's singles title**. Ken Rosewall, who won the title at the 1972 Australian Open aged 37 years 62 days, is the only man in the Open Era to win a Grand Slam title aged 37 or older. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- Djokovic is bidding to become the **first player in the Open Era to win multiple Wimbledon titles after turning 35**. In 2022, aged 35 years 49 days, Djokovic became the 2nd player in the Open Era to win the Wimbledon aged 35 or older – after Federer, who won the title here in 2017 aged 35 years 342 days. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- Djokovic is bidding to win his **5th Grand Slam title since turning 35** and extend his Open Era record for most Grand Slam singles titles won aged 35 or older. He is also bidding to win his 13th Grand Slam title since turning 30 and extend his record for most Grand Slam singles titles won after the age of 30 in the Open Era.
- Djokovic is bidding to record his 389th Grand Slam match-win. By defeating Francisco Cerundolo in the round of 16 at 2024 Roland Garros for his 370th Grand Slam match-win, he claimed sole ownership of the **all-time record for most Grand Slam singles matches won among men and women**, ahead of Federer.
- Djokovic has **won 40 of his last 42 matches at Wimbledon and 40 of his last 42 Tour-level matches on grass**, with his only defeats coming against Alcaraz in the finals here in 2023 and 2024. His defeat to Alcaraz in the 2023 final ended a 34-match winning streak at Wimbledon – he had previously not lost here since retiring due to a right elbow injury in his quarterfinal match against Tomas Berdych in 2017. That defeat to Alcaraz also ended a 34-match Tour-level winning streak on grass – he had previously not lost a grass court match since falling to Marin Cilic in the final at 2018 Queen's.

- Djokovic is making his **20th consecutive Wimbledon appearance and contesting his 79th Grand Slam overall**. He is in joint-2nd place on the Open Era list for most Wimbledon men's singles appearances alongside Jimmy Connors and Feliciano Lopez, behind Federer (22 Wimbledon appearances). He is in 3rd place on the Open Era list for most Grand Slam men's singles appearances, behind Federer and Lopez (both 81).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Djokovic reached the semifinals at both the Australian Open, where he retired due to a left leg injury after losing the first set against Alexander Zverev, and Roland Garros (l. Jannik Sinner).
- Djokovic won his **100th Tour-level title** at Geneva in May this year (d. Hubert Hurkacz), becoming the 3rd man in the Open Era to win 100 or more Tour-level titles after Connors (109 Tour-level titles) and Federer (103). He also became the first player to win at least one Tour-level singles title in 20 consecutive seasons (2006-25), claiming sole ownership of the record ahead of Nadal (who won Tour-level singles titles in 19 consecutive seasons from 2004 to 2022).
- Djokovic's **other highlights this season** are finishing runner-up at Miami-1000 (l. Jakub Mensik) and reaching the quarterfinals at Brisbane (l. Reilly Opelka).
- Djokovic **did not contest a grass court tournament prior to Wimbledon this year**. He is one of just 7 men in the Open Era to have won the title here without playing a warm-up event on grass, achieving the feat in 2011, 2014, 2015, 2019, 2021 and 2022. He is one of 12 players in the men's singles who has not competed on grass this season prior to Wimbledon.
- Djokovic is bidding to win his **9th Tour-level title on grass**. In addition to his 7 Wimbledon titles, he also won the title on grass at 2017 Eastbourne (d. Gael Monfils).
- Djokovic has a 10-2 win-loss record in **5-set matches** at Wimbledon, with his only defeats in 5-set matches here coming against Mario Ancic in the round of 16 in 2006 and against Alcaraz in the 2023 final. He has won 11 of the last 12 five-set matches he has contested, with his only defeat in a 5-set match in that time coming against Alcaraz in the 2023 final here. He holds the record for most 5-set matches won at the Grand Slams (38-9) and has a 40-11 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Djokovic **holds the record for most weeks ranked No. 1**, having held the top ranking for a total of 428 weeks. His most-recent spell as world No. 1 in June 2024, when he dropped to No. 3 following his withdrawal from Roland Garros. He plays here at No. 6.
- Djokovic became the **5th player to complete the career 'Golden Slam' in singles** by winning Olympic singles gold for Serbia at the Paris 2024 Olympic Tennis Event, defeating Alcaraz in the final. He joined Andre Agassi, Steffi Graf, Nadal and Serena Williams as the only players to have achieved the feat. He also won Olympic singles bronze at Beijing 2008 and is the only player to have won a medal for Serbia in the Olympic Tennis Event.
- Djokovic has played **Davis Cup** for Serbia since 2004, has a 46-16 win-loss record in the competition and led Serbia to their only title in the competition to date in 2010. Serbia fell to Denmark 2-3 in the 2025 Qualifiers 1st Round and will play at home against Turkiye in a World Group I tie in September.
- Djokovic is currently without a permanent coach.
- Wild card **EVANS** is bidding reach the 3rd round here for the 4th time and equal his best Wimbledon result. This is his 10th Wimbledon appearance and his 33rd Grand Slam overall.
- Evans is bidding to become the **4th British wild card to reach the men's singles 3rd round at Wimbledon since 2000** – after Murray (who achieved the feat in 2005 and 2021), James Ward (2015) and Liam Broady (2022 and 2023). (NB fellow British wild cards Arthur Fery and Jack Pinnington Jones are also bidding to achieve the feat)
- Evans is bidding to become the **7th British player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles 3rd round at Wimbledon on 4 occasions** – after Andy Murray (13 appearances in the 3rd round here), Tim Henman (9), Mark Cox (6), Greg Rusedski (5), Chris Wilkinson (4) and Cameron Norrie (who has reached the 3rd round here for the 4th time this year).
- Aged 35 years 51 days, Evans is bidding to become **the 2nd-oldest British man in the Open Era to reach the 3rd round at Wimbledon** – after Cox, who reached the 3rd round here for the final time aged 36 years 2 days in 1979. He would also become the 3rd British man to reach the 3rd round at a Grand Slam after turning 35 after Cox and Murray, who reached the 3rd round at the Grand Slams on 2 occasions after turning 35. (NB ages calculated at end of the tournament)

- Evans is one of 4 British players competing in the men's singles here today, alongside Jack Draper, Fery and Pinnington Jones. If all 4 British men win today and join Cameron Norrie in the 3rd round here, it will be the **highest number of British men to reach the 3rd round at Wimbledon since 1962**. With 7 British men reaching the 2nd round here, it is the joint-highest number of British men to reach the 2nd round at Wimbledon in the Open Era – there were also 7 British players in the men's singles 2nd round here in 1968, 1969, 1976, 1996 and 1997.

- Evans advanced to the 2nd round after defeating wild card Jay Clarke 61 75 62 in the 1st round on Tuesday. He is the **3rd British man in the Open Era to reach the 2nd round at a Grand Slam aged 35 or older** – after Murray (who made 5 appearances in the 2nd round at the Grand Slams after turning 35) and Cox (4 appearances).
- Evans' **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the 3rd round on 3 occasions – in 2016 (l. Roger Federer), 2019 (l. Joao Sousa) and 2021 (l. Sebastian Korda). Last year here, he fell to Alejandro Tabilo in the 1st round.
- Evans' **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the round of 16 on 2 occasions – at the 2017 Australian Open (l. Jo-Wilfried Tsonga) and at the 2021 US Open (l. Daniil Medvedev).
- In Grand Slam play this year**, Evans reached the 2nd round of qualifying at Roland Garros (d. Billy Harris, l. Clement Tabur) but fell in the 1st round of qualifying at the Australian Open (l. James Kent Trotter). Prior to this season, he had contested the main draw at 23 consecutive Grand Slam tournaments from the 2019 Australian Open through the US Open last year.
- Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Evans reached the quarterfinals as a wild card at Eastbourne, where he defeated Miomir Kecmanovic and Tommy Paul before falling to Jenson Brooksby. He also reached the 2nd round as a qualifier at 's-Hertogenbosch (d. Rinky Hijikata, l. Ugo Humbert) and as a wild card at Queen's (d. Frances Tiafoe, l. Brandon Nakashima).
- Evans is bidding to record his **6th Tour-level match-win of 2025**. His only match-wins at Tour-level this season have come during the grass court season. His only other Tour-level appearance in 2025 came as a wild card at Dubai, where he fell to Karen Khachanov in the 1st round.
- Evans has **competed mainly at Challenger-level in 2025**. His best result is reaching the quarterfinals at the Barletta Challenger (ITA), where he defeated Jelle Sels and Jacopo Berrettini before falling to Vitaliy Sachko.

- Evans is bidding to **defeat a Top 10 player on grass for the first time**. He has lost all 4 matches he has contested against Top 10 players on grass – including his only previous match against a Top 10 player at Wimbledon, against No. 3 Federer in the 3rd round here in 2016. The highest-ranked players he has defeated on grass are No. 13 Tiafoe and No. 13 Paul at Queen's and Eastbourne, respectively, this year. The highest-ranked player he has defeated at Wimbledon is No. 16 Nikoloz Basilashvili in the 2nd round in 2019.
- Evans is bidding to **defeat a Top 10 player at a Grand Slam for the 2nd time**. He has a 1-9 win-loss record against Top 10 players at the Grand Slams with his only victory coming against No. 7 Marin Cilic in the 2nd round at the 2017 Australian Open. He has a 6-31 win-loss record against Top 10 players at Tour-level overall.
- Evans lost the only **5-set match** he has contested at Wimbledon – against Sousa in the 3rd round in 2019. He has a 5-6 win-loss record in 5-set matches overall.
- Evans reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 21 in August 2023. He dropped outside the Top 100 for the first time since March 2019 in August last year and plays here at No. 154.
- Evans has played **Davis Cup** for Great Britain since 2009 and has an 18-24 overall win-loss record in the competition. Great Britain will play away against Poland in a 2025 World Group I tie in September.
- Evans is coached by Germain Gigounon.

- **SHELTON** is bidding to reach the 3rd round here for the 2nd straight year. This is his 3rd Wimbledon appearance and his 12th Grand Slam overall.
- Shelton advanced to the 2nd round after defeating qualifier Alex Bolt 64 76(1) 76(4) in the 1st round on Tuesday.
- Last year here, Shelton recorded his **best Wimbledon result** by reaching the round of 16. He recorded 3 consecutive 5-set victories against Mattia Bellucci, Lloyd Harris and Denis Shapovalov, before falling to Jannik Sinner in straight sets. In his only other appearance here, in 2023, he reached the 2nd round (d. Taro Daniel, l. Laslo Djere).
- Shelton's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the semifinals on 2 occasions – at the 2023 US Open (l. Novak Djokovic) and at the 2025 Australian Open (l. Sinner).
- **Elsewhere at the Grand Slams this year**, Shelton reached the round of 16 at Roland Garros (l. Carlos Alcaraz).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Shelton reached the semifinals at Stuttgart (l. Alexander Zverev) but lost his opening match at both Queen's (l. Arthur Rinderknech) and Mallorca (l. Learner Tien).
- Shelton's **best result in 2025** is finishing runner-up at Munich (l. Zverev). He also reached the quarterfinals at Indian Wells-1000 (l. Jack Draper).

- Shelton has won all 4 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon. He recorded a 5-set victory against Daniel in the 1st round in 2023, before recording 5-set victories against Bellucci, Harris and Shapovalov in the opening 3 rounds here last year. He has a 7-3 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Shelton **broke the Top 10, at No. 10, for the first time** after reaching the semifinals at Stuttgart last month. He plays here at the same ranking.
- Shelton is one of **10 American men** to reach the 2nd round from the 16 who began the men's singles draw here this year. USA had the most players and most seeded players in the men's singles at Wimbledon this year.
- Shelton **played college tennis**. He represented the University of Florida for 2 seasons, compiling a 65-10 win-loss record in singles and winning the 2021 NCAA team title and the 2022 NCAA singles title.
- Shelton **contested just 4 tournaments as a junior player**, all of which came in his home country. His best result was reaching the 3rd round as a wild card at 2020 JA Plantation (USA) (also known as the Orange Bowl), falling to Jack Pinnington Jones.
- Shelton made his **Davis Cup** debut for USA at the 2024 Final 8 Knockout Stage. He lost both matches he contested at the event, falling to Thanasi Kokkinakis in singles and to Matthew Ebden/Jordan Thompson alongside Tommy Paul in doubles. USA will play at home against Czechia in the 2025 Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Shelton's father, Bryan Shelton, reached a career-high ranking of No. 55 in March 1992. He made 6 appearances at Wimbledon, reaching the round of 16 in 1994.
- Shelton is coached by his father, Bryan Shelton, and Dean Goldfine.
- **HIJIKATA** is bidding to reach the 3rd round here at a Grand Slam for the 2nd time. This is his 2nd Wimbledon appearance and 10th Grand Slam overall.
- Hijikata advanced to the 2nd round after defeating David Goffin 63 61 61 for his **first Wimbledon match-win** in the 1st round on Tuesday.
- **Last year here**, on his Wimbledon main draw debut, Hijikata fell to Flavio Cobolli in the 1st round.
- Hijikata's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the round of 16 as a wild card at the 2023 US Open. He defeated Pavel Kotov, Marton Fucsovics and Zhizhen Zhang before falling to Frances Tiafoe.
- **At the Grand Slams this year**, Hijikata fell in the 1st round at both the Australian Open (l. Mitchell Krueger) and Roland Garros (l. Reilly Opelka).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Hijikata fell in the 1st round at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Daniel Evans) and as a wild card at Mallorca (l. Bernard Tomic). He also reached the semifinals at the Birmingham Challenger (GBR) (l. Colton Smith).
- Hijikata's **best Tour-level result in 2025** is reaching the quarterfinals as a lucky loser at Adelaide, where he defeated David Goffin and Brandon Nakashima before falling to Tommy Paul. He has not won consecutive matches at Tour-level since Adelaide.
- Hijikata is bidding to record his **7th Tour-level match-win in 2025**. In addition to his 2 victories in his quarterfinal finish at Adelaide, his 3 Tour-level victories prior to this tournament came in 2nd round finishes at Dallas (d. Adrian Mannarino, l. Tomas Machac), Indian Wells-1000 (d. Alexander Shevchenko, l. Nakashima) and Miami-1000 (d. Hamad Medjedovic, l. Novak Djokovic). His victory in the 1st round here ended a 7-match Tour-level losing streak.
- Hijikata has also contested **4 Challenger-level events in 2025**. His best results at Challenger-level are reaching the semifinals at the Bordeaux Challenger (FRA) (l. Giovanni Mpetshi Perricard) and the Birmingham Challenger (GBR).
- Hijikata is bidding to **defeat a Top 10 player for the first time**. He has lost all 11 matches he has played against Top 10 players – including all 4 matches he has played against Top 10 players at the Grand Slams. The highest-ranked player he has defeated is No. 28 Frances Tiafoe in the 1st round at 2024 Queen's, when Tiafoe retired due to a right hip injury. The highest-ranked player he has defeated at the Grand Slams is No. 57 Fucsovics in the 2nd round at the 2023 US Open.
- Hijikata has won one of the 2 **five-set matches** he has contested. He defeated Yannick Hanfmann in 5 sets in the 1st round at the 2023 Australian Open but fell to Jan-Lennard Struff in 5 sets in the 1st round at the 2024 Australian Open.

- Hijikata reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 62 in August 2024. He plays here at No. 87.
- Hijikata **won the 2023 Australian Open men's doubles title** alongside Jason Kubler as a wild card team, defeating Hugo Nys/Jan Zielinski in the final. It was the pair's first event as a team at any level. They also became the 2nd all-Australian men's doubles champions at the Australian Open in consecutive years after Thanasi Kokkinakis/Nick Kyrgios in 2022.
- Hijikata **played college tennis**. He represented the University of North Carolina in 2019-21, earning All-American honours as a sophomore in 2021.
- Hijikata was a **good junior**. He reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 9 in December 2019, and reached the quarterfinals of the boys' singles as a wild card at the 2018 Australian Open (l. Aidan McHugh). He fell in the 1st round on both his appearances in the boys' singles here – in 2018 (l. Nicolas Alvarez Varona) and 2019 (l. Govind Nanda).
- Hijikata is coached by Mark Draper.

NO. 11 ALEX DE MINAUR (AUS) v (Q) ARTHUR CAZAUX (FRA)

Head-to-head: first meeting

De Minaur has never lost a Grand Slam match to a player ranked as low as No. 115 Cazaux. The lowest-ranked player to have defeated De Minaur at a Grand Slam is No. 110 Marco Cecchinato in the 1st round at 2020 Roland Garros. The lowest-ranked player to have defeated De Minaur at Wimbledon is No. 41 Steve Johnson in the 2nd round in 2019.

De Minaur won the only match he has played against a qualifier at Wimbledon – against Kimmer Coppejans in the 1st round in 2023. He has a 7-1 win-loss record against qualifiers at the Grand Slams, with his only defeat coming against Cecchinato in the 1st round at 2020 Roland Garros. He has a 31-13 win-loss record against qualifiers at Tour-level overall and is bidding to extend an 11-match winning streak against qualifiers, having not lost to a qualifier since falling to Aslan Karatsev in the 3rd round at 2023 Madrid-1000.

Cazaux is facing an Australian player in a 2nd consecutive match after defeating Adam Walton in the 1st round. He has won 2 of the 3 matches he has played against Australian players at Tour-level – he also defeated Walton in the 1st round at Adelaide this year but fell to Rinky Hijikata in the 2nd round at 2024 Winston-Salem.

- **DE MINAUR** is bidding to reach the 3rd round here for the 4th time. This is his 7th Wimbledon appearance and his 32nd Grand Slam overall.
- De Minaur advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Roberto Carballes Baena 62 62 76(2) in the 1st round on Tuesday.
- Last year here, De Minaur recorded his **best Wimbledon result** by reaching the quarterfinals. He gave a walkover to Novak Djokovic due to a hip injury.
- De Minaur's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the quarterfinals on 5 occasions. In addition to his quarterfinal finish here last year, he has also reached the quarterfinals at the US Open in 2020 (l. Dominic Thiem) and 2024 (l. Jack Draper), at 2024 Roland Garros (l. Alexander Zverev) and at the 2025 Australian Open (l. Jannik Sinner). By reaching the quarterfinals at the Australian Open this year, he became the 55th player in the Open Era – and the 12th active player – to reach the men's singles quarterfinals at all 4 Grand Slam tournaments.
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, De Minaur reached the 2nd round at Roland Garros, where he defeated Laslo Djere before falling to Alexander Bublik in 5 sets despite leading 2-0.
- De Minaur's **best result in 2025** is finishing runner-up at Rotterdam (l. Carlos Alcaraz). He also reached the semifinals at Monte Carlo-1000 (l. Lorenzo Musetti) and the quarterfinals at Doha (l. Andrey Rublev) and Barcelona (l. Alcaraz).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, De Minaur fell in the 1st round at Queen's (l. Jiri Lehecka).
- De Minaur has **won 2 Tour-level titles on grass** – at 2021 Eastbourne (d. Lorenzo Sonego) and 2024 's-Hertogenbosch (d. Sebastian Korda). He is one of 9 players who began the men's singles draw here this year to have won multiple Tour-level titles on grass.

- De Minaur has lost both **5-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon – falling to Steve Johnson in 5 sets in the 2nd round in 2019 and to Cristian Garin in the round of 16 in 2022. He has a 3-7 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- De Minaur **broke the Top 10 for the first time** in January 2024 and reached a career-high ranking of No. 6 in July last year following his quarterfinal finish at Wimbledon. He plays here at No. 11.
- De Minaur is a **former Wimbledon boys' singles finalist**. He reached the boys' singles final here in 2016 (l. Denis Shapovalov). He reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 2 in February 2016 and also reached the semifinals of the boys' singles at the 2015 US Open (l. Tommy Paul) and the 2016 Australian Open (l. Jurabek Karimov).
- De Minaur led Australia to **back-to-back Davis Cup finals in 2022-23**, the team's first appearances in the Davis Cup final since 2003. The team finished as runners-up to Canada in 2022 and to Italy in 2023. De Minaur won 10 out of 13 Davis Cup matches he contested in 2022-23 and has a 16-10 win-loss record in the competition overall. Australia will play at home against Belgium in the 2025 Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- De Minaur is coached by Adolfo Gutierrez.
- Qualifier **CAZAUX** is bidding to reach the 3rd round here for the first time. This is his 2nd Wimbledon appearance and 10th Grand Slam overall.
- Cazaux is one of 3 qualifiers competing in the men's singles 2nd round today. If at least 2 qualifiers win today and join fellow qualifiers Nicolas Jarry and Adrian Mannarino in the 3rd round here, it will be the **highest number of qualifiers to reach the men's singles 3rd round at Wimbledon since 2000**.

- Cazaux advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Adam Walton 63 76(6) 46 67(5) 61 in the 1st round on Tuesday. He has **won both 5-set matches he has played at Wimbledon**, having also defeated Zizou Bergs in 5 sets in the 1st round last year. He has a 4-1 win-loss record in 5-set matches overall.
- As No. 7 seed in **Wimbledon qualifying last week**, Cazaux defeated Ignacio Buse (PER) 62 67(11) 61, Ugo Blanchet (FRA) 75 64, and No. 26 seed Dusan Lajovic (SRB) 67(6) 62 63 64. It was the first time he successfully qualified at Wimbledon on his 2nd attempt, and the first time he successfully qualified at a Grand Slam on his 4th attempt.
- By reaching the 2nd round here, Cazaux has equalled his **best Wimbledon result**. He also reached the 2nd round on his debut here last year (d. Bergs, l. Alexander Bublik).
- Cazaux **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the round of 16 as a wild card at the 2024 Australian Open. - Last year here, Paul recorded his **best Wimbledon result** by reaching the quarterfinals. As No. 12 seed, he defeated Pedro Martinez, Otto Virtanen, Alexander Bublik and Roberto Bautista Agut before falling to Carlos Alcaraz.
- Paul's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the semifinals at the 2023 Australian Open (l. Novak Djokovic).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Paul reached the quarterfinals at both the Australian Open (l. Alexander Zverev) and Roland Garros (l. Alcaraz).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Paul fell to Daniel Evans in his opening match at Eastbourne. He withdrew from Queen's, where he was defending champion, due to an abdominal injury.

- Paul made his **Davis Cup** debut in 2020 for USA and has a 5-5 win-loss record in the competition. USA host Czechia in the 2025 Qualifiers 2nd Round at Delray Beach on 12-13 September.
- Paul is coached by Brad Stine and Hugo Armando.
- **OFNER** is bidding to record his 50th Tour-level match-win.
- Ofner is bidding to reach the 3rd round here for the 2nd time become **the 5th Austrian player in history to reach the men's singles 3rd round at Wimbledon on multiple occasions** – after Jurgen Melzer (who made 6 appearances in the 3rd round here), Franz-Wilhelm Matejka (3), and Hans Redl and Freddie Huber (both 2).
- Ofner advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Hamad Medjedovic for his **first Wimbledon match-win since 2017** in the 1st round on Tuesday. He was leading 76(8) 3-1 when Medjedovic retired due to injury. This is his 3rd Wimbledon appearance and 10th Grand Slam appearance overall.

Berdych is the only Czech man to reach the 3rd round here as a teenager in the Open Era. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- Mensik advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Hugo Gaston 61 46 62 62 for his **first Wimbledon match-win** in the 1st round on Tuesday.
- **Last year here**, on his Wimbledon main draw debut, Mensik fell to No. 23 seed Alexander Bublik in 5 sets in the 1st round, despite holding a 2-0 lead. It is the only time he has lost in the 1st round on his 6 previous appearances at the Grand Slams.
- Mensik's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the 3rd round on 3 occasions – at the US Open as a qualifier on his Grand Slam debut in 2023 (l. Taylor Fritz) and as a direct acceptance in 2024 (l. Nuno Borges), and as a direct acceptance at the 2025 Australian Open (l. Alejandro Davidovich Fokina).
- **Elsewhere at the Grand Slams in 2025**, Mensik reached the 2nd round at Roland Garros, where he defeated Alexandre Muller before falling to Henrique Rocha in 5 sets despite holding a 2-0 lead.
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Mensik reached the quarterfinals at Eastbourne, where he received a bye through the 1st round and defeated Reilly Opelka in the 2nd round before falling to Davidovich Fokina. He also reached the 2nd round at Queen's (d. Cameron Norrie, l. Roberto Bautista Agut).
- Mensik's best result in 2025 was winning his **first Tour-level title** at Miami-1000 (d. Novak Djokovic). Aged 19 years 210 days, he became the 2nd-youngest men's singles champion in tournament history – after Carlos Alcaraz, who won the title aged 18 years 333 days in 2022. He also became the first Czech player to win a Masters-1000 singles title since Berdych won the title at 2005 Paris.
- Mensik's **other highlights in 2025** are reaching the quarterfinals at Brisbane (l. Giovanni Mpetshi Perricard), Auckland (l. Borges) and Madrid-1000 (l. Francisco Cerundolo) and the round of 16 at Rome-1000 (l. Hubert Hurkacz).
- Mensik has won one of the 6 **five-set matches** he has contested, with his only victory in a 5-set match coming when he recovered from 0-2 down to defeat Tristan Schoolkate in the 2nd round at the 2024 US Open. He has lost 3 matches from 2-0 up – against Bublik in the 1st round here last year, against Davidovich Fokina in the 3rd round at the 2025 Australian Open and against Rocha in the 2nd round at 2025 Roland Garros.
- Mensik reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 17 in June this year. He plays here at the same ranking.

- Mensik had a **successful junior career**. He reached the 2022 Australian Open boys' singles final, falling to Bruno Kuzuhara in 3 sets, becoming the 2nd Czech player to reach the boys' singles final at the Australian Open after 2011 junior champion Jiri Vesely. He reached the 2nd round of the boys' singles in his only appearance as a junior here in 2022 (d. Henry Searle, l. Pedro Rodenas). He reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 2 in April 2022.
- Mensik made his **Davis Cup** debut for Czechia in 2023 and has a 6-4 overall win-loss record in the competition. Czechia will play away against USA in the 2025 Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Mensik is coached by Tomas Josefus.
- **GIRON** is bidding to reach the 3rd round here for the first time and equal his best Grand Slam result. This is his 6th Wimbledon appearance and his 25th Grand Slam overall.
- Giron advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Camilo Ugo Carabelli 76(6) 76(4) 63 in the 1st round on Tuesday.
- By reaching the 2nd round here, Giron has equalled his **best Wimbledon result**. He also reached the 2nd round here in 2021 (d. Emil Ruusuvuori, l. Hubert Hurkacz), 2022 (d. Holger Rune, l. Alex Molcan), 2023 (d. Hugo Dellien, l. Marton Fucsovics) and 2024 (d. Henry Searle, l. Alexander Zverev).
- Giron's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the 3rd round on 3 occasions – at Roland Garros in 2021 (l. Cristian Garin) and 2023 (l. Nicolas Jarry), and at the Australian Open this year (l. Jannik Sinner).
- **Elsewhere at the Grand Slams in 2025**, Giron fell in the 1st round at Roland Garros (l. Tallon Griekspoor).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Giron reached the quarterfinals at Eastbourne, where he defeated Luciano Darderi and Jacob Fearnley before falling to Taylor Fritz. He fell in the 1st round at Halle (l. Zverev).
- Giron's **best results in 2025** are reaching the quarterfinals at Adelaide (l. Felix Auger-Aliassime), Delray Beach (l. Miomir Kecmanovic), Acapulco (l. Denis Shapovalov) and Eastbourne, and the round of 16 at Indian Wells-1000 (l. Arthur Fils).
- Giron has won **one Tour-level title** – on grass at Newport last year (d. Alex Michelsen). He is one of 23 players who began the men's singles here this year to have won a Tour-level title on grass.
- Giron is bidding to **defeat a Top 20 player at a Grand Slam for the 2nd time**. He has a 1-8 win-loss record against Top 20 players at the Grand Slams, with his only victory coming against No. 17 Grigor Dimitrov in the 1st round at 2021 Roland Garros when Dimitrov retired due to a lower back injury. He has lost both matches he has contested against Top 20 players at Wimbledon – to No. 18 Hurkacz in the 2nd round in 2021 and No. 4 Zverev in the 2nd round last year. He has a 17-44 win-loss record against Top 20 players at Tour-level overall.
- Giron has won 4 of the 5 **five-set matches** he has contested – including the only 5-set match he has contested at Wimbledon, against Ruusuvuori in the 1st round in 2021. His only defeat in a 5-set match came against Jack Draper in the 1st round at the 2024 Australian Open.
- Giron played **college tennis**. He represented UCLA between 2012 and 2014, winning the 2014 NCAA singles championship title before turning professional.
- Giron reached a **career-high junior ranking** of No. 18 and won the title at the 2011 Easter Bowl (d. Mac Styslinger). He reached the 3rd round on his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2011 (l. Jason Kubler).
- Giron made his **Davis Cup** debut during USA's Qualifiers 1st Round victory against Chinese Taipei in February, defeating Tseng Chun Hsin in the only match he contested during the tie. USA will play at home against Czechia in the 2025 Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Giron is coached by Maxime Tabatruong and Karue Sell.

NO. 19 GRIGOR DIMITROV (BUL) v CORENTIN MOUTET (FRA)

A 3rd meeting for Dimitrov and Moutet. Their first meeting came in the 1st round here in 2019, when Moutet recovered from 0-2 down to defeat Dimitrov in 5 sets – a victory which remains Moutet's only successful comeback from 0-2 down to date.

Dimitrov is facing a lefthanded player for the 2nd consecutive match, having defeated Yoshihito Nishioka in the 1st round here. He has won 5 of the 6 matches he has played against lefthanders at Wimbledon. His only defeat to a lefthanded player here came against Moutet in the 1st round in 2019. He has a 10-4 win-loss record against lefthanders at the Grand Slams and a 69-38 win-loss record against lefthanders at Tour-level overall.

- **DIMITROV** is bidding to reach the 3rd round here for the 7th time. This is his 15th Wimbledon appearance and his 59th Grand Slam appearance overall.
- Dimitrov advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Yoshihito Nishioka 62 63 64 in the 1st round on Tuesday.
- **Last year here**, Dimitrov reached the round of 16, where he retired against Daniil Medvedev due to a knee injury.
- Dimitrov's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the semifinals on 3 occasions – including once at Wimbledon, in 2014 (l. Novak Djokovic). He also reached the semifinals at the 2017 Australian Open (l. Rafael Nadal) and the 2019 US Open (l. Daniil Medvedev).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Dimitrov retired against Francesco Passaro due to a hip injury in the 1st round at the Australian Open and retired against Ethan Quinn due to a left thigh injury in the 1st round at Roland Garros. He has retired at the last 4 Grand Slam tournaments, having also retired against Medvedev in the round of 16 here last year due to a knee injury and against Frances Tiafoe in the quarterfinals at the US Open last year due to a groin injury.
- Dimitrov is contesting his **58th consecutive Grand Slam tournament** here this year. It is the longest active streak of Grand Slam men's singles appearances and the 5th-longest streak of Grand Slam men's singles appearances in history. He has contested the main draw at every Grand Slam tournament since the 2011 Australian Open.

- Dimitrov reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 3 after winning the title at the 2017 ATP Finals (d. David Goffin). He plays here at No. 21.
- Dimitrov is **one of 9 former Wimbledon boys' singles champions** to begin the men's main draw here this year. He won the boys' singles titles here (d. Henri Kontinen) and at the US Open (d. Devin Britton) in 2008 and finished the year at No. 3 in the ITF Junior Rankings.
- Dimitrov is coached by Daniel Vallverdu and Jamie Delgado.
- Lefthander **MOUTET** is bidding to reach the 3rd round here for the first time. This is his 4th Wimbledon appearance and his 25th Grand Slam overall.
- Moutet advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Francisco Comesana 64 64 62 in the 1st round on Tuesday.
- By reaching the 2nd round here, Moutet has equalled his **best Wimbledon result**. He has reached the 2nd round here twice before – as a qualifier on his debut here in 2019 (d. Dimitrov, I. Felix Auger-Aliassime) and as a direct acceptance in 2023 (d. Richard Gasquet, I. Roman Safiullin). He missed the event last year due to a wrist injury.
- Moutet's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the round of 16 on 2 occasions – as a lucky loser at the 2022 US Open (I. Casper Ruud), when he became the 10th lucky loser in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam, and as a direct acceptance at 2024 Roland Garros (I. Jannik Sinner).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Moutet reached the 3rd round at the Australian Open, where he defeated Alexei Popyrin and Mitchell Krueger before falling to Learner Tien, and the 2nd round at Roland Garros (d. Clement Tabur, I. Novak Djokovic).
- Moutet's best result in 2025 is reaching his **2nd Tour-level final** – on grass at Mallorca last week (I. Tallon Griekspoor). He also reached the round of 16 at Rome-1000 (I. Jack Draper).

- Moutet won the only **5-set match** he has contested at Wimbledon – against Dimitrov in the 1st round here in 2019, when he recorded his only successful comeback from 0-2 down to date. He has a 3-3 win-loss record in 5-set matches overall.
- Moutet reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 51 in November 2022. He plays here at No. 69.
- Moutet was a **good junior**. He reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 7 in August 2017, having reached the semifinals of the boys' singles at both the Australian Open (I. Zsombor Piros) and Wimbledon (I. Axel Geller) that year.
- Moutet is coached by Hugo Guerriero.

NO. 21 TOMAS MACHAC (CZE) v (Q) AUGUST HOLMGREN (DEN)

Head-to-head: first meeting

Machac has lost Tour-level matches to players ranked as low as No. 192 Holmgren twice before – when he retired due to illness against No. 213 Beibit Zhukayev in the 2nd round at 2024 Almaty and when he retired due to illness against No. 349 Yosuke Watanuki in the 2nd round at 2025 Indian Wells-1000. The lowest-ranked player to have defeated Machac at a Grand Slam is No. 70 Maxime Cressy in the 2nd round at the 2022 Australian Open.

Machac won his only previous match against a qualifier at a Grand Slam – against Mario Vilella Martinez, who retired due to a back injury during their 1st round match at the 2021 Australian Open. He has a 7-5 win-loss record against qualifiers at Tour-level overall.

- **MACHAC** is bidding to reach the 3rd round here for the first time. This is his 3rd Wimbledon appearance and his 13th Grand Slam overall.
- Machac advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Damir Dzumhur 63 62 64 in the 1st round on Tuesday.
- By reaching the 2nd round here, Machac has equalled his **best Wimbledon result**. He also reached the 2nd round here last year (d. David Goffin, I. Roman Safiullin). He fell in the 1st round on his only other appearance here, as a qualifier in 2023 (I. Cameron Norrie).
- Machac's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the round of 16 at the US Open last year. He defeated Fabio Fognini, Sebastian Korda and David Goffin before falling to Jack Draper.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Machac reached the 3rd round at the Australian Open, defeating Sumit Nagal and Reilly Opelka before falling to Novak Djokovic. He fell in the 1st round at Roland Garros, retiring against Quentin Halys due to a lower back injury.
- Machac's best result in 2025 is winning his **first Tour-level title** at Acapulco (d. Alejandro Davidovich Fokina). He also reached the quarterfinals at Dallas (I. Denis Shapovalov) and on grass at Halle (I. Alexander Bublik).
- Machac is bidding to record his **5th Tour-level match-win on grass**. His only Tour-level victories on grass prior to Wimbledon this year came in his 2nd round finish here in 2024 and his quarterfinal finish at Halle last month, where he defeated Jesper de Jong and Fabian Marozsan before falling to Bublik.
- Machac won the only **5-set match** he has contested at Wimbledon – he recorded his only successful recovery from 0-2 down to date against Goffin in the 1st round here last year. He has a 3-2 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Machac reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 20 in March this year. He plays here at No. 23.
- Machac **won the mixed doubles gold medal at the Paris 2024 Olympic Tennis Event**. He partnered Katerina Siniakova to victory over China, P.R.'s Wang Xinyu/Zhang Zhizhen in the final to win Czechia's 2nd gold medal at the Olympic Tennis Event (after Siniakova and Barbora Krejčíková won women's doubles gold at Tokyo 2020). He also reached the semifinals alongside Adam Pavlasek in men's doubles but fell to USA's Austin Krajicek/Rajeev Ram in the semifinals and to USA's Fritz/Tommy Paul in the bronze medal match.

- Machac reached a **career-high junior ranking** of No. 16 in January 2018. He lost in the 1st round on his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2017 (l. Hamish Stewart).
- Machac made his **Davis Cup** debut for Czechia at the 2021 Davis Cup Finals and has an 11-8 overall win-loss record in the competition. Czechia will play away against USA in the 2025 Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Machac is coached by Daniel Vacek.
- Qualifier **HOLMGREN** is bidding to become the 2nd Danish man in the Open Era to reach the 3rd round on his Grand Slam debut – after Kenneth Carlsen, who reached the 3rd round on his Grand Slam debut at the 1993 Australian Open.
- Holmgren is bidding to become the **5th Danish man in the Open Era to reach the 3rd round at Wimbledon** – after Torben Ulrich (who reached the 3rd round here in 1968 and 1970), Jan Leschly (1969), Carlsen (1993, 1994 and 2004) and Holger Rune (2023 and 2024).
- Holmgren is one of 3 qualifiers competing in the men's singles 2nd round today. If at least 2 qualifiers win today and join fellow qualifiers Nicolas Jarry and Adrian Mannarino in the 3rd round here, it will be the **highest number of qualifiers to reach the men's singles 3rd round at Wimbledon since 2000**.

- Holmgren advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Quentin Halys 76(4) 63 64 for his **first Grand Slam match-win** in the 1st round on Tuesday.
- Holmgren defeated wild card Giles Hussey (GBR) 46 63 75, Mikhail Kukushkin (KAZ) 46 76(4) 62 and Yosuke Watanuki (JPN) 64 67(2) 36 76(11) 76(7) in the 3 rounds of **Wimbledon qualifying last week**. It was his first appearance in qualifying at Wimbledon and his 3rd appearance in qualifying at a Grand Slam. He saved 3 match points in his 5-set victory against Watanuki, the only 5-set match he has contested at any level.
- Holmgren's **only previous appearances in Grand Slam** qualifying draws both came in 2025. He reached the 2nd round of qualifying at both the Australian Open (d. Hayden Jones, l. Jozef Kovalik) and Roland Garros (d. Murphy Cassone, l. Thiago Tirante) this year.
- Holmgren is contesting his **2nd grass court event, at any level**, at 2025 Wimbledon. His only previous appearance on grass as a professional came in qualifying at the Nottingham 2 Challenger (GBR) last month, where he fell to Ugo Blanchet in the 1st round of qualifying.
- Holmgren is bidding to record his **9th Tour-level match-win**. Prior to this tournament, all 7 of his Tour-level victories had come in Davis Cup ties. His only Tour-level appearance away from Davis Cup prior to this tournament came as a lucky loser at 2021 San Diego, where he fell to Grigor Dimitrov in his opening match.
- Holmgren is bidding to **record back-to-back main draw victories, at any level, for the first time this season**. His only back-to-back victories so far this year came in qualifying here last week. Prior to competing in qualifying here, he had recorded just 6 match-wins at all levels and not advanced beyond the 2nd round at any event.
- Holmgren plays mainly at Challenger-level. He won his **first 2 Challenger titles in 2024** – at the Pozoblanco Challenger (ESP) (d. Antoine Escoffier) and the Porto 1 Challenger (POR) (d. Alejandro Moro Canas).
- Holmgren is bidding to **defeat a Top 50 player for the 2nd time**. He has a 1-1 win-loss record against Top 50 players – he fell to No. 29 Dimitrov at 2021 San Diego but defeated No. 46 Halys in the 1st round here on Tuesday.
- Holmgren broke the Top 200 for the first time in August 2024 and reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 163 the same month. He plays here at No. 192.

- Holmgren **played college tennis** at University of San Diego from 2017 to 2022. He finished runner-up at the 2022 NCAA Singles Championship.
- Holmgren has played **Davis Cup** for Denmark since 2017 and has a 9-3 overall win-loss record in the competition. Denmark will play away against Spain in the 2025 Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Holmgren is coached by Jonas Svendsen and Ryan Keckley.

NO. 22 FLAVIO COBOLLI (ITA) v (WC) JACK PINNINGTON JONES (GBR)

Head-to-head: first meeting

Cobolli has lost a Tour-level match to a player ranked as low as No. 281 Pinnington Jones once before – to No. 644 Rafael Nadal in the 1st round at 2024 Barcelona. The lowest-ranked player to have defeated Cobolli at a Grand Slam is No. 38 Tomas Martin Etcheverry in the 1st round at the Australian Open this year.

Cobolli is facing a British player at Wimbledon for the first time. He has a 1-3 win-loss record against British players at Tour-level, with 3 of his matches against British players having come on grass – at 2024 Eastbourne, when he defeated Giles Hussey in the 2nd round before falling to Billy Harris in the quarterfinals, and at Eastbourne this year, when he fell to Jacob Fearnley in the 1st round. His other match against a British player came against Cameron Norrie, to whom he lost in the 2nd round at 2024 Miami-1000.

Cobolli is facing a wild card at a Grand Slam for the first time. He has a 5-2 win-loss record against wild cards at Tour-level, with his 2 defeats coming against Harris in the quarterfinals at 2024 Eastbourne and against Luca Nardi in the 1st round at Rome-1000 this year.

This is the 29th men's singles match between a British player and an Italian player at Wimbledon in the Open Era – and the 3rd this year, after Mattia Bellucci defeated Oliver Crawford in the 1st round on Tuesday and Arthur Fery's 2nd round match against Luciano Darderi, which began on Wednesday and will conclude today. British players lead Italian players 14-13 in previous men's singles matches at Wimbledon in the Open Era.

Fery's match against Darderi and Pinnington Jones' match against Cobolli are the 60th and 61st men's singles match between a British player and an Italian player at the Grand Slams in the Open Era. British players lead Italian players 31-28 in the 59 previous Open Era men's singles matches at the majors – in addition to the 28 previous matches at Wimbledon, there have been 16 matches at Roland Garros (British players lead 9-7), 9 matches at the Australian Open (British players lead 5-4) and 7 matches at the US Open (Italian players lead 4-3).

- **COBOLLI** is bidding to reach the 3rd round here for the first time and equal his best Grand Slam result. This is his 2nd Wimbledon appearance and his 8th Grand Slam overall.
- Cobolli advanced to the 2nd round after defeating qualifier Beibit Zhukayev 63 76(7) 61 in the 1st round on Tuesday.
- **Last year here**, on his Wimbledon main draw debut, Cobolli reached the 2nd round (d. Rinky Hijikata, l. Alejandro Tabilo).
- Cobolli's best **Grand Slam result** is reaching the 3rd round on 3 occasions – as a qualifier at the 2024 Australian Open (l. Alex de Minaur), and as a direct acceptance at both the 2024 US Open (l. Daniil Medvedev) and Roland Garros this year (l. Alexander Zverev).
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Cobolli fell in the 1st round at the Australian Open (l. Tomas Martin Etcheverry).

- Cobolli's best results in 2025 are winning his **first 2 Tour-level titles** – at Bucharest (d. Sebastian Baez) and Hamburg (d. Andrey Rublev). His victories en route to the title at Bucharest ended an 8-match Tour-level losing streak – he had not previously recorded Tour-level match-wins since winning 2 of the 3 singles matches he contested at the United Cup in January.
- Cobolli reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 24 last month. He plays here at the same ranking.
- Cobolli has won one of the 3 **five-set matches** he has contested, with his only victory in a 5-set match coming against Nicolas Jarry in the 1st round at the 2024 Australian Open. His 2 defeats in 5-set matches also came in 2024 – to Holger Rune in the 2nd round at Roland Garros and to Tabilo in the 2nd round at Wimbledon.
- Cobolli was a **good junior**. He reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 8 in January 2020, and finished his junior career by winning the boys' doubles title at 2020 Roland Garros alongside Dominic Stricker. He reached the 2nd round in his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2019 (d. Sergey Fomin, I. Filip Cristian Jianu).
- Cobolli is coached by his father, Stefano Cobolli.
- Wild card **PINNINGTON JONES** is bidding to become the 3rd British man in the Open Era to reach the 3rd round on his Grand Slam debut – after Luke Milligan at 1996 Wimbledon and Andy Murray at 2005 Wimbledon.
- Pinnington Jones is bidding to become the **4th British wild card to reach the men's singles 3rd round at Wimbledon since 2000** – after Murray (who achieved the feat in 2005 and 2021), James Ward (2015) and Liam Broady (2022 and 2023). (NB fellow British wild cards Daniel Evans and Arthur Fery are also bidding to achieve the feat)
- Pinnington Jones is one of 4 British players competing in the men's singles here today, alongside Jack Draper, Evans and Fery. If all 4 British men win today and join Cameron Norrie in the 3rd round here, it will be the **highest number of British men to reach the 3rd round at Wimbledon since 1962**. With 7 British men reaching the 2nd round here, it is the joint-highest number of British men to reach the 2nd round at Wimbledon in the Open Era – there were also 7 British players in the men's singles 2nd round here in 1968, 1969, 1976, 1996 and 1997.

- Pinnington Jones advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Tomas Martin Etcheverry 76(4) 63 75 for his **first Tour-level match-win** in the 1st round on Tuesday.

- **Last year, as a wild card in Wimbledon qualifying**, Pinnington Jones fell in the 1st round of qualifying (l. Lucas Pouille). He also competed as a wild card in Wimbledon qualifying in 2021, when he reached the 2nd round of qualifying (d. Joao Menezes, l. Arthur Rinderknech). They are his only Grand Slam appearances, in either the main draw or in qualifying, prior to Wimbledon this year.
- Pinnington Jones made his **Tour-level debut** as a wild card at Eastbourne last week. He fell to Nuno Borges in the 1st round.
- Pinnington Jones' best result this season is reaching his **first Challenger-level final** – on grass as a wild card at the Ilkley Challenger (GBR) (l. Tristan Schoolkate). He has lost in the 1st round of the 3 other Challenger-level main draws he has contested this season.

A 5th meeting between Fucsovics and Monfils, but their first at a Grand Slam or on grass. Three of their 4 previous meetings have gone to a final set.

Monfils has lost Wimbledon matches to players ranked as low as No. 105 Fucsovics twice before – to No. 105 Igor Kunitsyn in the 1st round in 2006, and to No. 107 Pedro Martinez in the 2nd round in 2021. He has lost Grand Slam matches to players ranked as low as No. 105 Fucsovics on 3 other occasions – to No. 105 Juan Carlos Ferrero in the 2nd round at the 2011 US Open, to No. 120 Ilya Marchenko in the 1st round at the 2015 US Open and No. 105 Mikael Ymer in the 2nd round at 2021 Roland Garros.

Monfils has won all 4 matches he has played against lucky losers at the Grand Slams – against Luis Horna in the 2nd round at 2008 Roland Garros, Dieter Kindlmann in the 1st round at 2010 Roland Garros, Greg Zemlja in the 2nd round at 2011 Wimbledon and Malek Jaziri in the 1st round at 2014 Wimbledon. He has a 13-5 win-loss record against lucky losers at Tour-level overall.

Fucsovics and Monfils are 2 of the 6 former Wimbledon boys' singles champions to reach the 2nd round from the 9 who began the men's singles main draw here this year. Fucsovics won the boys' singles here in 2010 (d. Benjamin Mitchell) and also reached the semifinals of the boys' singles at the Australian Open (l. Sean Berman) and the US Open (l. Jack Sock) in the same year.

Monfils narrowly missed out on achieving the Junior Grand Slam in 2004 after winning the Australian Open, Roland Garros and Wimbledon. His preparation for the Junior US Open that year was hampered by a knee injury and he lost in the 3rd round to Viktor Troicki. He was named 2004 ITF Junior World Champion.

- Lucky loser **FUCSOVICS** is bidding to reach the 3rd round here for the 3rd time. This is his 8th Wimbledon appearance and his 32nd Grand Slam overall.
- If Fucsovics and fellow Hungarian Fabian Marozsan (who plays Jaume Munar in the 2nd round today) both reach the 3rd round here, it will be the **2nd time in history that multiple Hungarian players have reached the men's singles 3rd round at Wimbledon** – after 1939, when Emil Gabori and Otto Szigeti both reached the 3rd round here.
- If Fucsovics and Marozsan both reach the 3rd round here, it will be the **first time that multiple Hungarian players have reached the men's singles 3rd round at a Grand Slam since 1973 Roland Garros**, when Attila Korpas and Balazs Taroczy both reached the 3rd round.
- If Fucsovics and fellow lucky loser Cristian Garin (whose 2nd round match against Arthur Rinderknech will conclude today) both reach the 3rd round here, it will be the **first time that multiple lucky losers have reached the men's singles 3rd round at Wimbledon since 2002**, when George Bastl and Jeff Morrison both reached the 3rd round here as lucky losers.

- If Fucsovics and Garin both reach the 3rd round here, it will be the **first time that multiple lucky losers have reached the men's singles 3rd round at a Grand Slam since the 2019 US Open**, when both Paolo Lorenzi and Kamil Majchrzak reached the men's singles 3rd round as lucky losers.
- Fucsovics advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Aleksandar Kovacevic 63 67(5) 61 57 64 in the 1st round on Tuesday.
- As No. 1 seed in **Wimbledon qualifying last week**, Fucsovics defeated Jurij Rodionov (AUT) 64 63 and Zachary Svajda (USA) 76(5) 63 before falling to Chris Rodesch (LUX) 36 46 60 67(4) in the final round of qualifying. He gained entry to the main draw following Borna Coric's withdrawal due to a right shoulder injury.
- With Fucsovics and Marozsan both reaching the 2nd round here this year, it is the **first time that multiple Hungarian players have reached the men's singles 2nd round at Wimbledon since 1953**, when Zoltan Katona and Istvan Sikorszki both reached the 2nd round here.
- **Last year here**, Fucsovics fell in the 1st round (l. Matteo Berrettini).
- Fucsovics' **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the quarterfinals here in 2021. He defeated Jannik Sinner, Jiri Vesely, Diego Schwartzman and Andrey Rublev before falling to eventual champion Novak Djokovic. He became the first Hungarian man to reach a Grand Slam quarterfinal since Balazs Taroczy at 1981 Roland Garros and the first to do so at Wimbledon since Jozsef Asboth in 1948.
- **Elsewhere at the Grand Slams this year**, Fucsovics reached the 2nd round at Roland Garros (d. Tristan Schoolkate, l. Tommy Paul). He reached the 2nd round of qualifying at the Australian Open (d. Oriol Roca Batalla, l. Henrique Rocha). He had previously contested the main draw at 29 consecutive Grand Slam tournaments from 2017 Wimbledon through the 2024 US Open.
- **Prior to competing in Wimbledon qualifying this year**, Fucsovics reached the quarterfinals as a qualifier at Stuttgart (l. Taylor Fritz).
- Fucsovics' **best Tour-level result in 2025** is reaching the semifinals at Bucharest (l. Sebastian Baez).
- Fucsovics has also contested 6 Challenger-level events in 2025. His best result at Challenger-level this year is winning his **7th Challenger-level title** at the Manama Challenger (BRN) (d. Andrea Vavassori). He also reached the quarterfinals at the Noumea Challenger (CAL) (l. Moerani Bouzige) and the Murcia Challenger (ESP) (l. Carlos Taberner).
- Fucsovics has won **2 Tour-level titles** – at 2018 Geneva (d. Peter Gojowczyk), where he became the first Hungarian man to win a Tour-level title since Taroczy at 1982 Hilversum, and 2024 Bucharest (d. Mariano Navone).
- Fucsovics has won 2 of the **3 five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon – including his 5-set victory against Kovacevic in the 1st round here this year. He defeated Rublev in 5 sets in the round of 16 here in 2021, but fell to Fabio Fognini in 5 sets in the 2nd round in 2019. He has an 11-9 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Fucsovics reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 31 in March 2019. He plays here at No. 105.
- Fucsovics has played **Davis Cup** for Hungary since 2010 and has a 35-20 overall win-loss record in the competition. Hungary will play at home against Austria in the 2025 Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.

- **MONFILS** is bidding to reach the 3rd round here for the 9th time. This is his 14th Wimbledon appearance and his 67th Grand Slam overall.
- At 38 years 315 days, Monfils is bidding to become the **10th man in the Open Era to reach the 3rd round at Wimbledon aged 38 or older**. He is the oldest man to begin the men's singles main draw here this year. By reaching the 2nd round here, Monfils and Novak Djokovic (aged 38 years 52 days) have become the 17th and 18th men in the Open Era to reach the 2nd round at Wimbledon aged 38 or older. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- Monfils is bidding to reach the 3rd round at a Grand Slam for the 2nd time since turning 38 and become the **10th man in the Open Era to reach the 3rd round at the Grand Slams on multiple occasions after turning 38**. He reached the 3rd round at the Australian Open this year aged 38 years 147 days. (NB Djokovic is also bidding to reach the 3rd

round at a Grand Slam for the 2nd time since turning 38 here, having reached the 3rd round at Roland Garros this year aged 38 years 17 days)

- Monfils advanced to the 2nd round after defeating No. 18 seed Ugo Humbert 64 36 67(5) 75 62 in the 1st round on Tuesday
- By reaching the 2nd round here, Monfils has become the **oldest French player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles 2nd round at Wimbledon** – ahead of Stephane Robert, who reached the 2nd round here aged 38 years 59 days in 2018.
- **Last year here**, on his first Wimbledon appearance since 2021, Monfils reached the 3rd round aged 37 years 317 days, becoming the oldest French player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles 3rd round at Wimbledon. He defeated Adrian Mannarino and Stan Wawrinka before falling to Grigor Dimitrov. He withdrew from the 2022 event with a foot injury and from the 2023 event with a wrist injury.
- Monfils' **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the round of 16 in 2018, when he defeated Richard Gasquet, Paolo Lorenzi and Sam Querrey before falling to Kevin Anderson.
- Monfils' **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the semifinals on 2 occasions. He reached the last 4 at 2008 Roland Garros – where, ranked No. 59, he lost to Roger Federer – and at the 2016 US Open (l. Djokovic).
- Monfils is bidding to record his 131st Grand Slam match-win and extend his **all-time record for most Grand Slam match-wins by a Frenchman**. He claimed sole ownership of the record, ahead of Jo-Wilfried Tsonga (121 Grand Slam match-wins), by defeating Thiago Seyboth Wild in the 1st round at 2024 Roland Garros.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Monfils reached the round of 16 at the Australian Open, where he defeated Giovanni Mpetshi Perricard, Daniel Altmaier and Taylor Fritz before retiring against Ben Shelton due to a back injury, and the 2nd round at Roland Garros (d. Hugo Dellien, l. Jack Draper).
- Monfils' best result in 2025 is winning his **13th Tour-level title** at Auckland (d. Zizou Bergs). Aged 38 years 132 days, he became the oldest Tour-level men's singles title winner since Ken Rosewall won 1977 Hong Kong aged 43. His other highlights this season are reaching the round of 16 at Miami-1000 (l. Sebastian Korda) and the 3rd round at Indian Wells-1000 (l. Dimitrov).

- Auger-Aliassime advanced to the 2nd round after defeating James Duckworth 62 36 67(2) 64 64 for his **first Wimbledon match-win since 2021** in the 1st round on Monday.
- **Last year here**, Auger-Aliassime fell to Thanasi Kokkinakis in the 1st round. He also fell in the 1st round here in 2022 (l. Maxime Cressy) and 2023 (l. Michael Mmoh).
- Auger-Aliassime's **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the quarterfinals in 2021, when he defeated Thiago Monteiro, Mikael Ymer, Nick Kyrgios and Alexander Zverev before falling to Matteo Berrettini.
- Auger-Aliassime's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the semifinals at the 2021 US Open (l. Daniil Medvedev). He became the first Canadian man to reach the semifinals at the US Open and the first man born in the 2000s to reach a Grand Slam semifinal.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Auger-Aliassime reached the 2nd round at the Australian Open (d. Struff, l. Alejandro Davidovich Fokina) but fell in the 1st round at Roland Garros (l. Matteo Arnaldi).

- Auger-Aliassime has won 2 of the 3 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon – including his 5-set victory against Duckworth in the 1st round this year. He also defeated Zverev in 5 sets in the round of 16 here in 2021 but fell to Kokkinakis in 5 sets in the 1st round last year. He has a 7-6 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Auger-Aliassime broke the Top 10 for the first time in November 2021 and reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 6 in November 2022. He plays here at No. 28.
- Auger-Aliassime was a **successful junior**. He won the boys' singles title at the 2016 US Open (d. Miomir Kecmanovic) and finished runner-up in the boys' singles at 2016 Roland Garros (l. Geoffrey Blancaneaux). He reached the quarterfinals in the boys' singles here in 2016 (l. Alex de Minaur) and also reached the final in the boys' doubles with Denis Shapovalov that year losing to Kenneth Raisma/Stefanos Tsitsipas in the final. He was also part of Canadian teams that reached back-to-back Junior Davis Cup Finals in 2015-16, defeating Germany to win the title in 2015 but finishing runner-up to Russia in 2016.
- Auger-Aliassime **led Canada to the Davis Cup title in 2022**, defeating Australia in the final. He won 8 of the 9 matches he contested in the competition that year. He was also a member of the Canadian team which finished runners-up to Spain in 2019 and has a 13-4 win-loss record in the competition overall. Canada will play at home against Israel in a 2025 World Group I tie in September.
- Auger-Aliassime is coached by Frederic Fontang.
- **STRUFF** is bidding to reach the 3rd round here for the 4th time and equal his best Wimbledon result. This is his 11th Wimbledon appearance and 43rd Grand Slam overall.
- Struff advanced to the 2nd round after defeating qualifier Filip Misolic 62 57 63 63 in the 1st round on Monday.
- Struff's **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the 3rd round on 3 occasions – including last year, when he defeated Fabian Marozsan and Zhang Zhizhen before falling to Daniil Medvedev. He also reached the 3rd round here in 2018 (l. Roger Federer) and 2019 (l. Mikhail Kukushkin).
- Struff's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the round of 16 at Roland Garros on 2 occasions – in 2019 (l. Novak Djokovic) and 2021 (l. Diego Schwartzman).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Struff fell in the 1st round at both the Australian Open (l. Auger-Aliassime) and Roland Garros (l. Sebastian Ofner). His victory against Misolic in the 1st round here ended a 4-match Grand Slam losing streak – he had previously not recorded a victory at the Grand Slams since reaching the 3rd round here last year, having also fallen in the 1st round at the US Open last year (l. Laslo Djere).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this season**, Struff reached the 2nd round as a wild card at Stuttgart (d. Matteo Arnaldi, l. Jiri Lehecka) but fell in the 1st round as a wild card at Halle (l. Lorenzo Sonego).
- Struff's **best result in 2025** is reaching the quarterfinals at Marseille, where he defeated Manuel Guinard and Hugo Grenier before falling to Medvedev. He had recorded 5 Tour-level match-wins prior to Wimbledon this year – his 2 victories in his quarterfinal finish at Marseille and in 2nd round finishes at Auckland (d. Bu Yunchaokete, l. Gael Monfils), Madrid-1000 (d. Botić van de Zandschulp, l. Stefanos Tsitsipas) and Stuttgart.
- Struff has reached **one Tour-level final on grass** – at 2023 Stuttgart, where he finished runner-up to Frances Tiafoe.
- Struff has won one of the last 6 **five-set matches** he has played, with his only victory in a 5-set match in that time coming against Rinky Hijikata in the 1st round at the 2024 Australian Open. He has a 2-2 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Wimbledon and a 10-10 win-loss record in 5-set matches overall.
- Struff reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 21 in June 2023. He plays here at No. 125.
- Struff made his **Davis Cup** debut for Germany in 2015 and has a 19-10 win-loss record in the competition overall. Germany will play away against Japan in the 2025 Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Struff is coached by Carsten Arriens.

- **DAVIDOVICH FOKINA** is bidding to reach the 3rd round here for the 2nd time and equal his best Wimbledon result. This is his 4th Wimbledon appearance and his 21st Grand Slam overall.
- Davidovich Fokina advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Brandon Holt 62 64 75 in the 1st round on Monday.
- Davidovich Fokina's **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the 3rd round in 2023, when he defeated Arthur Fils and Van De Zandschulp before falling to Holger Rune in 5 sets. He missed Wimbledon last year due to a back injury.
- Davidovich Fokina's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the quarterfinals at 2021 Roland Garros, where he defeated Mikhail Kukushkin, Van De Zandschulp, Casper Ruud and Federico Delbonis before falling to Alexander Zverev.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Davidovich Fokina reached the round of 16 at the Australian Open, where he defeated Shang Juncheng, Felix Auger-Aliassime and Jakub Mensik before falling to Tommy Paul, and the 2nd round at Roland Garros (d. Pablo Llamas Ruiz, l. Jiri Lehecka).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Davidovich Fokina reached the semifinals at Eastbourne, where he defeated Tseng Chun Hsin, James Duckworth and Mensik before falling to Taylor Fritz.
- Davidovich Fokina's best results in 2025 are reaching his **2nd and 3rd Tour-level finals** – he finished runner-up at both Delray Beach (l. Miomir Kecmanovic) and Acapulco (l. Tomas Machac). He also reached the semifinals at Monte Carlo-1000 (l. Carlos Alcaraz) and the quarterfinals at Barcelona (l. Karen Khachanov).
- Davidovich Fokina has won one of the 4 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon. He defeated Hubert Hurkacz in 5 sets in the 1st round here in 2022, but lost 5-set matches here to Denis Kudla in the 1st round in 2021, to Jiri Vesely in the 2nd round in 2022 and to Rune in the 3rd round in 2023. He has a 9-7 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Davidovich Fokina reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 21 in August 2023. He plays here at No. 27.
- In 2017, Davidovich Fokina became the **first Spanish boys' singles champion at Wimbledon** since Manuel Orantes in 1967, defeating Axel Geller in the title match. He is one of 9 former Wimbledon boys' singles champions who began the men's main draw here this year. He also reached the semifinals of the boys' singles at 2017 Roland Garros (l. Alexei Popyrin) and reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 2 in July that year.

- Davidovich Fokina made his **Davis Cup** debut for Spain in 2022 and has a 1-5 overall win-loss record in the competition. Spain will play at home against Denmark in the 2025 Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Davidovich Fokina is coached by Felix Mantilla and David Sanchez.
- **VAN DE ZANDSCHULP** is bidding to reach the 3rd round here for the 2nd time. This is his 5th Wimbledon appearance and his 19th Grand Slam overall.
- Van de Zandschulp advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Matteo Arnaldi 76(4) 76(5) 64 in a 1st round match which began on Monday and concluded on Tuesday. It was his **100th Tour-level match-win**.
- **Last year here**, Van de Zandschulp reached the 2nd round (d. Liam Broady, l. Ugo Humbert).
- Van de Zandschulp's **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the round of 16 in 2022. He defeated Feliciano Lopez, Emil Ruusuvuori and Richard Gasquet before falling to Rafael Nadal.
- Van de Zandschulp's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the quarterfinals as a qualifier at the 2021 US Open. He defeated Carlos Taberner, Casper Ruud, Facundo Bagnis and Diego Schwartzman before falling to Daniil Medvedev in the last 8. He became the 3rd qualifier in the Open Era to reach the men's singles quarterfinals at the US Open – after Nicolas Escude (1999) and Gilles Muller (2008) – and the first Dutchman to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam since Sjeng Schalken at 2004 Wimbledon.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Van de Zandschulp lost in the 1st round at both the Australian Open (l. Alex de Minaur) and Roland Garros (l. Emilio Nava).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Van de Zandschulp fell in the 1st round of qualifying at Mallorca (l. Nishesh Basavareddy). He withdrew from 's-Hertogenbosch due to a right arm injury.
- Van de Zandschulp is bidding to record his **6th Tour-level match-win of 2025**. He recorded 4 victories at Tour-level prior to Wimbledon this year – in a 3rd round finish as a lucky loser at Indian Wells-1000, where he defeated Nick Kyrgios and Novak Djokovic before falling to Francisco Cerundolo, and in 2nd round finishes as a qualifier at Doha (d. Abedallah Shelbayh, l. De Minaur) and as a lucky loser at Munich (d. Roberto Bautista Agut, l. Ben Shelton).
- Van de Zandschulp has won 5 of the 6 **five-set matches** he has contested – including the only 5-set match he has contested at Wimbledon, against Zhang Zhizhen in the 1st round in 2023. His only defeat in a 5-set match came against Davidovich Fokina in the 2nd round at 2021 Roland Garros.
- Van de Zandschulp achieved a **career-high ranking** of No. 22 in August 2022. He plays here at No. 92.
- Van de Zandschulp made his **Davis Cup** debut for Netherlands in 2019 and has a 15-8 win-loss record in the competition. He was a member of the Dutch team which reached the Davis Cup final for the first time in 2024, falling to Italy in Malaga. Netherlands will play at home against Argentina in the 2025 Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Van de Zandschulp is coached by Peter Lucassen and Fred Hemmes.

Head-to-head: first meeting

Darderi is facing a British player at Wimbledon for the 2nd time – he defeated wild card Jan Choinski in 5 sets in the 1st round here in 2024. He has lost the 2 other matches he has contested against British players at Tour-level, both of which have come against Jack Draper – in the 2nd round at 2024 Vienna and in the 2nd round at 2025 Rome-1000.

This is the 28th men’s singles match between a British player and an Italian player at Wimbledon in the Open Era – and the 2nd this year, after Mattia Bellucci defeated Oliver Crawford in the 1st round on Tuesday. Flavio Cobolli and Jack Pinnington Jones will begin the 29th British-Italian men’s singles match in the Open Era here today. British players lead Italian players 14-13 in previous men’s singles matches at Wimbledon in the Open Era.

This is the 60th men’s singles match between a British player and an Italian player at the Grand Slams in the Open Era. British players lead Italian players 31-28 in the 59 previous Open Era men’s singles matches at the majors – in addition to the 28 previous matches at Wimbledon, there have been 16 matches at Roland Garros (British players lead 9-7), 9 matches at the Australian Open (British players lead 5-4) and 7 matches at the US Open (Italian players lead 4-3).

- Wild card **FERY** is bidding to reach the 3rd round at a Grand Slam for the first time. This is his 3rd Grand Slam appearance, with both of his previous appearances at the Grand Slams having also come at Wimbledon.
- Fery is bidding to become the **4th British wild card to reach the men’s singles 3rd round at Wimbledon since 2000** – after Murray (who achieved the feat in 2005 and 2021), James Ward (2015) and Liam Broady (2022 and 2023). (NB fellow British wild cards Daniel Evans and Jack Pinnington Jones are also bidding to achieve the feat)
- Fery is one of 4 British players competing in the men’s singles here today, alongside Jack Draper, Evans and Pinnington Jones. If all 4 British men win today and join Cameron Norrie in the 3rd round here, it will be the **highest number of British men to reach the 3rd round at Wimbledon since 1962**. With 7 British men reaching the 2nd round here, it is the joint-highest number of British men to reach the 2nd round at Wimbledon in the Open Era – there were also 7 British players in the men’s singles 2nd round here in 1968, 1969, 1976, 1996 and 1997.

- Fery advanced to the 2nd round after defeating No. 20 seed Alexei Popyrin 64 61 46 64 for his **first Tour-level match-win** in the 1st round on Monday.
- Fery lost in the 1st round on his 2 **previous Wimbledon appearances** – as a wild card in both 2023 (l. Daniil Medvedev) and 2024 (l. Daniel Altmaier).
- Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Fery competed as a qualifier at the Nottingham Challenger (GBR). He defeated Kyrian Jacquet and Ugo Blanchet in qualifying before reaching the 2nd round of the main draw (d. Fabio Fognini, l. Terence Atmane).
- Fery **competes mainly on the Challenger Tour and the ITF World Tennis Tour**. - Fery reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 229 in August 2024. He plays here at No. 461.
- Fery **played college tennis** at Stanford University from 2020 to 2024, ending his college career with a 58-16 singles win-loss record. He was named an all-American in singles in both 2022 and 2023.
- Fery had a **good junior career**, reaching a career-high junior ranking of No. 12 in March 2020. He reached the 3rd round on his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2019 (l. Shintaro Mochizuki).
- Fery is coached by Benoit Foucher.
- DARDERI** is bidding to reach the 3rd round at a Grand Slam for the first time. This is his 2nd Wimbledon appearance and his 6th Grand Slam overall.
- Darderi advanced to the 2nd round after defeating Roman Safiullin 76(3) 16 67(2) 63 61 in the 1st round on Monday.
- By reaching the 2nd round here, Darderi has equalled his **best Grand Slam result**. He has reached the 2nd round at a Grand Slam on 2 previous occasions – on his first 2 appearances in the main draw at the Grand Slams, at 2024 Roland Garros (d. Rinky Hijikata, l. Tallon Griekspoor) and 2024 Wimbledon (d. Jan Choinski, l. Lorenzo Musetti).
- In Grand Slam play this year**, Darderi fell in the 1st round at both the Australian Open, where he retired against Pedro Martinez due to joint pain, and Roland Garros (l. Sebastian Korda).
- Darderi's best result in 2025 is winning his **2nd Tour-level title** at Marrakech (d. Griekspoor). He also reached the quarterfinals at Munich (l. Ben Shelton) and Hamburg (l. Andrey Rublev).

- Darderi has contested **3 Challenger-level events in 2025**. His best result is finishing runner-up at the Naples Challenger (ITA) (l. Vit Kopriva).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Darderi fell in the 1st round at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Nicolas Jarry), Halle (l. Stefanos Tsitsipas) and Eastbourne (l. Marcos Giron).
- Darderi is bidding to record his **4th Tour-level match-win on grass**. In addition to his victories in the 1st round here in 2024 and this year, his only other Tour-level match-win on grass came in a 2nd round finish at 2024 Mallorca (d. Pedro Martinez, l. Sebastian Ofner).
- Darderi has contested **3 five-set matches** – all of which have come at Wimbledon. He defeated Choinski in 5 sets before falling to Musetti in 5 sets here last year, before recording another 5-set victory against Safiullin in the 1st round here this year.
- Darderi reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 32 in August 2024. He plays here at No. 59.
- Darderi had a **good junior career**, reaching a career-high junior ranking of No. 8 in February 2020. His best results in the boys' singles at the Grand Slams were reaching the 2nd round at the 2019 Australian Open (d. Thantub Suksumrarn, l. Emilio Nava) and 2020 Roland Garros (d. Shunsuke Mitsui, l. Arthur Fils). He never competed in the boys' singles at Wimbledon.
- Darderi is coached by his father, Luciano Enrique Darderi.
